Brief Summary

The conference started on Wednesday 4th evening. Duncan Stewart spoke on the challenges we face everything from need for bus lanes to 30 kl outside Dublin to the steps we need to take to protect our wild life.

On Thursday 5th Geraldine Dunne spoke on green procurement and Eric Ehigie on dangers of politicizing the climate crisis, the most interesting was Kieran Mulvey on climate change – challenge to communities. He highlighted the problem of the number of agencies that need to be consulted. The challenge to incentivize companies to locate to midlands – 24k travel daily from midlands to Dublin to work. He also spoke about the technocratic stranglehold and how people feel isolated from decisions.

In the afternoon we had "Women's Local Government Network meeting. It didn't really amount to much as there was agenda other than sharing stories.

We had our seminar dinner at 8p.m and Jim Gavin Former Dublin Football manager spoke about motivation.

Recommendations
