**363 Councillor Greg Kelly**

This Area Committee invites two members of the St. Michael's Regeneration Board to make a presentation to the Area Committee about the future plans for the board. That South Central Area Committee invites Familibase in to make a presentation to the Area Committee on the proposal for a scrambler and horse park in Cherry Orchard.

That this Area Committee request the Area Manager to develop and implement a strategy and plan for the canal route between Suir Road Bridge and Tyrconnell Road, to include cleaning, enhanced lighting and pathway repairs.

**366 Councillor Paul Hand**

In light of the important social and sporting function they perform, commercial gyms should have an exemption or a reduction in commercial rates. This would enable small, community gyms to survive and thrive and provide countless social benefits to all communities. This area committee supports assisting our gyms in this way through reforming the Valuation Act and requests that the area manager write to the relevant minister outlining this motion and request that the minister give our motion due consideration and to reply with any plans they may have on this issue.

This Area Committee condemns the placing of names of the British Crown Forces and Irish Freedom Fighters on the same wall. This wall should be taken down and this Area Committee calls on the Glasnevin Trust to start the process of dismantling it. Everyone should have the right to remember and honour their dead, whether they were Irish republicans, members of British crown forces or civilians. That is catered for already within Glasnevin Cemetery with its many and diverse memorials and graves.

That this Area Committee request the Area Manager to develop and implement a strategy and plan for the green area at junction Marrowbone Lane/Pimlico, in particular to provide for adequate drainage of the footpath.

**369 Councillor Paul Hand**

That this Area Committee requests that An Post re-establish a post box near the Hilton Hotel on the Inchicore Road now that the road and path have been refurbished and most of the Centenary Celebrations carried out. This would benefit local residents in Inchicore, Kilmainham and Islandbridge. To this end we would request that this motion is forwarded to the CEO of An Post so that action can be taken.
