479 Councillor Tina MacVeigh

Noting:

- the historic importance of the Iveagh Markets;
- the lack of community amenities in the Liberties Village;
- the length of time the Markets have remained undeveloped and the contribution this makes to the severe dereliction of the area of special character of John Dillon Street and surrounds, this Area Committee requires that Dublin City Council should :

- 1) Fulfil its own mission to tackle dereliction and take back responsibility for the development of the Iveagh Markets including a consideration of acquiring the building if necessary/possible;
- 2) Commit and secure funding to develop the building within a two years as a central hub for community, cultural, social enterprise, tourism and heritage activities in the Liberties.

This redevelopment of Iveagh Markets should be addressed urgently as it affects the development of the surrounding area and impacts negatively on local communities.

We also agree to forward this motion, if agreed, to the next meeting of Dublin City Council for consideration'.

480 Councillor Daithí Doolan

This Committee commends the residents of Tyrone Place on the recent report into dampness in the flats. That Dublin City Council compiles and publishes, within 8 weeks, a report outlining the best option for Tyrone Plane. The report will include exploring the options of DCC accessing finance to carry out refurbishment of the flats or detenanting the flats and redeveloping the site.

481 Councillor Greg Kelly

This Area Committee asks the Council to have the laneway at the rear of Balfe Ave, Walkinstown (Entrance opposite the Up's A Daisy Crèche on Somerville Park.) to be concreted. The surface of the lane way is very uneven and the residents in the area are quite elderly and I feel this is an accident waiting to happen. This laneway is also attracting a lot of dumping and if it is concreted also it would make it easier to try and keep clean.

482 Councillor Paul Hand & Councillor Pat Dunne

That this Area Committee supports the ongoing work of Addiction Response Crumlin and commends all the staff there in providing necessary services throughout the Dublin 12 area. Furthermore this Area Committee supports the continued presence of ARC at their current

premises on the Crumlin Road and hope that they can secure their long term future at this location. To this end, we request that on agreeing this Motion this Area Committee write to the following Ministers and Government Departments to request a grant so that ARC can purchase their current home as outlined in their proposal document which is to accompany the letter to the relevant bodies.

483 Councillor Tina MacVeigh

This Area Committee supports the occupation of Apollo House by housing activists and calls on Dublin City Council management to implement the following motion agreed at the city council meeting on 10th November 2014:

That this Council open an 'Unused Properties Register'. The owners of private properties that have been unused/ empty for a period of more than six months (as per CSO Census 2011 and other official statistics) will be required to register their intention for use with Council. Where these properties remain idle for a period exceeding six months of registration date or where Council is not satisfied with intended use, by the powers granted to it under Section 213 (2) (A) of the Planning and Development Act (2000), this Council will immediately requisition these properties for immediate use as emergency housing, paying no more than a nominal transaction fee to the owner.

484 Councillor Daithí Doolan

That this South Central Area Committee commends those involved in taking action to provide essential homeless accommodation in Apollo House. We urge DRHE to work with the organisers to ensure this accommodation is sustainable and supported.

485 Councillor Greg Kelly

This Area Committee calls on the Area Manager to start the process of installing Smart Bins in Dublin South Central. These bins should be the same used by Dun Laoghaire, which have proven to be a success. The bins should be used in busy retail areas to start, with a plan to install them throughout the area.

486 Councillor Paul Hand

That this Area Committee notes with concern that local drug and alcohol projects have not had any funding increases in nearly a decade (in fact they have had their funding hacked by nearly 50% in the same period), despite the fact that front line services have been seriously stretched in the intervening period. To improve social services locally and nationally we request that the Minister for Communities and the National Drugs Strategy increase funding by at least 10% to all locally funded projects through the HSE and to all Regional and Local Drugs and Alcohol Task Forces nationally by at least the same amount. To this end we request the Area Manager write to the Minister with the contents of this motion.

487 Councillor Daithí Doolan

This Area Committee strongly condemns the recent attack on building workers in Cherry Orchard and we urge the Gardaí and others to work with Cooperative Housing Ireland to ensure adequate protection is provided by Gardaí for the duration of the construction of the 72 social units of housing.

488 Councillor Greg Kelly

This Area Committee calls for the inspection of the heating system in Canal View Apartments, Bluebell, Dublin 12. The heating system keeps failing for a number of tenants and some have waited up to 2 weeks over Christmas to get them fixed. If there is a fail found in the system DCC should do what it can to get it repaired as a matter of urgency.

SOUTH WEST INNER CITY AREA OFFICE REPORT

St. Teresa's Gardens

Phase 1 of the St. Teresa's Gardens Regeneration Masterplan is now complete following the demolition of the 6 blocks on the Eugene Street side of the site. The refurbishment of 2 blocks at the front of the complex is also complete. There are currently 3 occupied flats in the 4 remaining blocks awaiting demolition. Tenders are being prepared at present to demolish the 2 rearmost vacant blocks. The football and boxing clubs are expected to move

into new ground floor premises in the front refurbished block in December. Enabling works for the building of 34 houses and 16 apartments commenced earlier this summer. Tenders documents are due to be issued in quarter 2 2017 with a view to the construction of the new dwellings starting in quarter 3 next year. Precinct Improvement Works in the area between the refurbished blocks are due to commence in early 2017. This will include a small playground, plaza, additional parking and electronic gates.

Dolphin House

A part VIII planning application was approved at the October 2014 City Council meeting for demolition, new build and refurbishment at Dolphin House (phase 1). A total of 96 existing flats will be replaced by 100 new units. The demolition of the 2 'canal blocks' was completed earlier this year whilst the new build and refurbishment commenced on 17th October.

The refurbishment of the 'long blocks' will be phase 2 of the project. A site at the rear of the football pitch has been identified for older persons apartments. Planning permission was granted to Fold Housing Association in November for 42 units of this type of accommodation together with a community centre. Construction (subject to possible planning appeal) is likely to start in early 2017. It would be the intention to transfer the existing tenants in Dolphin Park to the new dwellings. Dolphin Park, which consists of 44 bedsits, would then be demolished to allow for new housing to be developed on the site.

New Public Park, Cork Street

A Part 8 Planning Application for a 0.6 hectare neighbourhood park on the site of the demolished Chamber Court and Weavers Court flats on Cork Street was agreed at the December 2015 City Council meeting. Enabling works (including archaeological investigations) were completed in July. Tenders for the main park works are being evaluated at present. It is expected that the park will be completed by summer 2017.

Dolphins Barn

A consultant has been appointed to prepare a Public Realm Improvement Plan for Dolphins Barn. The cost associated with the plan is provided for in the 2016 Discretionary Fund. A very well attended community workshop took place in St. Andrews Community Centre on 28th November.

Crane Street/Sugar House Lane

It is planned to enhance pedestrian access along this important and busy tourist route. The works include the widening of the existing footpaths and the narrowing of the carriageway. A Part 8 planning application was agreed at November City Council meeting with construction likely to commence early next year with a works period of 3 to 4 months.

Newmarket

A Public Realm Improvement Plan for Newmarket Square and its environs is substantially complete. The Plan describes, supports and guides the implementation of improvements to enhance the use and attractiveness of the area. A report in relation to the plan was presented at July's Area Committee meeting whilst a part 8 planning application is being finalized at present.

Francis Street

A consultant has been appointed to facilitate the preparation of a Part 8 planning application for the Francis Street Environmental Improvement Scheme. Stakeholder meetings are due to take place in early 2017.

Ceannt Fort, Mount Brown

Following a series of meetings agreement has been reached with local residents for the refurbishment of the play area at Ceannt Fort. It is expected that this work will be carried out in mid December weather permitting.

Michael Mallin House

Works to convert 4 bedsits into 2 x 1 bedroomed units are due to commence on 12th December with an expected completion date of March 2017. Similar work is ongoing in Basin Street to convert 8 bedsits into 4 x 1 bedroomed units.

Kilmainham Inchicore Network

The Kilmainham Inchicore Network facilitates the economic, social, cultural and environmental development and enhancement of the Kilmainham and Inchicore district. Since the end of October 2016, there have been seven meetings of the Network. These have been public meetings open to active citizens asking them what their main issues are in relation to development of the area. The meetings have been attended by between 75 and 20 persons, held in various locations across Inchicore and Kilmainham (including Inchicore College, Richmond Barracks, Hilton Kilmainham, Oblate Campus and a vacant shop unit in Inchicore Village).

Crumlin/Kimmage/South Inner City Community Update December 2016

The Community & Social Development Team has recently being reassigned across the South Central Area to better reflect the electoral boundaries. Pat Teehan will head the Crumlin/Kimmage/South Inner City Team. We would ask for your patience while we settle our teams into their new roles, areas and responsibilities, meet new groups and make the connections necessary for the smooth running of projects in the area.

Residents Groups

We are supporting the residents of various areas to start/restart Residents/Community Groups in order to support areas in environmental improvements, deal with issues, support family/youth projects etc across the area.

Dolphin House & Dolphin's Barn

We are working with the residents of Dolphin House to develop a programme to photographically document the regeneration of Dolphin House. It's hoped to have resident participation in the capturing the development in photographs and put together an exhibition to show the transformation.

A reading of "A Christmas Carol" will take place in Our Lady Of Dolours will take place on 18th Dec at 2pm by the Back Of The Pipes Residents Association.

Romanian Cultural Day

Romanians in Ireland organised a full day of traditional songs and dance in the F2 Centre including traditional costumes, products and crafts and amazing Romanian food.

Older Persons Christmas Celebrations

A number of Christmas Parties across the Crumlin/Kimmage/Liberties area are being supported by community staff including a Christmas dinner with music and presents for the elderly neighbours of the Guinness Storehouse which will be held in the Storehouse and will cater for 60 -70 residents from the locality. The event will be attended by Cllr. Ray McHugh on behalf of the Lord Mayor of Dublin on the 14/12/16 at 12.00hr

LECP Consultation

Dublin City Council and the two SICAP implementers have completed their work on the LECP Consultation. New plans have been drawn up with specific responsibilities for each

implementer and Dublin City Council. A number of collaborative projects have been agreed and will be implemented in 2017.

Liberties Schools

Eric Dempsey, noted ornithologist is delivering workshops to 4 schools in the Liberties Area in association with Dublin City Council community staff.

Ceannt Fort

Work has begun to enable the resident of Ceannt Fort to celebrate the centenary of their housing estate.

Christmas Tree Lighting

All Christmas Tree lighting across the area have been supported and attended by community staff.

Community Grants 2017

Work has been completed locally on the proposed allocation of Informal Education and Community Grants Schemes across the area. It is expected that the results of this work will be presented to local councillors in early January.

CRUMLIN AREA OFFICE REPORT

New Children's Playground – Stannaway Park

A new children's play area in Stannaway Park is intended to be created. The play area will cater for young children aged between 2 and 7 years of age and it is expected that the works will be carried out and completed early 2017. This small play area will be natural in style to blend in with the grassland of the existing park. Play features will be constructed of natural materials and will be set into the landscape within gentle mounded forms. Seating will be provided as part of the works.

Improvement works at Cashel Avenue and Captains Avenue

The construction of improvement works at Cashel Avenue and Captains Avenue, consisting of new parking zones, new footpaths and a plinth wall surrounding the green, will commence in January 2017, weather permitting. These works will be funded from the South Central Area Discretionary Fund 2016.

Brickfield Park

Works have begun on the all weather pitch in Brickfield Park and are progressing well. Synthetic carpet & shock pad will be laid in January 2017 subject to weather conditions. Whilst construction works at this time of year are very much weather dependent, it is expected that the project will be completed by March 2017.

Bunting Park

The boundary hedging surround Bunting Park along Balfe Avenue will be removed and replaced with new railings. These works will be carried out in December 2016 and are funded from the South Central Area Discretionary Fund 2016.

BALLYFERMOT AREA OFFICE REPORT

Ballyfermot/Drimnagh Community Update 2017 Community Grant Scheme

Over 250 applications were received in the South Central Area which are currently being processed. The grants provide a great opportunity for the community staff to make contact

and meet with the majority of the groups to offer support and assistance. It is proposed to hold a pre meeting with the elected representatives in January in advance of the February Area Meeting Area Meeting.

Comhairle N'OG

28 young people representing 13 schools attended the Comhairle N'OG AGM in late November. Six young people will represent the area on the Committee for 2017. Their chosen topic for 2017 is Homelessness.

Drimnagh / Walkinstown / Bluebell

Dublin City Council is working with the Associated Bluebell Community group and has recently set up an environmental group to work towards creating a greener and cleaner Bluebell. Over 35 residents have volunteered to take part in this initiative which is being supported by the City Council.

Drimnagh Ladies Club has operated from Our Lady's Hall Mounre Road since it opened and will be celebrating their 50th anniversary in 2017. Dublin City Council will be supporting them to organise a programme of events to mark the occasion and to encourage new members to the group.

Ballyfermot / Chapelizod

The Ballyfermot Office is currently producing a Cold Weather information card with useful numbers particularly for older people. Contact will be made with Resident and Community Groups to encourage them to drop the information cards into older residents in their area over the Christmas period.

Dublin City Council staff are supporting the following initiatives for older people in the area: the newly formed choir for older people with dementia, a weekly sewing and craft group and a weekly dance class.

Kilmainham / Inchicore

The Community development team are working with the Kilmainham Inchicore Network and have attended the public meetings looking at the formation of three subcommittees to develop plans around the economic, social, cultural, physical and environmental development of the area.

LECP Consultation

Community staff are working with the Ballyfermot Partnership and the South City Partnership community teams as part of SICAP to implement community development actions resulting from the LECP consultations.

These sites are prime development sites screaming out for development. The lack of action in a housing crisis leaves a lot to be desired.

Ballyfermot Swimming & Water Sports sessions resume this month each Monday from 5-6pm in Sports & Fitness Ballyfermot. A number of DCSWP Sports Officers are involved. The programme is open to referrals from the local welfare officer. The Monday pool sessions have been running since March 2016 and cover swim technique/fitness, water safety, snorkelling & sea swimming outings in the Summer. Participants must have a good baseline standard of swimming as the training is of a high intensity.

Opportunities are available for those interested to progress onto a Pool Lifeguard Course and achieve certification in this area. This may, in turn, open up employment prospects for them. However, the focus of the programme is to use the experience of successful candidates within the group in a peer to peer leadership model in order to sustain success.

Club Support

The local DCSWP Sports Officer supports and works with the coaches from *St. Catherine's Boxing Club* & *Tae Kwon-Do Club* who both train on various evenings in St. Catherine's Sports Centre and are always willing to take on new members. Likewise with *Liberty Saints Rugby Club U13's & 17's* who train on Tuesday & Thursday nights in Liberty Park on Basin Lane.

The Liberties Club (Youth Justice Project)

The local DCSWP Sports Officer will be assisting youth workers from The Liberties Club to provide a soccer drop-in every Monday night from 8-10pm in St. Catherine's Sports Centre. This acts as a form of outreach to young people in the area and the hope is that they will join the club and get involved in activities on an ongoing basis.

TULSA Programme South City Family Support Services

The DCSWP Sports Officer is working with the South City Family Support Services TULSA to help build resilience for a group of young people aged 8 to 12 years of age, allowing them to find their voice. The group will be taking part in a 12-week Water Confidence / Snorkelling programme taking place in Crumlin Swimming pool on Tuesday afternoons from 3-4pm. The Programme will run from January to April.

Teen Gym - Introductory Programme

The DCSWP Sports Officer, with the support of the St. Catherine's Gym staff, has organised another four week block of Teen Gym sessions for new participants, which commenced on Saturday 7th January. This introductory programme is held on Saturday afternoons after the gym is closed to the public. The teens are given exclusive access to equipment and instructor supervision.

Once teens have completed these four weeks they may then use the gym after school on weekdays and up to 6pm daily during the school holidays. We constantly have new teens signing up for this programme and we have also retained a large number of teens who have progressed from Teen Gym to a full gym membership.

The cost of Teen Gym is €2 per session and is open to any teen from the age of 13 – 16 years. Teen Gym also operates every Wednesday & Thursday in Clogher Road Sports Hall (St. Kevin's College)

Car Driving Programme

The local DCSWP Sports Officer will be assisting both the Fountain Youth Project & Foróige DAN Youth Justice Project with their Safe Car Driving Programme which will take place on Wednesday afternoons across 4 weeks from late January to late February.

Bluebell Change For Life – This 8 week general health and fitness based programme consists of a health check, body measurements, weekly weigh-ins, nutrition advice and then final reassessments. Three fitness classes are also provided as part of the programme - Zumba on Mondays from 7-8pm, Walking/Jogging on Wednesdays from 6-7pm and Step Aerobics on Thursdays from 7-8pm. All classes take place in Bluebell Community Centre. This programme is open to all adults in the local community.

Fatima Change For Life – As above. Three fitness classes are also provided as part of the programme – Step Aerobics on Mondays from 6-7pm, Walking/Jogging on Wednesdays from 6-7pm and Circuit Training on Thursdays from 6-7pm. It is proposed to dispose of the site in fee simple to the ESB subject to the following terms and conditions:

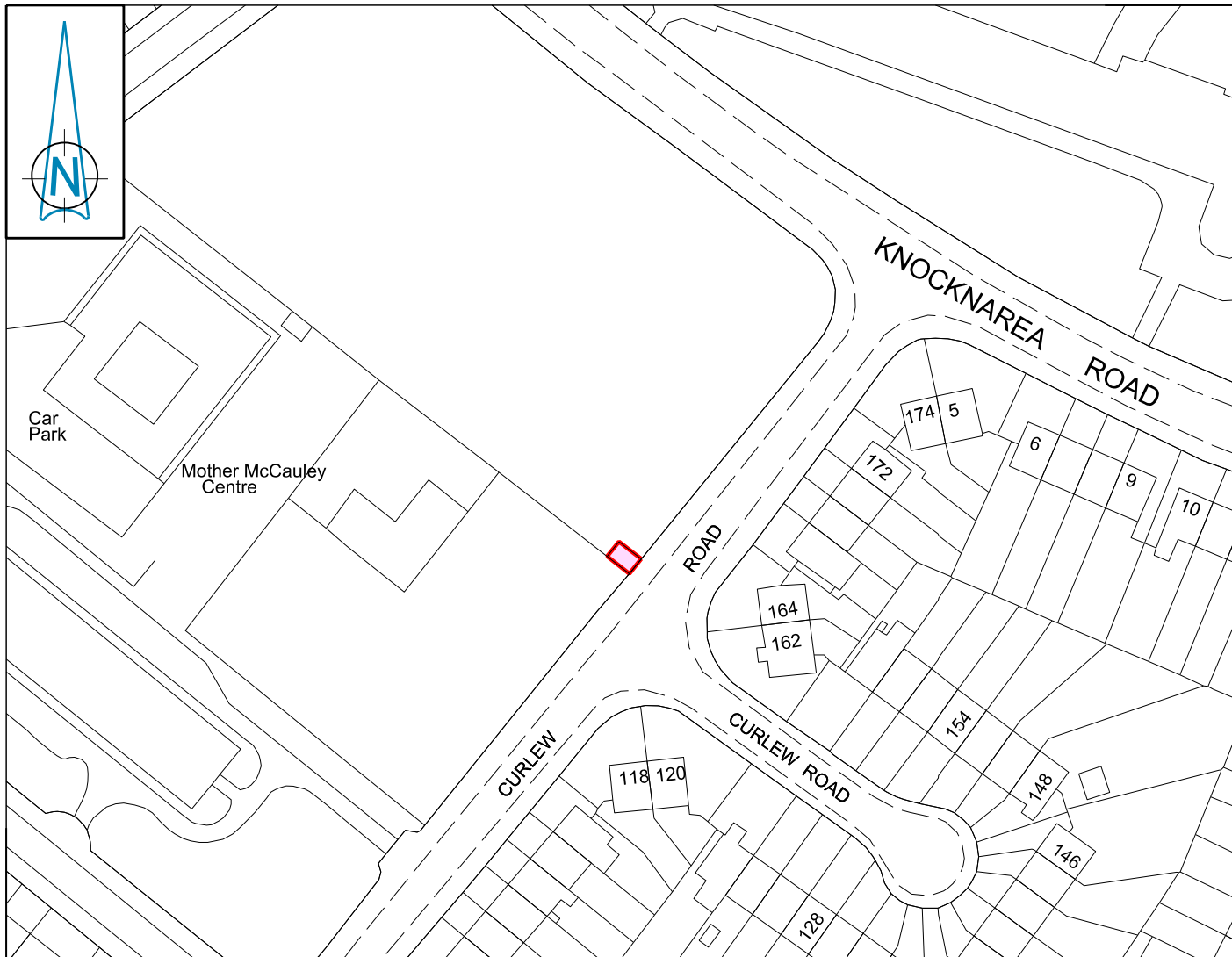
1. The site will be transferred to the ESB free of charge.

To ask the Area Manager to reconsider the refusal for a disabled parking bay at (*details supplied*). This lady is an old age pensioner who is disabled, there are constantly cars parked outside her maisonette causing great inconvenience to her especially in bad weather and attending Doctor, Hospital visits or shopping.

Reply

The City Council's criteria provide for the consideration of requests for disabled parking bays outside private residences.

The City Council would not normally consider a request for a disabled parking bay outside a multi-unit building and in particular where there is no car at the address, as in this case.
