### Q2 Councillor Críona Ní Dhálaigh

To ask the Director of Services to investigate the public lighting at (*details supplied* 1). The lighting is quite poor on this stretch of road. There is an increase in footfall on the street/area due to the volume of student/tourist/hotels in the area. There has also been an increase in anti-social behaviour with cars being damaged, gardens being used as public toilets, clients from the local student/tourist accommodation on (*details supplied 2*) being extremely loud and at times fighting as they return to their accommodation.

### <u>Reply</u>

The lighting levels on *(details supplied)* are considered to be to an acceptable standard on the roadway and footpaths and there are no plans to install additional lighting here. However, a couple of the lamps in the lights are due for replacement and we will arrange for these to be relamped in the coming weeks.

# Q3 Councillor Críona Ní Dhálaigh

To ask the Director of Services to report on the CCTV within our complex (*details supplied*). Is there CCTV there? Does it work? How old is it? What standard is it? Is it of good quality? Is there a plan to upgrade it? Has it been used in any Garda/Estate management issues and, if so, was it used for prosecutions? I ask as residents have noticed an increase in open drug dealing on the stairwells (especially on Saturdays, anti-social behaviour by gangs of young people sitting on the stair wells. This is happening outside the community flat that hosts the after schools club. Residents did report to Gardaí but it has not improved.

### **Reply**

There are 14 CCTV cameras spread evenly in the *(details supplied)*. There are all working and are all generally considered to be of good quality. CCTV cameras were first installed in these blocks several years ago and various upgrades have taken

place in the meantime. Upgrades will continue into the future as new technologies come available & subject to budgetary provisions.

Dublin City Council uses the cameras continuously as an aid to estate management. An Garda Siochana use them as well in their investigations into serious crime. Information on number of prosecutions as a result would be held by An Garda Siochana and is not available to Dublin City Council at this time.

### <u>Reply</u>

Dublin City Council erected gates either end of this laneway some 9/10 years ago and from the outset made it clear that the opening and closing was a matter for the shopkeepers' representatives a number of times over the years without a satisfactory proposal from the shopkeepers and agreement on how this may work.

The issues were revisited again in 2014 when a number of meetings took place. A number of shop owners signed up to say they agreed in principle with the proposal to close the laneway between certain hours. However, the following issues remain outstanding:

- 1. Signage: Provision and content of same.
- 2. Information campaign to inform the public.
- 3. Agreed contact name and number: Who is (are) the contact(s) should a person or vehicle get locked in the laneway.
- 4. Procedure to ensure the laneway is empty prior to locking gates.
- 5. Procedures in the event of a person or vehicle being locked in the laneway following closure,
- 6. Response times (guaranteed) to calls for assistance.
- 7. Response should Gardai require access in the event of disturbance.
- 8. Liability in the event a person/vehicle has a claim when the laneway is closed( NB: One of the shop owners said he has had legal advice that shop owners may have legal liability in the event of an accident/incident when laneway is closedmajor concern for shop owners-shop owners asked to seek further clarification from their legal advisors.

It is not proposed to have further meetings on this issue without the above matters being fully addressed by the shop owners.

A resident has asked me to clarify as they were told as they lived with their parents (local authority tenants) they could not make an application in their own right even though they fall under the required income threshold.

# **Reply**

An applicant for Social Housing to Dublin City Council must fulfil the relevant criteria.

If a bedroom is available for the applicant within their parents' home in which they reside they would not be eligible.

The Council must be satisfied that it is reasonable for any person wishing to leave the family home to seek to obtain social housing support to secure alternative accommodation based on issues of overcrowding, risk or any Special Housing Needs, which must be supported in writing by a third party - namely a Social Worker / Counsellor with whom you have an established relationship, or a Garda, in support of why they can no longer remain at the address.

I would advise the individual in question to call into Housing Allocations and meet with a Housing Advisor who are available (Monday to Friday 9.30am - 4pm) to discuss their options.
