INFIRMARY ROAD – 38 HOUSING UNITS

INTRODUCTION

The now vacant Infirmary Road site was previously owned by the Department of Defence and managed by the Office of Public Works. It was transferred to Dublin City Council in the early 2000s on the understanding of its use for the then government's Affordable Housing Initiative and was actively pursued for development at that time prior to the economic downturn. Given the site's proximity to the much larger O'Devaney Gardens redevelopment lands the Infirmary Road site has always been viewed in relation to the broader context of developments thereon.

The current brief takes into consideration a number of changes, which have occurred in the intervening years, including revisions to the Development Plan 2016-22, Department of Housing, Planning, and Local Government Guidelines on Sustainable Urban Housing, Planning considerations, space standards. Significant changes in the Building Regulations, including Technical Guidance Documents TGD: Part M 2010 and Part L 2011(NZEB) Nearly Zero Energy Buildings, all impact on the project.

Initial scoping studies had indicated that the clearer southernmost lower portion of the site was the most suited for any proposed redevelopment. On this basis Dublin City Council sought Capital Works Management Framework (CWMF) Stage 1 approval for a proposal for a residential apartment scheme on the lower portion of the site and received approval from the Department of Housing, Planning, and Local Government in Reference Number N292/894 on 7th July 2015.

The proposed housing development is located at the southernmost lower portion of the overall site boundary enclosure. This proposal has taken into account the site setting, the overall site enclosure and the existing protected structures and the implications on them of the proposed new residential development and the future development on the overall site.

The budget costing for the development indicates an estimated project cost in excess of €12 million.

The Pre-Part 8 Consultation process has been completed and DCC Planning & Property Development Department have issued their Pre Part 8 Report.

The Proposing Department, Housing and Community Services intend to commence the Part 8 process for the scheme presented herewith for noting.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Site Location

The site is located on Infirmary Road, Dublin 7. It is bounded by Infirmary Road, Montpelier Hill and Montpelier Gardens and is directly opposite the new Criminal Courts of Justice.

The overall site contains a number of standing protected structures including the former Married Quarters (red brick building), the Boundary Walls and gateways, RPS ref 3994. Two other structures are on the NIAH list, the Former Isolation Infirmary (cruciform building) ref 50070132 and the Mobilization unit ref 50070133.

The lower part of the site lies within the Zone of Archaeological Interest.

The site is adjacent to the Phoenix Park, residential Streets on Infirmary Road and

Montpelier Hill.

The site is located in the SDRA 11 O'Devaney Gardens (Strategic Development and Regeneration Area) in Dublin City Council Development Plan 2016-22, for the creation of a high quality residential quarter. The SDRA area also includes St Bricin's, where the amalgamation of the 68 existing bedsits into 35 1 bed apartments for senior citizens is completed and a new 54 unit social housing scheme general mix in O'Devaney Gardens is currently under construction.

The overall Infirmary Road site enclosure has 3 distinct changes in level, ranging from +14.5M at the southernmost lower portion, +17.5M and +18.5M at the upper part of the site. The proposal residential scheme is located at the southernmost lower portion end of the site.

Housing Development

The proposed new build residential development comprises social housing, a landscaped courtyard, cycle parking, plant and ancillary accommodation, bounded by the existing Protected Structures Boundary Wall and Gateways on three sides and the 3 storey building Married Quarters on Infirmary Road.

Housing Mix

The proposed development comprises 38 no. social housing units with 134 bedspaces as follows:

- 12 no. 1 bedroom 2 person apartments
- 16 no. 2 bedroom 4 person apartments
- 4 no. 2 bedroom 4 person duplex units
- 6 no. 3 bedroom 5 person duplex units

Arrangement

The new buildings are arranged in two blocks, Block A to the rear of the site and the corner "L" shaped Block B fronting onto Infirmary Road and Montpelier Hill. The existing 3 storey former Married Quarters (MQ) (Protected Structure) building forms the third building element on the lower site. An Architectural Conservation Fabric repair survey and Structural conditions survey report and works has been carried out on this building.

Block A, rear block at courtyard level is accessed from the courtyard and comprises of 6 no. 1 bedroom- 2 person apartments with private space fronting onto the courtyard and 6 no. 3 bedroom 5-person duplex above, accessed at first floor level, each with private front and rear gardens. 2 no. duplexes and 2 ground floor apartment units share a common stair access. The duplexes enjoy dual aspect, whereas the ground floor has single aspect onto the courtyard due to the existing change of level in the site between the lower part of the site and the upper part of the site.

Block B the corner block is set back from the wall on Infirmary road to address the preeminence of the former Married Quarters building (Protected Structure) in terms of scale, massing and location. Block B is accessed from the courtyard with own door access for all units at ground floor level. Block B comprises of 4 no. duplexes and 22 apartment units. The apartment units facing onto Infirmary Road also have an alternative access from the second pedestrian access route. The duplexes at ground floor level are located at Montpelier Hill road side, these are set back from the boundary wall (Protected Structure) forming rear private gardens space. All units in Block B enjoy dual aspect. All apartment units have private balconies. All units have dual aspect. A single stair and lift core serves semienclosed access galleries to apartments on upper levels overlooking the landscaped

courtyard side.

The existing boundary wall (Protected Structure) along Montpelier Hill will be lowered to its original height as identified in Archaeological Assessment report. The original gateways, 2 in number will be reopened and reused. The original pedestrian gateway adjacent to second gateway at the eastern end of Montpelier Hill will be reopened and reused for pedestrian access. New gates will be provided at all access points.

Landscaped Courtyard

The new building Blocks A & B, together with the existing former Married Quarters building (Protected Structure) and the existing boundary walls (Protected Structure) create a 'Walled Garden' courtyard for residents.

Car Parking

There is no private vehicular parking proposed. The pedestrians will have access via both gateways with vehicular entrance for utilities and emergency access vehicles only accessed at the eastern gate on Montpelier Hill.

Bicycle Parking

58 no. cycle parking spaces will be provided in accordance with the Dublin City Councils Development Plan 2016-22.

Space Standards

Apartments have been designed to take account of the Guidelines contained in the Sustainable Urban Housing: Design Standards for New Apartments, issued by the DHP&LG in March 2018. Duplex units have been designed to take account of design standards as contained in the Guidelines, Quality Housing for Sustainable Communities, issued by the DoEHLG 2007.

Wheelchair accessible units have been designed to take account of relevant guidelines. All units meet the requirements of the Building Regulations TGD Part M 2010 "Access and Use".

Ancillary Accommodation

A new single store standalone building is being provided on the eastern side of the site adjacent to Montpelier Hill. The accommodation includes for a new ESB sub-station, switch room, plant rooms, refuse storage and ancillary accommodation.

Site Boundary

The proposed new development will be contained within the existing site walls and gateways enclosure.





To The Chairperson and Members of Central Area Committee

With reference to the proposed grant of a further licence to the premises at The Tram Café, Wolfe Tone Park, Jervis Street, Dublin 1 to The Tram Café Limited

By way of Agreement dated 11th April 2016 the premises The Tram Café, Wolfe Tone Park, Jervis Street, Dublin 1, which is more particularly delineated shown coloured in pink on Map Index No. SM2019-0270 was let under licence by Dublin City Council to The Tram Café Limited for a period of 3 years and subject to a licence fee of €8,000 p.a. This licence expired on 23rd April 2019. Under the agreement Dublin City Council reserved the right to renew the licence for a further period of two years (subject to the total period of the licence not exceeding five years.) The Parks Department has decided to invoke this right and offer a new licence subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. That the Council will be prepared to grant a 2 year licence commencing on a the 24th April 2019.
- 2. That the proposed licence area is shown indicatively on the attached copy map and comprises the tram, the adjoining structure and an outdoor seating area. The seating area is to be confined to the areas located within the existing windbreaker/barrier. A formal drawing delineating the above area shall be prepared by the Council's Draftsman and attached to the licence.
- That the licence fee shall be €10,000 per annum plus VAT (if applicable), exclusive of all
 outgoings. The licence fee is to be payable quarterly in advance by direct debit
 mandate.
- 4. That the Licensee shall be responsible for the payment of all taxes, rates, outgoings, utilities, operational costs and maintenance related to the licensed area.
- 5. That the licensed area is to be used as a café/restaurant only. The licensee is not to permit the licensed area or part thereof to be used for any other purpose.
- 6. That the licensee shall take out and produce to Dublin City Council Liability Insurance in the sum of €6,400,000 (six million, four hundred thousand euro) and Employer Liability Insurance in the sum of €13,000,000 (thirteen million) for any incident with a recognised Insurance Company with offices in the State and the policy shall indemnify the Council against all liability as owner of the property. The insurance is to extend to the external seated area.

- 7. That the licensee will be responsible for insurance of the structure and all fixtures fittings and equipment.
- 8. That the licensee is responsible for any loss or damage to the structure located on the licensed area.
- 9. That the Café will be required to be opened the following hours:


a. Monday-Thursday 8am-6pmb. Friday 8am-9pmc. Saturday-Sunday 10pm-6pm

The opening hours may be extended by agreement of the parties.

- 10. That the Licensee will ensure that the highest levels of Health and Safety Standards apply to the use of the licensed area and ensure compliance with all relevant legislation.
- 11. That the Licensee shall keep the licensed area in a reasonably tidy condition during the licensed period.
- 12. That the Licensee shall not excavate the licensed area or interfere or damage services (if any) that encumber the licensed area.
- 13 That the applicant will be required to sign a Deed of Renunciation, with the benefit of legal advice.
- 14 That the Licence is personal to the Licensee and it cannot be transferred or otherwise disposed of.
- 15 That the Licensee shall ensure that any branding notice or advertising shall be subject to the prior consent of the Council.
- 16 That the Council reserve the right to relocate the licensed area to another section of the Park should the need arise.
- 17 That the Council will retain the right to close off the licensed area to carry out essential repairs and maintenance and will not be required to compensate the licensee.
- 18. That prior or at the termination of the licence the licensee shall at its own expense remove all materials not belonging to the Council and shall leave the licensed area in a clean and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Council and to bear cost(if any) incurred by the Council in making good any damage caused.
- 19. That the licence may be terminated by the Council on giving two months notice in writing.
- 20. That the Licensee will permit the Council, its officers, agents and workmen to inspect the licensed area at all reasonable times.
- 21. That the Licensee is not to do or allow to be done or permit any act or thing which is or is likely to be or become a nuisance, danger or source of annoyance, inconvenience or disturbance to the Licensor or the occupiers of neighbouring premises or to the public at large.

- 22. That the Licensee is to notify the Licensor forthwith in writing of every notice received at the premises from any statutory, local or sanitary authority and to comply therewith.
- 23. That the Licensee is not to impede or interfere in any respect whatsoever with the Licensor in the exercise of its right to exclusive possession of the premises which is subject only to the rights of the Licensee hereunder.
- 24. That both parties shall be responsible for their own fees.
- 25. That the above proposal is subject to the necessary approvals and consents being obtained.
- That the licence is subject to any other terms deemed appropriate by the Council (including the Council's Law Agent).

Alfie Byrne House/ James Larkin House:

A programme of boiler replacement was completed in Alfie Byrne House and James Larkin House.

Ballybough Road, Nos 2-8:



External rendering on Nos. 2-4 is finished and the roofing of the entire terrace is almost complete.

Brendan Behan Court:







New CCTV Cameras were installed at Brendan Behan Court to aid the monitoring of illegal dumping and misuse of the complex's bins at the rear near Wellesley Place.

Croke Villas:



The external construction of the Handball Alley is nearing completion. We continue to work with the remaining residents in Croke Villas pending their move to new housing at 2-8 Ballybough Road.

Saint Laurence O'Toole's Court:

Front Door Bells were fitted to all the new doors of residents in Saint Laurence O'Toole's Court.

Saint Mary's Mansions:



Cluid have advised that construction work on St. Mary's Mansions remains on schedule and they estimate its completion in the final quarter of 2019. The finished redevelopment will consist of 80 homes in one to four bedroom apartments.

The Oakley Development



The construction of external brick/block walls is nearing completion, as are the internal stairs. The current estimated date for completion is October 2019. The finished complex will provide 29 homes for senior citizens.

Thomas Clarke House:







There has been an ongoing issue with overgrown ivy on the walls between Sean Terrace and Orchard Lane at the rear of Tom Clarke House. Recently there have been attempts to set fire to the ivy by vandals. Because of this, contractors were engaged to cut the ivy back. Once completed the area will be landscaped.





8 Flower Beds, (4 square and 4 round) have been installed at Tom Clarke House.



A number of apple trees were planted, following the clearing of the ivy at the rear of Tom Clarke House. The Liaison Officer has generated interest in the future use of the apples by distributing cookbooks with assorted fruit recipes to residents.

Dominick Street Lower


Duggan Brothers are currently constructing 5-3 bed town houses, 67 apartments consisting of 5-3 bed, 50-2 bed and 12 1-bed units, a community facility and retail/commercial units with 47 car spaces at basement level on the eastern side of Dominick St. This month's work will include stone bed for piling rig, archaeological investigations, secant piling, and the reduced dig. Planned working hours are 7 am to 7 pm Monday to Friday and 8 am to 2 pm on Saturday when required.

A monthly information meeting takes place between Duggan's and the neighbours around the site. These meetings have been productive. A draft leaflet will be produced by Duggan's for the meeting and once agreed, it will be distributed to the local people and businesses. I have asked for the local Area Councillors to be included in the circulation.

The Gaelscoil is expected to go to planning in the second quarter of next year.

Constitution Hill

An internal design team has been set up to make a submission to the Department of Housing, Planning, Community and Local Government on a recommendation for some new build and refurbishment of this complex. The Stage 1 report is with the Department of Housing, Planning, Community and Local Government for approval. Tender brief completed for design team. A contractor has commenced working on installing a garden on the old playground at the south end of this complex. A photo montage was distributed to all residents. We expect some of the trees from Sean Foster Place to be relocated to this garden in the planting season.

Dorset Street & Saint Marys Terrace

The Department, after reviewing the consultant's report, has advised that the cost of refurbishment was so close to the cost of demolition and new build that they requested that this option be further developed. The Stage 1 report is down with Department of Housing, Planning, Community and Local Government for approval of funding. Tender brief completed for design team.

Sean Foster Place

Stage four funding has been approved by the Department of Housing, Planning, Community and Local Government. Duggan Brothers Ltd has been awarded the contract and expects to be on site May 7th.

This scheme comprises 30 no. residential units over 6 no. floors, all dual aspect, with the living accommodation and private open space in the majority of units, facing South or West, onto a small shared landscaped court. The apartment mix consists of 7 no. 1 bedroom apartments, 18 no. 2 bedroom apartments, 3no. 2 bedroom duplex apartments and 2 no. 3bedroom apartments. Each apartment has dual aspect, with a private balcony.

A sod turning ceremony will take place at 2.30 pm on Friday 10th May on site, with the Lord Mayor and Minister for Finance in attendance

St Michan's House

A roof replacement programme has commenced in this complex, Blocks A and B is complete and work is ongoing on the remaining blocks.

Blackhall/Marminon

The tender for the roofs complex has been awarded and should commence in the next six weeks

O'Devaney Gardens

NORTH EAST INNER CITY PROGRAMME OFFICE REPORT

ALLOCATION OF 2019 FUNDING

On recommendation of the Budget Sub-Group a further round of projects was approved by the Programme Implementation Board at its meeting held on 24th April 2019. This brings the total 2019 funding allocation to date to €5,251,754 (of €6.5M). The full list of approved projects / programmes is set out on Appendix A.

The latest round of funded proposals, totaling €323,140 are as follows:

- Acts of Compassion Ministries €6,000 12 no. Ethnic Policing Forum gatherings and 60 one-to-one interventions in the local community.
- NCI Early Learning Initiative €50,000 Educational Guidance Programme : to provide career guidance support programme for second level students to promote educational engagement in the NEIC.
- Childcare CPD Bursary €25,000 Continuation of fund to support existing childcare workers in community childcare projects who have minimum level 6 qualifications to progress to level 7 (Higher Diploma) or level 8 (Honours Degree) in early childhood education.
- Youth Work Showcase 2019 (led by Belvedere Youth Club) €4,140 showcasing the transformative nature of collaborative youth work with disadvantaged young people in the area.
- NCI Brighter Futures Restorative Practice Initiative €43,000 Continuation (Yr. 3 July 2019-June 2020) of existing NEIC Restorative Practices Training Initiative that connects with early years services, primary and secondary schools, afterschool and youth services, along with statutory and non-statutory community organisations.
- Integrated Youth Outreach Swan Youth Service €75,000 to provide an enhanced integrated detached youth work service for the NEIC area.
- Sean MacDermott St. Swimming Pool €120,000 Continuation of partnership with Swim Irl. to staff public opening hours, Sat. p.m., Sunday and Monday for a further period of 1 year (wef mid-May).

An allocation of €705,000 remains set aside for further projects emanating from Sub Group 3 on the pending detailed proposals to be brought forward at a later date for consideration by the Budget Sub Group and by the PIB

NEIC COMMUNITY GRANTS SCHEME 2019

Following approval of €100,000 funding the 2019 NEIC Community Grants Scheme (Round 1) is was open for applications until 30th April 2019. For the 2019 Scheme it has been agreed to focus on two priority themes i.e.

Theme 1 Environmental awareness and improvementTheme 2 Active Living, Recreation and Wellbeing

A total of 44 applications were received by the closing date. The assessment of these applications will be undertaken in the coming weeks with a view to bringing a report and recommendations to the NEIC Programme Implementation Board meeting to be held on 29th May. Successful applicants will be notified after that date. The report will also be brought to the next meeting of the Central Area Committee.

NEIC COMMUNITY EVENTS



Following on from successful community events held to date this year with NEIC support e.g. Chinese New Year, Five Lamps Arts Festival, Try-A-Tri Triathon; the 2019 Programme of community events will continue throughout the Summer months. The next large scale event will be Super Soul Sunday to be held in association with the Gospel Rising Music Festival in Mountjoy Square Park on Sunday 19th May 2019. The three-day festival is in its 10th year but this is the first time that it will be held in Dublin, focusing on venues in the north inner city. Info. at www.gospelrising.com

Planning is also underway for other summer events, Crinniú na Nóg; Bloomsday in the Monto, Monto Festival, Festival of Nations. Following completion of an evaluation by Dublin City Community Co-op planning for The Big Scream Halloween Festival has also commenced. In seeking to increase representation and participation of local residents both in organising and delivering the festival the Festival Committee put out an open call for a Volunteer Co-ordinator who will have a specific role in mobilising, recruiting and managing local volunteers.

Drugs Related Intimidation (DRI)

Arising from the recommendations of the Drugs Related Intimidation conference 'Lives Without Fear – What Works', which took place on the 18th June 2018, the Programme Implementation Board approved the appointment of a dedicated resource to focus on a clear action plan to tackle drugs related intimidation in the North East Inner City. The project was the subject a tender process publicly advertised with a closing date of 15th March 2019. No submissions were received, however there were some expressions of interest seeking an extension of time for submissions and this was agreed. The revised closing date was 18th April 2019. One submission was received and this is currently being assessed.

Measuring the Impact of the North East Inner City Initiative

Following the appointment of *Just Economics Research Ltd.* Phase 1 of measuring the impact of the NEIC Initiative is underway. This phase will involve conducting workshops to develop cost-effective evaluation methodologies that are practical to implement and accessible to stakeholders. The first workshop took place on Tuesday 2nd April and this was followed up with a series of more in-depth interviews with key people involved in each of the Sub-Groups. Just Economics will present their report by mid Q2 and this report will form the basis for the research phase which will be tendered separately in 2019. It is anticipated that the evaluation project will be completed in Q4 2019.

1. DCSWP HIGHLIGHT EVENTS & PROGRAMMES MAY - JUNE 2019

CHAMPIONS DAY 2019

The Champions Programme is a core programme targeted at adults with intellectual, physical and sensory disabilities. The programme aims to promote inclusion and encourage participation through the delivery of multi-sport initiatives. Champions Day 2019 takes place on Tuesday 14th May in Ballyfermot Sports and Fitness Centre and Thursday 16th May in Cabra Parkside. The aim of the event is to provide taster sessions in various sports and provide a pathway to DCC facilities and existing local clubs. Activities confirmed to date include tennis, rugby, tai chi, frisbee and table cricket. Details of ongoing Champions programmes are outlined in the next section.

BIKE WEEK 2019

Bike Week is a week-long National event celebrating and promoting cycling. In 2019 Bike Week will take place from $9^{th} - 17^{th}$ June. Dublin City Sport & Wellbeing Partnership has sourced funding via the Environment & Transportation Department and will use this to deliver a number of bike related activities across the city during this week.

A 'Bike Skills Training Day' is also scheduled for Tuesday 25 June in Sundrive Velodrome, Eamonn Ceannt Park. This is a partnership programme with local Primary Schools and the Irish Cycling Centre.

Sport Officers in the South East Area will be providing Cycle Safety programmes in primary schools in the area throughout Bike Week in partnership with Cycling Ireland.

GO FOR LIFE 2019

The Go For Life Games is a core Dublin City Sport & Wellbeing Partnership programme targeted at older adults and delivered in partnership with Age & Opportunity and the HSE. The aim of the programme is to engage and involve older people in recreational sport. The emphasis is on participation and fun; the games are played in a non-competitive environment with all participants encouraged to umpire their own game.

The 2019 Go For Life North and Southside regional finals take place in Ballyfermot Sports & Fitness Centres (Southside) on 21 May and in Cabra Parkside Community and Sports Centre (Northside) on 23 May. Successful teams will then progress to the National Go For Life Games in Dublin City University on 8 June.

SMALL GRANTS 2019

Sports Clubs operating within the administrative area of Dublin City Council and affiliated to a National Governing Body are invited to apply for financial assistance from the Sport For Young People Small Grants Scheme (10-21 years pf age). The Grant Scheme is funded and administered by Sport Ireland and the Dublin Sport & Wellbeing Partnership. The scheme supports clubs in some of the following;

- Training and coaching courses
