Community Grants

Dublin City Council Community and Informal Education Grants opened on the 22nd June and will close on the 22nd July. As the Grants process is an online process this year, the Community & Social Development staff have contacted all groups on their database to advise them of the grants process and to provide assistance should the need arise.

A number of Community Groups have already sought and been given assistance with their applications.

St. Josephs/Kevin's Fun Day

Dublin City Council in conjunction with St. Josephs GNS, St Kevin's BNS and Axis Ballymun arranged a "Fabulous Fun Day" for the pupils and teachers in both schools.

The idea behind the day was to give pupils a sense of normality in their lives given the high levels of anti-social behaviour in the area and to introduce them to positive activities in the locality.

In the run up to the event, a series of workshops took place; these workshops included drama, football, rugby and boxing. Both school Principals expressed their delight with the event but more importantly a number of pupils have engaged in sporting activities resulting from their participation in the programme.

Another positive outcome from the programme is that both schools will be engaging with Dublin City Council Sports Section in September to look at other sporting activity.

1. Local Area Plan Update

Shopping Centre - Site 1

Circus Gerbola brought their show to the former shopping centre site from 21st to 26th June. They had 9 shows in total with over 3,500 people attending. The show on opening night was exclusive to the community and many groups/agencies were invited to attend. Gerbola stated that Ballymun was one of the best atmospheres they have ever encountered and it was a great experience for them. Feedback from the public has been very positive.

Both the circus and funfair were trial events and while they have being deemed a success it must be acknowledged that the site requires works to enable better use for future events /visiting groups. Planning Department, Parks Services and the Area Office are currently working together on preparing plans and costings for these works.

Box Gym, Aspen Building, Main Steet

The Planning Department had sought additional information including an accoustics report which was duly submitted. They have come back requesting further information which has also been submitted but it is estimated it will be a further 8 weeks before a final descision is made.

Vacant DCC units

New barbershop, Unit 4 Santry Way, Coultry

The fit-out license has been approved and signed so the tenant will get the keys soon.

Units 2 and 3 Santry Way, Coultry

Contracts for the disposal of units 2 and 3 in Coultry are with the Law Department and ready for signing.

Proposed - Approved Housing Body Developments

Site 9 - Coultry Road

Empower the Family are investigating their eligibility for CALF funding. DCC Housing Department are liaising with them in relation to this. This has yet to be determined.

PPP Sites (bundle 3 & bundle 4)

Site 10 – Shangan Road

The deadline for observations was 21st June. A report will be presented to this month's Area Committee Meeting.

Site's 5/15/16/17 and Site 18 Balcurris

Approval in principle was received to include the above sites in PPP (Bundle 4). The Housing Team updated the NWAC Councillors in respect of same on Friday 15th July.

Affordable Housing Bodies

Site 6 – Coultry Road/Main Street (including Community Gardens)

DCC Housing team met with O'Cualann and Tuath in relation to development of the site in early July. The funding mechanism for this site is Cost Rental Equity Loan (CREL). Tuath are currently progressing the funding application and are liaising with DCC Housing in relation to this.

Site 19 – St. Joseph's

Pre planning meetings were held with O Cualann in February and March 2022 in relation to a proposal for Senior Citizens' Units. A draft "Through Road" design in line with the LAP has now been prepared and will be reviewed by DCC. Design proposals are also being progressed for affordable housing provision on the site.

Site 21- opposite the Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre

DCC Housing has submitted an Affordable Housing Fund application for the proposed development.

Site 25 – Parkview

DCC Planning Department will issue a decision on the Senior Citizens' application in the coming weeks. Proposals have been developed for the Affordable provision and a planning application is due to be submitted before the end of August.

Site 30 – North City Operations Depot

The construction of the North City Operations Depot continues to progress well. The permanent east side access is in use by the Contractor as the main construction access. As previously reported, works to the northern access (opposite IKEA/Decathlon) are continuing. The Contractor is carrying out ongoing works around the existing traffic lights which will remain operational. New traffic light installations are agreed between Dublin City Council and Fingal County Council.

Work is continuing on the North City Operational Depot complex as follows:

Administration and Welfare Building -Curtain walling works are continuing along with fitting of glass. Roof works and internal blockwork are ongoing.

Multi Storey Car Park - Internal block work is continuing. Installation of pre cast wall panels on all levels is ongoing.

Central Stores and Workshops- Wall cladding is ongoing. Works to internal blockwork partition walls are continuing. Above ground external precast walls are continuing to be installed on the southern elevation. Roof cladding is almost complete along with the installation of roof lights.

Civic Amenity Site Office - Construction of the external block walls to the Civic Amenity Site Office has commenced.

Salt Barn - The holding down bolts for the glulam timber frame will be cast into the Salt Barn plinths in the coming weeks. The timber frame is in production and installation will commence in July 2022.

Boundary Walls - Works are continuing on the boundary wall foundations and installation of wall panels to the south of the site. Installation of the northern section of boundary wall panels is also continuing. The walls to the western end of the site will be installed in the next few weeks.

The project remains largely on schedule with completion anticipated in late 2022.

Sillogue Infrastructure Scheme

Works are ongoing on the installation of the last section of new surface water line from Our Lady's Nursery towards the Ballymun Road. Footpaths and kerbs were installed from Owensilla Terrace junction towards Ballymun Road but have been vandalised and must be broken out and replaced.

Topsoil landscaping has been levelled and seeded from the compound at the Sillogue Road junction as far as the western side of Owensilla Terrace. The asphalt on the carriageway has been completed on the mainline from Sillogue Road as far as the Owensilla Terrace junction. Public lighting has been completed. No works will take place on the mainline from 18th July to 2nd August.

A "Road Closure" application has been submitted for Owensilla Terrace to Gateway Gardens from 15th August to 5th September. This is to safely facilitate constructing this last section of roadway. Residents will be notified in advance and diversionary routes will be put in place.

Sillogue Gardens

Drainage works are continuing to install a new foul and surface water network. The installation of a new Public Lighting Network is also continuing but has been slowed down as some existing infrastructure is located in private gardens and also some residents have built out into public space. There are on-going discussions with the ESB about arranging access. This delay is affecting the progress of the drainage works.

Work will continue in Sillogue Gardens throughout the builder's holidays. Plans have been prepared for new signage in Sillogue Gardens, which will show the house numbers at each laneway. Once the drainage and public works have been completed work will commence on constructing new footpaths throughout.

2. Community and Social Development

Community and Social Development Funding

The DCC Community and Social Development Grants for 2022 were launched at the end of June. There is an online format this year for applications. The Community and Social Development team are working with local community groups to get the applications completed and uploaded in the most efficient manner possible. A number of groups have met with staff members to help them submit their applications. The closing date for applications is the 22nd July.

Social Inclusion/Health and Wellbeing

A second successful information day/BBQ event was held in the Muck and Magic Community Garden on July 1st for people from migrant groups currently residing in local hotels and Balseskin Reception Centre. It was a pleasure to welcome our newly elected Lord Mayor, Caroline Conroy to the event. The event was a collaboration by the Community and Social Development team and Dublin North West Area Partnership to assist the groups and help better enable them to access local services. This intercultural event was a great success with refreshments, face painting, craft stand from Rediscovery Centre, magician, etc.









St Joseph's Hill Community Project

The Ballyrunners have finished their clean up and planting project on St Joseph's Hill. A brainstorming Art Workshop took place in St Joseph's School with 5th and 6th class students whereby 75 images were gathered relating to different forestry elements that were used for the artwork. The artwork is being finalised and dates will be agreed to start the artwork on the wall. There is great enthusiasm for this local community enhancement project which is being continually supported by a collaboration of DCC Ballymun, Community & Social Development team, Housing and Public Domain teams. Also included are the Community Gardaí, Sharon Harvey/Gap Ballymun, the Ballymun Jobs Centre, The Ballyrunners, The Easy Street team, St Joseph's staff / students and local residents.

Burren Court Community Group

The Golden Age Community Group is continuing to grow. An official launch of the group will take place in late August, with our support.

Environmental Initiatives

The Community and Social Development team (CSDT) are collaborating with Public Domain Section on a number of ongoing environmental initiatives including:

Greening Neighbourhoods Programme (four areas will be enhanced in the coming weeks), 2 of the greening neighbourhoods will take place in July in Belclare Lawns and on Dane Road outside St. Joseph's Church. Additional locations are being considered.

We have collaborated with Ballymun Tidy Towns on a number of community-related initiatives including judging the Ballymun Tidy Towns Competition.



Additional Community Events/Initiatives

Axis 21st Anniversary Live and Local Event

Our Community team collaborated with Axis on the organisation of an outdoor event as part of the Axis 21st Birthday Celebrations. This event took place on the Ballymun Plaza on 18th June and was a fun family-centred day with local musicians, play area for children and other fun birthday treats. It gave the local community a chance to meet with some of the people from Ukraine that are staying nearby. A great day was had by all.





Ballymun Health and Fitness- Triathlon Event

Following an emergency meeting on 1st July between Dublin City Council, An Garda Síochana, the Ballymun Triathlon Event Organisers and their Traffic Advisors the proposed Ballymun Triathlon event was postponed by the organisers as the draft traffic management plan was not adequate for the challenging and complex route proposed for the event. The impact of the proposed traffic management arrangement was likely to cause disruption to the wider community and in particular those living on the proposed route, many would not have being aware of the proposed event.

Dublin City Council and An Garda Síochana engaged with the group following the announcement and sale of tickets of the event earlier this year. A number of recommendations were made in relation to the proposal at a series of meetings, which were to be followed up, and actioned by the event organisers. However, the City Council and the Gardaí only received a draft Traffic Management Plan for the event on 29th June. In relation to any events with under 5000 attendees, a comprehensive Traffic Management Plan should have be submitted 6 weeks prior to the proposed event date for review by City Council and other stakeholders.

Dublin City Council wishes to acknowledge the work and commitment of the Ballymun Triathlon Club and Ballymun Health and Fitness Committee and look forward to continuing to work with them in the future.

Community Games

The Ballymun area entered the Dublin Community Games competitions in Athletics, Camogie and Table Tennis. Weekly coaching and training sessions have taken place throughout the year in other events including Handball, Olympic Handball, Basketball and Futsal.

It is proposed to enter more events next year and to increase the membership of the local committee.

A special mention to the volunteer coaches from the various local clubs and from the members of the Ballymun Health & Fitness Committee who gave their time and energy. The Girls u14 Camogie team were runners up in their event so achieved a silver medal representing their local area with distinction. Also a special mention to our Track & Field Athletes, who faced stiff competition at the Dublin Athletics finals at the Morton National Athletics stadium in Santry.



Walking Football

Walking Football has become a very popular activity. It is a great way to exercise and to relive past glories! In conjunction with the Ballymun Health & Fitness group, An Gaisce (Presidents award) and DCC, an intergenerational Walking Football programme is starting with An Gaisce students and older adults at the Trinity Comprehensive from Thursday July 7th at 3pm.

Recovery Month

The (CSDS) will support Ballymun Recovery Month. The Local Drugs Task Force in conjunction with statutory and voluntary stakeholders are in the process of planning programmes and activities to highlight strategies to promote recovery from drug/alcohol addiction and mental health issues. Recovery month takes place in September.

DCC have previously supported a couch to 5k running/jogging programme, a morning of meditation/tai chi in conjunction with the weekly walk in Poppintree Park and have allocated funding to the cycling programme.

Survey of Shangan Park Residents

The (CSDS) recently undertook a survey of Shangan Park residents to find out the issues and recommendations regarding the proposed upgrading of the designated play area. Some of the recommendations and issues are cited below:

Local residents are keen to see the area upgraded, suggestions included the marking of the tarmacked area for mini basketball/football. The installation of mini goalposts, basketball hoops and a soft play area. Both parents of young and older residents suggested the installation of picnic tables or a bench. Residents also cited the planting of flowers/shrubs and painting of the walls surrounding the area.

Issues hi-lighted by residents included anti-social behaviour, gangs congregating, drug taking/street drinking and littering. The (CSDS) are keen to work with a local resident working group to develop and upgrade the area for recreation, play and social purposes.

3. Economic Development Update

Ballymun 4 business held its summer 'Grill & Chill' gathering in the Aspen Student Life building on Main Street. There was a very good turn-out and the weather was good. The event also marked the 5th anniversay of B4b and there were spot prizes, live music and plenty of networking.





Following initiation of the Part 8 process at the North West Area Committee meeting on the 15th of February 2022, Housing and Community Services Department lodged a Part 8 application on the 10th of May 2022 for the development of the Site c. 1.77 ha at Shangan Road, Ballymun, Dublin 9.

Proposal:

LAW: Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) - Part 8

Applicant: Dublin City Council, Housing and Community Services

Location: Site c. 1.77 ha at Shangan Road, Ballymun, Dublin 9

Pursuant to the requirements of the above, Notice is hereby given of the construction of 93 residential dwellings at a Site c. 1.77 ha at Shangan Road, Ballymun, Dublin 9, which will consist of the following:

- 73 no. elderly persons apartments (67 no. 1-bed units and 6 no. 2-bedunits) in a 3 and 4 storey high building, with community room (51.66 sqm) and an office (14.42 sqm)
- 4no. 2 bed duplex apartments in a 2-storey high building.
- 16 no. 2 storey terraced houses (6 no. 2-bed; 8 no. 3-bed and 2 no. 4-bed units).

The proposed development also includes 55 no. new surface car parking, the redistribution of 12 no. existing surface car parking spaces, Communal and public open space, boundary treatments, public lighting, site drainage works, internal road surfacing and footpath, ESB switchroom, bin and bicycle storage, landscaping, play area and all ancillary site services and development works above and below ground. Construction of a link road from Shangan Road to the Ballymun Road.

The PPP Project Team held an online information session for local residents on the 23rd of February 2022. The period for submission of observations ended on 21st of June 2022.

There was 1 no. Third party observations made to the planning authority regarding this Local Authority Works application. The main issues raised being;

- Great to see development of the site
- Some concern from residents in Oldtown re overlooking and overshadowing
- The security on the playground beside Longdale is gueried
- The future plans for the rest of the site is questioned

These issues noted above are addressed in the Project Manager's summary below and outlined in further detail in the Planner's Report.

The conclusion and recommendation of the Planner's report is:

Conclusion

The Planning & Property Development Department considers that the proposal on completion will have a positive impact on the residential and visual amenities of the area. The proposed development complies with the policy provisions of the Dublin City Development Plan 2016 – 2022 and the Local Area Plan for Ballymun (2017). It is also noted that Irish Water have no objection subject to agreement to be reached on the diversion of the public foul sewer. Drainage and Transport Planning Divisions have recommended conditions,

In conclusion, the Planning & Property Development Department have no objections to the proposal.

Recommendation

It is recommended that a decision be made by Elected Members of the Council to proceed with the proposed development subject to the following recommendations:

1. Community Room

The community room shall be made available to the wider community. Details to be agreed with the planning authority in writing prior to the first occupation of same.

2. Materials

(i) All render proposed in the scheme shall be low maintenance with an anti-mould/anti-mildew additive included within (ii) Prior to the commencement of development, details of materials in the public realm shall be submitted to and agreed in writing by the Planning Department, having regard to the need to compliment and tie-in with the existing palette of materials in the area and in keeping with the Urban Form & Design objectives of the Ballymun Local Area Plan 2017.

3. Landscaping

- (a) Development shall not commence until a landscape scheme prepared by a suitably Qualified person comprising full details of the size, species and location of all trees and shrubs to be planted and the treatment of all external ground surfaces, has been submitted to and agreed in writing with Dublin City Council's Parks Landscape and Biodiversity Services Division and implemented in the first planting season following completion of the development, and any trees and shrubs which die or are removed within 3 years of planting shall be replaced in the following planting season. (The landscaping scheme shall have regard to the Guidelines for Open Space Development and Taking in Charge, available from the Parks and Landscape Services Division). Reason: In the interests of amenity, ecology and sustainable development.
- (b) The landscape scheme shall be implemented fully in the first planting season following completion of the development, and any trees or shrubs which die or are removed within 3 years of planting shall be replaced in the first planting season thereafter. (The landscape scheme shall have regard to the Guidelines for Open space Development and Taking in Charge, copies of which are available from the Parks, Biodiversity and Landscape Services Division

Reason: In the interests of amenity, ecology and sustainable development.

2. Irish Water Full details of the proposed diversion of the public foul sewer shall be agreed in writing with Irish Water prior to the commencement of construction on site.

3. Transportation Planning

- (i) The proposed site layout plan shall ensure compliance with the Design Manual for Urban Roads and Streets, 2013 as amended (2019) and in particular, all perpendicular car parking spaces shall incorporate a wheel stoppers to protect the pedestrian footway.
- (ii) Prior to commencement of development, and on appointment of a main contractor, Construction Management Plan shall be submitted to the planning authority for written agreement. This plan shall provide details of intended construction practice for the development, including traffic management and construction mobility management plan, hours of working, noise and dust management measures and off-site disposal of construction waste and access arrangements for labour, plant and materials, including location of plant and machine compound. The Construction Traffic Management Plan shall seek to minimise impact on the public road and potential conflict with pedestrians, cyclists and public transport. The appointed contractor shall liaise with DCC Road Works Control Division during construction period. The developer shall be obliged to comply with the requirements set out in the Code of Practice.
- (iii) Prior to commencement of development, the developer shall agree in writing with the Planning Authority's Environment & Transportation Department the proposed footpaths, hard landscaping areas and on-street car parking, including proposed car share spaces to be taken in charge. Details of all materials proposed in public areas shall be in accordance with the document Construction Standards for Roads and Street Works in Dublin City Council and agreed in detail with the Road Maintenance Division. Any proposed works to the public road shall be carried out by Dublin City Council and at the expense of the applicant/developer.
- (iv) The applicant/developer shall undertake to implement the measures outlined in the Mobility Management Plan, and Car Parking Management Strategies to ensure that future occupants of the proposed development comply with these strategies. A Mobility Manager shall be appointed to oversee and co-ordinate the plan.
- (v) The car parking spaces shall not be sold, rented or otherwise sub-let or leased to any parties. The car parking spaces shall be retained by and managed by the Operator for the development in accordance with the details outlined the submitted Mobility Management Plan and Car Parking Strategy.

- (vi) Prior to occupation, each car parking space shall have ducting infrastructure (consisting of conduits for electric cables) installed to enable the subsequent installation of recharging points for electric vehicles.
- (vii) Cycle parking shall be secure, conveniently located, sheltered, well lit and functional in line with manufacture specifications. Key/fob access shall be required to the resident bicycle parking stores. Cycle parking shall be in situ prior to the occupation of the proposed development.
- (viii) The applicant shall liaise with the Roads Maintenance Division prior to completion in relation to the works within the public road.
- (ix) All costs incurred by Dublin City Council, including any repairs to the public road and services necessary as a result of the development, shall be at the expense of the developer.

4. Drainage

- (i) The developer shall comply with the Greater Dublin Regional Code of Practice for Drainage Works Version 6.0 (available from www.dublincity.ie Forms and Downloads)
- (ii) The developer shall submit an appropriate flood risk assessment for the proposed development, which identifies and proposes design solutions to mitigate the potential risks from all sources including coastal, fluvial, pluvial and groundwater. Reference should be made to the DEHLG/OPW Guidelines on the Planning Process and Flood Risk Management published in November 2009 and the Dublin City Development Plan 2016-2022 Strategic Flood Risk Assessment. The developer shall confirm in writing to the Drainage Division that the development has been designed such that the risk of flooding to the development has been reduced as far as is reasonably practicable, and that the proposals do not increase the risk of flooding to any adjacent or nearby area.
- (iii) Records of public surface water sewers are indicative and must be verified on site. The Developer must carry out a comprehensive site survey to establish all public surface water sewers that may be on the site. If surface water infrastructure is found that is not on public records the Developer must immediately contact Dublin City Council's Drainage Division to ascertain their requirements. Detailed "as-constructed" drainage layouts for all diversions, extensions and abandonment of public surface water sewers; in both hard and soft copy in an approved format are to be submitted by the Developer to the Drainage Division for written approval. Please refer to Section 5 of the Greater Dublin Regional Code of Practice for Drainage Works Version 6.0.
- (iv) The development is to be drained on a completely separate system with surface water discharging to the public surface water system.

- (v) A connection from this development to the public surface water sewer network will only be granted when the developer has obtained the written permission of the Drainage Division and fulfilled all the planning requirements including the payment of any financial levies. All expense associated with carrying out the connection work are the responsibility of the developer. Developers are not permitted to connect to the public surface water network system without written permission from the Drainage Division. Any unauthorised connections shall be removed by the Drainage Division at the developer's expense. A licence will be required from the Drainage Division to allow the connection work to be carried out. Permission of the Roads Dept must also be obtained for any work in the public roadway.
- (vi) Where pipelines are to be taken-in-charge by Dublin City Council, as-constructed drawings of all pipelines complete with CCTV surveys, to a standard specified by Drainage Division, must be submitted to Drainage Division for written sign-off. This must be submitted no later than the completion of each phase of the development works on site. Please refer to Section 5 of the Greater Dublin Regional Code of Practice for Drainage Works Version 6.0.
- (vii) New public surface water sewers shall have minimum clear distance of 3 metres between the sewer and any new structures on site.
- (vii) All surface water discharge from this development must be attenuated to two litres per second.
- (viii) The development shall incorporate Sustainable Drainage Systems in the management of surface water. The Suds devices outlined in the RPS Drainage and Watermain Design Report, dated March 2022, including Green Roofs, permeable paving and on-plot SuDS devices shall be implemented in full. Full details of these shall be agreed in writing with Drainage Division prior to commencement of construction.
- (ix) An appropriate petrol interceptor shall be installed on the internal drain from the car park. Please refer to section 20 of the Greater Dublin Regional Code of Practice for Drainage Works Version 6.0.
- (x) Full details and maintenance requirements of the attenuation storage facility, flow control device and petrol interceptor intended to be taken in charge by Drainage Division shall be submitted for agreement with Drainage Division prior to the commencement of construction.
- (xi) The outfall surface water manhole from this development must be constructed in accordance with the Greater Dublin Regional Code of Practice for Drainage Works Version 6.0.
- (xii) All private drainage such as, downpipes, gullies, manholes, armstrong junctions, etc. are to be located within the final site boundary. Private drains should not pass through property they do not serve.

Project Manager Summary Report

The PPP Project Manager can confirm consideration was given to the observations raised during the online information session for local residents on the 23rd February 2022.

The planners report also addresses the issues raised during the public consultation and outlines same in the comprehensive planners report.

The summary below outlines the issues raised and the response to same.

Some concern from residents in Oldtown re overlooking and overshadowing

It is considered that the most sensitive properties in relation to any potential overlooking would be the established two-storey houses on Oldtown Avenue, located immediately to the south of the site, where the rear gardens of same back onto this application site. It is noted that minimum 22 metre separation distances are proposed between the rear elevations of the new two-storey dwellings and the elevations of the proposed duplex units and the rear of the existing two-storey dwellings along Oldtown Avenue i.e. nos. 43 – 73a (odd only). The dwellings proposed are two-storey. The separation distances are adequate and comply with development plan requirements to ensure privacy levels are not unduly impacted upon. As the proposed development is located to the north of these established dwellings. The closest dwellings, two-storey in nature, will not lead to overshadowing of existing rear gardens on Oldtown Avenue. Site 10 is at a higher level to the rear gardens of Oldtown Avenue however it is proposed to install a 2.0m high post a panel fence on the high side to eliminate potential overlooking. Discussion will take place with residents closer to construction to resolve any possible boundary concerns.

The security on the playground beside Longdale is queried

The park will be a public open space managed and maintained by Dublin City Council, Parks Dept in partnership with the Local Area Office.

The future plans for the rest of the site is questioned

The Ballymun Lap stipulates that the western half of this site to the rear of the Civic Centre shall accommodate increased heights and densities given proximity to Main Street and should be in keeping with the urban form of Shangan Hall and Gateway Student housing. Additional student housing could be provided on this site, with heights of five storeys achievable. This proposal does not compromise the development potential of the balance of the site.



The Public Domain Section in conjunction with Ballymun Tidy Towns are working together to do a series "Wildflowers of Ballymun" Posters. Trinity Comprehensive photography students were involved as well as another young photographer from the area. These were designed by the Ballymun Biodiversity Focus Group who are involved in the new Ballymun Biodiversity Action Plan.









IBAL Report 2022

Overall the IBAL (Irish Business against litter) report highlighted significant improvements in the Ballymun area.

Ballymun: 31st out of 40 towns / cities surveyed. Moderately Littered.

There was a notable improvement in the overall presentation of Ballymun with several of the heavily littered sites in 2021 no longer so – examples of these included the car park at the former Ballymun Shopping Centre, Gateway Crescent and the rear of Ballymun Sports and Leisure Centre. Several different initiatives were noted e.g., Tidy Towns, 'Better Ballymun' and 'Ballymun Recovery – our Community Supports Addiction Recovery'.
