To ask the Manager to find a solution to the continuing illegal parking on (details supplied) it is causing daily issues with cars having to reverse back onto a busy road in order to let cars pass.

**PROPOSED EXTINGUISHMENT OF THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY AT 12 GORTBEG DRIVE, FINGLAS,
DUBLIN 11.**

Proposal

It is proposed to extinguish the public right of way at the above location in order to facilitate the installation of a plinth wall and railings to reduce/eliminate anti-social behaviour and access at this point into the estate. The extent of this proposed extinguishment is shown on the attached Drawing SM-2022-0521.

A service check will be undertaken to establish the extent of the services located on this area. Suitable arrangements will be put in place prior to completion of this proposal.

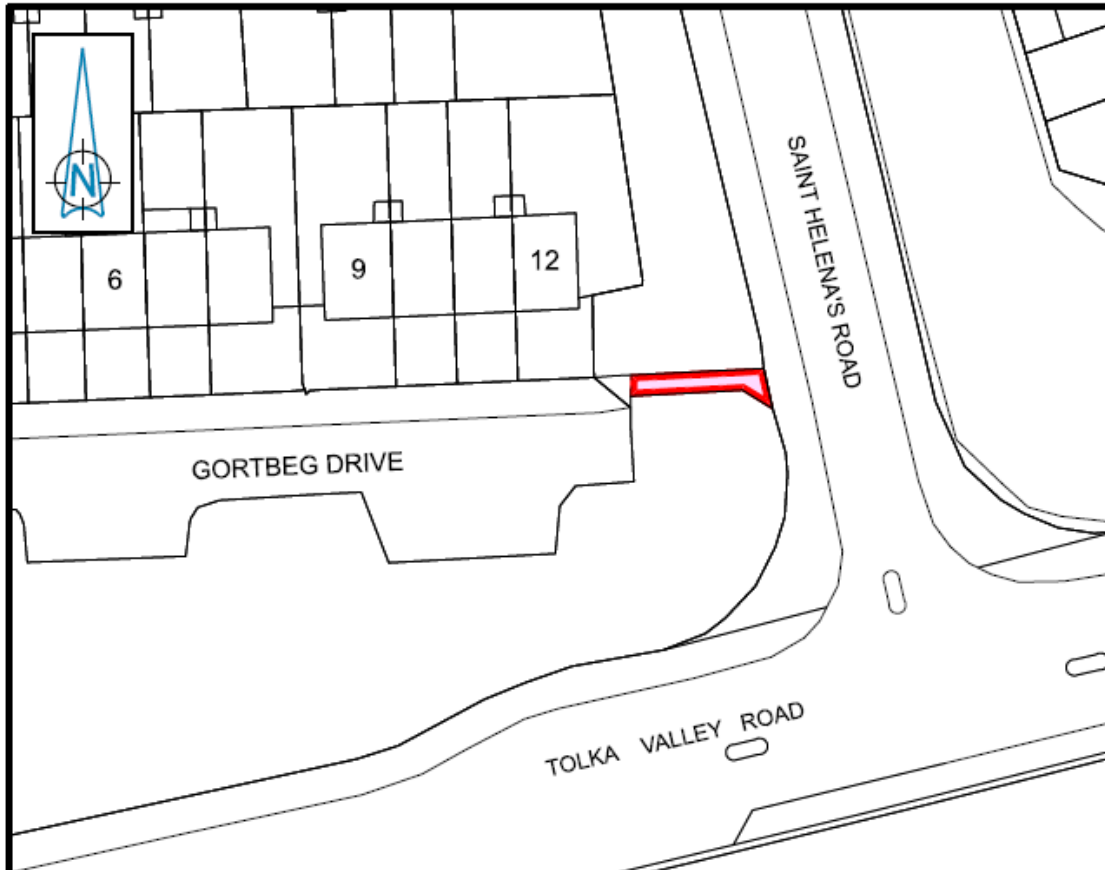
Statutory Requirement

The statutory procedure involves giving public notice of the proposal in one or more newspapers circulating in the City and the affixing of that notice at the right of way for a period of not less than 14 days. Any objections or representations made and not withdrawn shall be considered. The extinguishment of a public right of way is a function reserved to the elected members of the City Council.


Recommendation

I recommend that procedures be initiated under Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993 to extinguish the public right of way over the area indicated on attached Drawing SM-2022-0521.

1. Local Area Plan Update

Site 1 – Shopping Centre

The process to appoint an estate agent to seek expressions of interest in the shopping centre site has commenced. The level of interest in the site will then be collated and analysed by the agents and their report will be considered by DCC with a view to determining next steps, Further update end Q1, 2023.

Vacant DCC units

Shangan Neighbourhood Centre

The Development Department has commenced negotiations with the 3 parties interested in the Shangan Neighbourhood Centre vacant units following site visits and significant engagement with the Area Office.

PPP Sites – Bundle 4

Ballymun LAP Sites 5 – Main Street to Santry Cross, 15, 16, 17 & 18 Balcurris

The above sites have been approved by the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage for inclusion in the National Social Housing PPP Programme, Bundle 4. An update was presented to North West Area Committee members by the PPP Project team in June 2022. The next project milestone is the appointment of the Design team which will be finalised in Q4 2022. The PPP Project team will be in a position to bring forward a programme and scheme design update in Q1/Q2 2023.

Affordable Housing Bodies

Sites 8 & 9 - Coultrey

Housing and Community Services continue to engage with Empower the Family on their proposals for part of site 9. A single Expression of Interest is being prepared for sites 8 and 9 together as this will improve the likelihood of success from the AHB Sector. It will also increase the viability of delivering mixed tenure developments on the sites.

Sites 11 & 13 - Sillogue Avenue and Sillogue Road

An Expression of Interest to the AHB Protocol is being finalised. Housing and Community Services are proposing to advertise a single Expression of Interest as this will improve the likelihood of success from the AHB Sector. It will also increase the viability of delivering mixed tenure developments on the sites. Community consultation will be arranged with the local residents and community.

Site 14 - Balbutcher Lane

The Planning and Housing Departments are currently finalising a revised density model which has been prepared for Site 14, the new proposals would increase the yield to 126 dwellings. The scheme will then proceed to Part VIII.

Site 19 – St. Joseph's

A decision is due in relation to Planning Application 4853/22 which was lodged on 14th September. This application was for 17 single storey senior citizens' units and 34 affordable purchase houses. Housing and Community Services have engaged with the local community and are making arrangements to update local residents in relation to issues raised during the local public consultation in recent months.

Site 25 – Parkview

Dublin City Council and O'Cualann held further discussions on outstanding LAP requirements relating to parking provision and permeability. A revised planning application

for affordable homes is expected to be made shortly. Planning was secured earlier in the year for a block of 36 senior citizens' units on the site.

Site 30 – North City Operations Depot

The construction of the North City Operations Depot continues to progress well.

The main structural work to the Administration & Welfare Building is complete. Work is continuing at roof level to install plant and roof light-well works which is almost complete. Curtain walling installations are continuing on all façades of the building with glazing completed. Work is continuing on the installation of brackets for coloured fins along with timber effect infill panels. Plastering is ongoing on all floors and stairwells. 1st and 2nd fix Mechanical & Electrical installations are continuing on all floors along with raised access floor installation. Under floor services containment is completed on 2nd and 3rd floors. Painting work is continuing along with decorative tiling to welfare areas.

External precast edge panels are completed on the Multi Storey Car Park (MSCP). Internal concrete works are mostly completed as is preparation for floor coatings application.

1st and 2nd fix Mechanical & Electrical installations are continuing in the Central Stores and Workshops. Sectional doors are now mostly installed. Super-flat floor now laid in the Central Stores ground floor. Preparation works for floor painting has commenced. The external canopy framing to the front of the workshops has been installed and the metal cladding is continuing. External kerbing completed and tarmac started outside the Central Stores and Workshops.

The Salt Barn's Glulam frame is complete. The 1st layer roof covering is installed and work on the final covering has commenced with erection of scaffold around this building. Timber cladding to walls has commenced.

The Civic Amenity Site (CAS) Office roof is completed. Window installation has commenced. Mechanical & Electrical installations are well progressed. CAS area kerbing and concrete slab is complete.

The eastern patterned Boundary Wall (north of the entrance) has been installed and foundations for the Boundary Wall (south of the entrance) have commenced.

The permanent east side access is in use by the Contractor as the main construction access. Works to the northern access (opposite IKEA / Decathlon) are continuing with kerbing works to form the central island now mostly complete. The Contractor is carrying out ongoing works around the existing traffic lights which will remain operational. New traffic light installations at both junctions are agreed between Dublin City Council and Fingal County Council. Junction design work is ongoing. Footpath works external to the boundary wall are substantially complete along Carton Way including lighting, kerbing and laying tarmac.

There have been some delays to the project programme and, assuming there are no further delays, the scheduled completion of construction is early 2023. There will be a fit-out period after that for furniture and IS configuration. It is still anticipated that the depot will start to become operational in Q1 of 2023.

Silloque Infrastructure Scheme

The new Silloque Avenue carriageway is open from Silloque Road to Ballymun Road. The two new sets of pedestrian lights are now operational. Dublin City Council engaged in a communication campaign to make locals more aware of these new lights, particularly the one located at the Holy Spirit National School where many drivers were not obeying the red

light. Compliance appears to have improved but is still an issue at the traffic lights near Our Lady's nursery.

The new drainage pipes and manholes are approximately 80% completed in Sillogue Gardens. Work will then continue on building the new gullies and connecting these to the new network, followed by construction of new footpaths.

Kerbing footpaths and parking bays have commenced in the laneway adjacent to the crèche. These works are slow while trying to maintain traffic flow. Work is continuing on the new parking bays and access laneway in the 'triangle' area at the east end of Sillogue Gardens.

Antisocial behaviour continues to cause problems on site as discussed at the Ballymun Safety Forum. The Project team in conjunction with the Public Domain Team and local Gardaí, visited the local schools prior to Halloween to highlight the issues and to deliver a safety message.

2. Community and Social Development

Age Friendly Initiatives

The first meeting of the North West Area Older Persons Council took place on Wednesday the 19th October and a new group has been formed. New members are still enrolling for this group.

A community team member attended the National Age Friendly Awards Ceremony along with two members of the Older Persons Council on Thursday the 27th November in Dromoland Castle, Co. Clare. This was a very worthwhile networking event.

Environmental Issues

The Community and Social Development team assisted the Ballymun Tidy Towns Group with the judging of the Halloween spooky gardens/schools competitions. Complementary bulbs were delivered to over 60 groups in the last few weeks.

Upcoming Initiatives

As part of Inclusion and Integration Week 2022, (7th to 14th November) The Community team will be organising and supporting the following events:

- **FACT:** Relaunch of the Group and taster sports session for members and families – 7th November – 3pm - Poppintree Community Centre.
- **Disability Sports Day:** Activities to include walking football, tennis and boccia – Trinity Comprehensive Sports Hall – Monday the 7th November – 1:30pm – 3:30pm.
- **Walk and Talk Historical Tour** – Santry Woods – Tuesday the 8th November – 11:15am – 1:15pm.
- **Gala Concert for Older Persons:** Active Living and the Community team are holding a Gala Concert on Friday the 18th November in the atrium, Ballymun Civic Offices from 7pm.
- **Ballymun Health and Fitness Summit** – 18th to 20th November. Dublin City Council, Ballymun have provided funding and additional supports for this Health and Wellness-related summit which is the first of its kind in Ballymun and includes a variety of health and wellness related activities, workshops and conferences to take place in Trinity Comprehensive, Axis Ballymun and the Ballymun Plaza. The Community team are involved in a number of activities over the weekend including the Come and Try Day to take place on the Plaza on Friday the 18th November.

- **Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony and Santa:** Friday the 2nd December from 5pm. Lord Mayor Caroline Conroy will open this festive event.

PUBLIC DOMAIN REPORT

Waste Management and Illegal Dumping

There were 201 incidences of illegal dumping recorded on CRM for October which were dealt with by Waste Management Services. 281 community clean-up were supported by the Public Domain Team for the month.

Bio Bags (compostable) are being distributed to as many groups as possible in order to assist with the clearing of leaves in the area. This initiative is very popular with local residents/environmental groups which has resulted in an increase in community clean ups since September.

Bulb Distribution

The Public Domain Team sourced a substantial allocation of bulbs from Parks Services and with assistance from both Ballymun and Finglas Community Teams distributed a parcel of bulbs to 120 Community and Environmental Groups in the last few weeks. This arrangement is always welcomed by the groups.

The Christmas tree lighting event will take place on Thursday 1st December at 5 p.m. in Finglas Village. The event is being arranged by the Public Domain and Community Teams. Finglas Tidy Towns will be present on the evening with treats for everyone. Official invitations have been circulated.

Ballymun and Finglas Tidy Towns

The North West Area representatives in the annual Tidy Towns competition did the area proud again this year getting favourable reports and increasing their scores when compared to 2021. Congratulations to Ballymun Tidy Towns who were the National Winner in the special category “Circular Economy Award”, a great achievement for Ballymun with an overall score increase from 308 in 2021 to 319 in 2022. Finglas Tidy towns marks also increased from 303 in 2021 to 311 in 2022.

These excellent results reflect the hard work carried out during 2022 by the Tidy Towns Groups in both areas. Congratulations to both groups for their ongoing commitment and dedication. The work undertaken is of immense value to the North West Area and Dublin City Council greatly appreciates their input and effort in the area. North West Area Halloween Report

As in previous years the Public Domain Team, Housing, Waste Management and Parks Services worked alongside Gardaí from Ballymun and Finglas as part of “Operation Tombola” to remove stockpiled material and reduce the negative impacts of bonfires in the area. This collaborative effort commenced on Saturday 22nd and concluded on the afternoon of 31st October.

Cooperation between Dublin City Council and local Gardaí was key to the success of the operation this year, with minimal damage to public amenities reported.

Waste Management Services have indicated that the total figure of stockpiled material collected was 441 tonnes citywide, which is an improvement on the 2021 figure of 515 tonnes.

Approximately 4000 information leaflets outlining the dangers of bonfires and listing Dublin City Council contact details to report locations of materials were distributed to householders in the vicinity of locations where bonfires have traditionally been set.

Businesses in the industrial estates were visited by the Public Domain team, and advised on the need to secure bonfire materials in the weeks prior to Halloween. Regular inspections of vacant City Council properties and green areas were conducted by Public Domain and Housing staff throughout the NWA to check for the presence of stockpiling.

In total, there were 25 bonfires, 11 in Ballymun and 14 in Finglas, the majority of which were minor, with minimal damage evident. The successful Amnesty Day, held in September, also significantly reduced the number of mattresses illegally disposed in the run up to Halloween.

The clearing and cleaning of all bonfire sites has now been completed by Parks Services.



Finglas Fright Night:

The Finglas Halloween Festival “Finglas Fright Night,” took place on site at the Finglas Civic Centre from 6.00pm to 9.00pm. There was a wide variety of entertainment for the community to enjoy. On the night there were carnival rides, inflatable obstacle courses, magic from our local magician Colm Jolly, food, coffee and treat stalls, along with various old fashioned carnival games with prizes, face painters and balloon modellers. On the main stage the night kicked off with several performances from the children and young adults from the new band “The MC Warriors”. This is a very talented group from the Meeting Place Club with differing abilities and were a big hit on the night. There were brilliant performances from Finglas locals Darian Kavanagh Keating, MC Samra and the up and coming Finglas rapper and TikToker Cian Carey – Dubal C.

As the headline act, Ciaran Houlihan who is currently on his European Tour and considered to be one of the best Elvis Tribute acts in the world delivered a star performance while the crowd danced and sang along.



The Finglas Community & Social Development Section (CSDS) organised and managed the event with assistance on the night from other staff from the Area Office and the Finglas Sports & Fitness Centre and support from the Civil Defence and Order of Malta.

An Garda Síochána attended the event and with the assistance of the security company monitored the crowds throughout the festival site.



The CSDS invited the local community groups to help with ticket sales for all the attractions. Ticket sales go towards the groups fund raising efforts. Entire Families entered the Fancy Dress Completion and hundreds of people attended the celebrations in fancy dress to add to the festivities and atmosphere.





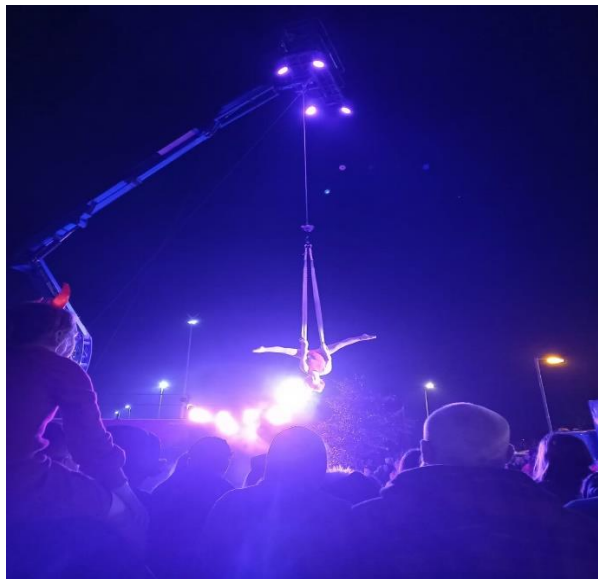
