**Q.1 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager to have the Parks Dept who had recently entered into correspondence with **(details supplied)**” about purchasing an overgrown/unused section of the green area to the rear of her house. This request was declined. The resident is seeking to simply meet with a member of the Parks Dept on site to be able to explain more fully what the issue is and what her proposal is, or in the alternative to highlight the need to maintain this site directly with a representative from Park. I would be obliged if this resident could be contacted to arrange such a meeting which can be very brief.”

**Q.2 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager if there are any precinct/traffic related improvements planned for the Abbeyfield/St. Brigid’s Road area, in particular once the current development work is completed there? This is a very narrow road with a lot of traffic that is likely to increase once the works are completed and new residents move in.”

**Q.3 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager for an update on the following housing application **(details supplied)**”

**Q.4 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager for the evergreen trees in Rockfield Park to be examined to ensure they are all in good health and that branches do not pose a risk of breaking.”

**Q.5 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager to have Planning assess the area behind **(details supplied)** for any breaches of planning permission as it seems this land is becoming very overgrown with high trees and foliage and is not being properly maintained.”

**Q.6 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager to have Derelict Sites investigate the properties at **(details supplied)** The properties are in derelict condition and someone has been dumping rubbish, some of it hazardous in both properties. See attached photos.

I cannot see the rear of number 5 but the front is horrendous. The property may be tenanted but it’s disgusting and could not possibly be meeting current rental standards. The property at number 9 is on the edge of the rear lane.

There is a serious dumping problem emanating from this house into the laneway. The back garden is used as a dumping ground. This garden is open to all residents who have access to the lane from Castilla and Vernon Ave. It has to be a health hazard and a haven for vermin.”

**Q.7 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager for an update from the Parks Dept on the proposals to restore public access to the tennis courts in St. Anne’s (i.e. without a need to join the club).”

**Q.8 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager for the bins at the junction of Vernon Avenue and the Clontarf Road be emptied more regularly than currently, as they are frequently overflowing, particularly at the weekends.”

**Q.9 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“On Friday evening September 18th there was a meeting of concerned residents in Fr Collins Park, Dublin 13 on the issues relating to the park. The residents present outlined in great detail the increasing incidents of intimidation, anti-social behaviour and criminality relating to the park. Residents are now saying that they are fearful to enter the park after lunchtime.

As you can appreciate there is an expectation that these problems will only escalate in the run up to Halloween. I am asking that extra Dublin City Council resources be allocated to the park to secure it effectively over the coming weeks as the situation already appears to be out of hand. I would also ask that a Community Liaison Officer would be made available to liaise directly with the local community so that a level of trust and partnership can be built up over the coming period.”

**Q.10 Question in the name of Councillor Jane Horgan Jones**

“To ask the manager to look into St Anthony's Field. This is a green space to the rear of St Anthony's Church in Clontarf which is also located in between St Laurence's Road and Hollybrook Road.

Residents are interested to know which areas of the field and its surroundings are 'in charge' and which access points to the field are approved by Dublin City Council . Can the council also provide a planning history of the site and explain as to how it appears to be zoned Z1 and not Z9 as open space?”

**Q.11 Question in the name of Councillor John Lyons**

“To ask the manager to request an update on the traffic survey request regarding the rat run off the Swords Road and through Lorcan Road in Dublin 9 as there has been a very significant increase in the volumes of cars, many at dangerous speeds, along Lorcan Road in recent months. “

**Q.12 Question in the name of Councillor Rachel Batten**

“To ask the Area Manger to see if lights can be installed in the **(details supplied)** as it is very dark and used by very elderly residence and is being graffitied very often”

**Details: Lane between Lorcan Grove that leads out to Lorcan Avenue in Santry.**

**Q.13 Question in the name of Councillor Rachel Batten**

“To ask the Area Manager to look at the last couple of months rota and see how often the area at **(details supplied)** has had street cleaner, road and path repairs and parks attention. The area is becoming run down and looks un-kept.”

**Details: Collins Avenue close to the Shanowen road and connecting streets.**

**Q.14 Question in the name of Councillor Rachel Batten**

“To ask the Area Manager to make contact with the DCU College to get them to engage in the up keep of the area especial, the collection of shopping trolleys and graffiti in the area.”

**Q.15 Question in the name of Councillor Rachel Batten**

“ To ask the Area Manager to arrange the inspection of the footpath at **(Details Supplied)** and investigate if repairs are required as the resident has recently fallen her which caused her to attend hospital.”

**Q.16 Question in the name of Councillor Rachel Batten**

“ To ask the Area Manager if he will arrange for trees at (**details supplied**) to be inspected and pruned? Branches from this tree have fallen in to the adjacent garden. Are the roots of this tree undermining the foundations of this house and garden wall?”

**Q.17 Question in the name of Councillor Rachel Batten**

“ To ask the Manager if pruning works can be undertaken in respect of trees at (**details supplied**)? These trees are completely overgrown and massive branches are growing out from the base of their trunks.”

**Details; On the Malahide Road dual carriageway outbound on both sides, from the Artane Roundabout to Greencastle Road**

“ To Ask the Manager if the playground park on Coolock Drive can have wild flowers planted on the edges as the grass cutting is not getting the edges and it looks un-kept, some wide flowers would make the area look much more attractive and increase Biodiversity in the area.”

“ To Ask the Manager to provide the committee with a report on anti- social behaviour in Area B, and provide us with a report on what action is been taken by the council on tenants that are committing serious breaches of the peace to include criminal activity and causing intimidation on innocent tenants.”

“ To Ask the Area Manager what action is been taken to address the illegal use of fireworks in the Dublin 9 area especial.”

“To ask the Manager to arrange that the road and path on Glencoy Road in Ellenfield be assessed for work to be done to the repairs.”

“To ask the Manager to arrange for the following works at (**details supplied**) to be carried out

**Details: the double yellow lines remarked from the start of Newbrook Road from the Grange Road (school side) as far down as to outside house no 1 Donaghmede Road.”**

“To ask the Manager to

- a) provide an assurance that the tree from outside (**details supplied**) will be cut down before Christmas and
- b) immediately arrange for the suckers to be cut off from the tree outside (**details supplied**) and in making this arrangement can it be requested that someone from the Parks Division to knock into the resident from this household to discuss the tree.”

“To ask the Director of Services to list the litter bins removed or sealed up with plastic and tape **(details supplied)**”

**Details: a) from the bus stops along the 17A route between Kilbarrack station and Beaumont Hospital and b) from in and around McAuley Park.”**

**Q.25 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland**

“To ask the Manager to provide an update **on (details supplied)**”

**Details: The relocation of Glin Boxing Club and the building of new facilities for them.**

**Q.26 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland**

“To ask the Manager to provide a comprehensive report on the various works on all DCC owned roads and lands along taking place during the months of August and September this year at **(details supplied)** to include details of various works carried out and by whom, legal entitlement to carry out such works, permissions secured to carry out these works and any enforcement measures taken with regard to these works.”

**Details: Belcamp Lane, D17 including on illegally occupied sites along this road**

**Q.27 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Gilliland**

“To ask the Manager to arrange for the cutting of the nettles along **(details supplied)**.”

**Details;** The pathway at the back of Larch Hill, Woodlawn, Aulden Grange & Santry Court parallel to the industrial estate along the Santry River. I was previously told that the foliage would not be cut back due to biodiversity reasons - the photo attached shows how bad this much used path has become (that is a buggy in the pic and the little boy had to make sure his legs are pulled in so he didn;t get stung - I won't complain about the effect on my own legs as I stepped into the nettles to let them by!)

“To ask the manager to have tree outside **(details supplied)** removed as it has caused cracks in the public footpath and the garden wall of above dwelling. Photo attached.”

“To ask the Manager to have the tree outside the back garden wall of **(details supplied)** removed or at very least, pruned back. This tree is approx. 40ft in height. All of the leaves fall into the back garden of this house, causing the owner to slip and fall on wet leaves recently. While the owner does her best to sweep up leaves, she is almost eighty and has some mobility issues. Crack in garden wall also evident. See photos attached.”

“To ask the Manager to install 'kissing gates' on the footpath outside **(details supplied)**. Cyclists using the cycle lane along Swords Road travelling in a northward direction take a short cut along the footpath in front of this block of houses **(details supplied)**. The path is narrow and several elderly people live along this stretch and state that they nervous with cyclists travelling at speed along the footpath as they exit their homes. There is an official cycleway along Swords Road footpath to the junction at Collins Avenue.”

“To as the Manager to provide an update regarding the provision of the Mayne River Greenway?”

**Q.34 Question in the name of Councillor Patricia Roe**

“To ask the Manager to provide an update regarding the timeline for the construction and completion of the extension of the main street in Clongriffin through to meet Belmayne Avenue”

**Q.35 Question in the name of Councillor Patricia Roe**

“To ask the Manager for an update regarding the provision of the Santry River Greenway from Ballymun to Bull Island and if there has been any recent engagement with Fingal County Council with regard to this project.”

**Q.36 Question in the name of Councillor Patricia Roe**

“To ask the Manager if he will review traffic light sequencing at the Swords Road and Griffith Ave junction **(details supplied)** .”

**Details: The green light timing, heading eastward on Griffith Ave, was reduced when Covid-19 public health measures were introduced. This has led to huge traffic congestion and regular breaking of red lights. The traffic light sequencing needs to be reverted.**

“To ask the Manager for an update regarding the provision of a Library at Belmayne.”

**Q.38 Question in the name of Councillor Patricia Roe**

“To ask the Manager to organise a joint meeting with Fingal County Council to explore ideas for submission to the upcoming City Development Plan and Fingal County Development Plan, with particular reference to the Santry area as it straddles the city/county boundary. I mentioned this early this year when DNCA councillors were discussing the proposed rezoning of industrial lands between Santry Avenue and Omni Park, in light of the deficit of school places and other public services for the current and future increases in population in the wider Santry area.”

“To ask the manager to ensure that all the lights bulbs along Clontarf Promenade are in working order. This area is extremely popular for evening and night walkers during this Covid 19 period.”

“To ask the manager to report on 31 Richmond Ave. This house was the home of 1916 leader Thomas Clarke and is of particular historical importance. I'm aware that the house is a protected structure but considering the recent destruction of 40 Herbert Park (The O'Rahilly House) what steps are DCC taking to ensure the protection and preservation of 31 Richmond Ave which is in an extremely poor state of repair. Is there an onus on property owners to maintain protected structures and if not what steps are DCC taking in this regard.”

“To ask the manager to report on property (**Details supplied**). These properties are on the derelict sites register and I would appreciate a full report / update please including whether or not any levies have been paid by the owner to date.”

“To ask the manager to respond to this housing application (**details supplied**) Currently living at this address, on HAP, with partner and three children. Children aged 7, 8 and 12 – two girls and one boy. Would be interested in any vacant property in the Moatview or surrounding area. Children attend the local school.”

“To ask the manager to respond to the following housing maintenance issue (**Details supplied**) to have the front door replaced & repairs to the bathroom”

“To request a maintenance inspection of (**details supplied**) who is very concerned about many of the problems in the house but also the problem she and her children encounter right outside their home: open drug dealing and intimidation. “Can the manager refer to **(details supplied)** which is covered in graffiti and say if he will agree to remove same and if not, if he will contact the owner of the property and request that the graffiti be removed as local residents are upset by the manner in which it downgrades the ambiance of the locality.”

“Can the manager please refer to kerb at **(Details supplied)** and say when same will be dishd as without it, vulnerable pedestrians using metal walkers and disabled persons using wheelchairs are being seriously inconvenienced.”

**Details; Kerb where the footpath from Lough Derg Road meets Lein Gardens (above the football pitch) Raheny, Dublin 5.**

“Can the manager please refer to tree at location as per **(details supplied)** and say if he can agree to seriously prune same which is over-growing into property of details attached”

**Q.54 Question in the name of Councillor Deirdre Heney**

“Can the manager refer to housing applicant as per **(details supplied)** who is awaiting housing in her own right for some time now and say when it is likely she will be made an offer of housing and if an official from the Housing Dept. can make direct contact”

“To ask the Manager to provide a report on **(details supplied)**”

**Details: complaints that Beaumont Hospital is infringing planning regulations and legislation on a site behind St. John Court (see attached photos). “To ask the Manager if he will arrange for the replacement/repair of the shed door that where measure by DCC and investigate the issue with the Gutters leaking at **(details supplied)**?”

“To ask the Manager to trim and clean-up of the tree’s along the Tarmac path at **(details supplied)** which has overgrown onto the path and is causing a bad blind spot for residents.”

**Details: Path adjacent to St. Paul’s School, Ayrfield, Dublin 13 between Ayrfield Avenue & Place and Slademoore Avenue, Dublin 13.**

**Q.68 Question in the name of Councillor Donna Cooney**

“To ask the manger if help can be provided to the Hollybrook road area residents groups who are cleaning up the lanes there and surroundings, with a survey on biodiversity in the area, bulbs and wildflowers seeds for planting, collection for waste collected after clean ups and to write to the telephone company to remove wooden poles marked as dangerous”

**Q.69 Question in the name of Councillor Donna Cooney**

“To ask the area manager if the pedestrian traffic lights crossing Castle Avenue at the Howth road be provided, there are lights halfway and none on the other side”

**Q.70 Question in the name of Councillor Donna Cooney**

“To ask the area manager if the road surfacing damaged by roadworks on Castle Avenue after the junction of Victoria Road can be repaired it’s particularly dangerous for cyclists, especially children cycling to school”

**Q.71 Question in the name of Councillor Catherine Stocker**

“To ask the Manager will they install Big Belly Bins on Merville Ave, Dublin 3?”

**Q.72 Question in the name of Councillor Catherine Stocker**

“To ask the Manager to install a filter lane or take other actions to reduce traffic congestion at the junction of Mount Prospect Avenue/ James Larkin Road/ Clontarf Road”

**Q.73 Question in the name of Councillor Catherine Stocker**

"To ask the Manager will the public bin removed from bus stop outside Clarehall off the Donaghmede roundabout be reinstated?"

**Q.74 Question in the name of Councillor Catherine Stocker**

"To ask the Manager will the Pitch and Putt course at the Hilltop in Edenmore Park be reopened?"

**Q.75 Question in the name of Councillor Catherine Stocker**

"To ask the Manager to provide an update regarding the taking in charge of public areas in the Clongriffin area?"

**Q.76 Question in the name of Councillor Catherine Stocker**

"To ask the Manager that Whitethorn estate be included in the early stages of the new maintenance/weeding programme. There is a relatively new resident's association working in the area and they would very much appreciate support with what has become an unmanageable level of weeds"

"To ask the Manager that the criteria for prioritising areas for cleaning under the new weeding system be made clear. "

**Q.78 Question in the name of Councillor Naoise O'Muir**

"There are ongoing concerns amongst parents in relation to revised arrangements for drop-off/pick-up at the Howth Road National School as set out below **(details supplied)**. Can the Manager organise for a meeting between DCC officials and school/parent representatives to see if they can be resolved."

**Details; 2 emails dated 07/10/2020 and 08/09/2020**

**Just wanted to share a final thought here as it appears DCC have no interest in a) investigating the dangers they have created or b) doing anything about it.**

**The situation is no less dangerous than it was a month ago and will only get worse as the mornings get darker and the traffic gets heavier.**

**In a single and (in the grand scheme of things) inconsequential move, DCC have taken what was predictable and made unpredictable the behaviour of motorists, pedestrians, cyclists and public transports in (their own words) "*relatively narrow, fast moving, outbound traffic lanes*". My assumption at this stage is it will take someone getting hurt for anything to be done (or even considered) here. Sadly, this is both as inevitable as it is unavoidable.**

**With no corrective action incoming, my conclusion to this episode is that for DCC, ideology is more important than proper planning and safety considerations.**

**08/09/2020:**

**After 8 or so days of school I reckon we have a decent picture on the initial impact of the bollards. A few notes below....**

- **On wet days parents are dropping kids at the front of the school (predictable). Some are using the laneway by the school. Some are parking beneath the train bridge. Some are just by the bollards.**
- **Older kids are being thrown out at the front gate as it is perceived as the only "safe" area to drop kids (very much goes against DCC's safe front gate ambitions)**
- **Cyclists are not using the cycle lane within the bollards at drop-off/collect time. I quizzed a few families who cycle to the school and asked why... The general feedback was the lane is too narrow and bollards too high. They are worried that their kids**

handlebars will clip the bollards and send them into the traffic lane. Another said they were worried about being squeezed by the bus (stop) and other kids jumping from cars into the cycle lane by the gate. These families are either on the road (outside the bollards) or on the path as they approach the school.

- Other cyclists are also not using the cycle path. In saying that... I've seen maybe 5 total cyclists over the past 8 days so it's a pretty small sample size. Speculating.... they are typically in the outside lane and look to be turning right onto the Alfie Byrne road or looking to cross the road to the cycle path along the coast road. The cycle path out the front of the school is as deserted as it ever was.
- At least one of the after school services have asked the school about working together to get the bollards removed. This was something I expected. They are not comfortable walking groups of small children what is a significant distance (for 4 and 5 year olds) by a main road. The single word they used is "dangerous"

If I was to surmise the past 8 days I would say that as things stand no one feels safe here. Cyclists are not comfortable because the bollards have created a degree of unpredictability. They are avoiding the cycle path as a result. After school services are trying to find additional resource to reduce the risks associated with groups of kids being walked and crossing main roads. Parents are (lets say) being creative with where they are parking – especially in poor weather like we had last week – which is creating further unpredictability and safety concerns for all.
