Since there is not sufficient road width to create a right turn feeder lane, the provision of a right turn filter light is not recommended. However, it is proposed to alter the operation of the signals to assist opposed right turning vehicles. ITS have added new functionality to allow the traffic controller at this junction to turn off the green time early on the Lucan Road approach to the junction which will afford greater time and opportunity for traffic travelling from St. Laurence Road to turn right on to Chapelizod Bridge unimpeded and to clear the junction before the wrap around pedestrian crossing phase commences. This new traffic signal program is currently being tested and is expected to be installed in the coming weeks. In addition additional measures (effective since June) have been taken to further protect pedestrians at this junction. An additional 1 second delay has been added before the green man aspect is shown for pedestrians. In practice this means that the pedestrian light will not go green until 4 seconds after the red light aspect illuminates for all vehicular traffic. The all red time of the preceding vehicular phase (for vehicles turning right from Chapelizod Hill Rd to St. Laurence's Rd) has been increased from 2 to 3 seconds before the pedestrian phase commences to further ensure that the right turners have safely cleared the junction before the pedestrians have a green light to walk. It is worth noting that these measures, while providing additional protection for pedestrians, cannot prevent the issue of drivers continuing to break red lights and as such is an issue for Garda enforcement. The junction will continue to be monitored via CCTV and the SCATS Adaptive Traffic Management System.
