MINUTES OF THE CENTRAL AREA JPC MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 19 JUNE 2017

Minutes of Central Area Joint Policing Sub-Committee meeting held on 27th February 2017

Minutes agreed.

Cllr McAdam extended a welcome and congratulations to Chief Supt. Ward on behalf of the Committee members and commended Chief Supt. Leahy on his work in the Division and with this Committee and congratulated him on his recent promotion. Noted that a presentation will be made to Chief Supt. Leahy at a later date.

2 Progress on actions agreed at last meeting

Noted. Cllr McAdam awaiting replies from Minister Harris and Minister Byrne. Minister Byrne to be invited to a future meeting to discuss supervised injection centres.

3 Presentation by An Garda Siochana

Chief Supt. Ward presented crime statistics for the week ending 4th June 2017 and the year to date and commented on the figures. The report was noted and the following matters were raised:

- Members expressed concerns in relation to elderly people being targeted by gangs. Chief Supt. Ward is aware of this and Gardaí are working hard on catching the individuals involved. Cllr Boylan reported on an initiative set up by the Cabra CPF to promote safety for older people and agreed to put the Cabra CPF in touch with Chief Supt. Ward.
- Members requested separate statistics on domestic violence.
 Categorization needs to be advanced so we can track progress on the issue. Supt. Murphy reported that a significant operation is in place re domestic violence and it forms a significant part of sector review meetings. Chief Supt. Ward stated that domestic violence is a priority in the Division and agreed to include it as a separate category in future reports.
- Brothels on Dorset Street were discussed. Garda operations were run but no prosecutions arose. Supt. Flavin will report on the matter at a future meeting.

- Chief Supt. Ward reported that Gardaí will be trained in relation to the new prescription drugs legislation. He will have monthly meetings with the Drugs Unit and report back to this Committee on those meetings.
- A major investigation is taking place following the recent murder on Dorset Street. There is a significant amount of armed Gardaí in the Division with a huge number of checkpoints being set up. The focus is to keep people safe and many incidents have taken place and been resolved quickly. Preservation of life remains the highest priority.

4 Presentation by Mick Clarke, DCC Anti-Social Policy Unit

Mick Clarke gave a verbal report on how Dublin City Council may terminate a tenancy. The 2014 Act changed the mechanism of how this is done. A number of challenges had to be overcome and 45 staff are now trained and all documents changed accordingly. The new system is now up and running.

The report was noted.

5 Presentation by Community Action Network

Presentation noted. Members supported the initiative and wished Community Action Network well.

Proposal for the extension of Garda CCTV cameras in the North Inner City

Chief Superintendent Ward wishes to report that as part of the North East Inner City (NEIC) regeneration programme there is a proposal for the extension of Garda CCTV cameras in the North Inner City.

A number of potential locations have been identified in the Store Street and Mountjoy Districts and some research and preparatory work is currently ongoing in consultation with Superintendent Telecommunications in this regard. It is recommended that a further 12 cameras are introduced, 5 in the Store Street District and 7 in the Mountjoy District (maps attached), listed below:

Mountjoy District

- 1. Junction of Summerhill and Gardiner St.
- 2. Junction of Glouster Diamond and Sean Mc Dermott St. (cover Corporation St.)
- 3. Rutland St. Preference would be half way up (near Bella St.)
- 4. Junction of Sean Mc Dermott St. and Killarney St.
- 5. Five lamps to cover Portland Row
- 6. Junction of NCR and Summerhill (Near the Brendan Behan pub)
- 7. Top of Buckingham St. and Summerhill

Store Street District

- 1. Amiens Street / Buckingham Street Lower Junction
- 2. Railway Street / James Joyce Street Junction
- 3. Seville Place / Oriel Street Junction
- 4. Sheriff Street / Seville Place Junction
- 5. Commons Street / Sheriff Street Junction

It is intended that an application for approval of the scheme extension will be made to the Garda Commissioner (Garda CCTV Advisory Board) under HQ Directive 24/2008. A requirement of this directive and application is a written approval from the Local Authority following consultation with the Joint Policing Committee of the CCTV scheme.




Proposed Camera Locations For Mountjoy District







Proposed Camera Locations for Store Street and Mountjoy

Central Area Report on Halloween

The Central Area is already preparing for Halloween 2017. A Meeting was held on Friday 1st September with the Waste Management Section and Public Domain Unit. Removal of bonfire materials such as tyres and pallets has been ongoing throughout June July and August.

Onsite Inspections of tyre garages by Waste Enforcement will be organised in the coming weeks to ensure compliance.

All reports of stockpiles of bonfire materials should be made to the Central Area Litter Hotline at 1800 248 348 or to litter.central@dublincity.ie

The customer service centre will also be facilitating reporting of bonfire materials at 222 2222 or customerservices@dublincity.ie .

On call arrangements for the immediate lead up to Halloween will be circulated to Councillors in the week prior to Halloween.

- Litter hotline 1800 248 348 to be used as contact point for reporting to DCC
- Sharing of information and intelligence
- Early morning removal of materials agreed as most suitable time. Before 6am or after 7am to ensure no issues with garda shift change

- Gardaí to provide contact person in each station
- DCC can only ensure collection are made on a Monday Friday basis

Report to Central Area Joint Policing Committee 25th September 2017

Community Impact Assessment

The final presentation will be made to South Central J.P.C. today.

Thereafter the group will meet and identify specific geographical communities, where it is feasible to carry out the pilot, within each area based on the local knowledge of the CPF's and it is proposed to allow an 18 month period to A) carry out a benchmark assessment B) identify appropriate interventions and C) carry out follow-up assessment to measure changes and outcomes. Each CPF will monitor the implementation of the tool as part of its own work plan and the working group will continue to meet to provide co-ordination and support for the pilot. We are also hoping to put in place an independent evaluation of the pilot, but this will be dependent on accessing an additional resource to fund it.

Halloween

Plans for Halloween Festival are well advanced. Three separate events are planned for the week before Halloween, one in each community of Ballybough, Sheriff Street and Diamond Park, Sean Mc Dermott Street. The main event will be held on Killarney Street on Halloween night. Youth services are organising a series of events for young people in the lead up to Halloween.

All events are supported by the community, Gardaí, DCC, Fire Service and various groups within the North East Inner City.

Garda Activity

As referred to on a number of occasions the main issues, given its open and visible activity, dealing of tablets remain a major concern for residents. Gardaí have disrupted, searched and charged a large number of individuals with this offence. Until such time as individuals receive appropriate sentences through the judicial system this situation will continue. That been said residents have welcomed the pro-active approach deployed by Gardaí. An example of this is the 1,100 searches conducted by Gardaí in an area where this behaviour is rampant. A number of Garda raids took place recently in the same area. This provides residents with a sense of security and assurance that garda are, for their part, dealing with the issues presented as best they can given the limitation on resources.

DCC Central Area Joint Policing sub-Committee September 2017 North Inner City Drugs & Alcohol Task Force Update

National Drugs Strategy

The strategy was launched in July and this will inform new local drugs task forces strategies and structures.

Dail legislation

Amendments to the Misuse of Drugs Act started in July 2016 on Tablet regulation with respect to street-dealing 'Benzos and Zimmos' was put in place and remains to be tested through initial court cases that are pending.

Medically-Supervised Drug Injecting Centres

A tendering process is under way. Coordinator attended Minister's attendance at Dublin City Joint Policing Committee on 12th September, where she addressed questions and she is willing to take further questions. Once a City Centre location has been selected, a local consultation will follow.

North Inner City Drugs & Alcohol Task Force

The Task Force has met twice since this last meeting and will meet again in October. The increase in the prevalence of Crack Cocaine continues to be raised as well as local incidents of drug-related violence and intimidation.

Emergency homeless accommodation service of families and related issues continue to impact on drug projects vulnerable client group.

Community Policing Forum

The Community Policing Forum has met a number of times and is liaising with NEIC Taoiseach's Initiative.
