There is a number of crime prevention strategies conducted in the Finglas area.

Operation Crossover which maximises resources deployed to Beats and Patrols during Unit crossover times is ongoing, as well as **Operation Reclaim** Patrols targeting drug dealing in the area. There is continued liaison with resident groups, local businesses, and Finglas Safety Forums to assist in addressing issues of Anti Social Behaviour in the area.

Operation Irene is ongoing to tackle Public Order issues with particular emphasis on parks and open areas. There are targeted patrols by the Community Policing Unit Friday and Saturday evenings between 4pm and 2am. Finglas East will be an area of focus in the run up to Christmas, to combat anti social behaviour of youths.

A Business watch scheme is in operation which has a targeted approach for crimes against businesses in the area.

Operation Thor, Operation Creeper and Operation Hybrid continues with checkpoints, surveillance and searches carried out during each tour of duty. Emphasis on high volume crime and specific criminal targets.

There are 1 Sgts and 5 Gardaí attached to the Community policing unit in Finglas and 6 mountain bikes that are in regular use.

There were 83 Juvenile Referrals for the Finglas District, a slight decrease of 1 in the same period last year.

Regular inspections of licensed premises remain a priority to target underage consumption of alcohol and the illegal sale of alcohol to minors. There have been 49 Licensed Premises Inspections in the Finglas area in 2017.

There are 2 projects in Finglas,

- F.A.N. (Finglas Action Now) 2 Project workers funded by the Dept of Justice and the Local drugs Task Force, primarily working in Finglas South and West areas.
- E.F.F.O.R.T (East Finglas for Organised Response to Youth) 2 Project workers funded by the Dept of Justice and the Local drugs Task Force, working in the Finglas East area.
 E.F.F.O.R.T. was launched by Minister Ahearn in October, 2009.

It should be noted that in any reference to statistics, those statistics are provisional, operational, liable to change and some possibly re-classified with the introduction of Central Statistics Office reports.
