B) The insulation works on the extension. In February there was conflicting views from inspections as to whether the inside of the walls were to be insulated or the outside. Could this be confirmed? If the inside walls are to be insulated could a commitment be given that the fitted wardrobes are put back. Could a timeframe for the works to be completed also be given.

To ask the Manager to confirm when the last boiler check took place at the unit under (details supplied) and to confirm that there would be no risk of carbon monoxide fumes rising from the boiler in to the tenant's home through the air vents

There is an 11 year old boy living here undergoing chemotherapy, and the accumulation of pigeon droppings is causing a health hazard.

To ask the Manager will the council fix the drain/channel in the back garden of (details supplied). The drain is needed to stop the garden from flooding, but it is not draining into the sewers properly and the garden floods regularly.

Cabra Area Office Report

Ashington Mews

A number of meetings have been held with a small number of residents of Ashington Mews over the past year to discuss their concerns regarding anti-social behaviour occurring in the vicinity of the Ratoath Flyover. Residents have been asking that the landscaped area be walled off to prevent access. Gordon Rowland of the Roads Department and Mark Jones of the Parks Section were on site last year to discuss these issues. It was felt that closing off access to the area would create an enclosure that would exacerbate any problems instead of solving them. Experience suggested that, as the landscaped area matured, activity would settle down.

Dublin City Council and Cabra Gardai have met the residents on site. The Gardai say that they have been patrolling as resources allow but say they have not experienced many incidents. However, residents dispute this and continue to complain of anti-social behaviour. They have provided photos of graffiti on the bridge and the presence of riders on a horse in support of their claims.

Fergus O'Carroll, the new Parks Superintendent, recently re-examined the area. He suggested planting more trees to obscure the Irish Rail fence adjoining the rail line and the bridge that residents are looking out on. The existing trees planted as part of the project will also help achieve this as they mature over a relatively short period of time. He also suggested additional planting at the back of residents' walls and possibly adding anticlimbing paint while the new bushes develop. These measures have been offered to the residents and we await their response. An offer to place a rail on top of their walls was rejected as unsuitable. Fergus also confirmed that blocking off access with a gated wall would most likely provide a secure enclosure for people who wish to keep horses there. There are no funds available to carry out such work.

Irish Rail has now confirmed that they have secured funding from the NTA to remove graffiti from the bridge and to strengthen fencing in order to prevent access to it. They will also add anti-graffiti paint as part of the works. The graffiti works alone will cost €25K.

Since the landscaped area has been handed over to Dublin City Council Parks Section in the summer it has been well maintained and inspections of the area reveal little or no littering on site. It is acknowledged that there is a horse being kept on the opposite side of the bridge from Ashington and the Control of Horses Section has been informed of this.

As the area matures and the additional measures proposed are put in place the landscaped area and security should be enhanced. However, no one can guarantee against people determined to carry out anti-social behaviour but these efforts and monitoring by the Gardai should act as a significant deterrent.

Ashtown Grove

Quotations are being sought with a view to having the landings either side of the shops marked out in response to residents' requests to create more disciplined parking. It is important to note that this will not become a formal paid car park and Dublin City Council may require the area for other uses in the future. However, having surveyed relevant Departments there appears to be no immediate demand.

Broome Lodge

The official opening of Broome Lodge by Ministers Murphy and Donohoe will take place on Monday 27th November at 10 a.m.

Royal Canal

Following lengthy discussion between Irish Rail and the Volunteer Clean Up Group, Irish Rail propose to provide the group with a lease to locate a container near the 6th lock to store the groups equipment, including canoes and safety gear supplied by the Area Office, to assist in these works.

Community & Social Development

Positive Ageing Week 25th September

Dublin City Council and Dublin North West Area Partnership organised a talk on Ageing with Confidence in Cabra Library on 28th September to highlight Positive Ageing Week. The aim of the talk was to promote self confidence by exploring one's own ageing process, physically, physiologically and socially and ways to address these changes in a positive way. The speaker was Geraldine Smyth and she has been invited to give a three day workshop on the topic during the Bealtaine Festival 2018 in the Library.

Environmental Projects

With the new season coming in many of our residents are replacing their summer bedding with winter plants and are also sowing bulbs for the spring. The Bee Hives have been installed in St Peters Church and a Community Event - organised with Phibsborough Tidy Towns - took place on the 30th September to bless the bees. Kaethe Burt-O Dea gave information on bee keeping, pollination and honey. It is hoped that there will be Phibsborough Honey next year. They also organised a walk along the Canal on 7th October to gather seeds to plant beside the bees in the St Peters Garden.

Community Grants Scheme 2018

Applications forms for the Community Grant Scheme have been sent to all the groups in the area who applied last year and also to some new groups. The closing date for receipt of applications is 27th October. If anyone has any queries, needs an application form or assistance with filling it in they can contact Marian Finglas or Paul Fitzpatrick in the Cabra Area Office.

Comhairle na nÓg A.G.M.

The AGM is taking place on 27th October in Croke Park. All the schools in the area have been invited to send participants to the event. Attendees will have the opportunity to learn about the work being undertaken so far. They will also have the opportunity to put themselves forward for election to the Comhairle. The A.G.M. facilitates filling vacancies

which arise from young people reaching 18 years of age or vacancies occurring during the course of the year. It is a very positive, educational and fun experience for young people who get the chance to have their opinions and ideas listened too, worked on and presented to those who make decisions affecting them.

<u>Halloween</u>

The Halloween Graveyard is being planned for Tuesday Night 31st October and the Men's Shed is working on the props. There will be an Athletics Halloween Camp in Cabra Parkside from 31st October to 3rd November. Ventry Park Recreation Staff and Volunteers are taking 24 young people to the Cavan Centre from Friday to Sunday on the Bank Holiday weekend and will also have activities on Tuesday 31st. There will be a Kids Disco in St Finbarr's G.A.A. Club on Friday 27th. Events for Seniors are also being planned. The Sports Development Officers will be linking in with volunteers to put together a programme of events. Flyers will be posted around the area before the Halloween weekend.

With reference to the proposed grant of a licence of a pitch and pavilion at Kildonan Park, Dublin 11.

By way of Agreement dated 1st June 2012 an area at Kildonan Park (also known as Larney Park), Finglas, Dublin 11 was let under licence by Dublin City Council to the Trustees of Mellowes BDS Football Club for a term of 10 years from 1st March 2012.

Mellowes BDS Football Club has now merged with W.F.T.A Football Club to form a new football club called Finglas United Youth and Football Club.

In order to regularise matters in respect of the licence Dublin City Council relying on Clause 4.01.4 of the aforementioned Agreement terminated that Agreement with effect from 31st May 2017.


Dublin City Council now proposes to grant a new licence of part of Kildonan Park (also known as Larney Park), Finglas, Dublin 11 as shown outlined in red and coloured pink on Map Index. No. SM-2017-0616 to the Trustees of Finglas United Youth and Football Club subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The licence shall be for a period of 5 (five) years commencing on 1st June 2017.
- 2. The licence fee shall be €100 (one hundred euro) per annum for the term of the licence payable in advance in each and every year.
- 3. The licensed area which for information purposes is more particularly shown outlined red and coloured pink on Map Index SM2011-0284 annexed hereto shall only be used for a non-profit making community football club.
- 4. The licensee shall indemnify Dublin City Council against any claims for compensation that may be made arising from their usage of the property. The licensee shall indemnify Dublin City Council from and against all actions, damages, costs, proceedings, claims or demands in connection with the use and occupation of the said premises by means of an insurance policy in the sum of €6.5M in respect of Public Liability and €13M in respect of Employers Liability.

- 5. The licensee shall be responsible for the full internal and external repairs (as appropriate) of the property including maintenance.
- 6. The licensee shall be liable for all costs associated with ESB, gas, telephone usage, waste management and water charges and any other charges incurred by the licensee associated with the property licensed to it.
- 7. The licensee shall at all times adequately secure the licensed area against entry by unauthorised persons or damage by third parties and maintain a safe and secure environment for all users of the property including the taking of all reasonable steps to prevent undesirable persons gaining access at any time.
- 8. The licence shall be personal to the licensee and may not be transferred or otherwise disposed of and the licensee may not part with occupation of the Licensed Area or any part thereof nor grant a licence of the whole or any part of the Licensed Area to any person or body.
- 9. The licensee shall not sell or allow consumption of alcohol or tobacco on the property which shall be a no-smoking zone at all times.
- 10. The licensee shall not use or permit any part of the property to be used or occupied otherwise than as a sports facility, or for any purpose or in any manner inconsistent with such use.
- 11. The licensee shall permit Dublin City Council, its servants and agents, accompanied by all necessary equipment, to enter the licensed area giving at least two weeks notice in writing of its intention, (except in emergency situations) without liability to compensate the licensee for any loss, damage or inconvenience, and do all acts necessary for the purpose of carrying out such works to the premises which the Council may think fit and on demand forthwith to remove all such articles out of the premises as may be indicated by the Council as requiring removal (vacating the space completely if necessary) in order to enable such works to be more conveniently carried out.
- 12. In the event that redevelopment or other works by Dublin City Council, or its nominee, are proposed for the licensed area or in its vicinity, the Council reserves the right to relocate the licensee within Kildonan Park to facilitate the development works.
- 13. In the event that Dublin City Council requires the licensee to relocate within Kildonan Park for the purpose of redevelopment or other works by the Council or its nominee, the Council will ensure that the facilities at the new location are of a similar type and standard to those that exist at the licensee's present location.
- 14. The licensee shall not exhibit any sign, board, placard, poster or advertising matter or any flag or banner on or outside the licensed area without first obtaining in advance the written consent of Dublin City Council.
- 15. Nothing in this licence shall be or ought to be construed as granting any estate, interest or title in the property to the licensee.
- 16. This licence does not confer any rights under Landlord and Tenant Law and may be terminated by Dublin City Council on the giving of one months notice for any breach of the conditions of the licence. In this regard the licensee shall be required to sign a Deed of Renunciation.

- 17. Should Finglas United Youth and Football Club disband and no longer be an affiliated association football club, then the licence with Dublin City Council shall automatically terminate.
- 18. Each party shall be responsible for their own legal fees in this transaction.
- 19. During the term and at all times, the licensee is to observe and comply in all respects with the provisions and requirements of any and every enactment, regulation, statutory order, statutory instrument, government, departmental, EU, Local Authority Order, regulation or directive, including the recommendations and regulations of the Fire Authority, Health & Safety Authority, Office of Minister of Children and any recommendations and regulations as laid down from time to time by any appropriate body or authority and to indemnify Dublin City Council at all times against all proceedings, actions, costs, charges, claims, expenses, damages and liabilities losses and demands arising from the breach of this Clause.
- 20. The licence shall be subject to any other terms and conditions as deemed appropriate by the Council's Law Agent in Agreements of this type.
- 21. The licence shall be subject to the necessary statutory approvals and consents being obtained.

With reference to the Development Department Property Section Community Group Lettings/Licences

Historical Background

One of the functions of the City Council is to provide community facilities to the various community organisations such as Sports Clubs, Residents Associations, Youth Clubs etc. within its functional area so that they can carry out their various activities. In the late 1960s and early 70s in particular and possibly as a result of the expansion of the suburbs the City Council began disposing of sites to community organisations on long term leases.

In general the disposals were made by way of a Building Agreement and subsequent lease i.e. the Council provided the land and the community organisations through fundraising and in some cases grant aid from Dublin City Council and others built the premises. In return for this the Council gave the groups in question a long term lease (usually 99 years) subject to an open market rent but abated to a nominal rent so long as the premises was used for a specific community purpose.

Usually there were two bands of abatement. If there was a covenant in the lease prohibiting the organisation from selling alcohol on the premises then they were charged either €33.00 (£25.00) or €127 (£100). However if there was no such prohibition in the lease then that group were charged an abated rent of €1,270 (£1,000). As these are leases and so long as the groups abide by the covenants therein there is no scope to increase rent on these properties. It should be noted that in the more recent leases of this type the abated rent is indexed to the open market rent so if the open market rent increases the abated rent will also increase by the same percentage.

The benefit of the above to Dublin City Council was that there was no capital outlay in building the premises and secondly the maintenance of the facility once built rested with the groups themselves and not with Dublin City Council.

Move to Licences

More recently there has been a shift away from this method of disposal for a number of reasons. Firstly there just would not be the same number of sites available as there was previously. Secondly the Council has found it difficult to reassert its ownership over properties which have been given out for the benefit of the community where either the original entity to whom the property was leased is now defunct or where a dispute has arisen within the original group to whom the property was leased. Thirdly as a result of the recent

economic downturn there was a lot of property and sites left vacant and it was felt that it was better to put these to use even on a short term basis rather than leaving them idle.

As a result over the last number of years the Development Department's Property Section has tended to grant short term rolling licences (usually 11 months) to various community groups on the instruction of the Area Managers or Heads of Department. The benefit of this method to Dublin City Council is that there is no title transfer and a licence can be terminated quickly in the event that the Council requires the property back for another use or is unhappy with the service that is being provided by the group in situ.

Also as a further protection and to prevent groups from acquiring renewal rights by virtue of long occupation the Council now insist that all community groups sign a Deed of Renunciation renouncing any rights they may acquire to a new tenancy under Landlord and Tenant legislation.

Types of Community Group

There is no exact definition of what constitutes a Community Group Letting\Licence. In general the Property Management Section has worked on the basis that if the rent was abated it was considered a Community Group Letting\Licence. Originally and as mentioned this generally would have only included Sports Clubs, Residents Associations and Youth Clubs and groups of that nature.

However over the years this has expanded further to include NGOs, Childcare Facilities, Youth and Employment Centres and Educational Training Projects to name but a few and each letting\licence when created is categorised on the basis of what is contained in the Agreement e.g. is the rent abated, what is the property being used for, what type of group is the tenant etc.

The range of community groups that the Council now provide facilities to, make consistency in respect of the level of abatement to be applied very difficult as some of these groups have a better ability to pay a higher premium than others i.e. Those groups which tend to be government funded (usually through Pobal).

Types of Premises

The range of Council's facilities that have been let\licensed to community groups range from a room in a Council community centre to a purpose built community facility such as the MACRO Building to small development sites which are currently being used for community gardens.

Grant Aid

Whilst the Council has moved away from long term agreements over the last number of years it is important to bear in mind that in order to secure state funding (e.g. Lottery Grants etc.) the groups must be able to prove to the Minister firstly that they have title to the property for which they require funding and secondly where the funding is substantial that the property is capable of being charged which usually requires a tenure of more than 20 years.

Property Management Records

Oracle Property Manager is the Council's computer system which keeps the records of the Council's Commercial Property Portfolio. The Council's Commercial Property Portfolio is defined as properties which the Council own but are currently surplus to its day to day requirements i.e. properties not currently being used by Dublin City Council directly. Currently on Oracle Property Manager there are 278 records for Community Group Lettings\Licences.

The income currently generated from these Agreements amount to €247,365. As noted above most of these Agreements contain abated rents\fees and is not reflective of the true commercial value. The current open market value of these properties is estimated to amount

to €10M but is probably higher than this as the current open market value is not available to the Property Management Section for all these properties.

Please note the above records do not include Special Lettings granted by the Housing & Residential Services Department or lettings or licences granted by the Parks and Landscape Services Division in respect of facilities operated by them or other units within Culture, Recreation & Amenity.

Halloween

In an effort to minimise the amount of flammable material appearing on bonfires, the Public Domain Team and Housing Staff are currently distributing leaflets reminding residents of their legal responsibilities, under the Litter Pollution Act 1997, to ensure that waste disposed of, does not end up on an illegal bonfire. The damage caused to green spaces by illegal bonfires has also been highlighted.

In addition, visits have been carried out by the Public Domain Team, accompanied by Litter Wardens, to Industrial units around the NWA to inform businesses of their legal obligation to secure pallets and other flammables materials.

New legislation has been quoted in the leaflets that we are distributing, as follows:

Please note the Waste Management (Tyres and Waste Tyres) Regulations, 2017
which impose obligations on persons who supply tyres to the Irish market,
whether as retailers, importers or manufacturers and on persons who manage
waste tyres. These regulations are designed to maximise and reuse, recycling
and recovery of waste tyres.

The Public Domain Team is closely liaising with the Gardaí and other departments within DCC, to arrange to collect bonfire material prior to and on the day of Halloween itself. Additional resources have been secured to assist in bonfire clearances in the NWA over the Halloween weekend.

The Finglas "Fright Night" Halloween Festival will take place on the 31st October, commencing at 6pm at the Finglas Civic Centre. The Ballymun "Otherworld Festival" is also taking place at the Plaza on Main St, Ballymun. These events have, in previous years, been very successful in diverting young people away from illegal bonfires.



Control of Horses

A number of issues regarding stray horses in the North West Area have been reported to the Public Domain Unit. A number of anti-social and threatening incidents have occurred with Public Domain Staff and horse owners over the last number of weeks. The Public Domain Office has been in regular contact with the Control of Horses Section to arrange the removal of the reported stray horses in the area.

The previous Contractor withdrew from their contract in September. A new Contractor has now been appointed. The Finglas Area Office is arranging a meeting with the local Gardaí and the Control of Horses Section to put in place some health and safety controls and procedures to ensure an effective service.

Weed Spraying Programme

The weed spraying programme has been completed in the North West Area. Following inspection carried out by the Public Domain Office, we have signed off on this years programme. The Roads and Parks Departments are putting forward a proposal to ban weed spraying in the Dublin City Area from next year. We have no alternative method of weed control in place at the moment. The Public Domain Office will liaise with Roads and Parks Departments to try to establish a new method of weed control.

Dublin City Sport and Wellbeing Partnership Report

Physical Activity Leader (PALS) Workshops

An 8-week programme of workshops running in conjunction with Age & Opportunity to provide training, ideas and skills to people involved in older adult groups. The participants become Physical Activity Leaders (PALs) who can lead members of their own groups in fun games, dances and sports. Started 5th October and running every Thursday up to and including 23rd November.

Go for Life Games

Activities/games and social tea & chat for older adults takes place every Monday from 1pm - 2pm in Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex. All welcome to join in during these free sessions

Aquafit

Weekly sessions of water aerobics for older adults in Inspire Sports Complex, Cabra, in partnership with the Participation Officer from Swim Ireland. Sessions take place on Wednesdays at 12pm (€3.50pp). Due to the popularity of these sessions we are currently working to deliver a second weekly class.

Bowling

Weekly bowling for older adults takes place on Thursdays from 3pm - 5pm at Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex. All welcome (€2pp).

Senior Sports Halloween Event

A one day FREE event for older adults is taking place on Thursday 23rd October from 2pm - 5pm in Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex. All welcome. Participants can take part in a wide range of activities.

Swim Lessons

The local DCSWP Sports Officer is partnering with Cabra for Youth and the Swim Ireland Participation Officer to deliver swim lessons every Tuesdays from 8pm - 9pm in Sean McDermott Street Pool.

There are also swim lessons for 4th & 5th Classes from St. Peter's National School, Phibsborough, on Thursdays & Fridays in Sean McDermott Street Pool.

The **'Forever Fit'** Programme in Finglas commenced on September 18th and will continue through until December 2017. In conjunction with St. Helena's Resource Centre and Tír na nÓg group, a varied programme of activities will be delivered every

Monday & Wednesday between 2pm and 4pm. The programme is aimed at older adults and will focus on activities to improve balance, co-ordination and fall prevention. Activities include chair aerobics, tai chi and line dancing.

Whitehall Pétanque Group

The group meets every Wednesday morning in Ellenfield Park at the Pétanque court (near the astro pitches) from 10am - 11am. This is an older adult group who are always looking for new members to join them for a game and a chat in an informal and friendly atmosphere. Beginners welcome!

Men on the Move'

This programme will be delivered throughout October and November 2017. Aimed at increasing adult men's health, wellbeing and participation in physical activity, the programme will incorporate a variety of activities including functional movement circuits, walking football and tai chi .The programme is delivered in conjunction with the **Finglas Men's Shed**. Activities take place every Wednesday afternoon 3pm - 5pm in the Abigail Centre, Finglas.

GAGA programme (Getting All Girls Active)

This programme will begin in October and run through November 2017. The programme is aimed at teenage girls and will be run in conjunction with local youth services and schools. A wide variety of activities will be delivered as part of the programme including dancing, fencing, boxing, boot camp & adventure activities. Activities will take place at various venues (including Finglas Youth Resource Centre) and at different times including Tuesdays 7.30pm - 9.30pm, Wednesdays 2.30pm - 4.30pm.

A variety of midterm activities will take place throughout the Halloween break. This programme will be delivered in conjunction with local youth services in Finglas. Activities to include adventure activities, kayaking, rafting, rock climbing & boot camp.

Both **Ballymun and Finglas Sports & Fitness Centres** have commenced a full programme of swimming lessons this month.

Cabra Parkside Community Sports Complex will host a **Halloween Athletics Camp** for kids aged 4 years plus, from Tuesday 31st October to Friday 3rd November (9am – 1pm daily).

FAI/DCSWP Football Development Officers – Update

Late Night Leagues have recommenced for youths in the North West Area. The 7-week initiative commenced on Friday, October 13th and will run till late November in Trinity Comprehensive School, Ballymun, D9. A further Late Night League will run simultaneously in Rivermount Hall, Finglas.

A Post Primary Futsal Competition for first years will take place in Trinity Comprehensive School, Ballymun (boys) & Our Lady of Mercy School, Beaumont (girls) on Tuesday 17th October and Thursday 19th October respectively.

A Primary School Futsal Tournament will take place on Tuesday 21st November in Trinity Comprehensive (for schools in the Finglas/Ballymun area).

Boxing

The AIBA/DCSWP Boxing Development Officer for the area has now commenced the rollout of the '**Startbox Silver**' programme in both Primary and Secondary (TY level) schools in the Finglas, Ballymun and Whitehall areas. More intense than the non-contact

'bronze' programme, young people will experience wearing a gum shield and headgear for the first time, while practicing giving and taking modified punches to the body only.

In November we will commence our Gold Sessions for some of the more talented students, who will train at the High Performance Gym at the National Stadium, with a view to an exhibition bout against a well-matched opponent, in the Showcase Finals in December.

Rowing

Get Going ... Get Rowing

This initiative, jointly supported by DCSWP, Sport Ireland, Healthy Ireland, Active School Flag & Trinity College, has been successfully rolled out for a number of years by Rowing Ireland's Leinster Women's Development Officer, Michelle Carpenter. This is a 4/6 week school's programme for girls (second level). Rowing Ireland provide rowing machines and a community coach to the schools.

A Transition Year Programme gives students the opportunity to get on the first step of the coaching ladder and enables them to be involved in a youth leadership role, working in a fun and interactive environment with younger students and hence, bringing value to the school.

Olympic Values Education Programme (accompanies above programme)

1. Community Update

General Community

Community team members attended the following meetings: Axis Events Meetings, Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre, Otherworld Festival Meetings, Setanta GAA, Aisling Poppintree, Acorn Empowerment, Santry Community Centre, Poppintree Community Centre, Muck and Magic Community Garden, Sports Development Officers.

Social Inclusion

Older Persons

Community team members linked with the following groups: Active Living, Positive Aging Committee, Solas, St Pappin's Bowling Group, BADIG, Age Friendly Alliance Group.

Ladies Groups

Ongoing support was provided to the Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre as they continue to grow their user groups. Community team members provided ongoing support to Sillogue Ladies Group as they plan for their Witches Brew Café in the Otherworld 2017 and Christmas Craft Activities. Team members also liaised with Ballymun All Sorts Ladies Group in relation to Otherworld and Christmas Activities.

Men's Sheds

Continued meetings took place with the Ballymun Men's Shed Association and DCU in relation to the proposed refurbishment of Buildings in DCU Community Garden to house the Ballymun Shed. Continued meetings took place with the Irish Men's Shed Association including attendance and assistance with the AGM which took place in the Ballymun Civic Offices Council Chambers on Friday the 15th September.

Mental Health

Team members attended the Mojo Inter-Agency Group meeting and liaised with the Acorn Empowerment Group around their mental health support group.

Environmental

The Community team worked alongside the Public Domain staff to organise and run the annual City Neighbourhood Awards Ceremony which took place on Thursday the 7th September in the atrium of the Ballymun Civic Offices. The event was very successful with many of the major awards being won by Ballymun Community Groups. Further wins were secured at the Awards Final in Croke Park on Thursday the 21st September including the D11 Transformers (representing the Poppintree Courts in Ballymun) who triumphed to become the overall winner in the Residential Section, the Rediscovery Centre who came second in the Business Environmental and Sustainability Initiative. Doon Court Environmental Group and Knowth and Druid Court also picked up major gongs for their environmental endeavours. Ongoing meetings took place with Public Domain staff also in relation to local environmental initiatives and distribution of planters, blue bags, brushes etc.

Events

Continued meetings have taken place with the Otherworld Working Group as we work towards the biggest and best Otherworld Festival ever. Along with the usual spooktacular fun activities such as Circus Gerbola, Fireworks, Main Stage Area, new developments this year include a revamped interactive all singing and dancing zombie parade, story telling sessions in Muck and Magic Community Garden, the premier of new theatre production 'Glimmer' in

Axis Ballymun, a craft tent, a spooky tunnel, a bigger 'Witches Brew Café', a Zombie Enclosure and a new music tent that will showcase new local talent and feature a live broadcast from Near FM. The working group is made up of representatives from Axis Ballymun, DCC Community team members, BRYR, Poppintree Youth Project, Youthreach Ballymun, Aisling Transition, B4B, Sillogue Ladies Club, Ballymun All Sorts Parents Group, Ballymun Community Gardens, Ballymun Men's Shed Association and local community artists.

Positive Aging Week took place from Monday the 25th September until Wednesday the 4th October with the committee organising events and activities on behalf of approx 150-200 older persons from Ballymun, Whitehall and Santry. Highlights included the Mystery Tour to Lough Rinn Castle, Theatre Production Radio Rosario at Axis Theatre, Ballroom of Romance at Setanta GAA and a Red Hurley Concert at Marewood Court.

A Sports Expo for Ballymun and surrounding area was organised by the Sports Development Officers and the Community Team Members. This took place on Saturday the 23rd September in Poppintree Community Centre from 12pm-4pm. Although 11 sports organisations/community groups had originally signed up to showcase at the event, only 5 ended up there on the day. A lot of work went into the organising of the event, however, it was not well attended by local people which might mean either the day did not suit local people or that local people are already very aware of local Sports and Leisure Clubs/Organisations.

2. Housing/Estate Management Updates

C.C.T.V

The C.C.T.V system is working well. The work on upgrading the system is continuing on a phased basis throughout the year - this includes replacing some cameras and upgrading the control room. We are at present working with the Parks Section on identifying trees which are restricting the images the cameras are receiving. These trees will be pruned in the coming weeks.

Cleansing / Waste Management

Waste Management and the Area Office are continuing to combat illegal dumping at open spaces. These measures include using the C.C.T.V system to monitor and identify those responsible. The area office has targeted illegal dumping around Carton, Whiteacre and Knowth Court and tenants have been called for interview and warned about their behaviour.

A number of short videos were produced featuring Gateway Student Village, Metro Hotel, Funky Monkey, Super Valu, Axis and Setanta Strings. These videos highlighted Ballymun as a great place to do business, live, work and the great community spirit that exists in Ballymun.

With further reference to the proposed disposal of land at Balcurris Road/Main Street, Ballymun, Dublin 11.

·

Report No.57/2017 which was assented to by the City Council at its meeting on 6th February 2017 contained a proposal to dispose of lands at Balcurris Road / Main Street, Ballymun, Dublin 11 to Lidl Ireland GMBH subject to terms and conditions.

The legal formalities have not yet been completed and agreement has now been reached with the proposed purchaser in respect of a proposal to dispose of additional adjoining land which abuts the Ballymun Horizon Building. The subject land is shown outlined in red on Map Index No SM-2017-0613-001, a copy of which is submitted with this report.

Accordingly, it is now proposed to dispose of this land to Lidl Ireland GMBH subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. That the property is located at Balbutcher Lane/Balcurris Road, Ballymun, Dublin 11 and has an area of approximately 0.013 ha/0.032 acres or thereabouts and is shown outlined in red on Map Index No SM-2017-0613-001.
- 2. That the disposal price shall be the sum of €26,000 (twenty six thousand euro) plus VAT, payable in the following manner:
 - a) 20% upon signing of the Agreement for Lease. A draft Agreement for Lease shall be issued to the proposed purchaser within two (2) weeks of Council approval to the disposal of the site. The proposed purchaser will endeavour to sign and return the Agreement for Lease in the form to the vendor's Solicitor within fifteen (15) working days of issue;
 - b) Eighty percent (80%) upon grant of leasehold title of the property to the proposed purchaser by the Council.

A 12% p.a. interest rate shall apply to any outstanding sums after they became due under the agreements.


- 3. That the proposed purchaser is Lidl Ireland GMBH.
- 4. That the vendor holds full unencumbered registered Freehold Title in the entire together with full vacant possession. The proposed purchaser's solicitors must be fully satisfied that the vendor has proven good and marketable title to the property.
- 5. That the disposal is subject to the receipt of satisfactory planning permission in a form acceptable to the proposed purchaser, for a mixed use scheme in conjunction with the adjoining Council site, located to the north and east ("the adjoining site") and which has an area of approximately three acres or thereabouts.
- 6. That this transaction is subject to all of the remaining terms and conditions (as appropriate) as set out in Report No.57/2017, for the adjoining site.
- 7. That prior to lodging a planning application for the subject site and the adjoining site, the proposed purchaser shall consult and obtain a written agreement from the occupiers and the managers of the Horizons Building. The Horizons Building is owned by Dublin City Council. Ballymun Horizons Company Limited manage the building and it is currently occupied by Ballymun Youth Action Project Limited and The Star Project Ballymun Limited.
- 8. That the proposed purchaser shall satisfy the Council that it has adequate public liability and employers liability insurance and shall indemnify the City Council against any claims for compensation that may be made arising from its usage of the site. The current levels of insurance are €6.5m public liability insurance and €13m employer's liability insurance.
- 9. That prior to entry on the subject site to commence construction of the approved development, the proposed purchaser shall consult and agree all aspects of the construction project that will impact on the Horizon Building including, inter alia, entry on site, timelines, erection of scaffolding, construction details etc.
- 10. That prior to the commencement of construction works, a dilapidation report and monitoring regime shall be agreed between the proposed purchaser and Dublin City Council for the Horizons Building. The proposed purchaser shall be liable for remedying any damage or defects caused to the Horizon Building, as a result of the building works.
- 11. That the proposed purchaser and his design team shall indemnify Dublin City Council against any claim for compensation which may be made by any party arising out of the building works being carried out on the site, or any working areas or on any access points thereto.
- 12. That title to be granted upon practical completion will be a 500 year lease. The subject property and the adjoining site shall be merged into one lease.

The dates for the performance of any of the requirements of the proposed agreement may be amended at the absolute discretion of the Assistant Chief Executive.

The disposal shall be subject to any such covenants and conditions as the Law Agent in his discretion shall stipulate.

With reference to the proposed grant of licence for use as a car park of land at New St.Margaret's Road, Ballymun, Dublin 11.

A licence was granted to IKEA Ireland Limited for the use of land adjacent to IKEA at New St.Margaret's Road, Ballymun as a temporary car park. The licence expired on 13th May 2016 and terms and conditions have now been agreed in relation to the granting of a further licence. The area to be licensed is shown outlined in red and coloured pink on Map Index No SM-2017-0602, a copy of which is submitted with this report.

It is therefore proposed to grant a licence of this site to IKEA Ireland Limited subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. That the licensed property comprises a car park located adjacent to IKEA, on New St. Margaret's Road in Ballymun, which is shown outlined in red and coloured pink on Map Index No SM-2017-0602.
- 2. That the licence shall be a 2 year licence agreement commencing on 14th May 2016.
- 3. That the licensed property shall be used solely for parking by IKEA customers, at weekends (Saturday & Sunday) and Bank Holidays only; and only during the Licensee's store opening times.
- 4. That the licence fee shall be €660 (six hundred & sixty euro) plus VAT, per month; payable in advance on the first day of each month by standing order or electronic funds transfer.
- 5. That the licensee shall be responsible for all outgoings associated with its use of the licensed property including taxes, rates, utilities and waste disposal.
- 6. That either party is entitled to terminate the licence at any time upon giving one calendar months prior written notice.

- 7. That the licensee shall indemnify Dublin City Council against any and all claims arising from its use of the property. Public Liability Insurance (minimum of €6.5 million) and Employers Liability Insurance (minimum of €13 million) shall be required.
- 8. That the licensee shall not assign, sublet or part with possession of the property or any part thereof.
- 9. That the licensee shall repair and maintain the property including, inter alia, all fences and lighting, in good and substantial repair and condition and to the same standard as the car park of the Licensee's store.
- 10. That the licensee shall repair any damage caused to the property as a result of, and during its use of the property.
- 11. That the licensee shall keep and yield up the property clean, tidy and free of litter.
- 12. That the licensee shall be responsible for all security matters during its permitted times of use.
- 13. That the licensee shall not carry out any structural alterations to the property.
- 14. That the Council and its nominees shall have access to, and use of the property, at all times on Mondays through to Fridays, excluding Bank Holidays. After such use the Council shall leave the property clean and tidy.
- 15. That the licence agreement shall contain covenants and conditions as normally contained in agreements of this type.
- 16. That each party shall be responsible for their own fees and costs incurred in this matter.



With reference to the proposed grant of lease of Workshop 1, Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre, Ballymun, Dublin 11

Quinns Convenience Store Limited currently holds leases in a number of retail Units at Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre and has also been granted successive licence agreements for storage purposes in Workshop 1 Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre. The last of these licence agreements terminated on the 31st November 2015.

The Chief Valuer has now agreed terms in relation to the granting of a lease in workshop 1 Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre, which is shown outlined red and coloured pink on Map Index No.SM-2016-0056, with a right of way shown coloured yellow, a copy of which is submitted with this report.

It is therefore proposed to grant a lease of Workshop 1 Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre, Ballymun, Dublin 11, to Quinns Convenience Store Limited subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. That the lease shall be for a term of five years from the 1 December 2015.
- 2. That the rent shall be €5,880 (five thousand eight hundred and eighty euro) per annum, payable quarterly in advance by standing order or electronic funds transfer.
- 3. That the subject property shall be used solely for storage purposes, during the hours of 8.30 am to 10 pm daily.
- 4. That the tenant shall be responsible for all outgoings associated with its use of the subject property including, inter alia, service charges, taxes, rates, utilities and waste disposal.


- 5. That the tenant shall be responsible for internally repairing and insuring the subject property.
- 6. That the tenant shall be responsible for fully insuring the property and shall indemnify Dublin City Council against any and all claims arising from its use of the property. Public Liability Insurance (minimum of €6.5 million) and Employers Liability Insurance (minimum of €13 million) shall be required.
- 7. That the tenant shall not assign or sublet without the prior written consent of the Landlord.
- 8. That the tenant shall not carry out any structural alterations or erect any external signage without the prior written consent from the Landlord.
- 9. That the tenant shall leave the building clean and tidy upon termination of this lease.
- 10. That the applicant shall ensure that the rear access gate, without hindrance to the business activities of other tenants in Poppintree Lane, is secured and locked by 7pm seven days a week.
- 11. That the lease will be subject to any other terms and conditions as deemed appropriate by the Council's Law Agent.
- 12. That the applicant shall sign a Renunciation of Rights to a New Tenancy.
- 13. That the applicant shall be responsible for the payment of any Stamp Duty and VAT liability that may arise on the creation of this lease.
- 14. That each party shall be responsible for their own fees and costs incurred in this matter.

The disposal shall be subject to any such covenants and conditions as the Law Agent in his discretion shall stipulate.
