Spring bulbs:

Gazebos have been provided to the three groups working form the Lourdes Parish Centre. Lourdes Day Care Centre, Francesca Arkin's Dance Group and the Taekwondo Club. This is to allow for reduced activities to take place outdoors during lockdown as Covid regulations allow.

A Christmas Concert on your Doorstep:

Arrangements are in place for a series of concerts in twelve flat complexes across the area. Each concert will consist of a short performance by MaSamba Samba School and a 45 minute recital of Christmas music by either the Dublin Concert Band or the Artane Senior Band. Drumalee Estate Remembrance Garden:


The refurbishment of this gardening project commenced on 9th November following consultation with local residents.
