- There have been 61 detections for the Sale/Supply of Drugs as opposed to 42 for the same period last year, representing an increase of 45%
- There have been 11 arrests for Driving whilst intoxicated in 2017 in comparison to 16 for the same period last year an decrease of 31%
- No Fatal Road Traffic Accidents recorded in 2017.
- 256 Public Order Incidents are recorded in 2017 as opposed to 267 incidents in 2016, showing a decrease of 4%
- 44 Incidents of Drunkenness are recorded in 2017 as opposed to 34 in 2016, an increase of 29%
- 17 Incidents of Assault causing Harm are recorded in 2017, as opposed to 16 in 2016, a increase of 6%
- 23 incidents of Minor Assault are recorded in 2017 as opposed to 24 in the same period last year showing a decrease of 4%
