<p>Crime Prevention Matters and Other Information</p>	<p>Operation Throw Over</p> <p>Is an new initiative targeting people supplying drugs to prisoners by throwing drugs over the prison wall at Cherryorchard and surrounding area. The Initiative started in December and to date has resulted in 16 incidents of Sale and Supply of Drugs. 2 incidents as a result of Gardaí patrolling area drugs where discovered in waste ground. And 3 incidents for simple Possession.</p>
