

# Housing Adaptation Grants For Older People and People with a Disability.

Three Grants available for older people and people with disabilities to help make their privately owned home safer and easier to get around.

1. Housing Adaptation Grant for People with a Disability.

- 2. Mobility Aids Grant.
- 3. Housing Aid for Older People Grant.

## Housing Adaptation Grant for People with a Disability.

- ➤ A Ramp or other ways to access your home.
- Grab Rails.
- > Bathroom facilities like an accessible shower or downstairs toilet.
- ➤ Stair Lift.
- ➤ Space for Wheelchair access.
- An extension (for a bedroom or bathroom to accommodate a person with a disability).

- ➤ Grab Rails.
- ➤ A Ramp.
- ➤ An Accessible shower.
- >A Stair Lift.
- This Grant can cover 100% of the cost of the work, up to a maximum of €6,000. Only applies to households with a total income of less than €30,000.

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## **Housing Aid for Older People Grant.**

For People 66 years old or older. Sometimes this Grant can be paid to people under 66 years old, but only in cases of hardship.

- ➤ Help repair or replace the roof.
- ➤ Upgrade the Electrical Wiring.
- Repair or replace doors and windows.
- Provide central heating (where there is no central heating or it is broken beyond economic repair).

## Review and Expected Changes in 2024.

- DHLGH is reviewing Housing Adaptation Grant for Older People and People with a Disability Scheme.
- Review is informed by engagement with relevant stakeholders and submissions.
- Among areas the review has considered is income thresholds, grant limits, and the application and decisions making process.
- ➤DHLGH is engaging with Dept. Public Expenditure & Reform on recommendations and possible amendments to the Scheme.

- ➤ Maintain high provision of various Grants for all applicants.
- >Importantly, facilitate older people and people with a disability to continue to live independently.
- **➤** Continue to build on progress to date.
  - > Support people to live in their own homes.
