

Abandoned Bicycles Update

Abandoned bikes continue to be removed throughout the South East area, in accordance with the procedure adopted by the Transportation SPC.

In 2018, a total of **257 bikes** were deemed abandoned and tagged for removal.

187 tagged bicycles were removed by Dublin City Council

270 tagged bikes were removed by the owners.

29 tagged bikes removed were in the Rathgar/Rathmines Ward

158 tagged bikes removed were in the Pembroke/South Dock Ward primarily in the City Centre area.
