5. North East Inner City Project	 ▶ BK briefed the board on the background to this. Ursula Donnellan will be taking on the role of Project Manager. A specially appointed Senior Sports Development Officer (SSDO) will work under her but will also be aligned to the Partnership. The total amount of funding towards both capital and revenue projects will comfortably exceed €1 million. The bulk of this will need to be spent by Dec 31st so the team involved will need to hit the ground running. A general discussion ensued in relation to what the area needs and how DCSWP can contribute. It was recommended that the new SSDO, once in place should report to the DCSWP advisory board meetings. It is hoped that this will allow the board to have some input into decisions made by the project team. ▶ SK requested the job description and workplan for the new SSDO BK intends to forward this information to the local councillors imminently so will copy all board members on this.
