Environment and Transportation

Control of Stationless On-Street Bicycle Hire ByeLaws

The byelaws came into effect on the 1st December 2017. An information session for potential operators was held on the 25th January 2018 and was well attended. The Council outlined its plans and schedule for roll out of the first stationless bicycle hire schemes which are expected to commence operations in April 2018.

Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Projects Grant Scheme for the Ringsend, Irishtown and Sandymount Catchment Area

Under the Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Projects Grant Scheme 2016 the Community Gain Liaison Committee approved in principle 32 grant applications to a total value of €4,808,215.95. Throughout 2017, 18 of the 32 beneficiaries completed their grant aided projects and successfully drew down grant funding to a total value of €1,319,454.74. Some of the grant aided projects completed include the purchase of a racing skiff boat by St. Patrick's Rowing Club, the implementation of community training by Ringsend Community Services Forum, the purchase of a bus and renovations to the Spellman Centre by Ringsend and District Response to Drugs, St. Matthew's National School's sports hall extension and a new roof at the Iris Charles Centre for Older People.

Pay & Display Machine replacement programme

Multifunction Pay and Display Ticket machines are currently being installed on-street which in addition to allowing coin and "wave and pay" payments will also provide visitors with information in relation to local points of interest.

Parking Tag and alternative methods of paying for parking

The average number of transactions per week is now over 100,000 representing 45% of weekly Pay and Display revenue. There are over 178,000 registered motorists with almost 700 additional motorists registering each week. Over 72% of all Parking Tag transactions are now made via the Parking Tag App. Once off payments in shops or charged directly to mobile phone bill or credit card on average account for 4,000 payments per week. The Council is currently engaged in 'Market Discussion' with potential service providers regarding the service in advance of a Request for Tender for provision of the service.

Car Clubs

Two Car Clubs remain operational on-street and have availed of 115 Car Club Permits. There are currently 19 dedicated car club only bays in the City. Discussion is ongoing with both operators who are seeking additional permits in order to expand their services and the number of vehicles located on-street, including additional EV vehicles.

Electric Vehicle Only Parking

There are currently 35 dedicated EV only bays located on-street and further sites are being examined for suitability.

Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR)

Submissions for funding under phase 1 of the SBIR Illegal Dumping challenge have been received and are currently being assessed. The challenge invited proposals to combat illegal dumping using low cost, innovative and technological solution to track, deter and prevent illegal Dumping in the Dublin Region.

Bin Tagging System

Tagging of all DCC litter bins with a unique identifier code and QR code is underway. This project will build a comprehensive map of all bins in the DCC areas and will allow member of

the public to report via smartphone issues with bins by simply scanning a QR code placed on the bin. The rollout has commenced in the North West Area.

Tagging of all bins is complete and system is live. Over 300 service requests have been generated by the system since installation began. It is planned to officially launch system once any outstanding issues with live system have been identified and resolved

Anti Dumping Initiative 2017

The monitoring and enforcement campaign have been completed on Dorset Street. 67 litter fines were issued on foot of the initiative. Engagement with the local business representative group is ongoing and has led to improved waste collection systems being put in place for some properties identified as having issues with non compliant waste presentation. Litter Wardens have engaged with all business premises regarding compliance with waste and litter bye laws.

Davitt Road Depot Refurbishment Works

Works are ongoing at Davitt Rd site. Major works are largely complete, relocation of overhead power cables to be undertaken by ESB before remaining works can be completed.

Herzog Park Bring Centre Realignment

Tender submissions did not come within budget and this project was not progressed on the basis of value for money not being achieved. Waste Management are examining options to facilitate current redevelopment of Herzog Park and maintain existing recycling facilities within a reduced footprint of the existing bring centre.

Dog Fouling Bins

Installation has begun of dog fouling specific bins at the remaining locations identified by the Area depts. A total of 125 bins will have been installed as part of this project

Extension of the 30/km/hr Speed Limit

Further extensions to the 30 km/hr special speed limit are proposed in new Draft Bye-Laws which it is proposed to put out to public consultation once approved by the Council.

1. New Policy/Strategic

The City Council is continuing work on a number of housing initiatives, including MUHDS (Major Urban Housing Developments Sites) and the Housing Land Initiative. The Poolbeg SDZ Planning Scheme and Ballymun LAP have been approved by the City Council, which will significantly contribute to the continued regeneration of the city. (The Poolbeg SDZ is currently the subject of appeals to An Bord Pleanala) A number of existing LAPs are currently being reviewed; reports are being brought to Members. The LAP Work Programme has been reviewed and prioritised. Work has commenced on the Cherry Orchard LAP. The commencement date for regulations relating to the Planning & Development (Housing) and Residential Tenancies Act 2016 came into effect on the 3rd July in relation to applications for 100 or more residential units and 200 or more student bed spaces, (which now go to An Bord Pleanála direct) and Part 8 applications (which must be passed by the City Council within 6 weeks of receipt of the Chief Executive's Report)

The Citywide Reading Campaign for Children launched on 17th January and will run until mid-March. The aim of the campaign is to encourage children to read for pleasure. *Making Millions* by Erika McGann, published by O'Brien Press, is the chosen book for 2018 and children across Dublin will read the book and attend events with the author in Dublin City Public Libraries. The initiative is organised by Dublin UNESCO City of Literature in conjunction with Dublin City Public Libraries. Readers in Residence - The programme will continue during 2018. The Readers commenced class visits to 17 schools and clubs in January. A final year report for Jan to Dec 2017 will be completed by mid February, which will include final figures for class visits, numbers of children involved, library visits plus special event attendance.

Commemorations

Funding - The Decade of Commemorations Fund for Communities will continue into 2018 with €75,000 available for allocation to community-based groups, community organisations and partnerships in Dublin who want to organise dignified and appropriate commemorative events within the Decade of Commemorations designation. Workshops will be arranged in each of the five DCC areas in the spring to highlight the grants scheme.

An event to celebrate community engagement in commemorations during 2016/2017 was held in City Hall on 1st February. Groups which received grants were awarded a certificate by the Ardmheara.

Historians-in-Residence - The Historians in Residence "History on Your Doorstep" project will be launched across the city in mid-February with a series of information panels with text and images telling local history stories. A new local history group has been set up in the Coolock/Artane area by North Central Historian in Residence Cormac Moore. Forty people attended its inaugural lecture/meeting and the group is called "Coolock, Artane and District Historical Society". Exhibition - A new exhibition "Suffragist City: Women and the vote in Dublin" has opened in Dublin City Library and Archive (until the end of February) marking the 100th anniversary of the Representation of the People Act which awarded women the vote for the first time.

New Temporary Exhibition, City Hall - A new exhibition recently opened in City Hall called Jacob's Biscuit Factory & Dublin: An Assorted History / Monarcha Brioscaí Jacob agus Baile Átha Cliath: Fite Fuaite lena Chéile.

Drawing on the vast Jacob Biscuit Factory Archive held at Dublin City Library and Archive, this major exhibition explores all aspects of the factory's twentieth century history and its impact on lives of Dubliners. Colourful panels demonstrate the history of the factory, the workers, the products it produced and its role in Irish life. Find out the fascinating history of the Jacobs cream-cracker, who was the marketing genius to develop the concept of Jim Figgerty, and how did major national and international events from World Wars to 1916 rising impact on the business, customers, and staff. This exhibition was developed by Dublin City Archives and funded by <u>Dublin City Council Decade of Commemorations</u>. Admission Free. No booking required for viewing.

The above exhibition will be on display at Dublin City Hall Exhibition Centre, until 29th March 2018. Free guided tours are available every Saturday at 13.00 & 14.00. Booking required for guided tours via http://bit.ly/jacobs-city-hall

Measure 1 Financial assistance for Business (funded by Dept. Business, Enterprise and Innovation). A total of 59 grants were approved in 2017 under this measure - total approved €865,400 which is estimated to create 95 New jobs including:

- 25 Feasibility Grants were approved totalling €196,400
- 19 Priming 33% Refundable were approved totalling €377,500
- 15 Business Expansion Grant 50% Refundable were approved totalling €291,500 2018 will see a similar target for the year.

Trading Online Vouchers (TOV) (funded by Department of Communications Climate Action and Environment) - A total of 140 trading online vouchers were approved in 2017 totalling €321,233.

Sports Capital Grants: Dublin City Council's Sports Section applied for funding for a number of projects under the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sports 2017 Sports Capital Programme. In total the City Council was provisionally awarded approximately €840,000 in funding to complete these projects. The monies will be used for a variety of new sports equipment and the redevelopment of existing sports facilities.

Furthermore, Dublin City Council applied in tandem with a variety of other sporting clubs to help them avail of the Sports Capital Programme. Entities such as Tennis Ireland and Cherry Orchard Equine Centre received funding on the basis of joint applications with the City Council's Sports Section.
