With reference to a proposal to initiate the procedure for the extinguishment of the public right of way over that part of the lane that is to the rear of the dwellings at Goldsmith Street, Berkeley Road, Saint Vincent's Street North and North Circular Road in the City of Dublin.

Proposal

A request, to have the public right of way extinguished over that part of a lane, that forms part of the lane, at the rear of 45 to 54 Goldsmith Street, 22A to 37 Berkeley Road, 2 to 9 Saint Vincent's Street North and 386 to 396 North Circular Road has been made.

The reason for this extinguishment is to eliminate anti-social behaviour and the dumping of litter and waste over the referred lane. The extent of this proposed extinguishment is shown on the attached Map RM 37539.

Service Checks

A service check will be undertaken to establish what (if any) services are located in the area as shown on the attached Map. Suitable arrangements will be put in place regarding all such services prior to completion of this proposal.

Statutory Requirement

The statutory procedure involves giving public notice of this proposal, in one or more newspapers circulating in the referred area and the affixing of that same public notice at each end of the referred right of way for a period of not less than 14 days.

Such notices shall indicate the times at which, the period during which and the place where a map showing such a proposal may be viewed and such notices shall state that objections or representations may be made. Any objections or representations made, and not withdrawn, shall be considered.

The extinguishment of a public right of way is a function reserved to the elected members of the City Council.

Recommendation

I recommend that procedures be initiated under Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993 to extinguish the public right of way over the area indicated on attached Drawing.
