MINUTES OF THE PROTOCOL COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 1 JUNE 2023

1 Minutes of the meeting held on 27th April and matters arising.

Order: Agreed.

2 St. Patrick's Festival - Richard Shakespeare

The Members raised the following issues in relation to the St. Patrick's Festival:

- Access to the unredacted report on the governance of St. Patricks Festival
- Councillor representation on the Board
- Greater recognition of Dublin City Councils role in supporting the Festival both financially as a sponsor but also the infrastructure of the City.

Richard Shakespeare responded to these issues as follows:

- The Governance report is a government document and therefore it is not within the authority of Dublin City Council to release it. A request for its release is currently with the Information Commissioner who's decision will determine if it is made available to Councillors.
- The request for additional Councillor representation on the Board will be considered at the AGM of St. Patrick's Festival. Although the Lord Mayor already sits on the Board as a special Member. The executive of Dublin City Council made a decision to withdrawn its representative due a conflict of interest.
- The Manager confirmed that Dublin City Council is a significant sponsor of the Festival, providing €398,000 in funding in 2022. The Members can have an influence on the Festival through the Memorandum of Understanding which is agreed as part of the sponsorship process. The Arts Strategic Policy Committee could provide the Members with an appropriate forum to raise issues in relation to the Festival. The Manager was happy to take on-board any recommendations from the Members in terms of what other goals they wanted to achieve through involvement in the Festival.

He thanked the Members for bringing the motion to his attention and assured them that it has been shared with the relevant legislative officials within the Department for their consideration.

 Cllr. Joe Costello informed Members that Sabina Higgins on behalf of the Sean O'Casey Committee had written to Dublin City Council asking the Council to investigate the commissioning of a public monument of Sean O'Casey to recognise his contribution to Irish literature.

The Manager advised that the request would be best progressed through the Arts SPC and the Commemorations and Naming Committee.

 Cllr. Alison Gilliland asked that the Manager ensure that adequate recycling facilities are in place in City Hall and also that reusable kitchenware be provided.

MINUTES OF THE PROTOCOL COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY 7 JUNE 2023

1 Lord Mayor Proposal for the awarding of The Freedom of the City

The Lord Mayor requested that the meeting be held in camera as they would be discussing private individuals. The Members agreed to this request.

The Lord Mayor proposed Duncan Stewart and Greta Thunberg for the Freedom of the City for their work on environmental issues, raising public awareness of the climate crisis and youth activism. They will be the first environmentalists nominated for the Freedom of the City award, which is a reflection of the significant contribution they have made.

The Members expressed their support for the two candidates proposed by the Lord Mayor and commended their contributions in promoting environmentalism, climate action and youth activism. Councillor Mannix Flynn abstained from supporting the nominations.

The Lord Mayor thanked the Members for their support and confirmed that the nominations would go for approval to the City Council meeting on 12th June 2023 and the Freedom of the City ceremony would take place on 21st June 2023 in the Round Room at the Mansion House.

The Chair suggested that the process for nominations for the Freedom of the City should be reviewed with regards to the timing of nominations and the number of candidates proposed. The Members supported the Chairs suggestion.

Report to the Chair and Members of the Protocol Committee



Friendship Agreement with City of Ramallah, Palestine – 29th June 2023

At the meeting of the Protocol Committee held on Thursday 26th January 2023, a Motion proposed by Councillor Daithí Doolan and seconded by Councillor Mannix Flynn was agreed "*Organising a delegation from Dublin City Council to Ramallah, Palestine*". This was agreed by Dublin City Council at its monthly meeting held on 6th March.

In December 2022 Chief Executive Owen Keegan met with Palestinian Ambassador to Ireland Dr. Jilan Wahba Abdalmajid to discuss potential for cooperation between the two cities. Following this meeting the Chief Executive wrote to Ramallah Municipality to ascertain the interest in developing the connection between Dublin City Council and the Municipality of Ramallah at both political and official level, based on sharing of knowledge / expertise in areas of mutual interest and benefit. The Chief Executive spoke to the Director of Ramallah Municipal Authority Mr. Ahmed K. Abulaban on 11th April and Mr Abulaban confirmed that Ramallah Municipal Authority were appreciative of the on-going political links with Dublin City Council, would be keen to develop the connection with Dublin City Council to cover areas of mutual interest and would be keen to enter into an agreement with Dublin City Council.

Areas of mutual interest discussed included:

- Climate Action
- Sustainable Transport / Active Travel
- Municipal Services in particular waste management
- Smart Cities

Consultation with senior staff within Dublin City Council was undertaken and it was agreed the areas identified above were suitable for collaboration to begin.

Other areas of potential collaboration may arise following more detailed conversations with Ramallah Municipal Authority. If the members have any suggestions of other areas which would be beneficial to Dublin City, I would welcome their comments.

A number of visits to Palestine by Councillors and staff from Dublin City Council have been held over the past ten years including in 2017 by Lord Mayor Brendan Carr, in 2018 by Ardmhéara Mícheál Mac Donncha and in 2022 by Lord Mayor Alison Gilliland.

The Department of Foreign Affairs are supportive of the establishment of a Friendship Agreement as is the Embassy of the Palestinian Authority in Ireland.

Recommendation

Following consideration, any new Friendship Agreement would align with the Dublin City Council's Mission Statement *To drive the sustainable development of the City through strong civic leadership and delivery of effective services that promote the well-being and quality of life of citizens and communities.*

I would recommend the establishment of a Friendship Agreement between Dublin and the Ramallah Municipal Authority for a 4 year term. Areas of co-operation to include Climate Action, Sustainable Transport / Active Travel, Municipal Services and Smart Cities. Other areas may be considered following more in depth conversations with Ramallah Municipal Authority.

If the members of the Protocol Committee agree to the establishment of this Friendship Agreement, planning will commence on a visit by a delegation of Elected Members and staff from Dublin City Council to Ramallah in Autumn 2023. The delegation to be led by the Lord Mayor of Dublin (or nominated representative) and Chairs or nominated representatives of the Climate Action, Environment and Energy SPC, Economic Development and Enterprise SPC and Traffic and Transport SPC.
