## MINUTES OF THE NORTH CENTRAL AREA JPC MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 21 JANUARY 2019

#### 1 Minutes of meeting held on 15th October 2018 (attached)

Order: Agreed

#### Presentation by National Justice Office on current practices -Superintendent Colm Healy

**Order:** Inspector Colm Healy gave a presentation on the Garda Youth Diversion Programme followed with a question and answers. This is a programme aimed at keeping children ages 10 years to 18 years old out of the Criminal Justice System. Dublin, Galway and Limerick are the busiest areas. 61% of children that go through this programme have one offence and only 10% go to court.

#### 3 Garda Report -

Order: The Garda discussed the statistics for DMR North.

There is a Major issue of illegal dumping at Moatview/Belcamp and the Travellers site. Deputy Broughan advised there was a similar issue about 10 years ago. Dave Dinnigan advised it is a challenge, DCC staff have been threatened and there is massive scale dumping. The cost of disposal is very high, over 100k has been spent on services to remove the dumping. DCC looked at CCTV, facial recognition at night is difficult a long term plan would be to develop out the site. The Coolock guards will link in with Waste Enforcement.

Cllr O'Moore referred to an incident in Edenmore. Superintendent O'Connor advised specific incidents will not be discussed at JPC Meetings. Cllr's spoke regarding the increase of cocaine use in the area. Superintendent Colm Healy spoke regarding SOLAS which manages, co-ordinate's and support's the delivery of an integrated Further Education and Training strategy for young people, this has been very successful with regard to young offenders. The Sector policing introduced in Darndale, Clongriffin and Edenmore has been very successful with high intensity garda patrols.

Superintendent O'Connor advised regarding how drugs have become cheaper and easier to buy. Chief Super Intendent Curran advised cocaine as seen as recreational, it is now more of a problem than drink. Superintendent O'Connor spoke regarding the increase in assault causing harm at GAA sporting events and how the GAA need to take a more proactive approach.

Inspector Francis advised there will be 10 new Garda assigned from Ballymun Garda Station to Santry Garda Station by the end of January. Santry Garda Station is managed by the Superintendent in Ballymun. Online fraud has increased 110%. It is not necessarily Irish people carrying out this fraud but mainly international groups. The new boundaries between North Central Area and North West Area will come into effect after the local elections on 24h May 2019.

4 Update on Garda resources to include replacement for Inspector Healy, and Community Garda (requested by Cllr. O Toole at last JPC meeting)

**Order:** 2 Garda Inspectors and 3 Sergeants have been assigned to the NCA in the last week. Inspector Brian Clune has replaced inspector Healy and has been appointed to Darndale.

  - Motion (Cllr O Brien) referred to from NCA December 2018 Area Committee (Motion 6a attached).

**Order**: This is an ongoing issue; crime figures are low in comparison to the Coolock District. Priority would be for a new enhanced Garda Coolock headquarters with additional resources. The projected population of the North Fringe will be 50,000. Cllr O'Brien queried did the original North Fringe LAP include a Garda station.

#### **Donaghmede Safety Forum**

The most recent meeting of the Donaghmede Safety Forum was held on the 6<sup>th</sup> of March 2019 and was well attended by representatives from local resident groups. Garda Jacinta Naughton and Garda Ronan Murphy attended the Fora on behalf of Coolock Garda Station. DCC area Councillors also attend meetings.

Public domain, road maintenance, traffic and parking enforcement issues were among the subjects raised by the attendees at the most recent meeting. Residents continue to raise concerns about Howth Junction station and DCC work in conjunction with larnród Eireann, as do the Gardaí (i.e regular joint meetings held to address same Gardai/larnrod personnel) While anti-social behaviour is sporadic, it still remains the main concern of residents alongside the internal of the station ref activity on the footbridge. Howth Junction Donaghmede DART station falls under the remit of 3 Garda Stations.

At the most recent meeting Residents advised that 35 homeowners in Grange Woodbine estates have had sensor lights installed outside their homes this winter, as a result of advice /information recommendation of the Gardaí attending the Fora. This is a positive outcome.

The North Central Area continues to support Donaghmede and its local environs addressing new and ongoing matters of concern.

The next Donaghmede Safety Forum is scheduled for Wednesday the 8<sup>th</sup> of May at 7.00pm in Naomh Bharróg GAA Clubhouse, Kilbarrack.

#### **Edenmore Safer Fora**

Edenmore Safer Fora has regular attendance of residents, public representatives and overall increased community participation .

Private investment in Edenmore is now to the fore which will ultimately offer the opportunity for better build, better amenity and increased security through usage, but crucially the potential for improved design and new build.

The backdrop of serious crime occurrence is an ongoing challenge to residents and the Gardai, but inroads have been made regarding the physical environment with site works now in evidence in St Monica's Community centre the locus of the new Primary Care centre. Works have also taken place at Edenmore Shopping centre with additional development in the offing. The Garda clinic is based here and this Garda input has been well received by residents.

At the last meeting of the Edenmore Fora on 13/3/19 methods of reporting crime have been clarified by Gardai attending, ref the sequence of "case building" for later prosecution.( i.e emphasis of the importance of residents reporting each offence as it occurs )

Separately, complaints arising re anti-social behaviour and under the remit of DCC Project Estate Management re DCC should be reported also as they occur so that patterns of behaviour are documented and can be investigated also ref *case building*. The next meeting of the Edenmore Fora will take place on 15/5/19.

#### **Clongriffin Belmayne Community Forum/ Updates**

#### Vanessa Carey, Administrative Officer

The Clongriffin Belmayne Forum/ JPC took place on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2019 and 19<sup>th</sup> March 2019 in the Junction Clongriffin. There was a good attendance at both Forums.

#### **Presentations from Guest Speakers**

Mr. Garry Keegan addressed the Forum. He has been appointed Community Liaison Officer with the Ayrfield PPP .He provided phone and email details to the Forum to facilitate with communication while the construction of the 150 social homes commences .He will provide a Newsletter to residents during the project and is available to meet with residents.

Mr. John Mahony, Iveagh Trust addressed the Forum. He will be managing the 84 unit facility on main Street Clongriffin. On behalf of Gannon Homes .It is expected that the development will be completed by the end of June. There will be 44 car parking spaces available to residents. He stated that the development will have 18 one bed units, 13 2 bed units and 29 3 bed units .There will be an Estate manager and Resident caretaker appointed to the development. He advised residents to contact the Iveagh Trusts if they are concerned over behaviours of tenants. Details available on the Iveagh Trust website.

Ms. Claire Hutchinson of Foroige addressed the Forum. Foroige wish to establish a youth group in the Clongriffin Belmayne area. The club will be initially open to young people 16 to 18 years. Foroige have secured the Junction every Friday to host the club. They are looking for Volunteers to become involved in the group. Claire provided her contact details to the Forum. These details are available from DCC North Central Area Office.

#### Local Garda Issues Update

Sgt. Dan Creedon provided an update on safety and security issues. Inspector Brian Clune addressed the Forum on the issues that were raised by residents in relation to anti-social behaviours that occurred over the bank holiday weekend.

The Garda Clinic takes place Saturdays in Junction when Garda Resources permit. Attendance at the Garda Clinics has steadily increased.

#### **Update On Fingal Council And Dublin City Council Developments**

#### **Sutton to Malahide Greenway**

Construction of the Baldoyle to Portmarnock cycling and walking route is due to start in May of this year. At the same time a more extensive cycling and walking route to connect Sutton Cross to Malahide is being designed. This will tie in with the Malahide Castle to Newbridge House cycling and walking route which will traverse the Broad Meadow Estuary.

#### Hole in the Wall Road Re-alignment

This road re-alignment will improve access for vehicles and cyclists travelling between Baldoyle and Balgriffin via the Moyne Road. The Compulsory Purchase Order for the

scheme was submitted to An Board Pleanála for approval in early December 2018 and the procurement process to source a main contractor to carry out the works is currently taking place. Construction will take place between 12-14 months.

#### Racecourse Park Baldoyle Wetlands

Substantial funding for works to improve the facilities at Baldoyle Racecourse Park are allocated and there has been consultation with residents to shape these plans. The final plans will be published shortly.

#### Ramp Access to Clongriffin Railway Station

Funding has been provided by central government under the Local Infrastructure Housing Activation Fund (LIHAF) for the provision of a high quality universal access to Clongriffin Dart Station from the Coast in Baldoyle. The Council will start work on this scheme once NAMA which controls these lands, activates their planning permission.

#### Provision of Community Facilities at the former Marketing Suite Baldoyle

Research carried out on behalf of Fingal County Council concluded that a new community facility at the Menolly Marketing Suite site should be flexible, multi-use, open and accessible to all groups and members of the community. The overarching requirements identified during consultation include a large, multi-use hall, meeting rooms/space and a café.

A full design team will be appointed in the second quarter of this year and work will commence on preparing a public planning notice.

#### **Upgrade Main Street Belmayne**

A preferred option has been chosen for Belmayne Main Street Section 2-2. This option requires altering the location of existing parking, kerbs and median, providing footways with a desirable width and providing a segregated cycle track on each side of the carriageway. The public consultation phase of the Belmayne Main Street and Belmayne Avenue Part 8 is now complete and the Planners Report has been done. There were no objections to the scheme. The proposal was approved by the North Central Area Committee on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2018. The scheme will then be forwarded to the full City Council Meeting in February 2018. The detailed design, tender and appointment of a contractor will then be progressed. It is hoped that a contractor will be appointed by the end of the summer.

#### School update:

The building contractor has commenced building on the two permanent schools in Belmayne. This building work is due to be completed by the end of March 2019. Vanessa Carey confirmed that Dublin City Council's Valuer's section are advancing negotiations with the DOE&S for the permanent disposal of a site for a second level school.

#### The Junction

The Junction Community Centre is now open for use by residents of Belmayne / Clongriffin. This facility is free of charge to non – commercial bodies. All group users must provide their own insurance. Preference will be given to non-profit local groups. Forum members who expressed an interest in using the facility were asked to submit their request to the local area office to be assessed.

- (A) Operation **Thor, Hybrid**, **Creeper** and **'Hi Viz'** have contributed to operations, with designated checkpoints being carried out by both uniform and plain clothes units, which have helped in the detection of crime and high visibility policing throughout the **Raheny/Clontarf Sub-Districts**.
- (B) Investigations into major incidents are ongoing and there have been several successful operations, as well as **successful Court Prosecutions** in this quarter.
- (C) Anti-social behaviour is being tackled through Operation Irene which targets local amenity areas during the summer months and there are also several area's being designated as 'Hot Spots' and high visibility policing whether it is members on foot patrol or on Mountain bike patrol have led to successful increase in Public Order detections throughout the District. School Talks are carried out with an emphasis being put on Cyber Bullying and for Juveniles to be aware of supports which are there if they find themselves victims of this type of crime. There also has being the implementation of a Garda Youth Development Project in the Kilbarrack/Raheny Area and the Donneycarney Area.

Call back initiatives have been put in place for persons who are victims of Burglary incidents, Domestic Violence incidents and Sexual Assault incidents. The victims of crime are visited and given crime prevention and security advice from members, this has proven to be quite successful and greatly appreciated by the persons' concerned. There also has been the implementation of a Pedal Cycle Identity Card which has proven to be very helpful in combating theft of Bicycle Crime.

**An 'Older Person' strategy** has also been developed and several Christmas parties were held throughout the District by Community Policing members.

- (D) There are **7 Garda Reserves** allocated to Raheny/Clontarf Sub Districts and Policing of amenity areas required an increase in Garda Resources at varying times in the summer to help Police the area.
- (E) There is **1 Sergeant and 6 Gardai** attached to Community Policing and they have all Neighbourhood watch schemes in operation in their designated areas, they are all ELO trained and Mountain Bike Operatives. Each member is involved in Community Engagement initiatives throughout the District.
