Halloween 2018 Report South Central Area

The South Central Area launched the Halloween 2018 campaign in early October. Meetings with all relevant stakeholders were conducted from September 2018 both at area and corporate level. It was agreed from the outset that a multidisciplinary approach delivering a co-ordinated plan to (a) reduce the harm caused by Bonfires to the environment and (b) facilitate alternative activities for young and old to participate in. This resulted in smaller bonfires across the south city area. The early retrieval of bonfire material from the public domain and from Dublin City Council housing complexes proved to be very successful. Intelligence based operations and drone technology was used to detect stockpiling in vacant sites, lane ways, open public spaces, green margins parklands etc. The main tranche began on **Sat. October 27**th and was carried through to **6pm on 31**st **October** with the exception of Sunday 28th October (Dublin City Marathon) not viable due to road closures.

Public Domain planned, organised and co-ordinated the campaign in conjunction with the Assistant Area Manager and working closely with Housing Managers', Project Estate Officers, Housing Maintenance, Community Development and the Gardai. Kevin St, Kilmainham, Ballyfermot & Crumlin Gardai were in attendance at any locations where there was a risk of serious anti social behaviour. Many Bonfire material raids were planned and executed with the Gardai resulting in some very successful hauls. The Garda co-operation and assistance is to be commended, providing invaluable support in the SWIC, Ballyfermot and Crumlin. The overall success of the 2018 campaign is due to increased resources, preparation and planning. Leaflets delivered to householders across the area, providing information on Bonfire stockpiling and the Litter Act coupled with advertising of family events across the city had a very positive impact.

It is estimated that 3,500 Pallets were removed between 27th and 29th alone. **175 Tons** of Bonfire Material was retrieved from the South Central Area. In Total **190 Tons** of Bonfire Material was disposed of at the Thornton's Facility on the Killeen Road. **80 Ton** of Bonfire Material was collected by Housing Maintenance City Wide. **347 Tons** of Bonfire Material City Wide- including the residual Bonfire Clean - up was disposed of by Parks at the Green Star facility.
