Existing UNESCO Biosphere at North Bull Island




- Only Biosphere entirely in a capital city in the world
- Proposed by citizens
- Established in 1981 before
 EU and national designations



Dublin capital region in top 10 for sites of EU importance for biodiversity

- Most of Dublin Bay is EU designated for nature conservation.
- 2 National Special Amenity Areas.
- Biosphere can unify all the sites into one network.

 Promote biosphere 'brand' to realise economic & tourism benefits of sustainable development



Align a Dublin Bay Biosphere with evolving UNESCO Strategy for the world network of Biospheres


Proposed Dublin Bay Biosphere
