Litter Warden Statistics

There were a total of 25 Fines issued by the area based Litter Wardens in the Central Area for littering offences in the period 1st July 2018 – 31th August 2018

303 Streets were inspected

799 Dumped bags were removed

790 Dumped bags were investigated

30 Dumped or wrongly presented bags were labelled with warning stickers


