2. Terms of reference

Order: Terms of reference agreed, Chair to seek nomination from An Garda to present to the Subcommittee.

3. Cllr. Heney's Working Document for Tender & Associated Issues

Member had a discussion in relation to the document(s) that were circulated and raised the following points / questions

- The possibility of each of the Dublin Local Authorities seeking tenders for individual service provider should be explored (DH)
- If the capacity of the facility required is smaller (than the current position) animal Welfare groups might be interested in tendering **(DH)**
- The Louth County Council service provider might be of interest (DH)

- Administration and the dog warden service should be separate entity to the kennelling (CP)
- Dublin City Council providing the Dog Warden Service by direct Labour should be examined (CP)
- What happens if no organisation tenders for the contract (CP)
- As part of the procurement it, should be clear that better care for the animals is central **(CP)**
- Are there any other Funding streams available for an enhanced service (Department of Agriculture, An Garda Síochána) or must the costs be met by DCC (DH)
- Can charitable organisations be used only for sheltering (CC)
- Members of the Committee should advise the Executive of contacts they
 have who might be interested in tendering (DH)
- Rehoming occurs by the Charities, this service should form part of the new contract. (DC)
- Does financial benefit accrue to Charitable Organisations for rehoming dogs from Ashton Pound
- What will happen to the employment of those currently working in Ashton Pound (CC)
- When does the tender document need to be completed (DH)
- There is provision to extend the contract if tendering timelines are not met
 (CP)
- The possibility of a site visit should be examined (DC)
- "A dog is not for Christmas" awareness campaign should be rolled out (CC)

John Flanagan / Kevin Meade / Céline Reilly responded/

- Welcomed Cllr Heney's working document
- DCC will review all the documents (Cllr. Heney's, Dept. of Agriculture, and Breeding Guidelines) and produce a paper that amalgamates all dog welfare / care recommendations, the procurement procedures / advice which will be presented to a future meeting of the Subcommittee.
- It is hoped that there will be plenty of competition for in the tendering process
- The expressions of interest will issue to Organisations identified
- The provision of the Dog Warden Service by direct labour will be examined and we will report back to the Subcommittee
- The focus is to have as many organisations as possible tender for the contract.
- We do not want to arrive at the point where tenders are not received for the contract.
- If tenders are not received, we will seek specialist procurement advice and will consider negotiating with organisations that could provide the service.
- An enhanced service will generally be more expensive
- Funding sources will be examined
- Charitable organisations tendering for the contract has been referred for procurement advice.

- Organisations identified as having and interest in providing the service will be contacted via an Expressions of Interest initially
- Existing staff have specialised skills which will be in demand irrespective of which organisation is successful in the tendering process
- It is hoped that the tender document will be finalised in February 2021.
