# FINGLAS AREA OFFICE REPORT

## Update on Kildonan Lands Project

Following public consultation the Lands Framework Study has been completed by Brady Shipman Brady. A summary report has been circulated to members. Pauline Byrne, Partner, BSM will be present at the September meeting of the NWAC to respond to comments from members.



## Next Steps

At the July Meeting Councillors requested that a report is presented to the monthly Area Committee meetings outlining progress made in attempting to relocate the Abigail Centre.

The Kildonan site was transferred to Dublin City Council from the OPW for the provision of a day and residential service to meet the needs of vulnerable women with histories of homelessness.

Now that the Site Framework Study has been completed the next step is to establish how the existing service can continue and that the City Council has satisfied the terms of the agreement for the transfer of the lands from the OPW.

The Housing Department has informed our office that they will consider including the lands in the Social Housing Programme when the requirements for the continuation of the service have been determined by the DRHE.

The next Meeting of the group chaired by Rita Burtenshaw, the Independent Facilitator, is scheduled for 4.30 pm on the 21<sup>st</sup> September.

Brendan Kenny, Assistant Chief Executive, will attend a meeting with the WFTRA Committee and public representatives in the Finglas Area Office at 4 pm on the 27<sup>th</sup> September.

#### Liam Mellows Working Group (WG)

The inaugural meeting of the WG was held in the Finglas Area Office on the 6<sup>th</sup> September. Following the meeting a site inspection was made of the proposed site. The next meeting will be held on the 10<sup>th</sup> October.

## **Community & Social Development**

#### **Environmental Workshops:**

The Community and Social Development Section worked with Global Action Plan (GAP) on a number of "Greening Neighbourhood Projects" this summer. It is hoped that this collaborative project would benefit groups and give them a better understanding of sustainable and bio diversity planting. The first enhancement project took place in Barry Park in July. An area in the park was planted by residents under the supervision of GAP Ballymun. The second workshop took place in August with the Finglas Tidy Towns Group. The group identified an area at the back of St. Canice's GNS which they wanted to enhance. With the support of Dublin City Council and GAP the Area Enhancement Project was completed in August. It is hoped to build on this successful initiative in 2018.

### Finglas Summer Projects:

This year there were six voluntary and one non voluntary summer projects in Finglas. The Finglas Summer projects cater for approximately 700 children. Dublin City Council supported the projects with grant assistance as well as providing summer students to the projects. Dublin City Council would like to acknowledge the great effort made by the committees to the projects.

## Positve Wellness Fortnight:

The Finglas Wellness Fortnight is taking place from Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> September to Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2017. It was was launched on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2017 at the Finglas Sports and Fitness Centre, Mellowes Road.

The Finglas Wellness Fortnight will include various free events and activities to promote positive wellness. There will be healthy eating workshops, baby massage, FYRC feel good factor workshops, a HIV lunch time seminar, lip sync battles, two wellness walks through Tolka Park, two pamper days (one Youth pamper day), SOS training, Jigsaw workshop, Abigail Centre community fete, and a men's health promotion day in the Finglas Men's Shed.
