Michael O'Hanrahan was a senior member of the Irish Volunteers and third-in-command in Jacob's biscuit factory. He was executed at Kilmainham on 4 May 1916 and buried at Arbour Hill.

Report received from TAG:

"I refer to Question No.49 submitted to the North West Area Committee meeting of 16th September, 2014, regarding the above.

I wish to inform you that the Traffic Advisory Group, at its meeting of 18th August, 2015, reported that in order to provide pedestrian facilities at the Lidl shop on St. Margaret's Road it would be necessary to reconfigure the existing roundabout. The estimated cost of implementing the scheme is approximately half a million euro. The National Transport Authority had considered funding the scheme as part of the accommodation works for the Finglas Improvement Scheme. This funding commitment is no longer available following lack of support for the overall scheme and the reduced funding for the sustainable transport measures grants in 2015. At present Dublin City Council do not have the necessary finances to fund the scheme"

Cabra Area Office Report

MAIN DEVELOPMENTS

Cabra East pole painting

The lighting poles on St Jarlath's Rd, as previously reported, will not now be painted. This is because they are due to be replaced in the Public Lighting Works Programme for 2016. Poles on St Eithne's and St Fintan's Roads and St Fintan's Terrace and at the entrance to Ratoath Estate will be painted.

Christmas Tree Lighting

The annual Christmas Tree Lighting ceremony will take place on Friday 4th December at 5 pm and will be attended by the Lord Mayor, Críona Ní Dhálaigh.

Local school choirs will participate and NaomhFionn Barra GAA will kindly provide refreshments afterwards.

<u>Halloween</u>

Preventative action from the combined services of Public Domain, Cabra Office and Housing Maintenance in identifying and removing bonfire material resulted in a relatively quiet Halloween in Cabra. We are thankful to residents in Drumcliffe and Killala for responding to our requests to ensure that no bonfires were held on the vulnerable parts of the swales.

Longford Bridge: Work has now been completed by Waterways Ireland with the capping replaced on the bridge.

LUAS

Construction Works began on site on April 7th 2015

Progress to date:

- 1. Site Clearance of 3 Hectares of the Old Railway Cutting which included the removal of trees, shrubs and 2,000 tonne of household waste off the site.
- 2. Removal of 30,000 tonne of unsuitable material off site.
- 3. The establishment of a new entrance, car park and compound beside Broombridge Train Station for the construction of the works.
- 4. Construction of 600m of capping foundation for new Luas Line.
- 5. Diversion of existing utility cables and pipework that will clash with the new works.

Work Plan for next three months:

- 1. Complete Earthworks and Capping
- 2. Drainage and Ducting Works
- 3. Boundary Works
- 4. Retaining Walls

5. Commence works on Large Depot Buildings

LUAS advise that they are looking at replacing the existing fencing on top of the Liam Whelan Bridge to make it more visual pleasing. The plaque will be put back in before Christmas.

Shandon Boundary Wall Replacement

Transport Infrastructure Ireland have appointed KN Network Services (KNNS) to complete these works. KNNS are providers to the Telecommunications, Civil Engineering, Rail, Electricity, and Energy Sectors in Ireland, the UK and Internationally. The works will be starting the week commencing 23rd November 2015 and they will take approximately two weeks to complete the works. KNNS will be providing security on-site out of hours during these works to prevent unlawful access to the site.

A letter will be issued to residents this week notifying them of the start date. The wall will be replaced with green palisade fencing which will match the existing height of 3.5 metres.

The Royal Canal Greenway

Trial holes have been bored and investigative work has commenced for the cycleway on some of the tow paths in preparation for the cycleway works. Progress report is included in the Agenda.

Ratoath Road Community Liaison - Irish Rail project

Irish Rail report that they are waiting for Ashington residents to get back in contact with them following previous discussions. Halloween did not result in any incidents in the area.

The tender for the landscaping has been awarded and the fence/gate tender has not yet been awarded but will be soon.

COMMUNITY & SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

Community Development Activities prioritised Halloween Celebrations over the past month. All activities were promoted on a low cost/high impact basis encouraging the local communities to celebrate the Festival in a positive manner. In particular, activities on Halloween Night itself were strongly promoted to celebrate Halloween and discourage antisocial activities.

Cabra Halloween Festival had a great week, but especially on Halloween night with the Graveyard Project on Faussagh Road/Quarry Road and a special disco for young people in Halla Naomh Fionnbarra. Cabra Mens Group deserve a special mention.

Drumcliff Road residents also held a major event on Halloween night as did St. Eithne's Roundabout residents.

Phibsborough Tidy Towns Committee ran their first Halloween Celebration in the Scout Den with the attendance of hundreds of local people.

The work of the local residents groups continues and a major celebration of the work of the voluntary dinner committee in Convent View Court, 40 years of delivering meals on wheels was held on Tuesday 10th November. This marks the end of this group.

Proposed Extinguishment of the Public Right of Way over the laneway to the rear of 1-29 Kinvara Road, 3-55 Kinvara Avenue, rear of 35-45 Kinvara Park.

A request to have the public right of way extinguished over the above was received by the Finglas/Cabra Area Offices via the Planning, Property, Enterprise & Economic Development Department in August 2015. The reason for the proposed extinguishment is to allow for the erection of gates on the laneway to prevent the serious anti social behaviour currently taking place in the laneway. The extent of this proposed extinguishment is shown on the attached Drawing RM. 36468

A number of signatures were missing from the original plebiscite and a further letter was subsequently sent to these residents on 14th August 2015 requesting that they state whether they were in agreement or not with the proposal.

Four objections were received in writing, two of which had concerns with safety, as they can access their garages without having to get of the car, gates would mean that they would have to get out of the car to open to the gate. The other two written objections did not state why they were against the proposal. One objection was received by telephone and stated that he had not heard anything about the closure and that had not received any documentation from the proposers (original letters on file).

The Public Domain Officer met with representatives from the residents on site to review their proposal and to ascertain information in relation to the position of the gates.

Service Checks

A service check will be undertaken to establish the extent of the services located in this area. Suitable arrangements will be put in place prior to completion of this proposal.


Statutory Requirement

The statutory procedure involves giving public notice of the proposal in one or more newspapers circulating in the City and the affixing of that notice at each end of the right of way for a period of not less than 14 days. Any objections or representations made and not withdrawn shall be considered. The extinguishment of a public right of way is a function reserved to the elected members of the City Council.

Recommendation

I recommend that procedures be initiated under Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993 to extinguish the public right of way over the area indicated on attached Drawing RM. RM. 36468.

Rents Update

The Finglas Area Office continues to provide a rent assessment service for tenants living in the Finglas area. The Rent Assessment Section conducted 101 rent assessments for the Finglas area in October 2015.

Ratoath Drive

As a result of the new railings at Ratoath Drive there was no bonfire there for the first time in a number of years

Hazelcroft Green

The new railings at Hazelcroft Green resulted in only a very small bonfire in this area. The Local Area office will work with the residents throughout the year to prevent any bonfire taking place here next year.

Prospect Hill

At the start of the year it became apparent that there were some fire deficiencies in the blocks of apartments in Prospect Hill.

A Fire Safety Consultant was engaged to inspect the blocks. In consultation with Dublin Fire Brigade the consultant identified works to be carried out in the common areas in all but one block and these were carried out immediately.

Each apartment then had to be inspected and a schedule of works to be carried out is being drawn up at present and has to be signed off by Dublin Fire Brigade and should be going to tender in December. It is anticipated that it will take between 3 and 5 days per unit to complete the works. The residents have been kept informed through out the process through the management company Greendoor.

The 58 apartments in Block 2 have still to be inspected to ascertain if there are any fire deficiencies before Dublin City Council will complete the purchase of the block. There is no time frame at the moment for when the purchase will be completed.

CCTV Camera's Barry Shops / Kildonan Road

The planning process for the placing of CCTV cameras at the Barry Shops and outside the Abigail Centre was completed on the 26th of October. There were no objections and the contactor has been instructed to fit the poles and arrange an ESB connection for the cameras.

COMMUNITY & SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

Dublin City Comhairle na nÓg AGM

The Dublin City Comhairle na nÓg AGM took place on Thursday 22nd October 2015 when nearly 200 young people aged 11 to 18 representing schools and youth organisations from around the City gathered in Croke Park. 20 young people represented 6 schools and 2 youth organisations from Finglas.

The AGM was chaired and led by existing Comhairle members, including 3 representatives from the Finglas area. Through a series of facilitated workshops young people discussed 3 topics relevant to young people; youth services, education and our environment. The theme

of education was selected by the majority of young people present as the overall issue for the Comhairle members to work on for the year ahead. 33 new members were elected onto the Comhairle committee which included 4 young people from Finglas.

Local based Halloween activities 2015

Dublin City Council Community and Social Development team supported a number of groups/clubs to organise locally based activities to promote Safety at Halloween. These activities took place during the week leading up to Halloween and activities ranged from fancy dress parties, scary movie evening, quizzes and graveyard tours.

Christmas Remembrance/Celebration 2015

In conjunction with the Positive wellness group, the Community & Social Development section, Dublin City Council have organised a Christmas remembrance / celebration. This event will be held on Monday 7th December at 7pm at the trees beside the Finglas leisure centre. There will be a turning on the lights ceremony, entertainment will be provided by St Michael's girl's choir. Members of the public who attend the event will be invited to place ribbons on the tree as a gesture of remembrance of loved ones who have passed away.

Age Friendly Cities Older Person's Council:

The North West Area Older Person's Council continue to meet on a regular basis. The next meeting of the council will take place on Wednesday 25th November 2015 at 12.00pm in the Civic Offices Mellowes Road.

Five members of the North West Area Older Person's Council will attend a National Older Persons Council meeting on the 19th/20th November.

Mellow Spring Childcare Development Centre:

Mellow Spring Childcare Development Centre is full once again for the period September 2015 to June 2016.

The Centre was recently visited by an expert advisory group with representatives from the Department of Children & Youth Affairs; the group praised the centre for its work and for providing a broad range of activities for participants.

Community Grants Scheme 2016:

Applications under Dublin City Council Community Grant Scheme closed on 30th October 2015. Community Development Staff will begin the process of assessing applications from 16th November 2015.

It is anticipated that a pre- Area Committee Meeting with Councillors and Dublin City Council staff will take place in January 2016.

The Finglas Halloween Festival took place in the Finglas Civic Centre on Saturday 31st October 2015 from 6.00pm to 9.00pm.

With reference to the proposed exchange of land with the ESB at 12 Valeview Gardens /21 Valeview Drive, Finglas, Dublin 12.

Dublin City Council disposed of the fee simple in a site to the rear of 12 Valeview Gardens, Finglas, Dublin 11 to the ESB for a substation in 1982.

The ESB applied to relocate the existing substation to a site adjacent to 21 Valeview Drive, Finglas, Dublin 11, and agreed to surrender their interest in the site of the old substation to the rear of 12 Valeview Gardens, Finglas, Dublin 11. This relocation which has already taken place was to facilitate the building of 22 affordable houses in the Berryfield/Valeview area.

In accordance with the standard terms and conditions for the provision of an electricity supply to housing developments the City Council is required to provide the site free of charge to the ESB.

The site for disposal is shown outlined red and coloured pink on the attached Map Index No SM-2015-0801 and the site to be surrendered is shown outlined red and coloured blue.


Accordingly it is proposed to accept the surrender of the site of the old substation from the ESB and to dispose of the new site subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The site adjacent to 21 Valeview Drive, Finglas, Dublin 11, will be transferred to the ESB free of charge.
- 2. The ESB agrees to surrender their interest in the site of the old substation at 12 Valeview Gardens, Finglas, Dublin 11.
- 3. The E.S.B will pay a contribution of €750 (seven hundred and fifty euros) towards the City Council's legal costs incurred in the transaction together with VAT and reasonable outlay.

The disposal shall be subject to such conditions as to title to be furnished as the Law Agent in his discretion shall stipulate.

No agreement enforceable at law is created or intended to be created until an exchange of contracts has taken place.

It is proposed to dispose of the fee simple in the plot of ground to Francis Mahon subject to the following terms and conditions:


- 1. The consideration shall be €1,500 (one thousand and five hundred euro).

Update on Proposed Royal Canal Cycleway – Sheriff Street Upper, Dublin 1 to Ashtown, Dublin 15.

The Planning & Development Department of Dublin City Council have evaluated the planning application for the Royal Canal Cycleway from Sheriff Street Upper to Ashtown and have determined that the proposed development is consistent with the Dublin City Development Plan 2011-2017 and with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area. They recommend that the proposed development should proceed subject to conditions.

The Chief Executive will be bringing the Recommendation for Council Decision at the December meeting.

Summary of issues raised in Submissions/Observations

- Additional Planting and greening of the greenway should be incorporated into the scheme.
- Design of Newcomen Bridge may facilitate anti social behaviour due to 'blind spots' being created.
- Access from Ossory Road to the greenway by means of a footbridge should be included.
- The playground shown on the plans for phase 2 should be enclosed and that only one playground to be constructed at the Sheriff Street end due to the acoustics in the area
- No skate park be included in the plan.
- Shared space should be kept to a minimum along the route.
- Wider Toucan Crossings should be provided for along the route.

- Public Toilets should be provided along the route.
- Proposed on-road cycle track removing on-road car parking south of Russell Street Bridge.
- Anti-social behaviour around Russell Street Bridge.
- Access Ramps at Russell Street Bridge will preclude pedestrians to walk under the bridge and force all users to cross Russell Street to access the opposite side of the route
- The system of Access to the canal towpath should be such that it prevents access by motor bikes, scramblers, quad bikes and similar vehicles.
- The scheme should take cognisance of the permitted development at Pelletstown Reg. Ref. 3069/14.
- The scheme should take cognisance of the permitted railway station at Ashington/Pelletstown.
- Suitable signage to be provided along the route.
- Proposed works should not conflict with use of canal for activities such as canoeing at 6th Lock and festivals such as Phizzfest.
- Kissing gates along the canal should be removed.
- Observations from larnrod Eireann regarding issues where the route interfaces with the railway line.
- Moving the Proposed Pedestrian/Cycle Bridge to the West of Cross Gunns Bridge to facilitate Cycling on the South of the Canal.
- Bridge Crossing of the Canal at Lock Gate 3 and the visual impact of the proposal at this location.
- Safety fence between the cycle track and the Railway boundary at Phase 3 is in appropriate.
- Requests for the cycle track to remain on the southern side of the canal from Binn's Bridge to Westmoreland Bridge.
- Narrow cross section running through the Linear Park between Phibsborough Road and Drumcondra Road.
- Public Art.
- Layout of Toucan Crossing at Cross Guns Bridge/Phibsborough Road. Narrow Footpaths and Cycle Facilities.
- The narrow nature of the existing footpath on the west side of Phibsborough Road at Westmoreland Bridge should be addressed.
- Litter bins should be provided as part of the scheme.
- The existing wall on Croke Park property will need to be raised in order to accommodate the Russell Street Access Ramp.
- During event days at Croke Park pedestrian access along the canal at this location is blocked. The proposal will have implications for the existing arrangement.
- Potential for anti social behaviour to take place under the proposed access ramps at Russell Street.
- An approach to larnrod Eireann should be made to ascertain their intentions for the lands behind Coke Oven Cottages.
- The Environmental Report submitted does not appear to have considered the cumulative impact of the entire length of the route from Dublin to the Shannon.
- The Appropriate Assessment Screening submitted with the application has only assessed phase 4 of the scheme from Ashtown to Phibsborough.
- The submissions received have been considered in the assessment of the planning application

Recommendation – Consistent with Dublin City Development Plan 2011-2017. Proposed Development to proceed, subject to the following conditions

1. Details of finishing materials to be agreed for all surfaces.

- 2. Details of additional landscaping elements to be agreed in writing with Parks and Landscape Services Division of DCC.

With further reference to the Exchange of lands at Finglas and Ballymun with Fingal County Council.

Report No. 19/1994 which was assented to by the City Council at its meeting on 7th February 1994 contained a proposal to effect an exchange of lands at Finglas and Ballymun with Fingal County Council to facilitate the construction of the Northern Cross motorway subject to terms and conditions. The legal formalities in respect of the majority of these lands were completed a number of years ago.

Subsequent to the construction of the M50 it transpired that Lands omitted from the original proposal would in fact be required by Fingal County Council together with some additional lands not included in the original proposal. The lands now proposed to be transferred measure 7232 sq. meters approximately and are shown outlined in red and coloured pink on Map Index No's SM-2014-0399-002 and SM-2014-0399-001, copies of which are submitted with this report.

Accordingly, it is now proposed to transfer the abovementioned lands to Fingal County Council subject to the following terms and conditions:


- 1. That Dublin City Council shall dispose of the subject land for the consideration of €1(one euro)
- 2. That the land is disposed of with full freehold title.
- 3. That Fingal County Council shall pay Dublin City Councils reasonable legal fees and valuers fees of €800 (eight hundred euro) plus VAT.
- 4. That the transaction is completed within 3 months of the date of the Council's approval of the disposal.


The disposal shall be subject to such conditions as to title to be furnished as the Law Agent in his discretion shall stipulate.

North West Area Complaints received via CRM.

The CRM is the system used by Dublin City Council Customer Services Centre and all departments to log and track complaints. Please see details below of the number of complaints received investigated and closed by the North West Area Office from 1st October to 5th November.

It is important to note that a significant number of additional complaints were also investigated as all area staff pick up complaints when carrying out daily duties but due to lack of resources all complaints are not logged.

Halloween/Bonfires

The North West Area once again increased their efforts to remove bonfire materials in the run up to Halloween. We began removing materials on the 3rd October. We contacted all our local residents groups through the Safety Fora and asked them to forward any details they might have in relation to youth's stock piling bonfire materials.

Over 1200 warning letters were issued to residents advising them not to store bonfire materials/waste in their gardens in the run up to Halloween. We worked closely with

residents to ensure that skips in the area were removed on or before 31st October in order to minimise materials available for the bonfires. We carried out a number of early morning raids on properties where large amounts of bonfire materials were being stored.

On the 30th and 31st October we started at 5.00am and continued to collect materials until 4.00pm. The Gardaí were fully supportive of this operation and provided assistance all day on Halloween, without their support this type of work would not have been possible.

We targeted bonfires/materials that we believed were an issue under Health and Safety or had large amounts of tyres/toxic materials. The Public Domain Office identified these stockpiles/bonfires and the Gardaí blocked off the area while a crew removed the materials. This proved to be hugely effective. However even with these efforts and the festivals in Finglas/Ballymun there were reports of anti social behaviour in some areas.

It is estimated that up to **28 tonnes** of material and over 200 tyres were removed between 22nd and 31st October by the Public Domain Crew and Parks Department in the North West Area. The clean up was completed in the area by Thursday5th November. Bonfires were reduced by 3 locations in Finglas and 1 locations in Ballymun compared to 2014.

Linking local active age group members from the Santry, Larkhill and Ballymun area to a Christmas Dinner Event in Parnell's GAA Club, Coolock on the 9th December.

Ballymun Otherworld Festival

The annual "Otherworld Festival" took place on October 31st from 6pm to 9pm. The event included the following.

- A parade organised by the Poppintree Youth Project, The Aisling Project and DCC.
- Main Stage & Mun TV organised by axis and Ballymun Communications.
- Fancy dress Ceilí House organised by Radhairc Ceilteach Setanta.
- Freaky Forest organised as a month long community wide project with schools, community groups and youth projects involved.

The event was coordinated and funded by Dublin City Council with a small financial contribution from the Local Drugs Task Force. Over 6,000 people visited the site with additional large numbers watching the fireworks from alternative locations.

Glasnevin Community Report

Community Development Activities prioritised Halloween Celebrations over the past month. All activities were promoted on a low cost/high impact basis encouraging the local communities to celebrate the Festival in a positive manner.

Finally, John Mitchell celebrated his 102nd birthday in Clareville Court with his many friends from Roscommon, England and Dublin.

2. Housing/Estate Management

Remaining Blocks

The two blocks at Balbutcher Lane and Joseph Plunkett Tower have been demolished. The programme of clearing the site of the rubble is ongoing.

C.C.T.V

The C.C.T.V system is working well at present. The Maintenance Programme is taking place during November this includes cleaning and checking all the cameras and installing updates to the system in the control room.

Cleansing/Waste Management

Waste Management and the area office are continuing to combat illegal dumping at open spaces. These measures include using the C.C.T.V system to monitor and identify those responsible. The area office has targeted illegal dumping in St Margaret's Road, Coultry, Whiteacre and Druid Court over the last month and this resulted in a number of tenants being called in and warned about illegal dumping. Our cleansing crew is continuing with the cleaning of the Courts in Ballymun which are cleaned on a rota basis.

Public Domain

The Ballymun Office now has a member of staff assigned to issues relating to Public Domain. Issues which can be reported include illegal dumping, graffiti, broken footpaths and open spaces. Complaints can be logged by calling to the public counter or by phoning 222 5610.

Plaza Apartments

The first group of residents moved into the apartments in the Plaza over the last couple of weeks.

Ballymun West Area Report

Halloween

Dublin City Council have made a huge effort to ensure a speedy clean up after Halloween period. The Public Domain officer in the Ballymun area, Cleansing, Parks and estate management all played a part in ensuring all reports of hoarding bonfire material was responded to, as a result the volume of bonfires on the West side of Ballymun was reduced in comparison to other years. A number of spots that would have been used for bonfires in the past were not used (Cranogue Road, Balcurris Park.)

Ard Na Meala- Balcurris Park

A number of complaints have been received relating to the volume of quad bikes and dirt bikes in this area. Dublin City Council is in constant contact with the Gardai and the Parks Department in an effort to reduce this problem. Dublin City Council has installed kissing gates on the foot path to the front of Ard Na Meala in an effort to stop the motor bikes/ quad bikes speeding up and down this foot path.

Doon & Knowth Court

Dublin City Council has been working with the residents of Doon and Knowth Court. The resident's have painted a large wall that has been a prominent area for antisocial behaviour. Dublin City Council has resurfaced the footpath and a wall has been erected to replace the concrete bollards. Kissing gates have been installed to stop access for motor bikes/ quad bikes. A public light that had been vandalised has been reinstated. Four trees have been planted to commemorate the young people that have passed away in the area. There has been huge resident's participation. The parks department have given topsoil, with a view to replant grass seed where fires have been set over the years. BRYR has agreed to carry out street games in this space also. The residents of Doon and Graigue Court have also been working with Dublin City Council to improve the area. A painting programme has taken place where Dublin City Council provided the paint and the residents have painted the back walls themselves. Shovels, brushes, bags and pickers have been provided by Dublin City Council for the residents. They have edged all the grass verges on the footpaths and have carried out a number of tidy ups. A number of different departments have been involved in

this piece of work. Parks, Cleansing, Public Lighting, the Community Department and Public Domain have all had a part to play. This work is ongoing. The huge effort that has been made by the residents has spurred other residents on from Cranogue Road and Knowth Court to engage with Dublin City Council with a view to achieving the same results as their neighbours.

Ballymun East Area Report

A lot of community groups have come to the end of their summer projects and are currently clearing flower beds and taking in planting boxes in time for the winter. All residents in the area are helping with the clearing of leaves and general up keep of the area. Cafta and Dublin City Council have been engaging with the groups with any support required and have already identified projects in Coultry Terrace and Woodhazel Terrace such as winter gardening, maintenance and public area up keep. This will be good preparation for spring when more groups will hopefully come on board.

There were a number of fires in the area over the Halloween period which was disappointing after all the work Dublin City Council had done to prevent the storing of bonfire material. All remnants of bonfires and general dumping are currently being cleared by the Parks Section and the Public Domain Section.

Whiteacre Park

The repair of the play area and replacement of play equipment has been completed and the general Whiteacre park area got a face lift with new planting and painting of the area. Dublin City Council has engaged a lot of the local residents with planting and cleaning projects around the park and are currently engaging the young people that live around the park with fun days and sports days. The Sports Development section and BRYR had a full week of programs in Whiteacre for the mid-term break which proved to be very successful. Waste management and the local area office are currently surveying the areas and houses to establish the compliance of waste management Bye-Laws. This is mainly being carried out on bin collection days. Currently waste enforcement is targeted at individuals that have accumulation of household waste and no obvious bin collection service. Dublin City Council are also issuing notice to all residents in the area not to be throwing food out for birds in public spaces as this attracts vermin and can also be considered illegal dumping.

<u>Shangan</u>

Snagging on the new houses in Shangan Avenue is nearly completed and hand over should follow soon after. A time line for this is not clear at the moment but it is expected that all properties will be handed over early in the New Year at the latest. Reports of antisocial behaviour around the Shangan Avenue and Shangan Green area over the Halloween weekend are being investigated by the Garda and Dublin City Council. All dumping and bonfire material is currently getting cleared by the Parks Section and Public Domain Section.

Coultry

Cleaning along with general repair work has started along Coultry Drive and Terrace during the Autumn with lots of residents getting involved, particularly the older residents. Residents that attended the planting course in Coultry Park also attended to lend a hand which proved very successful. The shop van space in Coultry Park received a certificate at the Tidy Town awards which the residents were delighted with. Dublin City Council is looking to display the cert in the space in recognition of all the hard work. Surveys are at an advanced stage in Coultry Gardens to alleviate the drainage and flooding problems in the area. A decision on this issue is at Senior Management level. It is hoped that the works will include resurfacing the area. Dublin City Council is committed to finding a speedy resolution to this problem. Waste management and the local area office are currently surveying the areas and houses to establish the compliance of waste management Bye-Laws. This is mainly being carried

out on bin collection days. Currently waste enforcement is targeted at individuals that have accumulation of household waste and no obvious bin collection service.

Longdale and Woodhazel

Residents are constantly active in cleaning the front gardens and the street outside each house and are now thinking of forming an action group to go into other areas to clean up and show how easy it is to get involved. Cafta have started engaging residents on Longdale with a view to preparing projects for the spring time. This is at an early stage at the moment. Waste management and the local area office are continuously surveying the areas and houses to establish the compliance with waste management Bye-laws. This is mainly being carried out on bin collection days. Currently waste enforcement is targeted at individuals that have accumulation of household waste and no obvious bin collection service.

Forrestwood and Sallowood

Cafta and the tenant engagement initiative are beginning to get a response from the residents here with more people looking to get involved. This has been a bit sporadic in the past as one side of Forrestwood achieved a gold award in the Tidy Towns and the other side is still a dumping black spot, so a concerted effort was made to work on all communal gardens during the summer time. Most complexes in the area have now got a representative for clean up initiatives. It is hoped that Forrestwood and Sallowood areas would work a lot better under the tenant engagement initiative.

Magenta Crescent

New street lighting has been installed in Magenta Crescent and new energy efficient bulbs were fitted to existing lights and the residents are delighted, especially the elderly as they felt vulnerable under poor lighting. There is a newly formed 1916 commemorative committee from which the residents want to mark the occasion in their local area next year. Dublin City Council has supplied the cleaning equipment and flowers for their clean up which is ongoing. The pedestrian crossing is still an on going issue.

3. Ballymun Town Civic Alliance

Economic Strategy

A draft 5 year economic plan has been completed. The plan was reviewed and discussed by the Economic sub-committee at on 6th Nov 2015. The committee provided input and feedback which will be incorporated into the plan and reviewed again before submission to the Civic Alliance.

Stimulating economic activity

Free Wi-Fi for Plaza – a license agreement has been agreed with Magnet Networks for the installation and provision of free Wi-Fi on the Plaza. Everything is now in place to go ahead with the installation.

The Plaza – a brief has been prepared to carry out a feasibility study on the Plaza. The objective of the study is to make it more user-friendly to increase usage on a daily basis which in turn might help the surrounding businesses – no update since last meeting.

Vacant Neighbourhood retail units – The Economic Development Officer now has access to all available units. A brochure has been produced to market each of the units. The current status of unoccupied Dublin City Council units is:

- Coultry Unit B T&C's agreed for a new café. Planning application required for change of use.
- Coultry Unit C & D require remedial works and will be available for let in Jan 2016.
- Shangan Court Unit 2 A formal expression of interest is pending from a kitchen appliance supplier.
- Sillogue Unit 2 T&C's have been offered to a barber-shop. Dublin City Council are awaiting acceptance
- Turnpike Santry Cross Unit 3 Pieta House have moved in temporarily while remedial works are carried out on Coultry NC.

Ballymun4Business

Next B4B meeting to be confirmed.

The Tolka Area Partnership (TAP) has offered the services of one of their Mentors Catherine Whelan to assist with the running of the B4B network. Catherine helps run and facilitate the TAP network and they have put some budget aside to help the B4B network. A meeting has been arranged with Catherine on Thursday 12th November 2015.

The date of the next Civic Alliance meeting is Thursday, January 28th 2016.

4. Safer Ballymun

The Safer Ballymun week was launched by Councillor Noeleen Reilly (Deputising for the Lord Mayor) and Assistant Commissioner John Twomey. Councillor Reilly welcomed everyone to the meeting and said Halloween was a testing time for the community with issues around anti-social behaviour and bonfires. Thankfully the Otherworld Festival has put paid to a lot of these issues and provides a safe and secure location to celebrate Halloween

Assistant Commissioner Twomey welcomed residents to the meeting and noted the importance of the community working in partnership with the agencies. He commended Sergeant Bernard Young.

And the Community Garda on the work they are doing in the area. The launch was followed with light refreshments and the Safety Meeting.

Mary Taylor gave a short presentation on the CCTV system in the area, explaining that there is approx. 99.5% availability of cameras at all times and that while the images are monitored locally, the network is repaired remotely. The Gardaí have a slave system in the Garda Station and can monitor/act upon any incidents that occur once they are reported

The next Safer Ballymun meeting is scheduled for 8th of December 2015.

The Safety Week was very well received in the community with great participation by local schools and Senior citizens. The Community Garda held a number of Safety talks in the Senior Citizen complexes and in a number of the local schools, with the largest one held in the Holy Spirit where the DSPCA, Dublin Fire Brigade, Dublin Bus and Garda gave a safety talk on their own organisation. The open day in the Garda station was very well attended. BRYR organised out games in the parks.

<u>Halloween</u>

Safer Ballymun would like to commend the work that was carried out by Dublin City Council staff in the lead up to and over the Halloween period.

5.Other significant updates

Civic Centre

Work has commenced on refitting the second floor so that all City Council staff in the Civic Centre will now be located together. It is hoped to move staff from the ground floor in December. This may necessitate closure of the public office for a few days.

Staff

There has been a number of staff changes in Ballymun – Niamh Reilly transferred to Finglas, Ciaran Mahony joined us from North Central, and as mentioned earlier, Brian Mongey is due to transfer shortly.

Modular Housing

As Councillors are aware part of the Poppintree 6 site has been selected for 22 modular housing units.

The public consultation sessions for the Issues Paper of the Ballymun Local Area Plan are being held in Ballymun Civic Centre during the following hours:


Walsh Road/Ferguson Rd Traffic Cell Management Study

Examination of the significant traffic issues in the area bounded by Mobhi Road / Home Farm Road / Drumcondra Road / Botanic Avenue has been underway for some time. The main issues are the difficulties experienced by residents due to rat running and pedestrians due to parking on footpaths. Existing restrictions, such as bans on right hand turns, while important, have proven to be insufficient.

/Several interim solutions have been examined but the complex nature of the problems has led to the conclusion that significant improvements will only be achieved through a Wider Area Traffic Cell Analysis of the area indicated in the map overleaf. This study, which will be prepared by consultants, will examine the issues and propose a series of integrated solutions across the study area.

The study brief is currently being prepared and tenders will be sought in mid November. The brief will include assessment of traffic conditions, traffic surveys and the development of options to address the identified problems. The final report, which should be available in early April 2016, will include costings for proposed solutions. Stakeholder consultation will be an integral part of the study and will include consultation with public representatives, local community, Gardaí and the emergency services.

Interim solutions will not be implemented during the course of this study as they would adversely affect the quality, accuracy and integrity of the wider area analysis. Also, none of the proposed interim solutions found broad based local acceptability.

With reference to the proposed grant of a lease of Unit 2, Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre, Ballymun, Dublin 11.

Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre is a mixed residential and commercial development at Sillogue Road, Ballymun, Dublin 11. The commercial/retail Units, no's 1-4 and the Community Office, are held by Dublin City Council by way of long lease.

The Chief Valuer has agreed terms for the proposed grant of a new lease of Unit 2, Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre to Keith Leonard & Paul Delahunty. The lease shall permit the use of the property for retail purposes or the business of a barber shop and hairdressing salon. The initial occupation will be by the way of a Works and Occupational Licence.

The subject unit, which has an area of 48.7 sq meters approximately, is shown outlined red and coloured pink, plus a right of way on foot over and along the service corridor shown coloured yellow, on Map Index No.SM-2015-0883, a copy of which is submitted with this report.

It is proposed to grant a Works and Occupational Licence and a Lease of Unit 2, Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre to Keith Leonard and Paul Delahunty subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. That the Works and Occupational licence shall commence on the 4th January 2016 (or as soon as practically possible on a mutually agreed date).
- 2. That the licence shall extend for a period of four months for the fee of €1, if demanded.
- 3. That the property shall be provided by the Council in its current shell condition and the applicants shall carry out all fit out works at their own cost, in accordance with the plans and specifications as agreed in writing with the Council's Architect prior to the commencement of the works.
- 4. That all fit out works and use of the property shall comply with all necessary statutory consents.
- 5. That the lease shall be for a term of one year & eight months, commencing four months after the commencement date of the Works and Occupational Licence. The

- lease shall permit the use of the property for retail purposes or the business of a barber shop and hairdressing salon
- 6. That in order to facilitate a business start up in the subject unit, the applicants shall pay in advance a rental payment of €7,000 (seven thousand euro) i.e. €875 (eight hundred and seventy five euro) per month for the first eight months of the lease term on the 4th January 2016.
- 7. That from 4th January 2017 the monthly rent shall be €1,000 (one thousand euro), payable semi-annually in advance by electronic transfer.
- 8. That the applicants shall be responsible for internally repairing and insuring the demise including all glass windows and doors.
- 9. That the applicants shall be responsible for the payment of rates, service charges (if and when applicable to the Superior Landlord currently Cluid Housing), building insurance, utilities, taxes and all other charges for the demised area.
- 10. That the applicants shall not assign or sublet the demise without prior written consent of the Landlord, Dublin City Council.
- 11. The applicants shall not carry out any structural alterations or erect any external signage without the prior written consent of Dublin City Council.
- 12. That the applicants shall have the right to use the service corridor for the disposal of refuse in bins and shall not at any time obstruct the service corridor.
- 13. That the applicants shall indemnify Dublin City Council against any and all claims arising from its use of the property. The applicants shall hold Public Liability Insurance (minimum of €6.5 million) and Employers Liability Insurance (minimum of €13 million) and contents insurance.
- 14. That the applicants will respect the right to quiet enjoyment of the residential units located above and to the rear of the property.
- 15. That the applicants shall insure that their use and occupation of the property complies with all necessary statutory consents.
- 16. That the applicants shall inform Dublin City Council in writing, six months prior to the lease expiry, of whether they wish to remain in occupation under a new lease (at market rental value at that time).
- 17. That the lease agreement shall contain covenants and conditions as normally contained in agreements of this type.
- 18. That the applicants shall be responsible for the payment of any Stamp Duty and VAT liability that may arise on the creation of the lease.
- 19. That each party shall be responsible for their own fees and costs incurred in this matter.
- 20. That this proposal is subject to Council approval.



With reference to the proposed grant of a 3 year licence for the use of an area at Poppintree Community Sports Centre, Balbutcher Lane North, Poppintree, Dublin 11.

Poppintree Community Sports Centre is a Community and Sports Facility located at Balbutcher Lane North, Poppintree, Dublin 11.

As part of the de-tennanting of the Ballymun flats a number of crèche and playgroup facilities agreed to relocate to the Poppintree Community Sports Centre. The Poppintree Early Education Centre Limited was formed following the amalgamation of these groups. The Chief Valuer has agreed terms for the proposed grant of a 3 year licence to Poppintree Early Education Centre Limited, for the use of an area at Poppintree Community Sports Centre, for the provision of a community crèche.

It is therefore proposed to grant a 3 year licence of an area at Poppintree Community Sports Centre, Balbutcher Lane North, Poppintree, Dublin 11, to the Poppintree Early Education Centre Limited, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. That the licenced property comprises a self contained crèche unit with outdoor playground, located on the ground floor of Poppintree Community Sports Centre, Ballymun, Dublin 11. The subject unit is shown outlined in red on the attached copy floor plan. The outdoor playground is shown outlined in blue and hatched pink.
- 2. That the licence shall be for a period of 3 years commencing on the 1st of January 2016.
- 3. That the licenced unit shall be used solely as a community crèche, on a non profit basis. A commercial licence fee of €30,000 per annum, shall be payable if the licenced unit is used for any other purpose.
- 4. That in order to assist the licensee becoming financially sustainable, the following abated licensed fees shall apply:

Year 1 - €1,000 per annum

Year 2 - €2,300 per annum

Year 3 - €3,640 per annum

5. That the licence fee shall be payable monthly in advance.


- 6. That the licensee shall be responsible for all outgoings associated with its use of the licensed property including inter alia rates, taxes and utilities. The unit comprises approximately 8.5% of the overall floor area of Poppintree Community Sports Centre.
- 7. That the licensee shall be responsible for the internal repair and upkeep of the licenced area.
- 8. That the licensee shall be responsible for fully insuring the premises and shall indemnify Dublin City Council against any and all claims arising from its use of the premises. The licensee shall take out and produce Public Liability Insurance in the sum of €6.7million and Employer Liability Insurance in the sum of €13 million for any incident with a recognised Insurance Company with offices in the State and the policy shall indemnify the Council against all liability as owner of the property.
- 9. That the licensee shall ensure that its use and occupation of the licensed area complies with all statutory consents.
- 10. That the licensee shall not assign or sublet the premises.
- 11. That the licensee shall not carry out any structural alterations without the prior written consent of the Licensor.
- 12. That the permitted business hours shall be 8.00am to 6.00pm, Monday to Friday.
- 13. That the licensee shall not erect any sign or advertisement on the premises without the prior approval of the Council.
- 14. That upon expiry of the licence, the licensee shall at its own expense remove all materials not belonging to Dublin City Council and shall leave the property clean and cleared to the satisfaction of the City Council.
- 15. That the licensee shall sign a Deed of Renunciation.
- 16. That the licence shall be subject to any other terms and conditions as deemed appropriate by the Council's Law Agent.
- 17. That each party shall be responsible for their own fees and costs in this matter.

The disposal shall be subject to such conditions as to title to be furnished as the Law Agent in his discretion shall stipulate.

The dates for the performance of any of the requirements of the proposed agreement may be amended at the absolute discretion of the Executive Manager.

No agreement enforceable at law is created or intended to be created until an exchange of contracts has taken place.

It is therefore proposed to dispose of the City Council's interest in this land to Ian Delaney subject to the following terms and conditions:


- 1. The purchase price shall be the sum of €500 (five hundred euro) in full and final settlement.

Naming of new development at Balbutcher Lane, Ballymun,
Proposed name Baile na Laochra. Balbutcher Lane, Ballymun, Dublin 11
"The town of the heroes"

The Housing Department have lodged a request to name a new housing project at Balbutcher Lane, Ballymun.

The site is bounded by Balbutcher Lane North, to the South by a proposed open space area, and to the East by a proposed development of 34 number housing units. Planning reference 4357/06 refers (map attached).

Permission as per planning reference 1142/07 is for the development of 22 housing units. It is proposed to construct 22 two story modular housing units on this site. It is proposed to name the estate "Baile na Laochra".

This name draws attention to the **Baile** (from both **Baile Bhúiséir /Balbutcher** and **Baile Cora/ Balcurris**) which are well established local placenames.

It also refers to the heroes of 1916 as does the local Irish school "Scoil and tSeachtar Laoch" and the new square "Cearnóg an tSeachtair Laoch"

The Heritage Officer considers the proposed name appropriate.

The name above is considered suitable and is recommended for adoption.
