- a Motion in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland
The North Central Area Committee notes with concern the significant restriction in the blue bag scheme that allows local residents gather local green waste from public areas in particular leaf fall in autumn. This service allows local residents to contribute to both the safety of local footpaths and to the cleanliness of the public realm and therefore support our local public realm and parks teams.

Acknowledging that the blue bag scheme will remain open to local residents groups 'known' to the local area office, this committee seeks that the North Central Community Section to establish a Blue Bag Register whereby local groups can make themselves know to the Community Section and register their details with them so as to avail of the scheme. That included in this new initiative would be an advisory role whereby local residents can be communicated with and advised as to how they might from a group so as to avail of the scheme.
- b Motion in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland
Noting the generic responsibility that Dublin City Council and by default each local area office has with regard to environmental issues, the North Central Area Committee notes the lack of grass cutting on the lands at St. Paul's school now in ownership of Crekav Landbank Developments Ltd. and the negative impact the high growing grass will have on the ability of the soon returning Brent geese to feed. Therefore, the North Central Area Committee calls on the Area Manager and the CEO to write to Crekav Landbank Developments Ltd. demanding that the grass be cut so as to protect and prepare the environment required by the Brent Geese, and that these communications be copied to the Minister Josepha Madigan at the Department of Arts Culture and the Gaeltacht, who has responsibility for parks and wildlife.
- c Motion in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland
The North Central Area Committee recognises that acutely high levels of families and single people waiting on social housing lists within its main catchment area, AREA B. The North Central Area Committee notes the proposal to sell off some of our waste management, housing management and other depots (Report 161/2018 to July DCC meeting) to fund the

depot consolidation project. These targeted depots include the waste management depot on the Kilmore Rd at Cromcastle Court. While the North Central Area Committee recognises the benefits of consolidating services into a more efficient plant it rejects the selling off of the Cromcastle Court depot particularly given it's location next to (if not in the grounds of) the Cromcastle Court complex. The recent partial collapse of the stairwell in Block 8 of this Complex has risen its status to that of regeneration. The North Central Area Committee therefore calls on DCC CEO to remove the Cromcastle Court depot from the list of depots for disposal and instead include it in the Cromcastle Court Regeneration Project as additional land for this project.

- d **Motion in the name of Councillor Deirdre Heney**
That the Manager, in relation to the proposal to construct a neighbourhood centre on the green space at Greendale, Kilbarrack, outline the reasons why the previously designed and agreed upgrade and extension of the already existing community centre on Greendale Road is no longer being pursued, say if he has totally ruled out the extension works to the existing facility, say if he is aware of the concerns of local residents facing the green and in particular, say if he is aware that building the proposed neighbourhood centre could be in breach of the Habitats Directive in relation to wildlife and in particular the displacement of Brent Geese that graze on this space.

That this area committee notes the proposal from the National Transport Authority to radically alter the bus routes serving the North Central Area. We note with particular concern the proposed loss of direct routes to the city centre affecting residents in Ard Na Greine, Edenmore, Harmonstown, Darndale, Bonnybrook, Kilmore and Artane. We support the initiative of residents and public representatives to form campaigns to direct pressure on the National Transport Authority to preserve city centre routes for all of these communities.

With reference to the proposed grant of Lease of the premises 55 Gracefield Road, Artane, Dublin 5 to Tus Nua Artane Coolock Family Resource Centre Company CLG

By way of lease datd 10th February 2015 the premises at 55 Gracefield Road, Artane, Dublin 5, shown coloured pink with right of way for access purposes shown yellow on Map Index No. SM2011-0559, was demised by Dublin City Council to Tus Nua Artane Coolock Family Resource Centre CLG (formerly Artane Coolock Resource & Development Centre Limited) for a term of 3 years from 1st October 2013. The Lease expired on 30th September 2016.

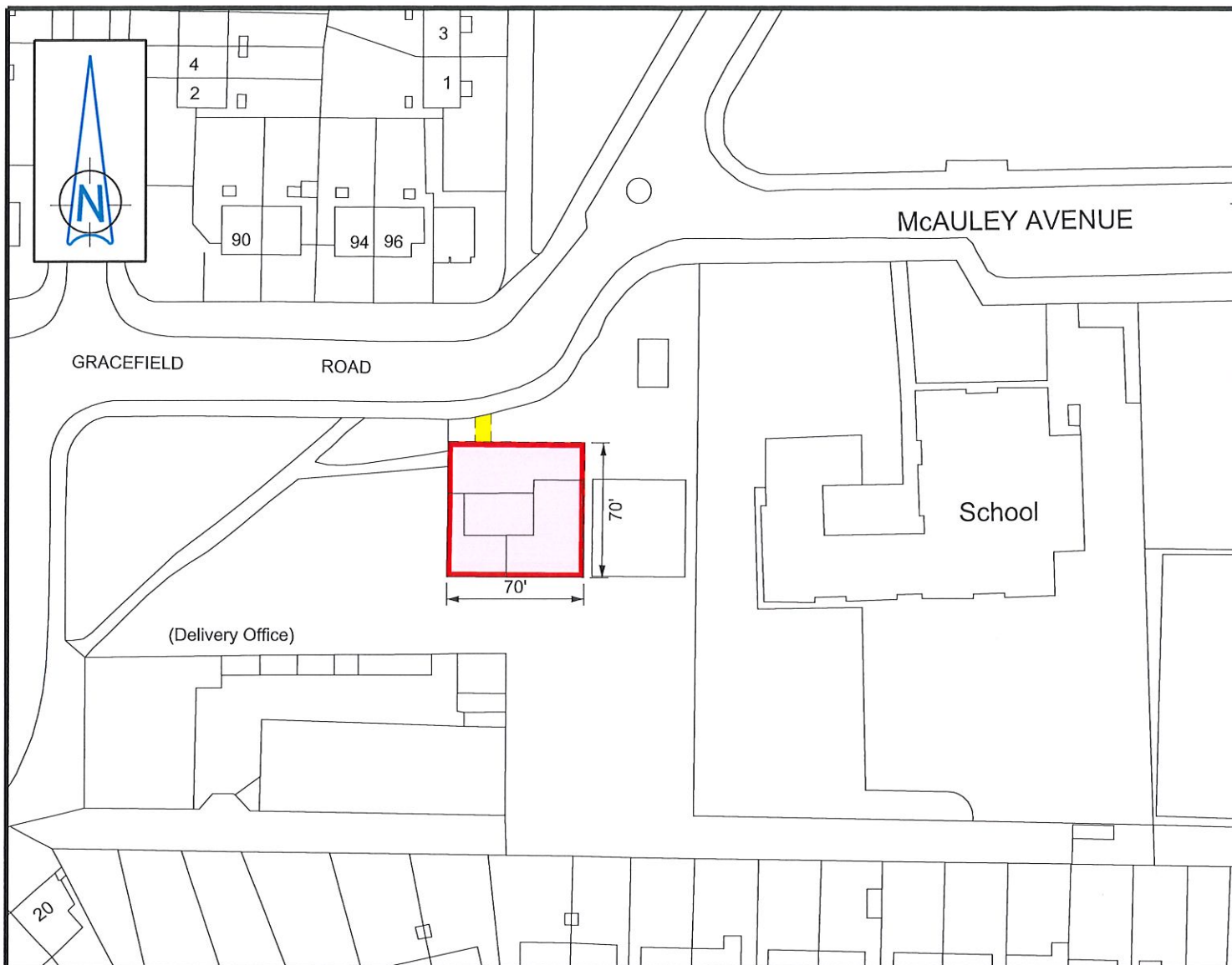
The Chief Valuer has reported that he has reached agreement for the grant of a further lease of 55 Gracefield Road subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The site to be leased is at 55 Gracefield Road as outlined in red on attached Map Index No: SM2011-0559.
2. That the Council shall grant Tus Nua Artane Coolock Family Resource Centre CLG a lease for a term of 5 years commencing on the 1st October 2016.
3. The annual market rent reserved shall be the sum of €12,000 (twelve thousand euro). This rent reserved shall be abated to €3,000 (three thousand euro) per annum in accordance with term 10 "Use" below.
4. The lessee shall be responsible for any V.A.T or other taxes due to the creation of this lease (if applicable).
5. The Lessee will comply at all times with the requirements of the Local Government (Planning and Development Acts 1963-2000, the Planning and Development Act 2000, the Building Control Act 1990, Building Regulations 1991-12994 and the Building Control Regulations 1997 and any amendments or re-enactments currently in force, or to be re-enacted in the future in respect of the said Acts and Regulations.
6. That any signage if permitted shall be subject to Council approval and shall be in accordance with the specifications of the Council.
7. That the lessee shall be prohibited from erecting any mast on the demised property.

8. That the lessee shall not carry out any alteration or development of the property or erect any structure or make any excavation without the prior written consent of the Council.
9. That the applicant shall comply at all times with the requirements of all present and future Waste Management and Litter Pollution legislation.
10. That the demised premises shall be used solely by the lessee for the purposes of a Family Resource Centre. In the event of the demise ceasing to be used for such purposes it shall revert free of charge to the Council or to the appropriate open market yearly rent as determined by the Council's Valuer.
11. That the lessee shall be responsible for the internal and external repair and maintenance of the demised property.
12. An authorised Council Official shall be permitted to enter onto the property at any time and view the state and condition of the property and if necessary prepare a schedule of dilapidations and the necessary works (if any) shall be carried out by the Lessee within a reasonable period of time as stated by the Council.
13. That the lessee shall not sell, assign, grant any sub interests, sub-divide, alienate or part with the possession of the subject property without the prior written consent of the Council. In the event that any part of the property is assigned or sublet, the open market yearly rent reserved under the lease shall be payable to the Council.
14. That the lessee shall insure and keep insured the property in a sum equivalent to the full replacement value, at all times in the joint names of the Council and the lessee against loss or damage by fire or other cause in an established insurance office to be approved by the Council and to pay all premiums or such sum of money necessary for that purpose and within 7 days after the same has become payable to produce to the Council the policy or policies of such insurance and the receipt for every such payment. In the event of loss or damage by fire or other cause, the lessee are obliged to reinstate the property and every part thereof to it's original state. Or in the alternative in the event of Dublin City Council insuring the property reimburse the Council the proportion of insurance applicable to the percentage of the property occupied by the Lessee.
15. That the lessee shall indemnify the Council in respect of any claims for injury or damage to any person or property through the use of the property.
16. The lessee shall be responsible for the payment of all outgoing including rates, charges, fees, electricity bills etc. that may become due on the premises during the period of the lease
17. That in the event of the Lessee failing to comply with any of the terms, conditions, warranties, covenants or the obligations and stipulations herein contained or becoming dissolved or going into liquidation, the Council may revoke this Agreement by giving the Lessees notice in writing to that effect or unless otherwise stated in such Notice, this agreement shall cease immediately upon such Notice having been given.
18. That the letting can be terminated by either party on giving the other one months notice in writing.

19. That the tenant will be required to sign a Deed of Renunciation as part of this agreement.
20. That the Lessee shall include any amendments and/or other conditions as are deemed appropriate by the Council or Law Agent.
21. That each party shall be responsible for their own costs in this matter.
22. That the Council shall retain a right to wayleaves for no consideration, through any lands included in the lease or any related areas.

Role of the Elected Members in the Planning Process

The elected members have a statutory responsibility for the following in the planning process ie reserved functions:

City Development Plan

Review, make and vary City Development Plan (including Architectural Conservation Areas).

Strategic Development Zones

Make subject to variations and modifications a draft planning scheme.

Local Area Plans

Elected members make, amend or revoke a Local Area Plan.

Resolution must be passed by not less than half the members of the planning authority.

Record of Protected Structures

Make additions and deletions to the record of protected structures.

Area of Special Planning Control

Make, amend or revoke a special planning control scheme for an ACA or for part of an ACA.

While it is the function of the elected members to make statutory plans for the city including the development plan, planning schemes for strategic development zones and local area plans, it is the function of the executive to implement these plans through the development management process. In this regard elected members are entitled to make submissions and to

be kept informed on particular applications but responsibility for deciding on planning applications (excluding SHDs and SIDs) rests clearly with the Chief Executive or an officer to whom the function has been delegated.

In relation to Strategic Housing Development applications the elected members views are communicated to An Bord Pleanala.

Part 8 Applications

Approval or rejection of a Part 8 (local authority development/works) proposal.

Development Contributions

Make and review development contribution schemes.

DUBLIN SPORTSFEST 2018

From the 23rd to the 30th of September, 2018, the first ever Dublin Sportsfest will bring together the people, the clubs, the sports and the spaces of Dublin in a celebration of sport and physical activity in our City.

The appetite for sport & sporting events amongst Irish people is the stuff of legend. Sport is part of the fabric of our society. We are the best fans in the world and will always back our local & national teams or individuals to the hilt.

However, if this enthusiasm went further, and translated to more sustainable participation in sport AND general physical activity, we could then truly call ourselves an active nation in line with some of our European neighbours. In turn, the people living in, working in & visiting Dublin City could say they belong to an 'active city'!

Dublin City Sport & Wellbeing Partnership's flagship event will take place during the European Week of Sport (September 23rd – 30th). The festival will comprise of a week-long programme of innovative events & promotions across many of the sports clubs resident in the City in addition to Dublin City Council's facilities, parks and urban spaces. The focus will be on encouraging sustainable participation across all ages, backgrounds & abilities. The vast majority of events & activities will be free of charge!

Our partners include Dublin City Council Sport & Recreation Services, Dublin Festival of History (Public Libraries), Cycling Ireland (Great Dublin Bike Ride), Parkrun, Junior Parkrun, Ireland Active, Sport Ireland, NEIC, Ballyfermot Youth Service and a large number of National & Regional Governing Bodies for various sports. This is in addition to a host of sports clubs from across the city. The list continues to grow all the time!

In an age of individualism where time is at a premium and community spirit is on the wane, we are asking the people of Dublin to make some me time to get involved in Dublin Sportsfest. By doing so you will meet new people and improve your health, fitness & general wellbeing.

Launch

Dublin Sportsfest was officially launched on Tuesday, September 4th in Irishtown Stadium by the Lord Mayor, Nial Ring. The Ombudsman for Children, Dr. Niall Muldoon, was also in attendance. The venue was a hive of activity on the morning with children from local schools and some older adult groups invited along to participate in the numerous taster activities and provide a flavour of what Dublin Sportsfest is all about.

We also had a number of Dublin-based national sporting personalities on hand to speak to the media and generate lots of excitement as part of their role as Dublin Sportsfest ambassadors. The launch was deemed to be a great success and let's hope the week of Sportsfest itself follows suit.

- **Website & Calendar of Events:**

DCSWP is currently working with Dublin City Council's Web Unit to populate the site with information on the full programme of events across the week. Although the programme of events will continue to evolve right up until Sportsfest week itself, the bulk of the information (all correct and double checked!) was up on the site in time for the launch on Sept. 4th

- **Pre-Existing Events:**

We are delighted to confirm that the Great Dublin Bike Ride, the Laser Run World Championships & Parkrun/Junior Parkrun have all formally agreed to allow us to market their events as part of Dublin Sportsfest. We will look to 'turn Parkrun blue' on Wednesday 29th September by encouraging participants in Parkruns across the city to wear blue for Sportsfest.

- **DCC Facilities & NGB Participation:**

All DCC sport & recreation facilities have been informed that there is an expectation on them to participate in the week by delivering an innovative event, open day or special promotion. The week is an opportunity for them to showcase their facility & avail of the marketing and promotional push that Dublin Sportsfest will hopefully bring. The majority of centres have now put action plans in place.

All National Governing Bodies for the various sports were contacted to see if they will get involved. The response to date has been positive with the FAI, Volleyball Ireland, Leinster Cricket, Tennis Ireland, Rowing Ireland, Leinster Rugby, Ladies Gaelic Football & Tug of War all due to take part in some form.

- **Response from Clubs to Date:**

We hope to add a few more between now and the commencement of Dublin Sportsfest.

HIGHLIGHT EVENTS

Please see below a flavour of some of the bigger events planned:

- **Lord Mayor's Liffey Bridge Paddle** – In partnership with our friends in Ballyfermot Youth Service Adventure Centre, this event will consist of a 10k looped paddle starting and finishing in Poolbeg Yacht & Boat Club, Ringsend. The event will take place on Saturday 29th September (11am – 4pm). The route will take participants under many of Dublin's iconic bridges with Grattan Bridge beside Civic Offices the designated turning point. It will be open to any craft that use a paddle such as kayaks – river and sea, canoes, sit-on-tops, stand –up paddle boards and rafts. This event is FREE and open to the general public - however all participants must pre-register via Clearbookings and satisfy the organisers they have the sufficient ability to participate (a Level 2 Kayak Cert will be the minimum requirement). Although they are not paddle craft, we will issue a special invite to a number of local rowing and dragonboat clubs to participate in order to add to the spectacle. BYS will also be responsible for promoting amongst other youth services & kayaking/rowing clubs citywide in an effort to recruit participants & additional craft. For any would-be participants who do not own or have access to a craft, we will enter an agreement with a kayak rental company to help provide a solution.
- **Dockland's FITFEST @ Grand Canal Quay – Thursday 27th September** (National Fitness Day). Run in partnership with Ireland Active, this will be a day of activities promoted by DCSWP as part of the overall Sportfest promotion and by Ireland Active as part of the National Fitness day initiative.
- **Sports Stadium @ Dalymount Park – Monday 24th September.** The main theme of this event is inclusion to coincide with Social Inclusion Week. Events will be aimed at older adults, school children, migrant groups, people with mental health issues and those suffering with intellectual disabilities. Partners for the event include the FAI, Bohemians FC – More than a Club Foundation and possibly D.I.T Grangegorman.
- **Glow Sports – Friday 28th September.** DCSWP has purchased two glow packs to deliver a number of 'glow events' during the week of Sportsfest and beyond. A glow football event will be held on the evening of Friday 28th September,
- **Sports History - Saturday 29th September.** As part of the Festival of History a talk on the impact of World War 1 on Sport in Ireland will take place in Pearse St. Library. A Sports History Cycling Tour around some venues of interest in Dublin City will also take place on the evening of Monday, Sept 24th. Details and logistics are currently being finalised.
- **City Hall Yoga – Monday 24th – Thursday 27th September.** Six free classes will take place across Sportsfest week in the City Hall Rotunda.
- **Girls Fest 5's – Friday 28th September.** A 5-a-side tournament aimed at girls born in 2007/8/9 will be held in Irishtown in partnership with the FAI

SPORT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE – SMALL GRANTS SCHEME

Grants were advertised in mid-May via email to clubs and sports contacts, newspaper advertisement and via social media. Deadline for receipt of applications was Friday, June 29th 2018 at 4pm.

Applications were open to Sports Clubs and Organisations within the Dublin City Area affiliated to a National Governing Body providing opportunities for young people aged 10 -21 yrs of age to participate in sport & physical activity.

120 applications were received and 112 were approved for payment. To date 80% of these payments were made in August with the remainder due to be paid in September.

BIKE FOR LIFE (CORE)

Under Active Adults

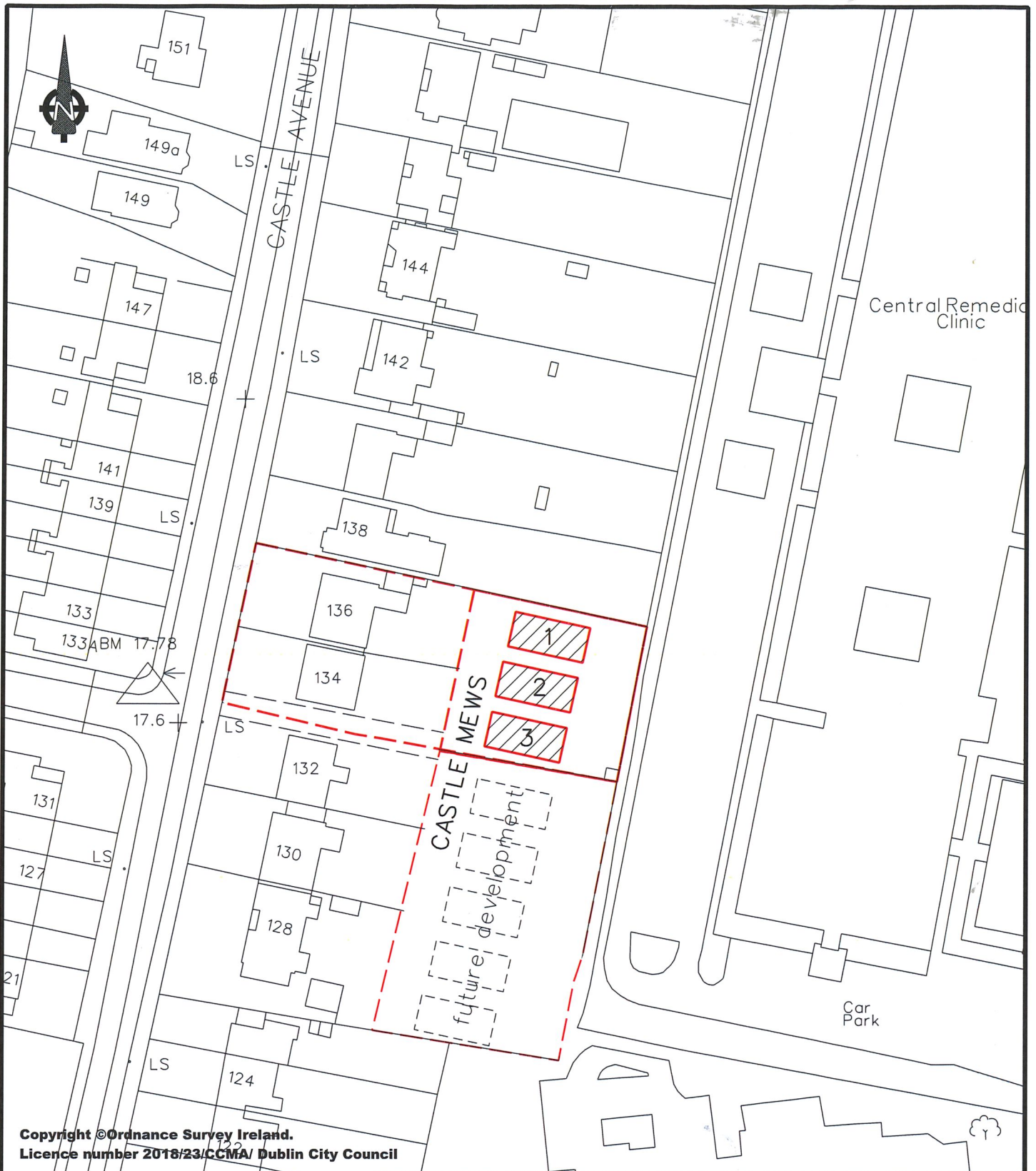
