That this area committee agrees that the wooden bridge access to Bull Island should be closed to cars (excepting residents, golf club and disability access) to improve safety and quality of experience until such time as community consultation can be undertaken.
- b Motion in the name of Councillor Donna Cooney
Welcoming the newly published Dublin City Council and Transport Authority Covid Mobility report with an ambitious plan to increase active transport to 89,000 commuters in the city, could this NC area request that Dublin City council agree to quickly expanding measures into the suburbs to link up with routes into the city, for example Fairview which is the second busiest for walking and cycling numbers in the city yet has a high level of serious road injuries, with the Malahide, Howth and Clontarf road feeding into Fairview, it also have six lanes of traffic (so plenty of room to expand the pavements on both sides and two way protected cycle ways) as temporary measures awaiting completion of the new C2CC also Eastwall road and Alfie Byrne road, protection of cycle lanes there and all Collins Avenue before schools and DCU reopen in September, also to extend 30k zone to The Bull Island causeway or 10k under park by-laws and protected clearly marked cycleway and walkway, to limit car parking on both the causeway and wooden bridge entrance to applied for permit only, with a possible shuttle bus along the causeway during bathing season, also to make Vernon avenue by the shops and restaurants at the Coast end one way with expanded pavement and safe cycling, only loading bay and only disability parking.

This area committee believes that the introduction of the Strategic Housing Development legislation in Dec 2016 has resulted in a vastly diminished planning system that has disenfranchised locally elected representatives and the Irish public, allowed private interests to by-pass local-authority development plans and local area plans, is less transparent and has failed in its stated objective of "fast-tracking" housing; therefore, this committee calls on national government and the relevant minister to repeal the Planning and Development (Housing) and Residential Tenancies Act 2016 and the Planning and Development (Strategic Housing Development) Regulations 2017, return the planning powers to the local authorities and restore democracy to the planning system.
- If passed by this area committee, the motion will be sent to the Housing SPC and a letter written to the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government informing it of our stated position and intention.

6 **Motions**

- a **Motion in the name of Councillor Lawrence Hemmings**

That this Area Office would adopt an ecology-first approach to managing vegetation in the public space as our Area is indeed an integral and ecologically significant component of coastal habitat within the Dublin Bay Biosphere. This approach, in-line with the City Biodiversity Plan, would ensure that actions taken by all divisions of DCC, including Parks, Traffic and Public Realm, would maintain and trim vegetation providing ecosystem services, rather than undertake complete / near complete removal of vegetated areas supporting local populations of species and helping nature during a biodiversity crisis. By way of an example, I raised a relevant issue previously concerning the removal of trees along the James Larkin Road cycle path, which had been providing important feeding

habitat to birds, including finch species before its removal. That habitat is no longer available to species and will not be for a number of years because an ecology-first approach was not taken to vegetation management at the time.

Reply:

DCC Parks Service have not found any information or reference to an 'ecology first' approach to land management (Google search 8 May 2020) nor is there such a reference in the Biodiversity Action Plan. However, the conservation of local ecology is a guiding principle in all land management decisions undertaken by the Parks Service.

No trees or shrubs were removed from the location as part of the works referred to above. Rather some woody vegetation (mostly self-sown buddleia) that was interfering with the public footpath which resulted in pedestrians having to walk onto the dedicated cycle lane to avoid these bushes was cut back to its base on safety grounds outside of the bird nesting season. The Buddleia is growing in the rock armour between the public path and the intertidal zone of Dublin Bay. This work is carried out every 2-3 years because the Buddleia grows back so quickly. Buddleia is an invasive, self-seeding, non-native shrub; cultivated varieties of which are widely planted in gardens as it attracts butterflies, and other species. It is widespread in Dublin.

Finches are among the most common garden birds in Dublin, and the cutting back of buddleia at this location is unlikely to have a measurably negative impact.

Area Matters A: Edenmore Pitch and Putt Course

The pitch and putt course in Edenmore park occupies approximate 4 hectares of the park which represents just over half of the space of the entire park. It has long been considered that the opening of this part of the park to the public rather than for the sole use of a club of about 40 members would be much more advantageous to the local community than its current use. There is little demand for pitch and putt in the area and the opening of the course as parkland would be like the creation of a new park in Edenmore. This additional 4 ha of undulating parkland which was never previously open to the community would no doubt be welcomed by the Edenmore Community who have been very active in enhancing the park and their local area.

However, as the Committee is more than aware, incidences of anti-social behaviour including joy-riding, fire setting and congregation after dark have all been on the increase in recent years. The soccer pitch in the park has been out of commission for well over 12 months and was just recovering from the repairs carried out after a car was burnt out when another car significantly damaged the pitch over the winter.

The most successful way to reduce such incidences of anti-social behaviour is to increase the number of visitors to the park by making improvements such as has been achieved in Stardust Park over the last 2 years. At present the 4 ha course is enclosed with fencing and dense vegetation. The intention would be to remove the fencing, reduce the vegetation cover to allow for clear views for public safety and to construct a footpath around the park which would give a perimeter path of 1.25km around the entire park suitable for running and perhaps a local Parkrun.

The unsightly concrete pavilion that was used for taking cash payment will also be demolished and the site returned to parkland.

Due to the covid event and restrictions which derived from social distancing requirements, maintenance priorities had to be set and the pitch and putt course (which requires a much greater level of work than normal grassland) was one area where maintenance was not continued as it was not open to the public. As the course has not been maintained in 3 months it would take some considerable investment of time and resources to bring it back into commission and it is unlikely to be playable for the remainder of the summer.

The pitch and putt course costs in excess of €60,000 per annum to maintain and operate however, the income generated has fallen considerably in recent years from €14k in 2010 to €3k in 2018 and €4k in 2019 which reflects the lack of demand and interest locally for this facility. A preferred alternative use of this funding would be a phased improvement programme for an extended Edenmore Park.

The Parks Service is more than happy to engage with the community to canvass opinion locally as how they would like to see the park developed over the next few years and to ascertain if there are any other facilities such as boules or pétanque which could be provided in the park to act as a social outlet. The par 3 in St Annes Park is also available to those interested in pitch and putt.

Area Matters B: Grass Maintenance Contract

A number of areas of complaint of poor grass maintenance were identified at last month's Area Committee meeting. It was assumed that these areas were under contract and that the contractor was not meeting the requirements of the Maintenance Contract 2016-2020. Upon investigation it was found that the areas in question are maintained by direct labour and are not under contract.

Due in part to some staff self-isolating, but mainly the need to achieve social distancing, reduced man hours and resources have been available to the Parks Service as with every other service during the covid event. Because covid signage and emergency response has been prioritised over routine maintenance it has taken longer to get around to all grass maintenance areas, however as restrictions relax all areas will begin to return to normal as resources allow.

Grass maintenance at this time of year whether by contract or by direct labour is a challenge as the spring growth surge can result in 4 inches of growth in a week leading to complaints even when the grass had been cut within the last 7 days. In a couple of weeks the growth rate will subside and so will the number of complaints.

Furthermore a number of the complaints referred to longer grass at the edges of open spaces, under railings and around trees as being unsightly. This is a consequence of the cessation of spraying of herbicides in the public realm, a policy change adopted and supported by the full council. While there are many benefits to this policy change in terms of pollinators, biodiversity, public health and quality of the water entering Dublin Bay it does mean that longer grass and opportunist native flowers and plants will be more evident in the public realm. This policy is being reflected in the next contract documents to be put out to tender later this year. Prices are being sought to have these areas which cannot be mown conventionally strimmed once or twice during the growing season which will keep the growth at these boundaries somewhat in check but the scorched earth approach that pertained in the past will no longer be the norm.

The Council is also committed to the National Pollinator Plan and has been carrying out wilding initiatives, planting of wildflowers, implementing differential mowing regimes and identifying areas that do not need to be cut. These initiatives have been promoted in the media but do not suit everybody's personal aesthetic and can be seen by some as not being neat and tidy but the positive feedback has far outweighed the negative.

The advice remains that complaints about grass cutting should be forwarded to parks@dublincity.ie with details and precise location where they can be logged in the Customer Response Management system and forwarded to the Parks District Supervisor in the first instance (as is require by the terms of the contract) and if appropriate the Parks Contracts Manager.

The level of complaints about grass cutting is actually quite low; 6 complaints were received directly by email (3 referred to the same estate came in one representation) re grass cutting in the North Central Area; 5 of which referred to areas cut by direct labour and 1 that claimed that the contactor had shredded litter when maintaining verges which was investigated but no shredded litter could be found at the reported locus. 8 complaints re grass cutting have been received in the last 4 weeks at the on the parks@dublincity.ie email 6 of which referred to areas maintained by direct labour and 2 referred to the verge cutting contract.

It has been the experience of the Parks Service that the contractors are quite anxious to rectify problems as soon as they arise as the contract does specify quite punitive penalties if such disputes are not resolved. The main issue that arises is the level of dumping on open

space in some locations that can prevent areas being cut. As such excessive dumping is not part of the maintenance contract the contracts manager works quite closely with the contractor and local management to have areas cleared in advance of scheduled maintenance visits. Some areas of public open space under grass have been maintained under contract since 2008. As this is the 4th and final year of this contract everyone involved is more than familiar with their areas and the requirements of the contract.

As you have referred to below I have only been in my current role in DCC since 2017 and have worked with 3 different contract managers whose role has in this time been always much wider than just the grass cutting contract and included the management of the invasive species control contract. My experience has been that the contractors are quite anxious to rectify problems as soon as they arise as the contract does specify quite punitive penalties if such disputes are not resolved. I have been advised by colleagues with more experience of this issue that the role of Contracts Manager predates this phase of the grass maintenance contract by many years and has always included the management of other contracts and some other city-wide corporate matter. Also it seems from earlier Contract Documents available on the server that some areas of public open space under grass have been maintained under contract since 2008. I believe the phrase 'Newly Appointed Contracts Manager' in the notes of the meeting referred to a newly appointed individual rather than a newly created role. The Contracts Manager's salary is not part of the tender price. The notes do not seem suggest that the Contracts Manager would exclusively work on the grass maintenance contract but would supervise same adequately and deal with all complaints in a timely manner. As this is the 4th and final year of this contract everyone involved is more than familiar with their areas and the requirements of the contract.

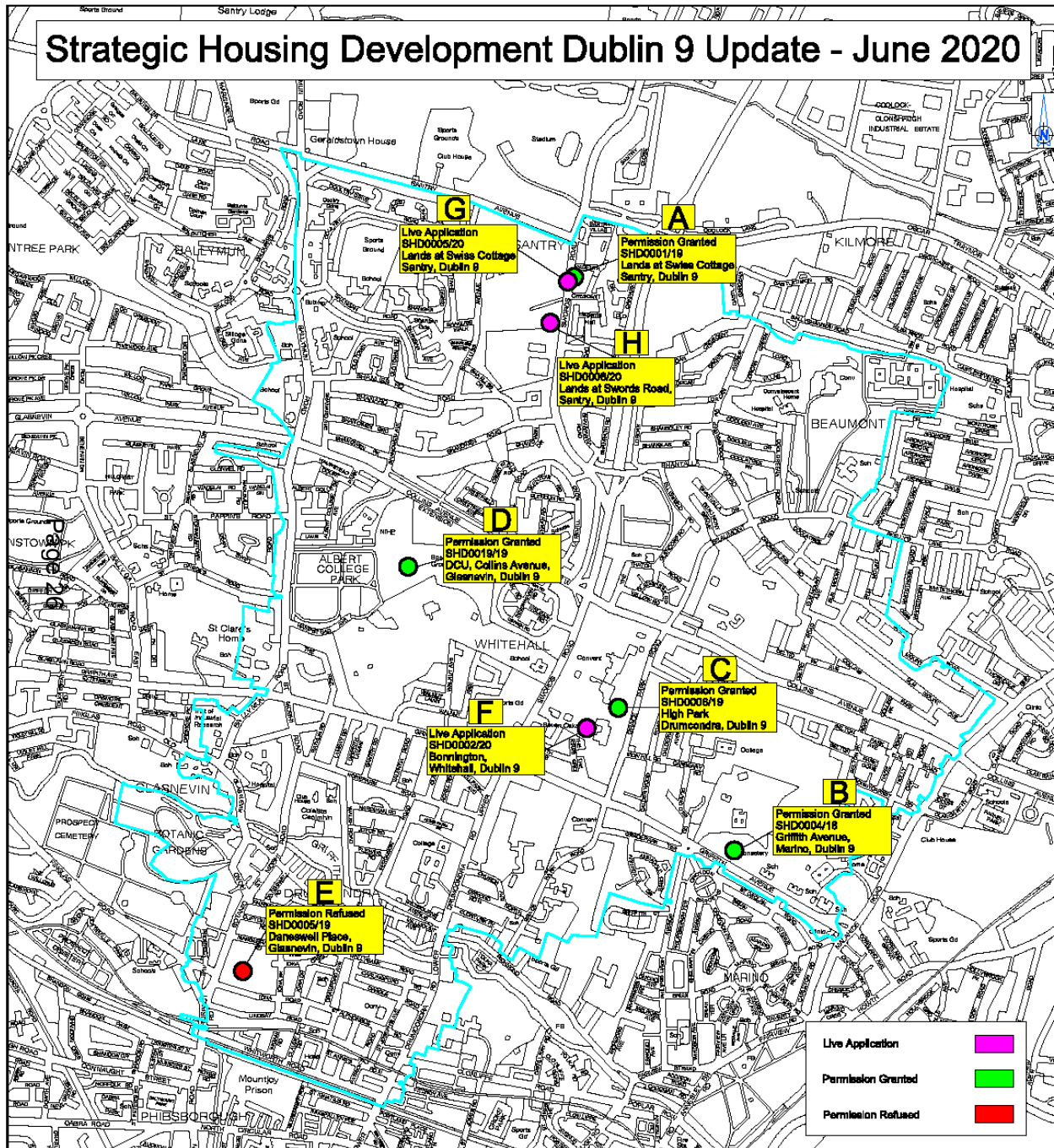

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Report on Potential Strategy to Address Illegal Dumping

To the chairperson and members of the North Central Area Committee,

The issue of illegal dumping tends to have 2 distinct areas of offence, investigation and enforcement.

1. The first is the illegal collection and disposal of waste by unauthorised collectors – enforceable under the Waste Management Act and enforced by Waste Enforcement officers
2. The second, and more commonly encountered on a day to day basis and which has a significant visual and environmental impact on the community, is the dumping of domestic waste and junk by householders within their own community – enforceable under the Litter Pollution Act and enforced by authorised officers

The methods of enforcement that are generally used in relation to the dumping of waste by householders are set out below:

3. Investigation of dumped waste to establish offender details
4. Use of CCTV to identify offender details
5. Enforcement of Waste Bye Laws regarding requirement to use authorised waste collector or civic amenity facilities to dispose of waste.

A combination of all 3 avenues of investigation is the most aggressive or focused form of enforcement that it is possible to carry out.

This could be strengthened further by the cooperation of Waste Enforcement Unit wherever there is a suspicion or evidence of illegal activity referred to in point 1. above.

Any or all of these avenues of investigation may be carried out in a planned and targeted manner working in conjunction with local area management and public domain teams.

Such a plan of action would involve the dedication of resources both locally and centrally and there would be a cost involved in implementing a specific enforcement regime that would be dependent on the extent and scope of the project.

It should be noted that Dublin City Council will be beginning to roll out a formal enforcement campaign based on point 5. above. This is commencing shortly with a trial process to ensure that the system and processes are effective and will be implemented further following a successful outcome of that trial.

It is possible that additional resources could be allocated to the formal enforcement campaign to focus on specific areas within the North Central administrative area as an element of any overall strategy.

Any strategy would require buy in and the involvement of a number of internal and external stakeholders including but not limited to the following potential members:

Waste Management

Housing

Area Management

Public Domain

Community Development

An Garda Siochana

Local Community Service Providers and NGO's

Waste Enforcement

A sample step by step implementation and enforcement plan is set out below that may be used as a template to consider how best to proceed with the development of any strategy or action plan.

Sample Implementation and Enforcement Plan

Set out below are what is considered to be a reasonable and proportionate scale of action that escalates in the event that measureable improvements are not realised from the actions already implemented.

The timeline of escalation should be decided upon based upon the effectiveness of each step and the severity of the level of offence.

The actions are not exhaustive. Dublin City Council will endeavour to be innovative and use all aspects of any applicable legislation that may assist in the prevention, reduction or prosecution of offences. These actions may be updated from time to time as new operating procedures, resources or technologies are identified.

1. Identification of blackspots : - this may be done by a number of means including, but not restricted to, the mapping of CRM Data or Local Area Office/Departmental operational knowledge
2. The inclusion of additional informational signage within the area with a tailored message related to ongoing offences.
3. **Evidence recovery from identified sites. These may be specific streets / laneways / green spaces or areas containing a multitude of locations depending on the scale of the offences.**
4. Official correspondence to each applicable residence or commercial premises within the area.
5. Identification where possible of owners and responsible persons within residences, multi-let or commercial premises.

6. Official correspondence with identified individuals.
7. Door to door compliance surveys to be undertaken.
8. **Issuing of advisory notices re non- compliance.**
9. **Upon completion of satisfactory DPIA - Installation of targeted CCTV (and associated signage) to identify offenders.**

(The items in bold print indicate steps at which enforcement action will be taken through the issuing of fixed penalty notices or direct prosecutions)

Current processes underway to identify additional properties

The City Council has established a communication forum with other Local Authorities, State Agencies and Approved Housing Bodies in relation to the recording and where possible the sharing of data on vacant properties.

The Housing Department vacant housing register has recorded 642 residential properties by accessing data from the CSO, Geo-directory, Vacanthomes.ie and internal databases. The City Council has undertaken 362 site inspections with a further 20 inspections scheduled and 17 title searches currently in progress.

The number of acquisitions exceeded the target by 293, and a total of 547 acquisitions during the year represented a major and speedy contribution to the needs of many households on the waiting lists. The number of Part V tenancies delivered was below the target because of less than anticipated

construction in the city, by the private building sector. The new build total was below target because a small number of schemes slipped into 2020 for completion and we did not achieve any success on new turnkeys as we had hoped for, this was a reflection of the very difficult housing market prevailing in 2019. The DRHE also sourced a further over 300 Homeless HAP properties outside our administrative area but they will be reflected in the completion outcomes of the relevant County Councils.

DUBLIN CITY SPORT & WELLBEING PARTNERSHIP REPORT JUNE 2020

Dublin City Sport & Wellbeing Partnership (DCSWP) on the ground programmes continue to be suspended however supporting people to stay active and healthy during these unprecedented times remains our goal via the following:

1) Ongoing Temporary Reassignment of Sport Officers to the North Central Area COVID Community Response Team initiative.

2) Online Presence

DCSWP Sport Officers continue to engage with local community groups and previous programme participants via tutorials, skill challenges and exercise sessions across social media channels, on zoom and via Whatsapp.

3) 'Get Physically Active' Sport Inclusion Programme

DCSWP Sport Inclusion and Integration Officers are hosting weekly zoom exercise sessions for individuals aged between 19 and 65 years with intellectual, physical and sensory disabilities. As part of the programme, each session has a different fitness theme covering topics such as the benefits of exercising every day, strength training, making healthy food choices, getting fresh air etc. The participants are also set weekly individual and group challenges, which encourage them to interact with their families at home and with each other in between sessions. The programme began as a partnership with the Central Remedial Clinic for one group and for a duration of 5 weeks. However due to its success, 'Get Physically Active' is currently being delivered on an ongoing basis, to groups with between 10 and 40 participants, in conjunction with the following service providers.

The Central Remedial Clinic programme has recently been expanded to include a dedicated boxercise class that is proving extremely popular with participants.

4) Spina Bifida Hydrocephalus Ireland (SBHI) Collaboration

DCSWP Sport Inclusion and Integration Officers are teaming up with SBHI to deliver sports and physical activity sessions for their online summer camps running from Monday 29 June 2020 until mid-August. Individuals from across Dublin will participate in the camps including the North Central Area.

5) Sport for Young People Small Grant Scheme

The Sport for Young People Small Grant Scheme is available once annually to sports clubs operating within the administrative area of Dublin City Council that are affiliated to a National Governing Body of Sport. The purpose of the scheme is to provide opportunities for young people aged 4 – 21 years to participate in sport and physical activity. The grants are funded and administered by Sport Ireland and Dublin City Sport & Wellbeing Partnership. The scheme will be open for applications at the end of June 2020 via the DCSWP social media channels as above.

6) Be Active Day

On Saturday 28 June 2020 Sport Ireland are co-ordinating a National Be Active Day via the 29 Local Sports Partnership in the country. On the day, the nation are being asked to 'Get Your Household Active' and upload photographs and videos to Sport Ireland's and the County Local Sports Partnership social media channels using the hashtag #BeActive. Promotion of the initiative will commence on 16 June 2020.

7) Virtual Couch to 3K Walk/Jog Programme

On 29 June 2020, in conjunction with the three other Dublin based Local Sports Partnerships (Fingal, Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown and South Dublin) DCSWP is launching a virtual couch to 3km walk/jog programme. Running for 8 weeks, participants will receive a weekly plan consisting of 3 session plans and will receive a certificate of completion at the end. The programme will be promoted on social media from 16 June 2020 and registration is via Eventbrite.

8) Co-funded Team Initiatives

Athletics in the Community

The Development Officer's key priority at present is supporting clubs as one of the first sports to return to activity in phase one of the government roadmap of easing restrictions.

Boxing in the Community

On Monday 11 May 2020 the Boxing in the Community Team began running their Start Box programme online via the DCSWP and IABA social media channels. Running for 8 weeks, the programme consists of basic boxing sessions and interviews with high performance coaches as well as current and former boxers. See above DCSWP social media handles.

Cricket in the Community

The Development Officer continues to promote and encourage keeping active and healthy via social media cricket skill challenges and tutorials that can be seen on <https://twitter.com/cricketleinster>

Assisting clubs in the North Central area i.e. Clontarf Cricket Club is also a key priority around areas such as return to training/playing, coaching sessions, planning local cricket camps if possible, attaining new members, engaging with the local community and targeting new schools in the wider community for the Autumn period.

Football in the Community

The Development Officers are currently carrying out an audit of all Dublin City based football clubs to assess their level of compliance with Safeguarding legislation. Over 200 clubs across Dublin have been contacted and an action plan will follow to address any deficits that may become apparent.

The team are continuing to volunteer for Boots Chemists by delivering prescriptions to vulnerable members of the community. They also continue to promote and encourage keeping active and healthy via social media football skill challenges and tutorials.

Get Going Get Rowing

The Development Officer continues to promote and encourage keeping active and healthy via social media and is supporting clubs as one of the first sports to return to activity in phase one of easing restrictions.

Rugby in the Community

The Development Officer is currently prioritising the return to rugby and sustainability of the sport in the North Central through the following:

- Online upskilling workshops aimed at local coaches and players
- Designing a 'Return to Rugby' modified camp in conjunction with Clontarf Rugby Club
- Producing both short and long term plans for growing and sustaining rugby in the area.
