DUBLIN SOUTH CENTRAL JPC MEETING

A reminder that the Dublin South Central JPC Meeting is scheduled for next Monday the 24th October in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 2.30pm.

Visit to Cherry Orchard Equine Centre for Councillors

The Manager of the Equine Centre recently gave a presentation to the Area JPC Parks Health and Safety Sub Committee. During the presentation the Manager invited Councillors to visit the centre. The Councillors present at the meeting agreed that such a visit would be a worthwhile exercise. It is now proposed to arrange a site visit to the equine centre for

Councillors. The visit will take place on Friday 11th November at 11am subject to the agreement of the Area Committee.

SOUTH WEST INNER CITY AREA OFFICE REPORT

New Public Park, Cork Street

A Part VIII Planning Application for a 0.6 hectare neighbourhood park on the site of the demolished Chamber Court and Weavers Court flats on Cork Street was agreed at the December 2015 City Council meeting. Enabling works (including archaeological investigations) were completed in July. Tenders for the main park works have been invited and will be evaluated next month. It is expected that the park will be completed by summer 2017.

Dolphins Barn

Works to create a pop-up linear park in the area between the new boundary wall to the rear of the houses at St. James Terrace and the public footpath was completed in September. The cost of these works is provided for in the South Central Area Discretionary Fund 2016. A consultant has been appointed to prepare a Public Realm Improvement Plan for Dolphins Barn. The cost associated with the plan is also provided for in the Discretionary Fund. It is expected that community workshop(s) will be held next month.

Crane Street/Sugar House Lane

It is planned to enhance pedestrian access along this important and busy tourist route. The works include the widening of the existing footpaths and the narrowing of the carriageway. Following agreement at the June Area Committee meeting a Part 8 planning application for the project was advertised on 22nd June. A report in relation to the Part 8 planning application will be prepared for the November City Council meeting. If the application is agreed construction is likely to commence early next year with a works period of 3 to 4 months.

Newmarket

A Public Realm Improvement Plan for Newmarket Square and its environs is substantially complete. The Plan describes, supports and guides the implementation of improvements to enhance the use and attractiveness of the area. A report in relation to the plan was presented at July's Area Committee meeting whilst it is expected that agreement will be requested at next month's meeting to initiate the Part 8 planning process.

Francis Street and Meath Street

South Central Area Office is working to enhance these commercial streets with a programme of pavement repair, greening initiatives and enhanced cycle parking. A number of businesses have also expressed interest in taking part in the Shopfront Improvement Scheme. The Council's initiatives support the wide number of small businesses active on these streets.

Pimlico

The upgrade of the open space at Pimlico was substantially completed in September. The works included the removal of the concrete pillars, new lighting and the relaying of the footpath.

High Street

As part of the Liberties Greening Strategy a series of planters were installed in High Street on 16th September. Further planters are due to be located here at the end of October.

Thomas Abbey, South Earl Street

Works to create a new allotment site at South Earl Street, Dublin 8 are now complete. The site, known as Thomas Abbey or Meath Market, has its entrance between nos.12A and 13 South Earl Street. The site is designated as a National Monument and, in order to protect any underground archaeology, the surface area has been covered with a geotextile layer.

The site includes 12 x 30 sq. m allotment plots and 5 smaller beds. It should be noted that all allotment plots will be constructed as raised beds and that the existing surface will not be disturbed. The project will also include a compost storage area, water butts, timber benches and a storage shed.

Re-roofing Programme

The renewal of the roofs in Thomas Court Bawn, School Street, Marrowbone Lane Flats, Meath Place, Braithwaite Street and South Summer Street has been completed. Works to the roof lights, chimneys and tank houses were included.

Similar remedial work to the roof in Pimlico Terrace commenced on 18th July and is due to finish this month. This will complete the programme.

Oliver Bond House

The upgrade of both playgrounds and the football pitch in Oliver Bond House commenced last month and is due to be completed on 14th October. The cost of these works is provided for in the South Central Area Discretionary Fund 2016.

Ceannt Fort, Mount Brown

Following a series of meetings agreement has been reached with local residents for the refurbishment of the play area at Ceannt Fort. It is expected that this work will be carried out later this year.

Thomas Street Renewal

A programme of repaving work on the south side of Thomas Street will be completed by the end of October, meaning that the planned scope of work envisaged under the Thomas Street-James Street QBC programme will be largely completed. Outstanding elements include new heritage-style street lighting on Thomas Street and James Street and additional planters at locations along Thomas Street, both of which will be installed by year end. The completed work will represent an approx. €4m investment by Dublin City Council on this route.

Private Sector Investment: Shopfront Improvements

Dublin City Council's Shopfront Improvement Scheme 2016 has supported 16 no. projects in the main commercial streets of The Liberties this year. The scheme has encouraged building renewal, shopfront improvements and good practice signage and advertising. The Area Office has made grants to the value of c. €35,000 in 2016 supporting an estimated overall spend of c. €120,000 by private sector partners.

The most high-profile refurbishment on Thomas Street to date has been the restored Arch of Chadwick's Builders Providers, which was supported by both the Council's Shopfront Improvement Scheme (in 2015) and the Built Heritage Investment Fund. Work has also recently begun on two major refurbishment of office property on Thomas Street: 10-13 Cornmarket, which is being refurbished by HSE for its own use, and 138-140 Thomas Street (Emmet House) which is being remodelled and refurbished for landmark office use.

New Children's Playground – Stannaway Park

A new children's play area in Stannaway Park is intended to be created. The play area will cater for young children aged between 2 and 7 years of age and it is expected that the works will be carried out and completed before the end of 2016.

This small play area will be natural in style to blend in with the grassland of the existing park. Play features will be constructed of natural materials and will be set into the landscape within gentle mounded forms. Seating will be provided as part of the works.

Improvement works at Cashel Avenue and Captains Avenue

Improvement works at Cashel Avenue and Captains Avenue, consisting of new parking zones, new footpaths and a plinth wall surrounding the green, have gone to tender. Works should commence in November 2016 with a completion date of December 2016. These works will be funded from the South Central Area Discretionary Fund 2016.

Brickfield Park

Works have begun on the all weather pitch in Brickfield Park involving erecting a temporary fencing, establishing an access road and stripping the soil at Brickfield Park. Whilst construction works at this time of year are very much weather dependent, it is expected that the project will be completed by March 2017.

Young at Heart Dance:

The annual Young at Heart Dance for the senior citizens of Dublin 12 takes place on Tuesday 25th October at 8pm in the Transport Club on Clogher Road. It promises to be a great night with music provided by the [Garda Band](#).

Cycle Stands

Cycle stands are currently being installed at a number of locations in Crumlin Village.

Ballyfermot Dementia Choir

Funding has been secured for the formation of a Choir in the Ballyfermot/Chapelizod area that supports persons with Dementia and their carers. There has been great interest from both areas and meetings are currently being held to secure practice areas, transport and a choral director with experience in this type of Choir.

SCA Network Groups

Meetings have been held for South Central Area Mens Network and Environmental Groups Network. It is envisaged that these groups will share knowledge and experiences, support each other, advocate for resources and projects across the area and seek to address issues affecting the South Central area.

It is disgraceful that a bank that has received billions in state aid would close down a registered not for profit company that is promoting human rights at home and abroad. Furthermore, this area committee requests that we write to the CEO of Bank of Ireland with the contents of this motion outlining our opposition to the actions they have taken.

Ballyfermot is being choked to death by traffic. An air quality report is also needed here as we have to live with the effects of traffic seven days a week.

The removal of funding will result in a loss of services in the area and also the loss of 2 jobs.

Road resurfacing works can only be carried out on the South Circular Road after 19.30hrs when the evening peak traffic flow subsides. The noisiest aspect of the work is completed before 23.00hrs. Works are permitted after 23.00 but the noise issue is at a lower level. This is a citywide policy.

In general, Dublin City Council's Roadworks Control Directive sets out the Council's requirements with respect to road works and details the restrictions on the timings of said works. Each road/street is graded according to its importance as a strategic traffic route. South Circular Road is an impact 4 road which means road works are permitted between 19.30hrs to 23.00hrs (Mon – Wed), 21.00hrs to 23.00hrs (Thurs & Fri) and 09.00hrs to 23.00hrs (Sat, Sun and Public Holidays).

**Report recommending the adoption of a pilot scheme for Choice Based Lettings in
Tyrone Place (Inchicore), Bernard Curtis House, Bluebell Road and Huband Road
(Bluebell)**

Introduction

The Housing Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2009 gives Local Authorities powers to include a system of Choice Based lettings in their Allocation Scheme. Choice Based lettings is widely used in the U.K and is particularly successful in areas with units which prove difficult to let. It is widely accepted that some of Dublin City Council's housing stock is located in less desirable areas. Over the years the Area Housing Managers have regularly raised the issue of the difficulty in allocating units in these less desirable estates. When vacancies arise in these areas strict adherence to current allocations process can be very lengthy. Long term vacant properties are easy to identify and pose a higher risk of being vandalised and in some cases can put adjacent houses and families at risk to the same vandals. There is also a loss of revenue to the Council.

It is proposed to introduce choice based lettings on a pilot basis in two areas, one complex in Inchicore (Tyrone Place) and three complexes in Bluebell (Bernard Curtis House, Bluebell Road and Huband Road). These areas have been identified as areas with very high refusal rates. Vacancies in these complexes have been offered out in accordance with the Scheme of Priorities but are constantly being refused by those applicants near the top of the list. If a choice based lettings had been used in these cases and persons had been invited to express their interest these units could have been allocated much more quickly.

Advantages of Choice Based Lettings.

- It empowers people to make decisions over where they live and exercises choice.
- Helps create sustainable communities and encourages the effective use of Council stock
- Reduce the amount of anti-social behaviour in the area.
- Allows a certain amount of choice to applicants who may be in lower position on the list and would not be reached under the present Allocations Scheme but would be happy to reside in these areas.
- Reduces the lengthy allocations process.
- Properties can be allocated quickly, thus minimising the loss of revenue through rent.

CHIOCE BASED ALLOCATIONS

Procedure Proposed

- Properties that become available for re-let in the above named complexes will be advertised in the Local Area Office and clinics.
- Expressions of interest will be invited and applicants will be asked to register their interest with the Area Housing Manager or Project Estate Officer in the relevant local area office.
- There will be a timeframe for applicants to register their interest.
- If a number of applicants express an interest in the same property, the final offer will be to the applicant deemed to have the highest need (highest position on the list and most suitable family size).
- All offers of accommodation will be subject to the usual estate management checks.
- In the case of transfer applicants only tenants with a clear rent account will be considered.

I request that the members of the South Central Area Committee approve the introduction of a pilot system for choice based lettings in Inchicore and Bluebell, as listed above.

Report on Halloween clean up in the South Central Area

The South Central Area Office provided a coordinated approach across a number of different units in the lead up to and during the Halloween period. In the week leading up to Halloween, our Public Domain Unit (PDU) and Housing staff actively built up intelligence and information concerning the stockpiling of material across the area. On Wednesday 28th October, the PDU began collecting materials using one truck while on Friday 30th October, two trucks were used. During both days, assistance was provided by the Public Order Unit of An Garda Síochána. A significant haul of materials containing hundreds of pallets and tyres was located on 30th October in an abandoned warehouse in the Dublin 8 area.

Over the weekend (Saturday, 29th to Monday 31st) , Area Housing Managers, Project Estate Officers, the Public Domain Unit and Area Office staff kept in regular contact with each other in order to identify areas of concern and to facilitate the removal of bonfire materials. They also liaised closely with staff from Housing, Waste Management, Parks and Dangerous Buildings as well as An Garda Síochána.

Private waste contractors along with staff from Parks and Waste Management assisted in the removal of bonfire materials. Although the exact amount of materials taken away over the Halloween period is still being calculated, the figures below detail some of the materials removed.

It is estimated that **150 tonnes** of waste and bonfire material was removed over the Halloween period by Public Domain staff from South Central Area which significantly reduced the potential for substantial bonfires to occur in the area.

- Derelict private site at Grand Canal Place (14 Trucks plus 2 Bin Lorries)

Marathon Kids is a citywide running programme developed to encourage 6th class pupils to embrace healthy, active lifestyles. The aim of the programme is to inspire children to run; and over 8 weeks accumulate the equivalent distance of a Marathon – 26.2 miles! Resource booklets have been given to all pupils to assist with motivation and learning.

DCC Sport & Wellbeing Partnership have teamed up with Fingal County Council to build on the very successful programme rolled out by Fingal in 2015, which saw 22 primary schools and over 600 kids take part in this unique event. The 2016 programme commenced in September (with many schools from the SCA taking part) and will climax in a ‘final mile’ event & celebration to be held in the National Sports Campus, Abbotstown, on Sunday November 20th.

Late Night Leagues

The DCSWP Sports Officer is working with the FAI Soccer Development Officer and the local Gardaí from both Kevin St. and Kilmainham Garda Stations to run a 4-week local soccer competition in St. Catherine’s Sport Centre on Monday nights for both 12 to 15 year olds & 16 to 19 year olds. The programme commenced on Monday 7th November. A second 3-week Late Night League Programme was scheduled to commence on the 10th of November on the pitch in Basin Lane from 6pm to 8pm. Representatives will travel to Irishtown Stadium in Ringsend for the Citywide Finals Night on Friday December 9th.

Late Night League Programmes will also run in Clogher Road Sports Centre and Ballyfermot Sports & Fitness.

Safeguarding 2 (Children’s Officer Course)

The DCSWP Sports Officer will be facilitating an open Safeguarding 2 course (Children’s Officer) which will be taking place on Wednesday 23rd November from 6:30pm to 9:30pm in Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex. The course is open to all adults involved in the running and assisting of young people’s activities but to attend participants must hold a current Safeguarding 1 Certificate.

Safeguarding 3 (Designated Liaison Persons Course)

The DCSWP Sports Officer will be facilitating an open Safeguarding 3 course (Designated Liaison Persons) on Thursday November 17th from 6:30pm to 9:30pm in St. Catherine’s Sport Centre, Marrowbone Lane. The course is open to all adults involved in the running and assisting of young people’s activities but to attend participants must hold a current Safeguarding 1 Certificate.

TULSA Programme South City Family Support Services

The DCSWP Sports Officer is working with the South City Family Support Services TULSA to help build resilience for a group of young people aged 8 to 12 years of age and allow them find their voice. The group is taking part in a 12-week Water Confidence / Snorkelling Programme which takes place in Crumlin Swimming Pool on Tuesday afternoons from 3pm to 4pm. This Programme runs until December.

Teen Gym - Introductory Programme

The DCSWP Sports Officer with the support of the St. Catherine's Gym staff will organise another four week block of Teen Gym sessions for new participants, which will commence on Saturday 3rd December. This introductory programme is held on Saturday afternoons after the gym is closed to the public. The teens are given exclusive access to equipment and instructor supervision.

Once teens have completed these four weeks they may then use the gym after school on weekdays and up to 6pm daily during the school holidays. We constantly have new teens signing up for this programme and we have also retained a large number of teens who have progressed from Teen Gym to a full gym membership.

The cost of Teen Gym is €2 per session and is open to any teen from the age of 13 – 16 years.

Teen Gym also operates every Wednesday & Thursday in Clogher Road Sports Hall (St. Kevin's College)

EPIC (Empowering Young People in Care) Team Building Event

A team of three DCSWP Sports Officers will be working with EPIC's Advocacy Officer in providing an adventure / team building day for the youth committee group of 20 teenagers on Saturday 19th November. The group will be travelling to Lough Crew for the day to take part in a range of activities.
