5046. Motion in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland

That Dubin City Council take full responsibility for funding, conducting and disseminating a 1) Transport Assessment and 2) Social Infrastructure Audit on the planned development of 655 units on the vacant lands on the Oscar Traynor Rd. That

- a) these assessment /audit be initiated as soon as possible
- b) this responsibility is detailed in any tender briefs/documentation with regard to the lands.
- c) DCC will use the resulting reports for each assessment /audit to inform the facility, amenity, public services, traffic and transport requirements for the development of the site so as to enable a sustainable, fully serviced urban community.
- d) plans be drawn up by DCC, where appropriate in conjunction with any developer that may win the tender, to address any deficits identified in each assessment/audit
- e) these plans operate in tandem with progress on the development so as to realise a sustainable, fully serviced urban community, to minimise disruption and knock on negative impacts to the local communities surrounding the vacant lands development.

We recognise that there were strong representations made by Councillors present on the ongoing dog litter situation in our city. In this regard we call upon DCC to place dog litter bins in suitable locations inside our parks within 50 metres of the entrance. For instance a possible suitable location would be inside St Anne's Park, Vernon Ave entrance. A dog litter bin 50metres inside St Anne's Park would allow for the disposal of dog dirt soon after the dog enters the park (when many dogs use the facility!!!) or for the disposal of a used bag on exit. After park closing time the entrance gates are locked at this location which deters fly tipping. There are other such suitable locations in this and other parks. DCC should meet members of the public who are prepared to bag their dog dirt half way and provide more disposal units.

5051. Motion in the name of Councillor Damian O'Farrell

That this Local Area committee acknowledges the presentation of DCC's Litter Management Plan at the April 2016 meeting of Dublin City Council. We recognise that there were strong representations made by Councillors present on the ongoing dog litter situation in our city. In this regard we call upon DCC to place a dog litter bin on the Bull Wall in a suitable location. There is no disposal facility in this area and I'm aware that the Bull Island Action Group (local voluntary group who clean this area once a month) disposes of many many filled dog litter bags. I believe that DCC should meet members of the public who are prepared to bag their dog dirt half way and provide a disposal unit at this location.

That this Local Area committee congratulates all who took part in the recent DCC initiative 'Team Dublin Clean-Up'

It was noted by the unit that operated along Clontarf Promenade that the shrubberies are major dirt collectors and their removal (trees to be left in situ) would greatly improve the cleanliness of the promenade. Also we note that a very large shrub area / tree which was causing problems (anti-social / dirt) was recently removed from the promenade opposite Hollybrook Road however a new shrubbery has recently been planted in its place and this seems to be counterproductive as far as keeping the area clean / safe is concerned.

Red Stables Market, St. Anne's Park

- Originally the market took place in the courtyard of the Red Stables. However, the resin surface in the courtyard, which is designed for pedestrian traffic, suffered greatly from the additional trader activity and footfall that the market generated. In addition, as the volume of traders and customers grew, pedestrian movement through the area was becoming problematic. Therefore, in order to give the market more space in which to operate, it was agreed to move the market into the park and that it would remain in the vicinity of the courtyard.
- It was envisaged that the Red Stables would be a place where the public could come and interact with artists working on projects and Dublin City Council Arts Section was responsible for allocating the studios. However, it was the experience of Parks and Landscape Services that the rooms were private and not privy to any contact with any interested visitor as artists wanted their privacy to work. Therefore, what was perceived as an opportunity for public interaction with artists in the Red Stables did not happen. In reality the Council were only landlords with no benefit to anyone visiting the park.
- There are currently no artists in residence. The artist's studios on the ground floor are now occupied by the relocated tearooms. The two former residential studios on the first floor will be available for a range of cultural/artistic uses when adequate fire safety and disabled access has been put in place. This work is the subject of the current part 8 planning process for the Red Stables.
- The market licence is for one day at the weekend and the current market operator has opted to continue to hold the market on Saturdays.
- It was previously reported to the Area Committee that the market will operate from 11.30 a.m. to 4 p.m. However, this has now been clarified with the market operator and the market will operate Saturdays from 10am to 4pm.
- All traders are subject to their contract with their Market Operator. The selling of counterfeit goods is illegal and is a matter for An Garda Síochána. Therefore, if it is suspected that such goods are being sold this should be reported directly to the Gardaí. If Dublin City Council receives any such reports they will also be forward to An Garda Síochána.

BUDGET FOR DUBLIN CITY SPORT & WELLBEING PARTNERSHIP

The Dublin City Sport and Wellbeing Partnership is a relatively new initiative formally launched in November 2015 and aligned to the Dublin City Council Sport and Recreation Section.

The Partnership is the merger of the former Dublin City Sports Network and the Sport Development team, it also encompasses the co-funded officer teams across boxing, cricket, rowing, rugby and soccer. It is Dublin City Council led but guided by a high level board.

The Partnership operates using the resources from the above elements – there was no additional funding or staff allocated to this new structure.

Funding comes via a variety of sources including:

- Sport Ireland: the partnership works under the local sports partnership model which means this funding is predetermined to cover a portion of wages, programming and administration.
- H.S.E.: this funding covers the salary of a Health Improvement Officer who works alongside the Partnership Sports Officers. It also covers the implementation of some public health programmes and initiatives.
- Young Peoples Facilities and Services Fund: - this funding covers a portion of the Sports Officer salaries and dictates where the officers work and who they work with.

In terms of staff working as part of the Partnership there are 18 Dublin City Sports Officers, 20 Co-funded Officers and an administration team of 7.

The merged budgets of the Dublin City Sports Network and Sport Development team are approximately 1.7m per annum.

16th MAY 2016

- **Cricket sessions** are being held in St Francis, Priorswood on Fridays from 1 – 2.30pm, Our Lady Immaculate NS, Darndale on Fridays from 10 – 11.30am and in Northbay Educate Together on Tuesdays from 10 – 11.30am.
- **Blue Way 10K Canoe Ireland Programme:** Blueway 10K is a fresh approach to canoeing and paddle sports, picture couch to 5k but on the water. Blueway 10K aims to take all the hassle out of paddling activity, allowing people quick and easy access to the water. This no nonsense workout will allow people to turn up in regular workout clothes, put on a buoyancy aid, grab a boat and paddle, and go for short intensive work out. In partnership with Edenmore Youth Centre Worker, John Daly, parents from Edenmore will be offered the opportunity to participate in this new on Monday and Wednesday mornings starting on 16th May in Howth Harbour. Once people have completed their workout schedule they will take part in a coordinated Blueway event on Saturday 20th August where they will meet up with other groups from around the country.
- **Paddles Up programme:** 8 young people from Kilbarrack and Edenmore will take part in a canoe Ireland initiative called Paddles Up. They will partner up with Cabra for Youth Group and will have weekly coaching sessions on the Royal Canal at Ashtown to prepare them for their level 1 & 2 awards. At the end of the programme the young people will be invited to a paddle event where they will join up with other participating groups.
- **Go for Life Games Introductory Programme:** A local Edenmore Group are taking part in an introduction to the games and activities that the Go for Life programme has to offer. Participants will be given instruction on how to set up and play lobbies, flisks and scidils. A second Go for Life games programme is taking place in St Benedict's Resource Centre in Kilbarrack on Tuesday mornings from 10.30 – 11.30am. A team of 12 people will go forward to represent the area in the Dublin City Council Regional Go For Life Games in Cabra Parkside on the 24th May and if successful go on to represent the Dublin City Council in the All Ireland Go for Life Games.
- **Scoil Eoin After-School Activity Programme:** This programme continues into May and June and will be supported by the DCC Sports Officer, providing them with resources, ideas and training opportunities. The programme will include fencing, Zumba, Ultimate Frisbee and tennis.
- **Rock Climbing NICAS Programme:** Eight young girls from Donnycarney Youth Centre will take part in a 6-week indoor climbing programme at Awesome Walls in Finglas. The 90 minute sessions on Thursdays will allow the participants to complete Level 1 and Level 2 of the National Indoor Climbing Award Scheme (NICAS).
- **Swim Fitness and Water Safety Programme:** On Tuesday evenings in Coolock pool, young people and volunteers the North Central Area will be improving their fitness levels while learning water safety. Some of the participants will be given the opportunity to attend a pool lifeguard training course (Level 1 & Level 2).
- **KYP Special Interest Activity Programme:** Young people from Kilbarrack Youth Project will be given the opportunity to take part in various activities on Monday evenings in May and June.
- **Community Walking Programme:** Two new eight week walking programmes have been set up in the area; one in Clontarf on Tuesday mornings at 10.15am at DCC Sports Grounds, Alfie Byrne Road and St Anne's Park on Wednesday mornings at 10.15am at the Red Stables. In association with Get Ireland Walking.
- **Fencing Club in Ard Scoil La Salle:** Following on from the TY fencing programme with the TY Class in Ard Scoil La Salle in Kilbarrack the programme is to be expanded with delivery of fencing during the P.E. classes and with the creation of an after-school fencing Programme on Mondays.

- **Aviva Stadium Tour:** The 5th and 6th class pupils of Scoil Fhursa in Kilmore West will be taking part in a tour of the Aviva Stadium on the 17th May at 10.30am which will also include a boxing training session. The 6th class pupils of Our Lady Immaculate in Darndale will take part in the tour and boxing training session on the 8th of June at 10.30am.
- **Boxing:** The pupils of Scoil Eoin in Kilbarrack will take part in Bronze StartBox classes on the 15th of June at 11am as part of their school Sports Week.
- **Rugby:** 6 week tag rugby programme taking place in St Pauls National School, Ayrfield
- **Schools Swimming Gala:** The final two sessions of the recent schools swimming programme will take place on the 19th & 20th May in Coolock Pool.
- **Macushla Dance & Creative Movement Programme:** Planned to start Tuesday 10th May, and will last 5/6 weeks for senior citizens at Carlton Hall, Marino. Time TBC.
- **Fairview Family Day:** Taking place on Saturday 21st May. The Sports Officers will be involved in organising and delivering some fun sports activities for all the family including outdoor volleyball and boules.
- **Bike Week:** Starting 13th June, the planning has now started for this citywide initiative. St. Anne's Park will host a BMX Trails day on Wednesday 15th June. Other programmes and events to be confirmed in the coming week.

**BELMAYNE TOWN CENTRE MAY 2016
DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL**

Background and review approach

The North Central Area Office with the Planning and Development Departments examined the development potential of the site designated as Belmayne town centre. The review process was carried out in the context of the adapted Belmayne Clongriffin Local Area Plan and its objectives, zonings and strategies.

The review process examined the high level options in relation to the disposal of the site, sought to provide more detail into the LAP plan for the site akin to a masterplan, consulted with DCC functional departments who are stakeholders, and also evaluated the wider macro-economic and property influences and factors.

Findings

Ownership split

The City Council is the owner of most of the land. However the corner site at Northern Cross / Malahide Road / Clarehall Avenue junction is in private ownership as is a narrow strip along a line parallel to Clarehall Avenue. Some negotiations may be required to either acquire this non DCC land and/or integrate its development optimally into the overall development of the site.

Zoning

The site is strategically designated as a Z14 zoned and a Strategic Development and Regeneration area and Key District Centre under the Draft Dublin City Council Development Plan 2016 – 2022.

Mixed use

A town centre of mixed use – amenity, office and business, open space, residential, retail, is identified in the LAP. The LAP envisages the completion of the town centre when the Belmayne/Clongriffin Main St has been achieved under earlier phases. It is estimated that it will not be available to public traffic until 2017 or 2018.

Requirement to complete Main St Belmayne Clongriffin

The completion of Main St – Clongriffin to Belmayne is a priority for the National Transport Authority.

Valuable site

The land is valuable and could realise a significant capital receipt for the City Council. The City Valuer recommends negotiation to realise the value of the front combined with DCC lands there.

Property market constraints currently

The property market has not fully recovered to pre-recession levels of activity. There are currently limitations on the availability of housing mortgages and limited demand for new apartments.

Conclusions

Given the current economic progress, it is considered that the site, at a key entrance junction to the city, has many opportunities for a positive and sustainable mixed use development with a good visual impact but the timing for the commencement of actions will be very important.

The timing will be critically influenced by the completion of the Main St with its transport advantages, the availability of capital funds for developers and mortgage seekers, construction costs and the capability of third parties to deliver the various elements of the mixed uses stated in the LAP.

It would be timely to review the Local Area Plan in 2016 given the level of development there since its adaption in December 2012 and assuming planning personnel are available.

Traffic and roads infrastructure should be critical success requirements. The City Council should liaise closely with the National Transport Authority to expedite infrastructure roads and traffic management improvements. There should be a high quality street frontage at Malahide Rd and Northern Cross junction similar in scale to the other side of the Malahide Rd.

National Cultural Institutions and the Neighbourhood Programme

Dublin City Council became a candidate for the European Capital of Culture 2020 designation in late 2014. A far reaching public consultation and a promotion of Dublin's cultural strengths and ambition characterised the bid process and the civic energy generated as well as the innovative programme outlined in the Bid Book have left a legacy of skills and new thinking.

Although not shortlisted, Dublin City Council had already set aside €1M to support the second round of the Bid in the Council annual budget 2016 and discussions of retaining this budget and reinvesting it strategically in Culture ensued. The City Arts Officer proposed to the Assistant Chief Executive and the CEO that the fund should be set to long term strategic goals i.e.

- (a) That any project or idea supported should be of such a quality and interest to the Members of Dublin City Council as to cause a desire to retain this budget for Culture in future years.
- (b) That the wide ranging consultations with citizens should continue.
- (c) That further investment in Culture should be leveraged because of this investment nationally and in Europe.
- (d) That Community organisations, businesses and cultural institutions could work together.
- (e) That the Projects should be of sufficient scale to leave a legacy of working closely with the National Cultural Institutions.
- (f)

Through further discussion and consultation with the Area Managers of Dublin City Council and subsequent meetings with Area Community Development Teams, City Council Libraries and the Arts Office, one of the large scale projects from Dublin's Bid Book was selected for feasibility study. The project proposed is that National Cultural Institutions (NCI's) including the Irish Museum of Modern Art, The Abbey Theatre, The National Museum, The Chester Beatty Library, The National Concert Hall, The National Gallery, The National Library, all of whom are located in Dublin, would form partnerships with local neighbourhoods in such a way that a high quality cultural initiative connecting the NCI and the Neighbourhood would result. This programme or initiative would seek to connect the local, national and international cultural ambition of Dublin as a Capital City while ensuring the development of local cultural capacity. The Department of Arts Heritage and the Gaeltacht (DAHG) convened the NCI's to discuss the project and the approach was wholly endorsed by all involved. DAHG are considering how best to support the project and may do so through financial assistance either Capital or Current Revenue.

It is proposed that each project is large scale and that programmes e.g. in schools or broader cultural initiatives e.g. in intercultural integration can be considered. In the first instance, 600K will be available for projects across the five areas and a Project Manager for each Area will be appointed by Tender. An overall coordinator Iseult Byrne has been appointed and local consultations in each Area have begun.

An Advisory Group has now been formed in each City Area and National Cultural Institutions have assigned themselves singly or in pairs as follows

The 5 National Cultural Neighbourhood Project groupings are:

Central Area is collaborating with the National Library of Ireland

South Central is collaborating with The Chester Beatty Library & the National Concert Hall

South East is collaborating with The National Gallery of Ireland

North West is collaborating with The National Museum of Ireland and The Abbey Theatre

North Central is collaborating with The Irish Museum of Modern Art.

Each Advisory Group consists as indicated above of The Area Community Development Team, The Arts Office, City Libraries, and a National Cultural Institution(s). Local consultations such as those undertaken in the Bid process have begun in each City Area to aid project development and Neighbourhood theme selection.

Each Advisory Group has met in facilitated session to agree their working purpose and to set out criteria for project selection.

The criteria agreed for selection of projects vary slightly in each of the Areas, but in all cases they require that the project:

- Contains Meaningful Participation and active engagement by residents of the Area
- Is Impactful – Personally, Locally, Nationally and Internationally
- Is Inclusive & Accessible (intellectually, physically & virtually)
- Is Ambitious & Challenging, Innovative & of high quality
- Is relevant (to the community, the area, the institution and to DCC)
- Is Feasible and Realistic

It is proposed that projects will be developed through a process of consultation and collaboration and also that significant progress in implementation occurs during 2016.

Through a consultation process involving community meetings and facilitated sessions supported by the Community Development Team, A community organisation (s) will be identified as partner in the project or programme proposed. Once the idea, community partner and implementation time line is set, regular updates will be provided to the Area Committee

With reference to the proposed grant of a long lease of Retail Unit No. 4 in the Darndale Belcamp Village Centre, Dublin 17.

By way of Indenture of Lease dated 3rd February 2006 Dublin City Council demised Retail Unit No. 4 in the Darndale Belcamp Village Centre, Dublin 17 which said unit is more particularly shown coloured pink (excluding hatched area) on Map Index No. SM2016-0125 to Sonjac Catering Limited for a term of 35 years from 17th December 2004 subject to an initial annual rent of €500 and subject to rent reviews at the end of every fifth year. The current passing rent is €15,000 per annum effective from 18th December 2014.

Peter Di Lucia the owner of Sonjac Catering Limited has applied to Dublin City Council to take a longer leasehold interest in Retail Unit No. 4 in the Darndale Belcamp Village Centre, Dublin 17 together with an additional portion to the rear thereof which is more particularly hatched blue on Map Index No. SM2016-0125.

The Council's Chief Valuer has agreed terms and conditions with Peter Di Lucia and Sonjac Catering Limited for a longer leasehold interest in Retail Unit No. 4 in the Darndale Belcamp Village Centre, Dublin 17 subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. That the lessee currently holds the area shown coloured pink on Map Index No. SM2016-0125 (excluding hatched area) from Dublin City Council by way of Indenture of Lease dated 3rd February 2006 for a term of 35 years from 17th December 2004.
2. That the lessee has constructed an extension to the rear of the subject property.
3. That the overall premises now to be leased comprise 129 square metres or thereabouts and is more particularly shown coloured pink and hatched blue on Map Index No. SM2016-0125.
4. That the lessee will surrender their leasehold interest as outlined above and will be granted a lease of the area shown coloured pink and hatched blue on Map Index No. SM2016-0125, for a term of 99 years, subject to the payment of a capital premium of €175,000 (one hundred and seventy five thousand euro), and a nominal rent of €1 per annum (if demanded), with five year rent reviews linked to changes in the Consumer Price Index.
5. That the lessee shall pay any charges which they are liable for under the relevant legislation and shall clear all outstanding rent, rates and taxes (if any) on the property prior to the completion of the disposal.
6. That the above proposal is subject to satisfactory proof of title.
7. That each party shall be responsible for their own fees.
8. That this proposal is subject to the necessary consents and approvals being obtained.
