- There were no murders in 2017
- There have been 72 detections for the Sale/Supply of Drugs in 2017 as opposed to 55 for the same period last year, representing an increase of 31%.
- There have been 24 arrests for Driving whilst intoxicated in 2017 in comparison to 28 for the same period last year an decrease of 14%.
- There are 2 Fatal Road Traffic Accidents recorded in 2017 as opposed to 0 representing an increase of 200%.
- 174 Public Order Incidents are recorded in 2017 as opposed to 158 in 2016, showing a increase of 10%.
- 23 Incidents of Drunkenness are recorded in 2017 as opposed to 14 in 2016, an increase of 64%.
- 11 Incidents of Assault causing Harm are recorded in 2017, as opposed to 11 in 2016, an increase of 0% .
- 21 Incidents of Minor Assault are recorded in 2017 as opposed to 37 in the same period last year showing a decrease of 43%.
