- There has been 1 murder recorded in the previous 12 months (September 2020)
- There have been 207 detections for the Sale/Supply of Drugs in 2020 as opposed to 181 for the same period in 2019, representing an **increase** of 14%.
- There have been a total of 86 arrests for Driving whilst intoxicated in 2020 in comparison to 70 for the same period in 2019, which is an **increase** of 23%.
- There have been no Fatal Road Traffic Accident recorded in 2020.
- 617 Public Order Incidents detections have been made in 2020 as opposed to 424 in the same period in 2019, showing an **increase** of 46%.
- 124 Incidents of Drunkenness have been recorded for 2020 as opposed to 108 in the same period in 2019, an **increase** of 15%.
- 118 Incidents of Assault Causing Harm have been recorded in 2020 in comparison to 115 in the same period in 2019, an **increase** of 3%.
- 306 Incidents of Minor Assault have been recorded in 2020 as opposed to 352 in the same period in 2019 showing a **decrease** of 13%
