	<p>This committee calls on Waste Management to remove the Bottlebank on Carnlough Road in Cabra. It's a disappointment to have to request the removal of an environmentally friendly facility but it's clear that Waste Management cannot ensure the proper maintenance of this site. Regular illegal dumping occurs with little or no sanction. The neighbouring residents have been extremely patient over a number of years regarding the ongoing issues with the site. The lack of an effective response to the illegal dumping at this site was demonstrated recently when it was confirmed that the temporary CCTV installed was mounted in the wrong location for 3 months and resulted in no fines being issued.</p>

By relocating the services, the lands can be opened up to more efficient use which could lead to an increase in the amount of housing units developed on the site.

That this Committee requests that the Housing Department during any potential negotiation with the Church of Annunciation/Dublin Dioceses in relation to the procurement of land gives full consideration to working with the HSE, who are also interested in using a portion of the land to build a Primary Care Centre.

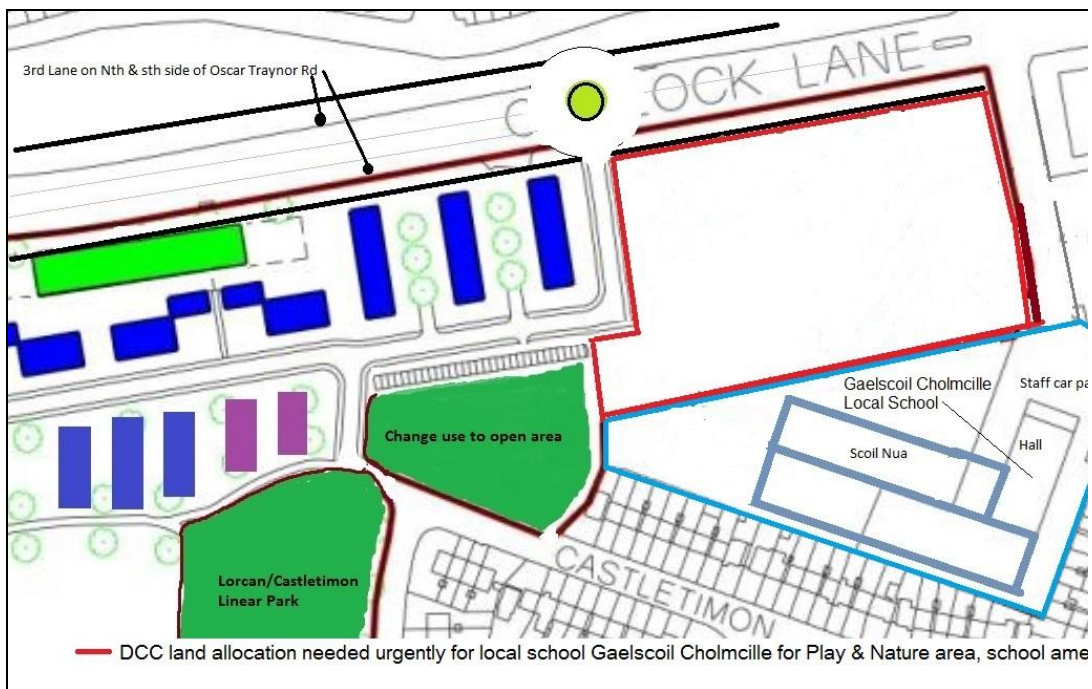
