## Questions to the Area Manager

### North West Area Committee

Meeting 18<sup>th</sup> July 2017

**Q.1 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager can the Council ensure the bins removed on (details supplied) during the pavement repairs are returned now that the work is complete.

**Q.2 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager to install a “children at play” sign on (details supplied).

**Q.3 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager can the Manager clean the lane at the rear of (details supplied). It was reported that it was always cared for by DCC.

**Q.4 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager can the council put dishing outside (details supplied) for car entry. This resident has limited financial means.

**Q.5 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager, a lady fell at this location and badly fractured her hand. She was in plaster and it cost her €100. She reported this fall to civic offices and said she did not want to make a legal complaint but simply wanted the path repaired. Despite this and several follow up emails the path is still not repaired. The raised section of path is a trip hazard and is located at the tree outside (details supplied). Can the manager arrange for an immediate repair?

**Q.6 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager to install a simple railings around the green at (details supplied) to prevent bikes and illegal dumping. This would underline its new zoning as recreational.

**Q.7 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager, when will we install new pavements on the other side of (details supplied).

**Q.8 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager to investigate the possibility of installing a fence and kissing gate at the cul de sac from (details supplied). The rationale behind the proposal is that residents are plagued with speeding scrambler motor bikes as the bollards at the top stop cars (including the guards from getting through). A number of children play on this road as it is a cul de sac.

They are basically looking for something similar to what is down in (details supplied) area which has the same problem.

**Q.9 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**

To ask the Manager are there any plans to repair/replace the pathways on (details supplied) the resident has concerns that other roads nearby have been done in recent years but not this one.

To ask the Manager to inform me as to when the Pavements on (details supplied) will be replaced. Can this be included in the programme of works in future?
- Q.11 Councillor Paul McAuliffe**  
To ask the Manager to replace the broken sections of pavement on (details supplied).
- Q. 12 Councillor Noeleen Reilly**  
To ask the Manager to trim the trees between (details supplied) as the houses feel they are being blocked from the sunlight.
- Q. 13 Councillor Noeleen Reilly**  
To ask the Manager to look at the condition of (details supplied). There are numerous potholes on the entire road.

To ask the Manager to arrange for clean up around (details supplied) and to Prune the Trees and Hedges.

To ask the Manager to arrange for a parcel of land at a location in (details supplied) to be retained in Council Ownership. The derelict parcel of land has recently been acquired by TII. Residents wish to have this integrated into the existing park.

To ask the Manager will the council replace the swings in Coultry Park. There were a variety of swings for different ages at the start of the summer, but in recent weeks there have been no swings in the park. The council should also give consideration to a swing for children with disabilities. Photo provided.

To ask the Manager will the council give details about the removal of access to the lane that was used to access George's Cemetery (off Whitworth Road). Why was the lane closed? When was it closed?
- Q. 33 Councillor Andrew Montague**  
To ask the Manager will the council clear the brambles at the back of (details supplied)?
- Q. 34 Councillor Andrew Montague**  
To ask the Manager will the Council meet with the parish priest of (details supplied) to discuss how car parking will be managed in the (details supplied) when the proposed new houses are built on the car park beside the (details supplied).

- Q. 35 Councillor Anthony Connaghan**  
To ask the Manager to arrange for Pedestrian crossings at the junction of Finglas Road (N2) and the Old Finglas Road (Violet Hill).

To ask the Manager to arrange for the section of Casement Road on the 40 bus route to be re-surfaced as it has broken up on several parts recently and is in poor condition overall.

To ask the Manager to arrange for a cast iron sign to indicate Wellmount Courts presence off Wellmount Avenue
- Q. 40 Councillor Anthony Connaghan**  
To ask the Manager to arrange for an inspection of (details supplied) to see if there is dampness is present, particularly in the bedroom, and to provide measures to deal with the issue.
- Q. 41 Councillor Anthony Connaghan**  
To ask the Manager to arrange for the small section of road which runs from Wellmount Park/Drive to Cardiffsbridge Road to be removed and taken into the park at this junction and for the area to be secured appropriately.

To ask the Manager for an update on the road works at Dunsink Avenue. Are works due to be carried out at numbers 1 to 7?

The contractors that were sent out pruned a different tree to the one requested. The residents tried to advise the contractor at the time which tree was the problem but the resident was ignored. This tree has been problematic for over a year now and needs to be pruned urgently.

To ask the Manager to confirm who has taken the decision to use all available resources in terms of electrical engineers to (details supplied), meanwhile, leaving areas with no electrical engineer to carry out necessary works. It would seem a very

irresponsible decision to delay required safety works such as pedestrian crossings to suit the business needs of (details supplied). This question refers specifically to the delay in getting the pedestrian lights at Griffith Ave (ext), outside the new Gaelscoil, operational since being installed a number of months ago. There are also pedestrian lights at Collins Ave awaiting an engineer. Can the CEO clarify when resources will be reallocated to the area for the completion of such works and will it be before the schools re-open in August?

**Q. 46 Councillor Cathleen Carney Boud**

To ask the Manager to confirm a timeframe for the low fencing around the swale at (details supplied) to be installed. Commitments have been given to provide the fencing to prevent motor vehicles crossing the green in the interests of safety for the residents and children who play on the green. Could the costs of this fencing also be stated.

**Q. 47 Councillor Cathleen Carney Boud**

To ask the Manager to pursue a CPO on the residential buildings of (details supplied). If the council is satisfied that it has exhausted all negotiations with the owners to purchase the buildings amicably, satisfied that the owners have provided no certainty as to their intentions to restore or sell the property, and that no other solution seems to be available to resolve the matter, then it is surely prudent of the council to begin the process of seeking a Compulsory Purchase Order. Can the manager also confirm if a demolition order on the buildings has been considered and reasons for not pursuing such an order which can be obtained under the legislation.

**Q. 48 Councillor Cathleen Carney Boud**

To ask the Manager to provide an update on (details supplied). Have the council reconsidered making another offer to purchase the houses or have the owners indicated their future intentions to sell or restore the properties. What is the current condition of the house with regards to safety, are they habitable?

**Q. 49 Councillor Cathleen Carney Boud**

To ask the Manager to arrange for an interim fire safety measure to be put in place at (details supplied), where the heat/smoke detection alarms have been disconnected due to an ongoing leak. Fire safety is of the utmost importance and could the manager URGENTLY install individual battery operated smoke alarms in the property until such time as the leak is fixed. It should also be noted that there are three small children living in the property aged 3years and newborn twins, naturally, the tenant is very concerned that such fire safety measures are not in place. Could the manager also give a timeframe for the roof to be fixed. The tenant has been told that the roof tiles have been discontinued and the council are seeking to replace them with an alternative.

To ask the Manager to arrange for the green area to the side of (details supplied) to be tidied up, landscaped and to consider planting.

## **Cabra Area Office Report**

### Shared Services Proposal for Cabra Office

Discussions have taken place with the Dublin North West Area Partnership (DNWAP) about the possibility of utilising the Shared Services Model to enable both organisations to operate from the DCC owned office at 97 Cabra Road. If agreement is reached the DNWAP staff in 27/28 Annamoe Terrace will relocate to the Council office.

The proposal would enable an upgrade of the Council Office to be undertaken as part of the redesign. A draft design brief has been prepared by the City Architect's Division. Subject to agreement on design, estimated construction costs and rent it will be possible to deliver a sustainable, best practice example of shared services in our Cabra Office.

### Faussagh Avenue upgrade

We approached Clúid with regard to a proposal to landscape the front of the Broome Lodge development in line with our overall plan to upgrade Faussagh Avenue. They are supportive in principle but, having sought advice from the Planning Department, they were advised that any reduction in the open space within the development for the residents would directly contravene the planning permission. The open space to the front of the scheme was a crucial element for the Planners at the time planning was granted, so a revised application to incorporate the public space is unlikely to be granted permission, and especially not within the time left available for completion.

Given the percentage of older persons in the area and the new residents about to move into the scheme, the Clúid Architect suggests that seating to the front of the scheme and a bus shelter would be more practical and make a real difference to the local community. They could incorporate the seating along the boundary of the site and allow the bus shelter to encroach on the site slightly. We have asked them to explore this option.

### Mount Bernard Playground extension

The Natural Play Area at Mount Bernard Park was completed. However, a post installation inspection identified a small number of snags which are being addressed. The park is now due to open by the weekend of the 15<sup>th</sup> July.

### Navan Road Church car park

The car park had become extensively damaged with large pot holes, particularly in the area adjoining the school. As this facility is extensively used by the Community, DCC agreed to assist with repairs.

### Shandon Area

Badly damaged kerbs on the corner of Shandon Crescent have been replaced and grass verges have been re-seeded on the Road, Park and Crescent. These had been extensively damaged due to the narrowness of roads here.

### Ashington Mews

The Area Office has been liaising with residents regarding complaints of anti-social behaviour coming from the area in the environs of the Ratoath Flyover. We have proposed a number of measures and are also liaising with Irish Rail, Waterways Ireland and the Gardai. However, it should be noted that anti-social behaviour has been a long standing issue in the wider area over the years.

### Ashtown Grove car parking

Residents have been seeking various measures to control parking on these landings and in front of the shops. However, businesses have opposed any measure involving paid for parking and we have now been informed by Traffic Department that DCC cannot consider any measures while property owned by DCC is being assessed for inclusion on the Vacant Sites register. The car parks on either side of the shops fall into this category.

## **Community & Social Development**

### Community Environmental Projects.

The Faussagh Avenue Group organise regular clean-ups and have recently planted up the containers with summer bedding. They would welcome any new residents who would like to get involved.

### Mount Bernard Park

The Parks Tennis Programme will run during the month of July.

### Christ the King Centre

The upgrading of the grounds is well under way and the improvements are making a huge difference to the appearance of the Centre.

### Phibsborough Tidy Towns

The Group is now organising additional clean-ups on Tuesday evenings and continue planting and maintaining the large amount of flower barrels throughout the area. They also link in with the other environmental and residents groups in Phibsborough and the surrounding area.

### St. Peter's Men's Shed

They meet every Tuesday in St Peter's Court at 11am. New members are welcome. The group went on a trip to Belfast recently and are organising some more outings during the summer.

### Community Events

The annual St. Peter's Garden Party took place on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> June with a large attendance. The annual Shandon Residents Community Day, which was held on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> July was also well attended.

Both events were supported by DCC through the Community Small Grant Scheme and provision of gazebo's, tables and bunting and staff attended to support activities on the Day.

### Cabra 4 Youth

Held a very successful Fun Day on the Canal to promote the new Kayaking Club on the 24<sup>th</sup> June. Kayaks on the water behind Des Kellys Shop and a barbeque was also organised on the day. Work is in progress on their new base at the disused cottage which was handed over by Waterways Ireland and the group is looking forward to establishing the new Club.

### Summer Camps

Cabra Parkside is running a two week Summer Camp from Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July to August 4<sup>th</sup> Monday-Friday with a full programme of activities. Contact the Centre for details.

Naomh Fionnbarra's Campa Shamhraidh ran from 3<sup>rd</sup> July-14<sup>th</sup> July Monday-Friday.

Ventry Park Community Centre has activities throughout the summer and information is available at the Centre.

The Cabra Men's Shed, History Group, Ladies Groups, summer projects and other community and residents groups are all organising their own activities and events so keep in touch locally to find out what is going on in your neighbourhood.

**Introduction**

It is proposed to initiate procedures under Section 54 and Section 55 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 to add Cherrymount House, Cherrymount Park, Phibsborough, Dublin 7 to the Dublin City Council's Record of Protected Structures (RPS).

**Name and Address of Owner:**

Report:

This area committee report is based on an assessment report carried out on the building for Dublin City Council by Lotts Architecture and Urbanism Ltd., a Grade 1 Conservation Practice.

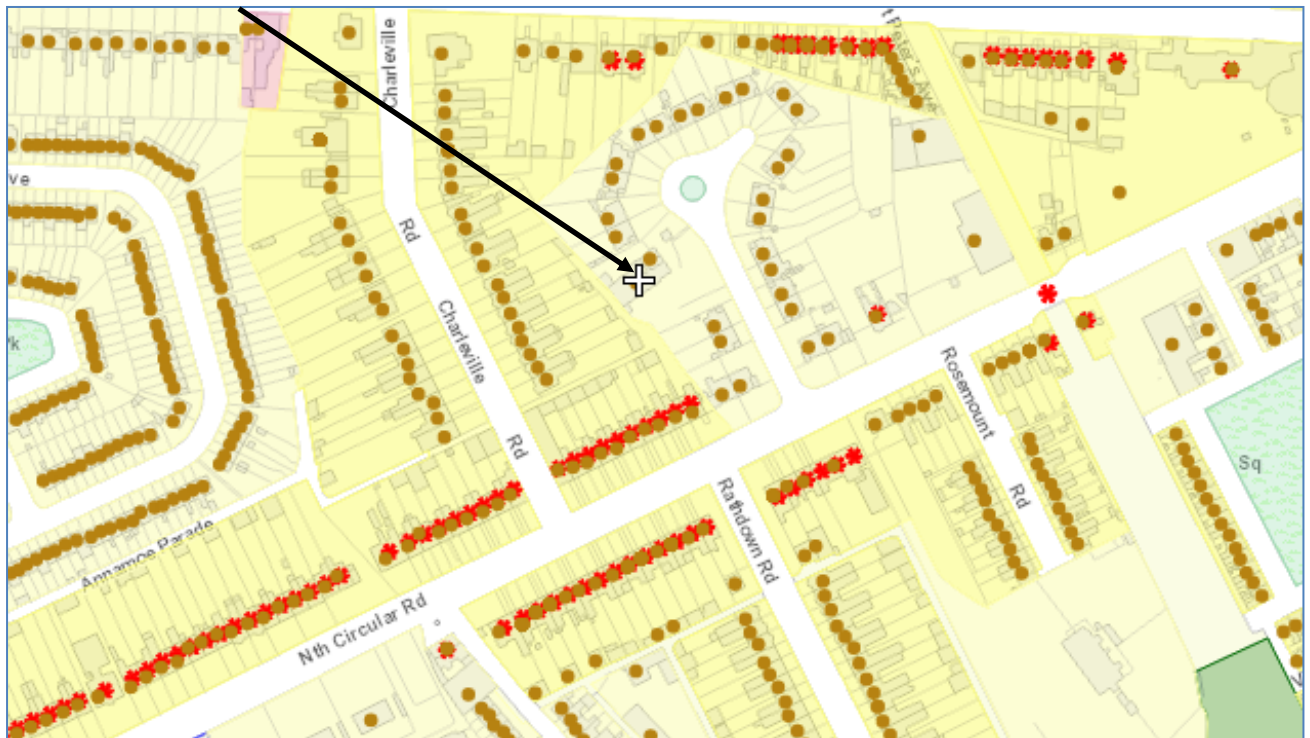
The applicants cite a number of reasons for the placement of Cherrymount House on the Record of Protected Structures. The house is a late Georgian / early Victorian structure dating from c.1834, and is among the few buildings from this period in the area. The adjacent Stone Villa, which dates from a similar period, is listed as a protected structure. The applicants report that Cherrymount House is in good condition: *'Unlike Stone Villa the property is in good condition and was reportedly occupied by its elderly owner until her death in 2016'*.

Planning History:

No recent planning history

Development Plan Zoning & location map:

2016-2022 zoning objective: Z1 – To protect, provide and improve residential amenities. Cherrymount House is located on Cherrymount Park, Phibsborough, Dublin 7, on a site close to the junction of North Circular Road and Charleville Road. Cabra Road is to the north. The address is listed in documentation and directories as 283a North Circular Road.



### Summary Description

Cherrymount House is a detached four-bay two-storey house, built c.1834, and features on the first edition Ordnance Survey map in 1837. The house also comprises a two-bay two-storey wing to the north west, a single storey wing to the east and a turret addition to the yard, all dating from the nineteenth century. The building was evidently built in phases, most probably in quick succession as all phases are represented on the first edition OS map (1837).

A two-bay two-storey extension, dating from the early twentieth century is located to the centre of the north elevation.

An adjoining single-storey apartment to the west and an adjoining two-storey house to the northeast were added in the late twentieth century. These units will not form part of the description or analysis.

Hipped slated roofs to the nineteenth century elements, having terracotta and stone ridge tiles, stone coping to parapets, rendered chimney stacks and some cast-iron rainwater goods. Flat roof to the early twentieth century extension. Roughcast rendered walls to front (south) and side elevations, and north elevation of nineteenth century block to rear. Rendered walls to other elevations.

Round-headed door opening to front elevation with moulded surround, timber panelled door, and plain fanlight and side lights. Timber windows to all elevations, replacement windows to first floor of front elevation. Oriel windows to ground floor of front elevation, dating from early twentieth century.

Detached single-storey outbuilding to northeast, having pitched roof, stone and brick walls and timber doors and windows.

Cherrymount House is set back from road, within landscaped gardens, having gravel path and forecourt, and rendered boundary walls with brick capping.

Timber doors, architraves, skirting boards, and lath and plaster ceilings to interior rooms. Decorative cornices to ground floor living room. Moulded timber staircase located in twentieth-century extension to rear.

### Historical Background

Cherrymount House was one of the original residences on North Circular Road. It was built on lands within the Monck estate in the early nineteenth century, and is referenced in the Monck estate papers.

*'The property features in the papers of the Right Hon. Charles Stanley Viscount Monck of Charleville, Co Wicklow as property no. 56 in "Rental of Dublin Estate" held in the National Library's Manuscripts Department. The tenants are listed as "Representatives Taaffe" and the yearly rent and Poor Law Valuation are stated as £42 and £34, respectively – both are significant valuations.'* (Gail Seekamp – Letter 18.04.17).

Cherrymount House first appears in Thom's Directory in 1835, which would suggest that it was constructed c.1834. It features on the 1837 OS map, unnamed and adjacent to 'Rose Mount'. The two properties are named individually on the 1867 OS map.

Cherrymount House originally had its own entrance and approach from North Circular Road, and this is still evident on the 1907 OS map. The houses on Cherrymount Avenue date from the mid-twentieth century, and it was at this time that the entrance gates were relocated, and Cherrymount House lost its direct connection with North Circular Road.

Thom's 1835 Directory lists a 'Mrs Taaffe' as occupant at Cherrymount House, and 'Robert Taaffe Esq. Attorney' is listed at the same address in the Dublin Almanac and General Register of Ireland 1836 & 1837.

It is reported that a well was located on the lands of Cherrymount House, though there is no evidence of this on the Ordnance Survey maps. *'The house contains its own stables and a circular well that was a source of drinking water for locals. It was reputedly associated with Lord Phibb, of the family after which Phibsborough is named.'* (Kevin Duff, An Taisce – Letter 21.04.17).

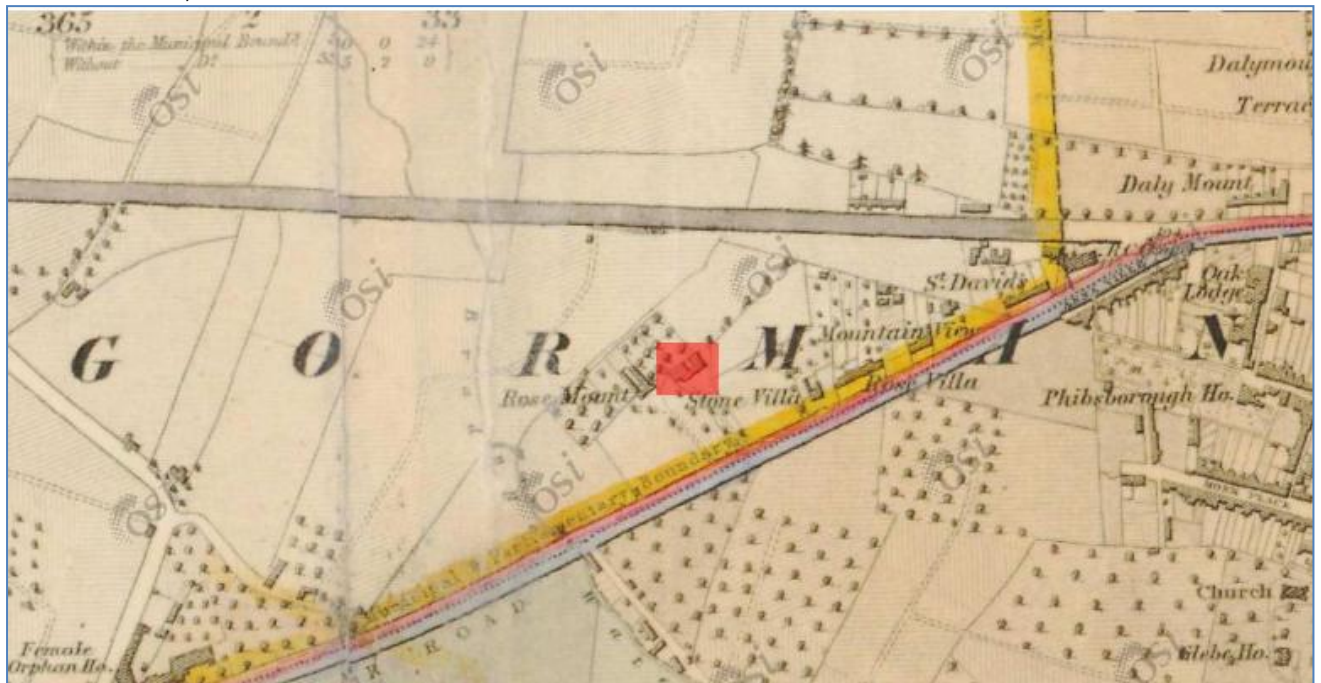
In the 1873 Thom's Directory, 'Matthew J Mooney Esq' is recorded as the occupant of Cherrymount House.

Dr JF Falvey of the Irish Medical Association was reported to be resident at Cherrymount House in 1946 (Irish Independent, April 1946).

In May 1965, Cherrymount House was advertised for sale in the Irish Times: *'Delightful old-world non-basement residence detached in its own well-kept grounds adjoining North Circular Road convenient to city. 4 reception, 6 bedrooms, garage and outoffices, etc.'* (Irish Times, 22 May 1965).

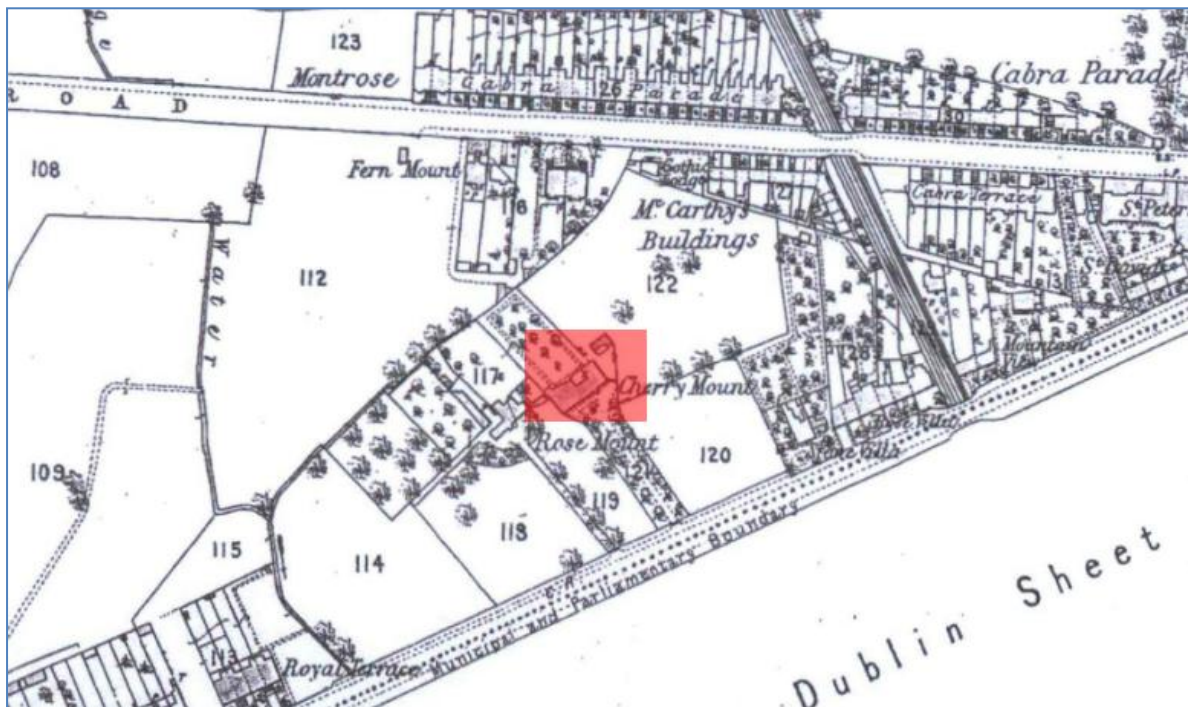
Though Cherrymount House retains much of its original 1834 footprint, additions to the rear (north), east and west date from the twentieth century.

**Map 1: First edition OS map, 1837.** Cherrymount House features on the first edition OS map, unnamed and adjacent to 'Rose Mount' which may have been part of the same larger property at that time. The buildings are located on landscaped grounds, each having an entrance and tree-lined approach path from North Circular Road. The site is just outside the 'Municipal and Parliamentary Boundary' outlined on the map. Cherrymount House is U-shaped in plan, and a formal garden is depicted to the rear. 'Stone Villa' is situated on North Circular Road, to the southeast of the site.



**Map 2: Second edition OS map, 1867.** The footprint of Cherrymount House remains largely unchanged. The building is named 'Cherry Mount', with 'Rose Mount' to the west. There is a

small addition to the northwest corner of the house, and an outbuilding to the northeast. The Midland Great Western Railway has been completed to the east of the site.



**Map 3: Thom's Directory map, 1874** Thom's 1874 Directory map reflects the information on the second edition OS map.



**Map 4: OS map, 1886.** More detail is evident in the 1886 OS map, which depicts an additional single storey addition to the southwest corner of the house, and a small structure along the northeastern boundary of the formal garden. The outbuilding has been extended.

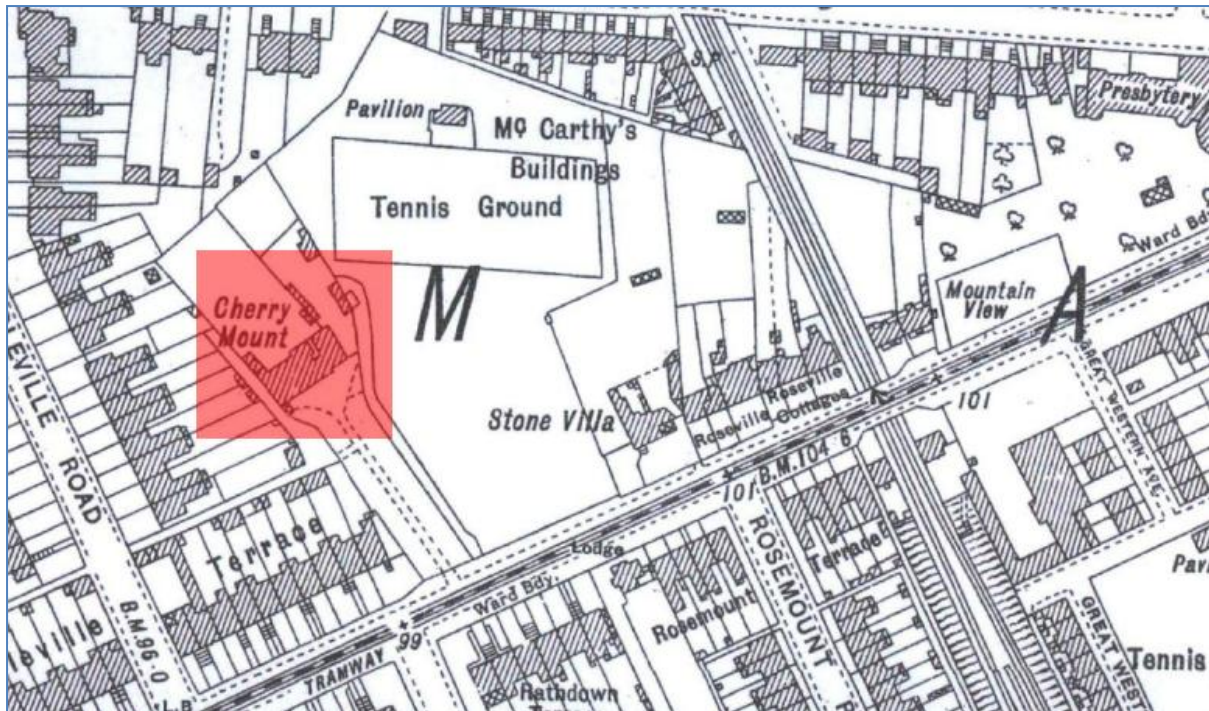
Charleville Terrace (unnamed) has been built along North Circular Road, immediately to the south of Cherrymount House.



**Map 5: Third edition OS map, 1907.** The footprint of Cherrymount House remains unchanged in the 1907 OS map. A small structure is evident to the south of the house along the approach path. Houses have been built along the Charleville Road, which has been established to the west of the site. 'McCarthy's Buildings' are depicted on the adjacent land to the northeast.



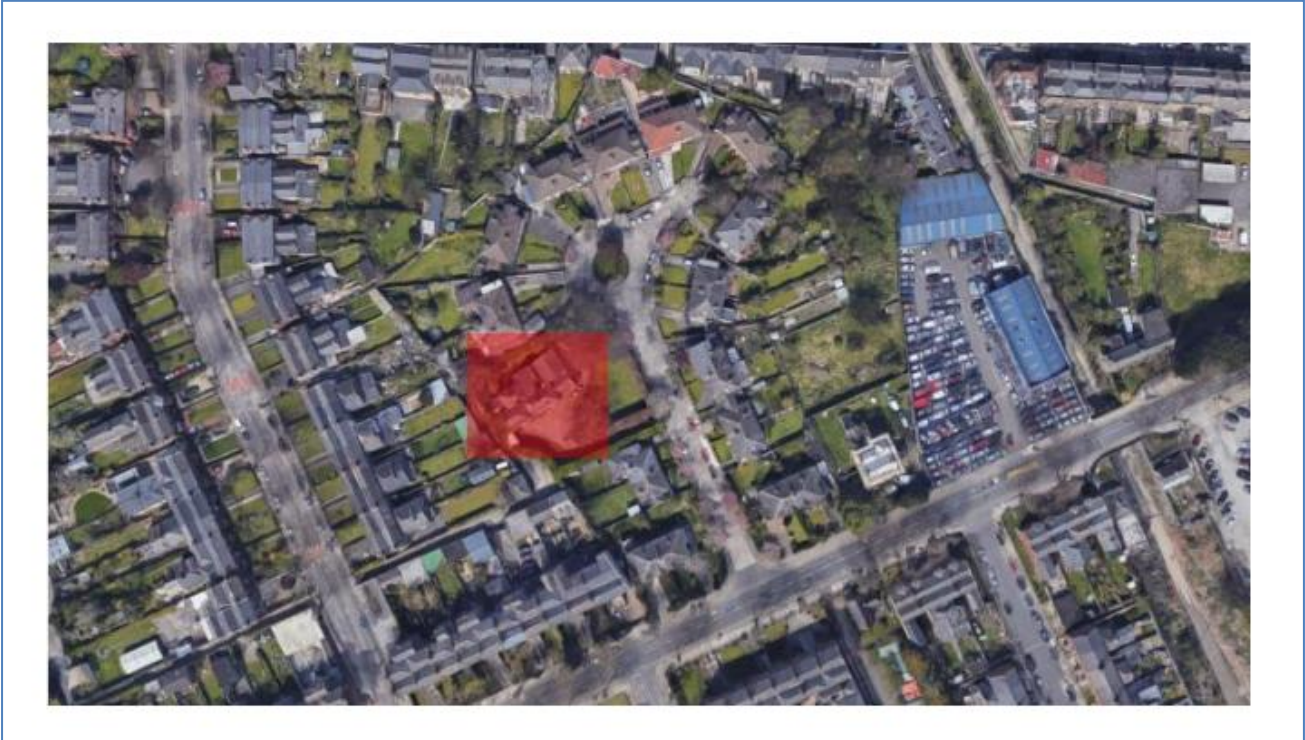
**Map 6: OS map, 1936.** The footprint of the house has been extended, and the building features an infill addition to the north. Additional outbuildings are featured to the north of the house. A 'Tennis Ground' and pavilion are portrayed on the adjacent land to the northeast.



**Map 7: OS map, 1966.** The footprint of the house remains the same as depicted on the 1936 OS map, but the outbuildings are no longer extant. 26 houses have been built on the former lands of Cherrymount House, forming Cherrymount Park. Access to Cherrymount House is from Cherrymount Park, with entrance gates and approach to the southeast of the house.

#### Assessment of Special Interest under the Planning & Development Act, 2000

The Categories of Special Interest are defined in the Planning and Development Act, 2000 as architectural, historical, archaeological, artistic, cultural, scientific, technical and social. When assessed under the above categories, it is found that Cherrymount House, Cherrymount Park, Phibsborough, Dublin 7, is of architectural and historical interest.

**Architectural significance:** Dating from c.1834, Cherrymount House is one of the earliest houses to be constructed on North Circular Road. Despite later additions and alterations, the structure and fabric of the original house remain largely intact and are of architectural merit. Though once part of a larger plot, with extensive gardens and a connection to North Circular Road, the current landscaped setting enhances the house and conceals it from the road. Early maps represent a U-plan house, with a two-storey extension added in the inner yard during the early twentieth century. The staircase is accommodated in this later extension, and it is unclear where the original staircase was located. The shift in first floor level between the central section of the house, and the section to the west would suggest that they may have been constructed separately, though both are depicted on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey map dating from 1837. This change in level is reflected in the first floor windows of the front elevation. The single-storey wing to the east sits on the original footprint, and most likely dates from the early phases of building. The early twentieth century oriel windows to the front elevation are elegantly detailed. The interiors retain original joinery, lath and plaster ceilings, and some decorative plasterwork.

**Historical significance:** During the Great Amnesty Campaign of 1869, when rallies were held in Dublin to demand amnesty for Fenian prisoners, it is reported that a large rally was held on the lands of Cherrymount House, adding historical significance to the property (Ronan Scaife & Ger Lardner - Letter 17.04.17)

**NIAH Rating:** Cherrymount House has not been included in the architectural inventory of Dublin city currently being undertaken by the National Inventory of Architectural Heritage



(NIAH). The surrounding area was surveyed by the NIAH, however due to this property's secluded position; it was not included in the scope of their survey work.

When evaluating the property using the NIAH criteria and rating system (International, National, Regional, Local and Record Only), it is found that Cherrymount House is worthy of a Regional Rating. Rationale for Regional Rating: Constructed in c.1834, Cherrymount House is one of the earliest houses to be constructed on North Circular Road. Despite later additions and alterations, the structure and fabric of the original house remain largely intact and are of architectural merit.

**Conclusion & Recommendation:**

Cherrymount House is considered to be of Regional significance. It is therefore recommended that **Cherrymount House – 19<sup>th</sup> century residence, excluding later 20<sup>th</sup> century extensions, Cherrymount Park, Phibsborough, Dublin 7** be added to the Record of Protected Structures in accordance with Section 54 and 55 of the Planning and Development Act 2000.

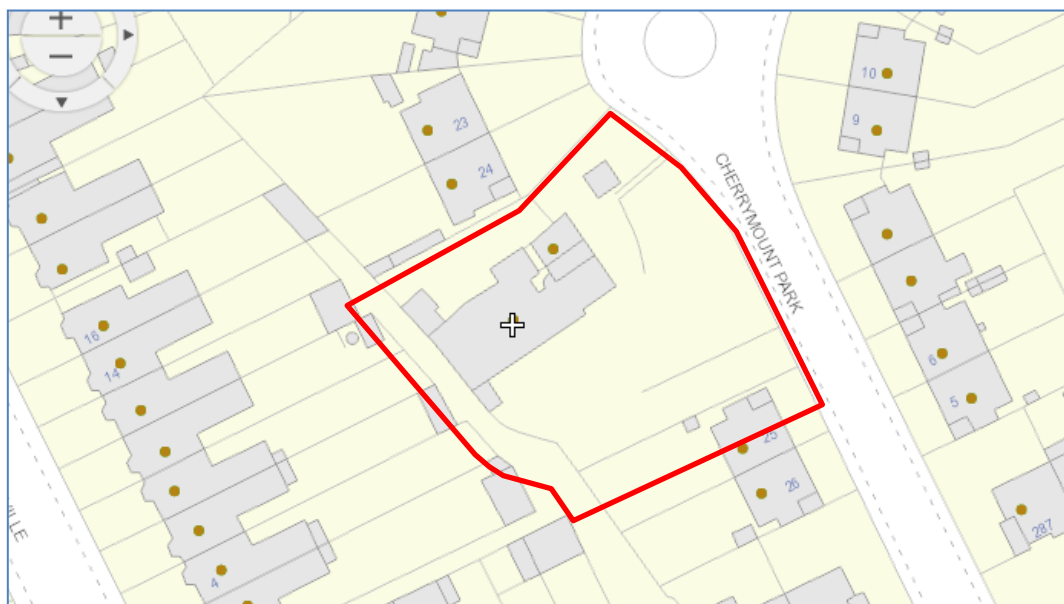

## **Finglas Area Office Report**

### **Update on Kildonan Lands Project**

The public consultation continued throughout June. The draft masterplan was available to view at Finglas Library, WFTRA Community Centre, and the North West Area Office. A large number attended the Brady Shipman Martin (BSM) Q&A session at the WFTRA Community Centre on Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> June. Submissions were received online and in hard copies. These are currently being analysed. BSM will present an updated plan at the September meeting of the NWAC.



### **Roundabouts Update**

The Environment & Transportation Department have indicated that they will submit a report to the October meeting of the NWAC in relation to their assessments of the following roundabouts:

- a) Outside the Lidl store (junction of St Margaret's Road and McKee Avenue).
- b) Jamestown Road.

### Liam Mellows Statue

A working group (WG) is being formed to assist the Liam Mellows Committee progress their proposal. Some of the key issues to be considered by this group include:

- a) Quality of the art and design of sculpture, plinth and environment.
- b) Technical issues, including design, fabrication and installation.
- c) Location.
- d) Financial costs.
- e) Permissions, including NWAC, Parks, and Planning.

The Lord Mayor has asked that the first meeting be held at an early date. I will represent the Area Office on the WG.

### Tolka Valley Park Sports Pavilion

Construction work commenced last August and is now completed. The Official Opening by Lord Mayor Mícheál MacDonnacha will be rescheduled for September.

The building will have 24 hour CCTV monitoring. The facilities will be available from 8am to 6pm Monday-Friday, and 9am-1pm Saturday.

## **Community & Social Development**

### Finglas Summer Projects

This year there are seven voluntary and one non voluntary summer projects in Finglas. The projects run from July to the first week in August and cater for upwards of 900 children. Dublin City Council continues to support these projects with grant assistance as well as providing summer students to the projects.

Summer Projects are run by voluntary committees and provide a valuable service to the local community.



### Finglas Men's Shed

The group is progressing very well. There are now fifteen members. The group meets on Wednesday and Friday afternoons in the Abigail Centre. The group intends holding an open day in September and is actively seeking new members.

### Jazz in the Park

Unfortunately, due to very bad weather, this event was held indoors in the FYRC. Those who attended were treated to a great performance from the excellent jazz band.

### Positive Ageing Week

Positive ageing Week takes place from Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September to Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> October. There are a number of events taking place this year including Senior Table Quiz, Senior Ball, Older Persons Sports Day, and a Variety Show. Further information on these events will be available over the coming weeks.

### Finglas Festival

The Finglas Festival Committee hosted the annual Finglas Festival on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> July in Mellows Park and Finglas Youth Resource Centre. The event went very well with a good attendance. Dublin City Council was one of the main funders for this event.



### Environmental Enhancement Project's

The Community and Social Development Section is working with Global Action Plan on a number of "Greening Neighbourhood Projects". The project will entail a Community Gardener from Global Action Plan working with our Tidy Towns Group, a local community group, and a residents group collaborating and working on a plan to enhance an area in need of improvements. It is hoped this collaborative project will benefit the groups and give them a better understanding of sustainable and bio diversity planting. Global Action Plan will work with these groups during July and August. The first enhancement project took place in Barry Park on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> July. An area in the park was planted by residents under the supervision of GAP Ballymun.



### Street Feasts 2017

Street Feast 2017 took place on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2017. Street Feast is a day of local lunches across Dublin: the events are hosted by and run by neighbours. Street Feasts give communities the opportunity to share food and engage in conversation and help build stronger neighbourhoods.

Street Feasts took place in eighteen locations across the Finglas area. Dublin City Council supported the Street Feasts events by making a contribution to Street Feast Ireland.

### 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Positive Wellness Fortnight

The Finglas Wellness Fortnight will take place on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> September to 22<sup>nd</sup> September. The Positive Wellness Fortnight will be launched on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> September at 1:30-3:30pm at the green area beside the Finglas Sports and Fitness Centre, Mellows Road.

The fortnight will include various free events and activities to promote positive wellness. There will be healthy eating workshops, baby massage, FYRC feel good factor workshops, lip sync battles, two wellness walks, two pamper days, SOS training, Jigsaw workshop, Abigail Centre Community Fete, HIV lunch time seminar and a men's health promotion day. A booklet will be available with more details on all of the events and activities that will be taking place.

Finglas Positive Wellness Group is an ad hoc group of diverse organisations and members of the Finglas Community, who work together to deliver services to help encourage positive mental health and also to educate the wider community with suicide awareness and training in suicide prevention.

The Group is made up of representatives from the Finglas Suicide Network, Dublin City Council, Finglas Mental Health Association, The Finglas Centre, Finglas Safety Forum, HSE, Dublin North West Area Partnership, Finglas Youth Resource Centre, The Den, Pavee Point, Local Drug Task Force, Dublin City Sports & Wellbeing Partnership and the Community Gardaí.

It is important to note that a significant number of additional complaints were also investigated as all area staff pick up complaints when carrying out daily duties but due to lack of resources all complaints are not logged.

### Cardiffsbridge Road Enhancements

In 2016 a programme of works was commenced to improve the public domain on Cardiffsbridge Road, in Finglas. The green area adjacent to the Wellmount Road junction was enhanced with tree planting, and planters of summer blooms were placed for the summer season at the area around Dunnes Stores. These planters attracted a lot of positive comment locally and as a result have again been provided at the same location.

A further schedule of works on Cardiffsbridge Road is ongoing in 2017. Safety barriers to impede motor cycles have already been constructed at the Cardiffsbridge Avenue walkway. This week work started on the repair of the wall around the Cardiffsbridge Shops. Demolished sections have been repaired and a capping will be installed to enhance and strengthen this structure. New bollards will also be provided at the entrances to the green. Funding has also been earmarked to repair the traffic barriers on Cardiffsbridge Road, adjacent to the Berryfield Drive cul de sac. It is expected that this work will commence in September.

### Name and Shame Update

The installation of a name and shame sign at Marewood Crescent has resulted in a very noticeable decrease in illegal dumping on the adjacent green space. The sign has also been very positively received by local residents, who have suffered the blight of illegal dumping close to their dwellings for a number of years. Following on from this a second name and shame sign has been installed at the junction of Gateway Crescent and the Ballymun Road. This location was selected for monitoring by CCTV as it has been highlighted in recent IBAL reports as being an illegal dumping hotspot, particularly around vacant dwellings on Gateway Crescent. It is hoped that this sign will have the desired effect of proving to be a deterrent to those who are engaged in illegal dumping at this location.

### Public Domain Works

A number of public domain works have either been recently completed or are ongoing in the area to enhance public safety. Further knee high wooden rails, similar to those recently installed on Griffith Road, have been installed on Beneavin Road to prevent vehicles parking

illegally, damaging grass verges and causing a slip hazard over the winter months. Barriers at Wellmount Green and Belclare Park are being modified to restrict the passage of motor cycles at speed. Railings are being installed on Cloonlara Road to discourage anti social behaviour in an area adjacent to dwellings and anti climb measures have been improved on a wall at a location in Glenties Park to tackle anti social behaviour. Recent enhancements also include a new decorative sign installed at Botanic Avenue Senior Citizens Complex, and additional planters installed at several locations in the NWA.

#### Installation of new Summer Flower Baskets

The summer flower baskets have been a familiar sight in Finglas Village over the last few years. This year poles have been installed in two other locations in the NWA to enable the placing of summer baskets. DCC Parks arranged for the installation of removable poles at the shops on Faussagh Avenue, in Cabra. These poles are designed to allow for their removal at the end of the summer season. The baskets have now been installed and have been widely welcomed by local residents and business as a colourful enhancement to the area.

The NWA Public Domain Team worked with colleagues in the North Central Area and local businesses to install poles and baskets in Drumcondra Village. The village has been recently rejuvenated, with a number of new businesses opening and excellent development work being carried out by the local business group. It is hoped that the summer blooms will support this work and enhance the village over the summer season.

### **Litter Bins, Technology and Policy - Waste Management Division**

#### **Introduction**

There is currently a stock of approximately 3500 standard litter bins in place in the Dublin City Administrative area. These comprise of 3 styles of litter bin:

- A type predominately situated in the city centre area (600)
- B type located in the suburban areas (2450)
- Cast Iron located in historic city areas. (450)



In addition Dublin City Council has recently installed 110 dog fouling specific litter bins in locations throughout the city identified in conjunction with the Area Departments at entrances to parks, green areas and areas of high footfall dog walking.

Dublin City Council currently has 48 solar compactor (Big Belly) bins in situ on a trial basis in 3 locations:

- Baggot Street and surrounds
- Sandymount Promenade
- Kilmainham at the historic jail.

Dublin City Council has 9 Big Belly units located in Temple Bar that it owns.

## Policy

It is the policy of Dublin City Council to maintain this stock of bins and to ensure that bins are located at the most effective locations to cater for the needs of the city population. The policy is to ensure that bins are located in close proximity to significant litter generators and in areas of high pedestrian footfall.

Significant litter generators and areas of high footfall include:

- Neighbourhood shops
- Schools / Educational Facilities
- Shopping centres
- Leisure areas
- Community centres / Facilities
- Major bus stops / Transport hubs
- Main thoroughfares / Arterial routes
- Car Parks

In order to ensure that bins are located in the most appropriate locations to cater for levels of demand and to ensure that bins are adequately serviced and maintained Dublin City Council is identifying ways of using technology to assist in managing this aspect of the service.

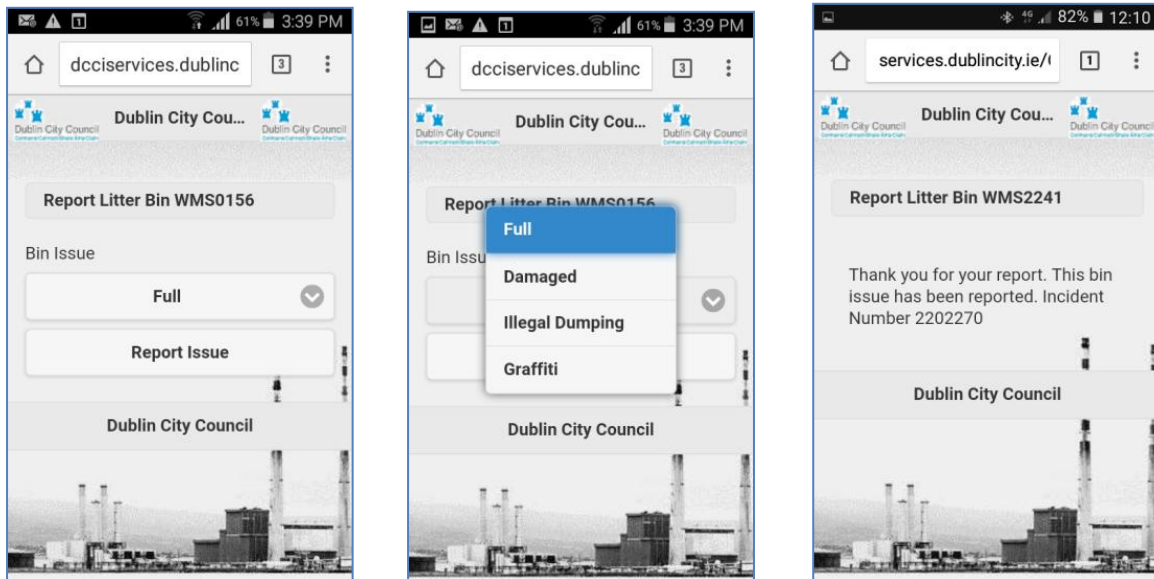
## Bin Tagging

Dublin City Council is currently identifying each of its bins with a unique identifier number and QR code in order to map locations and maintain bin records. This system also allows for the public to scan the QR code and report via a 2 step process any issues that they might encounter.

This initiative allows DCC to better manage its stock of bins and coordinate maintenance and replacement of bin stock and identify through the mapping process areas where bins are not supplied in sufficient quantities or where there may be an oversupply of bins that could be relocated to areas of higher demand.



The QR code technology allows the public to report via a smart phone issues with bins. The report is directly relayed via the Customer Relations Management system to the operations teams allowing for a quick response to issues reported.



### Bin Sensors

Complementary to the tagging and mapping process is the introduction of bin sensor technology. Currently in use on a trial basis, to assess the effectiveness of the technology, bin sensors that monitor the fill levels of bins and provide reports when bins require servicing is in place.



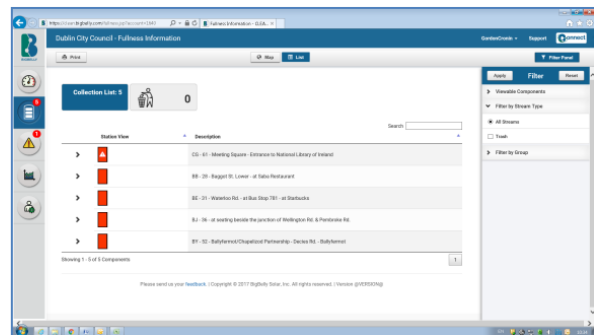
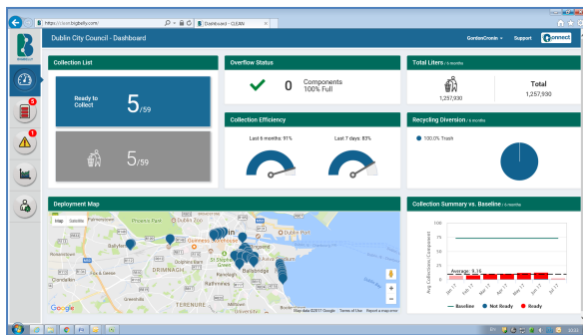
This technology allows DCC to identify high use locations and conversely locations that are low use or rarely used and may be potentially relocated to higher demand locations. It can also be used to map routes and assist in increasing street cleaning over bin emptying on traditional milk round style routes. The technology can be monitored via a web portal and alert systems set up at preset intervals to notify the relevant operations teams of bins that require servicing.

This technology has been used in 40 locations, 20 in Finglas Village and 20 in Drimnagh to date and results have included an overall increase in service efficiency by reducing the number of bin collections required over the period of the trial. The technology is relatively low cost and may be retro fitted to existing bins.

## Solar Compactor Bins (Big Belly)



Dublin City Council has carried out a trial of Big Belly bins in a total of 48 locations and currently has 9 units installed in Temple Bar. These bins have the capacity to monitor fill levels and notify at set intervals and on an alert basis where bins require servicing. They also have the additional function of an on board compactor which gives the bin up to 6 times the capacity of a standard bin and consequently further reduces the frequency at which bins require servicing. The telemetry and compactor technology is solar powered. Similarly to the sensor technology alerts and route monitoring may be carried out via a web portal.



The trials have delivered impressive results and Dublin City Council has carried out a competitive tender process to procure this type of bin. It is expected that an initial purchase of this type of bin will be carried out in the near future.

This type of technology is costly and its use is considered to be most beneficial in areas of high demand such as neighbourhood shopping locations or amenity areas which may have seasonal peaks such as Sandymount and Clontarf promenade.

## **Dublin City Sport and Wellbeing Partnership Report**

- Green Scene is a new summertime initiative aimed at getting more people active through better use of our parks and green spaces in Dublin City. DCSWP Sports Officers will work with partners to organize new, interesting and enjoyable games, activities and coaching sessions.

Complimenting The Green Scene will be the following:

Seen on the Green – Efforts will be made to entice well known sporting personalities to attend activities. We will promote these through a ‘Seen on the Green’ segment on social media and other relevant media channels. This will help build the profile of the programme and assist with securing future sponsorship.

The Green Machine – Awards/prizes will be presented to participants attending the highest number of sessions.

Green Scene events taking place in the North West Area during this period include:

- *Whitehall Pentaque Group takes place every Wednesday morning from 10am – 11am in Ellenfield Park (over 55’s)*
- Cycle Leader Training: A number of DCSWP Sports Officers combined resources to facilitate a Cycle Leader Training Course on June 28<sup>th</sup>/29<sup>th</sup> in the Municipal Rowing Centre, Islandbridge, Dublin 8. This was a great success and further training dates are expected to be confirmed. A number of adults from the North West Area communities are expected to attend this training and subsequently lead a six week ‘Bike for Life’ programme prior to the great Dublin Bike Ride in September. Updates to follow.
- Older Adults Programmes - Cabra
  - Monday 1 - 2pm; Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex - Go for Life
  - Wednesday 12 - 1pm; Inspire Gym and Pool, Ratoath Road, Cabra - Aqua Aerobics
  - Thursday 3 - 5pm; Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex - Bowls

- Get Climbing Programme: This eight week indoor climbing certified programme is run in conjunction with Mountaineering Ireland and local youth services in Finglas. The programme is aimed at young people 14 years and over and takes place in the Awesome Walls facility in Finglas.
- An Outdoor Pursuits Programme (kayaking, mountain biking, rafting, rock climbing) will run throughout July and August in Ballyfermot Youth Service Adventure Centre. DCSWP Sports Officers in the North West Area will facilitate sessions for local youth groups.
- Summer Projects – The local DCSWP Sports Officer for Finglas will help to facilitate a wide variety of activities for the various Summer Projects and camps taking place throughout the area in July and August.
- Sports & Fitness Ballymun and Sports & Fitness Finglas will hold weekly Summer Camps for 5 – 12 year olds, commencing on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July. The camps will entail fun games/activities and swimming sessions and will run throughout the Summer. There will also be weekend swimming lessons for children from the age of 3 upwards, commencing July 8<sup>th</sup>. Each block of lessons will run for 4 weeks.
- Sports & Fitness Ballymun are offering specific classes for people with back pain every Monday at 12pm (in partnership with the HSE)
- Both Sports & Fitness Ballymun and Sports & Fitness Finglas have introduced a scheme whereby homeless people currently residing in nearby hotels can access the facilities at a reduced rate to assist with their physical and mental wellbeing (in association with DePaul)

### **FAI/DCSWP Football Development Officers – Update**

- Paul Whelan and Jamie Wilson have just wrapped up the Project Futsal Programme for the 2016/17 academic year. The students will now be concluding their FETAC Level 4 Award, ITEC Gym Instructors Award and their FAI Coaching Awards.

The FAI/DCSWP Development Officers will be delivering eight weeks of Summer Soccer Camps. These camps will be held at various club and DCC venues throughout Dublin for the duration of July and August. The camp capacity each week is 100 kids and it is hoped to attract a lot of boys and girls from the Finglas and Ballymun areas. Students from Project Futsal will also be used as paid coaches on these camps.

### **Boxing**

- Aviva Stadium Tours & Boxing Taster Session: All 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class pupils and Transition Year students throughout the Dublin City area, including many from the North West Area, who took part in the Startbox Programme have been invited to take part in free tours of the Aviva stadium throughout June and July (which will be guided by DCSWP/IABA Boxing Officers). Students will also experience a short coaching session and view some famous Irish, International and Olympic boxing memorabilia (this will be coupled with interesting and informative stories/anecdotes to inspire and educate the students!).

### **Cricket Development Officer Update**

- The Cricket Development Office is currently liaising with Sports Officers to organise the running of summer projects for the area e.g. summer camps, family fun days etc.
- We have a number of players involved in the provincial teams (U11, U13, U15, U17 and U19), both male and female, from 9-18 years of age who have training sessions and cricket tours during this period. These sessions take place on a weekly basis at different venues in the Dublin City area. Although all the venues may not be in the area, a lot of the participants will be from the North West Area. These events include:
  - Dublin City Summer Camp - 17<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> July from 10am - 4pm in the Phoenix Park
  - Dublin City U17 match in YMCA cricket grounds on the 24<sup>th</sup> July from 11am - 5pm
  - Dublin City girls camp from 31<sup>st</sup> July – 2<sup>nd</sup> August from 10am - 4pm (venue TBC)
  - Boys U11 training session on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> August from 10.30am - 1pm in YMCA cricket grounds.
  - Boys U11 interprovincial match in Pembroke CC on the 14<sup>th</sup> of August from 11am - 4pm.
  - Dublin City U12 Tournament in Pembroke CC on the 10<sup>th</sup> of August from 10am - 4pm.

### **Rowing Update from Dublin City Municipal Rowing Centre**

- Active Age Rowing - Tuesdays and Fridays from 12.20pm - 1.30pm, for new and on-going participants aged 55 and over. No previous experience required.
- Summer Youth & Community Project rowing slots – July: Summer Projects can book in for groups of up to 12 where they can experience an introduction to the sport in a safe and comfortable environment with user friendly equipment.
- Youth Rowing Camps – August: During the month of August, youth rowing camps will be running from the Municipal Rowing Centre for children aged 10 years +. The camps will run Monday to Friday from 10am - 1pm at a cost of €50 per young person. No previous experience required, we will begin with the basics and help the participants to progress and improve their skills as the week proceeds.
- Phoenix Rowing Club: A recreational rowing club for adults based in Dublin Municipal Rowing Centre. The club is purely aimed at getting people on the water to enjoy the activity and surrounding environs of the Memorial Gardens, Phoenix Park and River Liffey. No previous experience required and members can progress at their leisure to a level of their comfort and choosing.

## **North West Area TAG Minutes continued 27/06/17**

### **1) Request for Traffic Calming Not Recommended on Navan Road, SR 34155:**

There are plans by the National Transport Authority (NTA) to build an efficient bus service called the BRT. The BRT offers fast, reliable, predictable and comfortable journeys in modern, high quality vehicles. BRT seeks to emulate the service, performance quality, and amenity characteristics of a modern light rail-based transit system at a much lower cost. Given its cost, flexibility and effectiveness, BRT has a key role in the development of an integrated public transport system for Dublin. It will deliver higher capacity on existing busy bus corridors and provides an attractive alternative to car transport, with fast and reliable journey times. One of these routes will be the Blanchardstown to UCD Swiftway BRT and will use the Navan Road. The NTA are currently designing the junctions along the route. Dublin City Council is awaiting to see these detailed design drawings from the NTA (e.g. awaiting drawings for Darling Road / Navan Road). The speed limit inbound on the Navan Road at Darling Estate is 50kph. The Navan Road is a main arterial route in and out of the city and traffic calming by way of ramps are not recommended at this moment in time. If vehicles are breaking the speed limit then this is a matter of enforcement for the Garda. Also Under the road Traffic Act "52.—(1) A person shall not drive a vehicle in a public place without due care and attention, or without reasonable consideration for other persons using the place. (2) A person who contravenes subsection (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence."

## **1. Community Update**

### **General Community**

Community Team Members attended the following meetings: Axis Events Meetings, Nigerian Carnival Group, Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre, Mojo IAG Meetings, Otherworld Festival Meetings, Drumcondra Safety Forum, Summer Project City Meeting, Poppintree Health for All Group, Poppintree Community Centre, DNWAP, Walk Social Enterprise, and Sports Development Officers. The Community team members have ongoing links and provide ongoing support for the Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre and the Ballymun Child and Family Resource Centre.

### **Youth**

The Community team are supporting five voluntary and five non voluntary summer projects in the local area. Ongoing meetings are taking place with the groups and Crosscare Representative Roisin Cloake. Additional supports have been put in place for the Arts Sessions and Sports Sessions in Poppintree Community Centre, which are local voluntary projects. DCC will assign two summer students to work with the local summer projects. Most of the projects will take place in July. The team members are supporting the FACT Autism Group (based in Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre) with their summer activity programme.

### **Social Inclusion**

#### **Men's Sheds/Groups**

The Ballymun Men's Shed and DCU are working on a funding proposal (for development of sheds in the DCU Community Garden Space), which will be sent to DCC in the near future. Community Team Members are continuing to link in with the groups with regards to this. Ongoing meetings took place with the Ballymun Men's Sheds Group and the Irish Men's Shed Association. A meeting was also held with the Ballymun Men's Centre in relation to funding and continued support.

#### **Older Persons**

Community team members linked with the following groups: Active Living, Age Friendly Group, and BADIG.

#### **Ladies Groups**

Community Team Members provided ongoing support to Sillogue Ladies Group and the new Ballymun Allsorts Parents Group.

### **Environmental**

The team are continuing to work alongside the Public Domain Staff to support this year's Pride of Place Entry for the North West Area (the residents and environmental upgrades in Doon Court, Graigue Court and Knowth Court and surrounding areas). They are also continuing to attend meetings with the groups as they work on their presentation for the competition. Ongoing meetings took place with Public Domain Staff in relation to local environmental initiatives and distribution of planters, blue bags, brushes etc. The Community Team continue to work with environmental groups on various planting projects. To date, over 40 community groups have received support and plants from the section. The second Greening of the Area Workshops (GAP, DCC, local residents, Poppintree Youth Project) took place at Druid Court/Termon Court and was a very successful day. The community team members assisted the Ballymun Tidy Towns Committee with their judging programme on Wednesday the 28<sup>th</sup> June. Entries have increased this year and areas have significantly improved.

### **Events**

The team members continued to roll out the new plan for Otherworld Festival 2017. To date including the overall Festival Committee, two working groups: (1) Parade and (2) Community

Groups have been established and are meeting on an ongoing basis. A number of new community group members have become involved and are working on a number of initiatives including a new revamped 'Zombie Walk Parade' and an even bigger space designed by community groups for the Plaza on Halloween Night.

### Dumping

Public Domain in conjunction with the Project Estate Officers in Ballymun continue to target residents who are illegally dumping. Project Estate Officers are carrying out regular calls to residents to make sure that they are set up with bin providers. There is an ongoing dumping programme in place to try and target households who have no bin providers. After a meeting with some residents in Coultry Terrace last month, a circular was issued to all residents there to refrain from illegal dumping. The problem improved significantly after the meeting. Other residents in the area have been steadily interviewed by Project Estate Officers over the last couple of weeks to determine who their bin providers are and if none are in place we inform them they have ten days to set up an account and produce evidence of their bin collection receipts. This is done in conjunction with a name and shame programme run by the Public Domain Unit where cameras have been catching people who dump their rubbish and pictures are displayed publicly asking for information on the person.

### Older Persons Unit

There are a number of new environmental projects that the Area Office in Ballymun has identified. One of these is the Albert College Complex - this involved removing overgrown bushes, shrubs and weeds in the three garden areas with a view to having them paved and some planters installed. Initial works have now been completed and we are looking to start the next phase of planting and paving in the coming weeks. This will make the area easier for residents to manage and become a place for them to sit relax and enjoy the gardens.

We are working with the Liaison Officer in Sandyhill Gardens Older Persons Complex and are continuing with a planting project started last month. Residents continue to plant, water, dig and tend to the green spaces in the complex. All equipment is supplied by the Area Office and plants are supplied by Community Section. Residents have said that it is bringing the complex together and improving the community spirit.

Residents in Griffith Close Older Persons Complex continue to look after the green space with the equipment provided by the Area Office and will now receive plants from DCC Community Section to bring some colour to the space and so they can enjoy the new benches recently installed.

### Planters

Residents groups that have been involved in regular clean-ups and engaged with us have been given large planters by Public Domain to help enhance the great work done. Shangan Avenue received two planters with a nameplate as they have been out every weekend doing clean ups and have put plant boxes around all trees that line the road and planted flowers inside. The road looks better and residents have expressed a new found pride and feeling of togetherness for their area as a result of all their hard work. Whiteacre Close received two planters for their involvement and clean ups. They have planted around all tree beds and done a weeding project on the paving stones.

### Pride of Place nomination

Residents in the Doon/Knowth/Druid and Graigue Court area along with Crannog Estate and Belclare Estate have been nominated for a Pride of Place award this year. Public Domain has been working with residents to give them the best chance of winning an award. There have been clean-ups, planting projects, painting and equipment given, topsoil, plants and much more including advice and support. This is a fantastic achievement and will be a chance to show Ballymun in a positive light and showcase all the residents' hard work. Judging will take place on August 29<sup>th</sup> at 2:30.

### Clean-ups

A number of our tenants in the Shangan and Coultry area have requested skip bags so they can organise a clean-up of their property.

### Road Maintenance

Bollards and pathways in the Shangan and Coultry area that were damaged over the last few weeks will be repaired shortly.

As much as budgets will allow DCC will do some upgrade and refurbishing - flooring, plastering, bathroom, kitchenette, suspended ceiling etc and seek expressions of interest for a barbershop in Sillogue. We are hopeful that this pilot will raise the profile of interested parties and the best application will be selected. We are awaiting quotations to be submitted from 2 suppliers.

The next Civic Alliance Meeting will be held on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2017, where there will be an updates on the Super Depot Project and the LAP. The next Economic Sub Committee meeting will be held on 31<sup>st</sup> August and the Social Sub Committee and Physical Sub Committee's will resume meetings in September.

#### Draft Ballymun Local Area Plan Update

A total of 226 submissions were received by Dublin City Council during the public consultation period of the Draft Ballymun Local Area Plan (the consultation period ran for a period of 6 weeks from Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> April to Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May). A 'Chief Executive's Report on Submissions from Public Display of Draft Plan', Report no. 199/2017 was prepared. Following the circulation of that report to Elected Members, motions were invited from the Members.

A total of 58 motions were submitted on the Draft Plan. The 'Chief Executive Report on Motions from Elected Members', Report no. 254/2017 was prepared and circulated to Members in advance of the Special Council Meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> July.

Members considered the above named reports at the Special Council meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> July. The purpose of the meeting was to reach agreement by resolution on amendments to the Draft Ballymun Local Area Plan.

Shopping Centre: We are still waiting on the Credit Union and the Job Centre to complete the fit out of their units in the Civic Centre. At this stage we are waiting on fire cert approvals etc. There are still 2 commercial occupiers trading in the Shopping Centre. One of these occupiers has applied for an arbitration regarding the assessment of compensation.

#### Northern Site

Lidl signed a contract for the Ballymun site in the middle of May. They had a pre planning meeting at the start of June. Under the terms agreed they are to endeavour to lodge within eight weeks of signing the contract.

#### Housing site: Balbutcher Lane-Cranogue Road Site, Ballymun-

All replies have been received from the relevant Service Departments and the matter has now been referred to the Chief Valuers Department with a view to the site going to the open market as soon as possible.

#### Safety Fora Updates

##### Safer Ballymun

A meeting of this forum took place on Tuesday June 13<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the Council Chamber, Ballymun Civic Centre. It was well attended by local residents, DCC staff and public representatives. A verbal presentation was given about the new Domestic Abuse Unit in Ballymun Garda Station. It is working well and providing much needed support for victims of domestic abuse in the area. Residents discussed various issues on the night such as crime, especially burglaries to people's properties, anti-social behaviour due to gangs congregating in public areas and the parks, a recent shooting that had taken place, quad bikes and scramblers being driven dangerously by youths and drug dealing.

The next meeting is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup>.

Drumcondra Glasnevin Community Forum

A meeting of this forum took place on Wednesday June 28<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the Maples Hotel, Drumcondra. Gardaí from Santry and Mountjoy Garda Stations were in attendance as well as a large number of local residents and some public representatives. Issues such as crime in the area, abandoned cars, illegal parking, the lack of bus routes in the area, and motorists ignoring traffic signs were discussed on the night. There was a lengthy discussion on the upcoming new traffic layout trial on Walsh/Ferguson Road. Residents spoke both for and against the trial which is due to take place over the coming months.

The next meeting is scheduled to take place on Wednesday September 27<sup>th</sup>.

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**With reference to the proposed assignment of the Council's leasehold interest in Unit 1 Coultrey Neighbourhood Centre, Ballymun, Dublin 9.**

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Under Indenture of Lease dated the 15<sup>th</sup> March 2007, Unit 1 Coultrey Neighbourhood Centre, Ballymun, Dublin 9, was demised by Ballymun Regeneration Limited to Coultrey Stores Limited for a term of 25 years from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2007. This is an occupational lease and is currently subject to an abated rent of €45,000 per annum.

As part of the MUDs Act 2011 transfer of title in Coultrey Neighbourhood Centre, Ballymun Regeneration CLG granted a 200 year lease in Unit 1 Coultrey Neighbourhood Centre to the Council. Mr. Darling, a Director of Coultrey Stores Limited, has applied to take an assignment of this lease from the Council.

Accordingly, the Chief Valuer has agreed the following terms and conditions for the assignment of the Council's leasehold interest to Coultrey Stores Limited in Unit 1 Coultrey Neighbourhood Centre. The property is shown outlined red and coloured pink on Map Index No. SM-2013-0807.

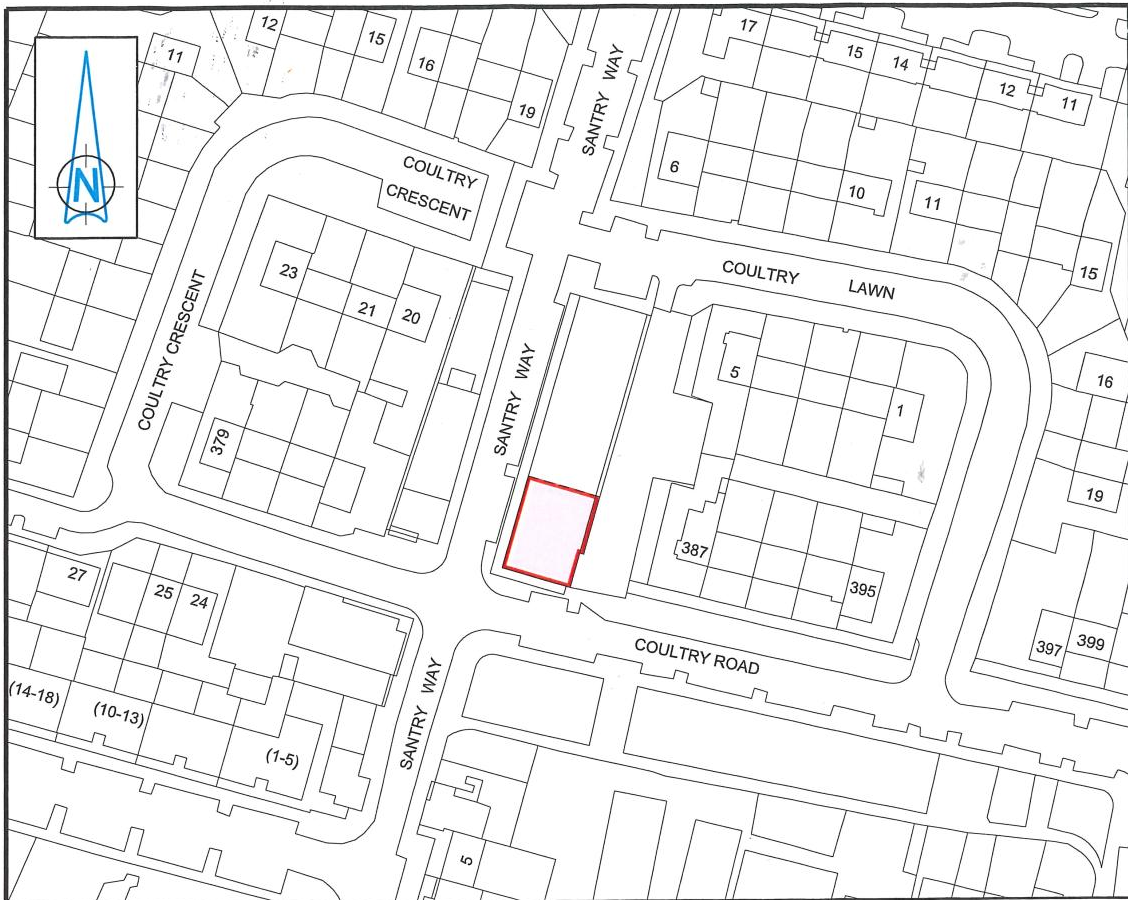
1. That the Council holds a lease in the property for a term of 200 years from the 1<sup>st</sup> December 2005 (less three days).
2. That the assignment of the lease shall be subject to a capital payment of €330,000 (three hundred & thirty thousand euro) plus VAT, if applicable.
3. Until the completion of this transaction, which shall occur as soon as practically possible in 2017, the applicant shall continue to pay the current abated rent of €45,000 per annum in respect of the occupational lease.
4. That the applicant shall sign and return the assignment contract and all other necessary documents in a time period specified by the Council's Law Agent.
5. That if this transaction does not complete in 2017, the Council reserves the right to withdraw from this agreement and the current occupational lease rent of €65,000 (sixty five thousand euro) per annum shall be payable by the applicant, as and from the date of the Council's withdrawal.
6. That the applicant shall pay all outstanding charges on the subject property, including inter alia, rent, service charges, rates and taxes prior to the completion of this transaction.

7. That the applicant shall be liable for any VAT and stamp duty liability arising from this transaction.
8. That each party shall be responsible for their own costs and fees in this matter.
9. That the dates for the performance of any of the requirements of the proposed agreement may be amended at the absolute discretion of the Executive Manager, Planning and Property Development Department.

No agreement enforceable at law is created or is intended to be created until an exchange of contracts has taken place.

The assignment shall be subject to any such covenants and conditions as the Law Agent in his discretion shall stipulate.
