Emergency Motion in the name of Councillor Nial Ring

That this committee instruct the Chief Executive to arrange a moratorium on out of hours work/ derogations on the Spencer North Site until further consultation has

taken place with local residents, as it seems that such derogations are now becoming the norm and also seem to be granted on an almost automatic basis without any consideration for the ongoing disruption being caused to the local community

Features to be considered should include 14 trees, 14 statues of the victims or something similar, to be decided by public consultation, and with descendants of the victims or other interested parties.
