SOUTH WEST INNER CITY AREA OFFICE REPORT

New Public Park, Cork Street

A Part VIII Planning Application for a 0.6 hectare neighbourhood park on the site of the demolished Chamber Court and Weavers Court on Cork Street was agreed at the December City Council meeting. A preferred contractor has been selected and it is expected that enabling works (including archaeological investigations) will commence shortly with the main park works due to commence later this year.

New Public Park, Bridgefoot Street/Island Street

Proposals to develop a neighbourhood park adjacent to the existing allotments have been put on hold pending consideration of the site by the newly established Dublin City Council's Interdepartmental Active Land Management Group which is chaired by the Chief Executive.

St. Audeon's Park, High Street

St. Audeon's Park is included in the Liberties Greening Strategy. As part of the proposed improvements to High Street it is planned to enhance the area by improving accessibility, permeability and circulation throughout the park. Following agreement at the March Area Committee meeting a Part VIII planning application for the project was advertised on 18th March with a closing date for the receipt of submissions of 19th May. If the application is agreed it is expected that construction works will commence in early 2017.

Bluebell Cemetery

Improvement works to the path system in Bluebell Cemetery are due to be carried out in the next 2 weeks.

Kilmainham Civic Space

The Kilmainham Civic Space is due to be officially opened by an tArdmhéara on 1st June. Invitations have been issued to Councillors.

Pimlico

It is planned to upgrade the open space at Pimlico. The works, which will include the removal of the concrete pillars, relaying of the footpath, repair of the grassed area, painting of the plinth wall and additional planting, are due to commence at the end of May/beginning of June.

Re-roofing Programme

A programme to re-new the roofs in Thomas Court Bawn, School Street, Marrowbone Lane Flats, Meath Place, Braithwaite Street and South Summer Street has been completed. Works to the roof lights, chimneys and tank houses were included. Similar remedial work to the roof in the second block in Braithwaite Street has commenced whilst work to the roofs in Pimlico Terrace is scheduled for later this year.

Oliver Bond House

A preferred contractor has been selected for the upgrade of both playgrounds and the football pitch in Oliver Bond House.

Basin Street Flats

An application has been made to the DOE for funding to convert the remaining 24 bedsits in the complex into 12 x 1 bedroomed flats.

The Liberties Public Art Commission

A public art commission to the value of €75,000 is being provided by Fáilte Ireland to animate and enliven the route from High Street to James Street. The Commission envisages

a series of pavement pieces or decorative flagstones installed along the route marking connections to area's heritage, local community and culture, aspects defining the areas commercial character and traditions and/or modern and contemporary influences. The commissioning process, which is being undertaken by DCC Public Arts Office, has commenced with a deadline for initial expressions of interest (Stage 1) by 9th June. A second limited competition of shortlisted artists will take place in September and it is envisaged that the final commission will be installed in 2017.

Ceol at the Storehouse

Eileen Reid will perform at the Guinness Storehouse as part of Dublin City Council's Bealtine activities and continuing flagship older person's event locally.

Memory Lane Choir

The Memory Lane Choir are holding a sing along in the CCMA to mark Bealtaine. The Council are supporting the CCMA to promote the choir within the sheltered housing complexes and the three Alzheimer's centres in Dn.12.

Community Connect

Impact Day Volunteers from the business community together with local community will take on an enhancement project with residents of West Court complex off Basin Street on 19/05/16.

The High Road & Kilmainham Residents Association.

1916 Revisited a journey back in time; an exhibition of uniforms, medals, arms and ammunitions from the 1916 Rising will take place on the 3rd and 4th June in Inchicore Community Sports Hall from 10am to 4pm. Admission is free. Local school children will attend on Friday and the exhibition will be open to the general public on Saturday.

James St. Primary School.

Two classes will visit the National Memorial at Arbour Hill followed by a tour of IUNVA the Irish United Nations Veterans Association on 08/06/16.

Liberties 1916 Walk

This walk will take in sites of importance to the 1916 Rising in the Liberties area including The Mendicity Intuition, South Dublin Union, Marrowbone Lane, Watkins Brewery and other sites that featured prominently in 1916 before finishing at St. Catherine's Church Thomas Street for a cuppa. The event will take place on the 22/06/16 at 13.30hrs.

CRUMLIN AREA OFFICE REPORT

Outdoor gyms

The construction works for the installation of outdoor gyms in Bunting Park and Lansdowne Valley Park will commence in the next 10 weeks.

Brickfield Park

There is funding in place for the painting of railings at Brickfield Park and work will begin by the end of the month, weather permitting.

Stannaway Park

Approval has been received for the painting of railings, footpath repair and depot improvements at Stannaway Park. Works will commence by the end of the month, weather permitting.

Drimnagh Ladies Club

Drimnagh Ladies club has operated from Our Lady's Hall Mourne Road for over 45 years. The group has over 50 members and actively encourages new membership. To mark Bealtaine the Council in association with the Ladies Club are hosting the Carnation Theatre production of the Midwife, a play that looks at the role played by Cumann Na mBan during the Easter Rising. This will take place on Tuesday May 24th at 8:00Pm in Our lady's Hall. Tickets are available from the Ladies Club and the Crumlin Area Office. Entry is free.

St. Agnes's Active Retirement Association

St. Agnes's Active retirement are based in the Parish Centre in Crumlin. This group meet on a weekly basis and organise a great programme of events for older people. To mark Bealtaine the Council in association with the Active Retirement group are hosting a musical afternoon celebrating the Theatre Royal on 17th May at 2:30pm in the Parish Centre. This show celebrates the theatre royal through the photos and songs of many of those who performed there including Lena Horne, Danny Kaye, Jimmy O'Dea and Noel Purcell.

Bealtaine Festival

As part of Bealtaine events DCC & Ballyfermot Community Association welcomes Singer/Songwriter Mary Coughlan to present her One Woman Show, "The House of Ill Repute" which will take place at 8pm on 17th May in the Ballyfermot Community Civic Centre

Cherry Orchard Restorative Forum

Regular meetings are held to address issues across Cherry Orchard using the Restorative Practices Forum. Youth Services Providers have engaged with youth using Restorative Practices on scramblers, quads and horses issues with a view to planning an intervention.

Cherry Orchard Mid Summer Fair

The Cherry Orchard Mid Summer Fair will take place in various locations around Cherry Orchard on Friday and Saturday the 17th & 18th June respectively as part of the Cherry Orchard Restorative Forum.

That this Area Committee is concerned at the lack of public transport options for many residents in Chapelizod to visit nearby Ballyfermot. Unfortunately the 76 only serves a small portion of the South-West of Chapelizod. Therefore, the South Central Area Committee would request that Dublin Bus consider re-routing the 26 bus through Chapelizod, along the Lucan Road, then along the Kylemore Road and to then travel down the Ballyfermot Road to Palmerstown as this would cater for the many residents, elderly and otherwise in Northern and Eastern Chapelizod to be able to visit the nearest commercial centre and conduct their business. Therefore we request the Area Manager to forward this to Dublin Bus for their consideration.
