What is the Recovery & Resilience Facility?

- The EU's plan for recovering from the Economic & Social Damage of the CoronaVirus Crisis
- The EU's Recovery and Resilience Facility (RRF) aims:
 - To mitigate the economic and social impact of the pandemic
 - To make European economies and societies more sustainable, resilient & better prepared for the challenges & opportunities of the green and digital transitions.



Financial support to public investments and reforms



What is the Recovery & Resilience Facility?

- The RRF is the key element of the €750bn Next Generation EU/Recovery Plan.
- Investments, reforms & new jobs in areas that affect all Europeans
- ➤ The Recovery and Resilience Facility (the Facility) will make €672.5 billion in loans & grants available to support reforms and investments undertaken by Member States.



How does Ireland get involved?

- Fireland is expected to receive €853m in grants under the RRF in 2021 & 2022
- Further grants will be allocated in 2023
- In order to access funding, Ireland must develop a National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP) for approval by EU.





National Recovery & Resilience Plan Next Steps – 2021 Timeframe



Dublin City Council

20th April:

Development of Ireland's NRRP is now at an advanced stage

30.April:

It is expected to be submitted to the Commission

May - June:

The Commission will then take 2 months to assess Ireland's plan

July:

The Council of the European Union will then have up to 4 weeks to consider the Commission's assessment and adopt an implementing decision by qualified majority.

August:

Dept would expect Ireland's plan to be published on <u>Gov.ie</u> website after engagement with the Commission.
