



Dublin City Infrastructure Summit – Outcomes Report

The Dublin City Infrastructure Summit, which took place on the 23rd May 2017 in the Council Chamber of Dublin City Hall, was intended to highlight the challenges facing infrastructure for Dublin City. The aims of the summit were to:

- Bring together key stakeholders to discuss the main issues
- Propose and debate new solutions
- Consider trends and the future needs for the city

The summit was hosted by The Chairperson of the Economic Development, Enterprise & International Relations Strategic Policy Committee of Dublin City Council, Cllr Paul McAuliffe and the Economic Development Office of Dublin City Council. It is part of the Dublin Summit Series which is organised by Dublin City Council in order to engage and facilitate cross city conversations on topical issues, challenges and opportunities facing the city of Dublin.

This document is the outcome report from the Infrastructure Summit and records the key contributions and outcomes from the summit. Various key policy makers from Local and National Government, industry bodies and key stakeholder organisations presented at the summit and contributed during discussions.
