- Q1 Councillor Michael Watters**
To ask the Director of Services if it would be possible to move the bus stop and road markings down the road and away from the front of Rialto Parish Church, Rialto, Dublin 8. The Church is experiencing issues with the no. 17 bus, which is blocking the gates to the Church, which is causing particular issue during funerals.

To ask the Director of Services if it would be possible to place double yellow lines on Rialto Drive, close to the junction with Herberton Road, Rialto, Dublin 8.

To ask the Director of Services to repaint the disabled space and reinstate the signage at Haven Chemist in Rialto Village, Dublin 8.
- Q4 Councillor Michael Watters**
To ask the Director of Services to implement uninterrupted double yellow lines along James Walk (on Luas track side), Dublin 8 from the junction with South Circular Road to Forbes Lane.

To ask the Director of Services to implement double yellow lines on the corners of Basin View, Dublin 8.

To ask the Director of Services to implement double yellow lines on the corners of New Ireland Road with South Circular Road, Dublin 8.

To ask the Director of Services to reinstate double yellow lines on South Circular Road on the West side from the junction with New Ireland Road.

To ask the Director of Services if discussion and liaison with businesses that serve take-away food and beverages will increase so that there is a focus on more frequent clean ups and litter management outside their premises?

To ask the Director of Services can the yellow lines requested be installed at Basin View in tandem with the planned public realm works at Oisín Kelly Park?

To ask the Director of Services that I welcome the speedy and necessary response to the dangerous chaotic parking in the Rialto/St James's Walk area and to ask the Manager provide an update on the following please?

- The timeline for Pay and Display in Rialto Street.
- To deter frequent speeding, this street be zoned to 30km.
- It is understood that the double yellow lines along sections of James's Walk is an interim solution in attempting to control dangerous parking. Can the Manager advise when a "Master Plan" for this area will be planned, agreed and installed?

To ask the Director of Services to remove the tree stump outside (*details supplied*) so that the uneven footpath can be repaired?

To ask the Director of Services for an update from the "Sustainable Mobility and Projects" section on the progress of extending and connecting the cycle lane at St James's Hospital/ Mary Aikenhead House?

To ask the Director of Services to set up temporary cameras at the entrance of Labre Park to tackle illegal commercial dumping. Under s57 an s58 of the Waste Management Act allows a person to seek order to the high court where it is alleged that waste is being held and/or disposed in a manner that is likely to cause environmental pollution.

To ask the Director of Services what is planned to prevent vehicles overtaking other vehicles on Knockmarron Hill in Chapelizod and to stop vehicles to crash into houses? What traffic calming measures can be put in place to replace the ineffective measures in place now? Can a solid white line be painted to stop vehicles overtaking.

To ask the Director of Services that pedestrian safety measures be put in place as a matter of urgency during construction work on Lucan Road, to install extra footpath

space at the junction with Anna Livia Bridge. With heavy vehicles and already narrow footpaths, this area represents a real danger to pedestrian safety.

To ask the Director of Services to remove the strap that are tied and remove the poles that are too close to all the trees on Errigal Gardens, Benmadigan Road, Bunting Park, Percy French Road Park, green area outside the allotments in Chapelizod, Ballyfermot Road across from area civic offices, Orchard Meadow in Cherry Orchard.

To ask the Director of Services to please outline if we have any measures available to compel residents within our housing estates to clean up their gardens and perimeter walls etc. All too often we are contacted by neighbours in relation to properties both owned by DCC and privately owned about the poor visual impact of badly maintained properties.

To ask the Director of Services to please indicate how a resident in a private owned house, without means, could have their heating / windows upgraded to ensure she and her child who has some health issues, could heat their home in the coming winter. The current old single glaze windows are over 30 years old and the heating was installed over 35 years ago and have well passed their sell by date. What do they need to get as financial support to repair / replace, or to be included for retro fitting of their home?

To ask the Director of Services to please look into the following. (*details supplied*). I regret the living conditions are very poor. Is there any support available to replace windows etc in their home?

To ask the Director of Services to look at printing a generic leaflet in relation to seeking the assistance of residents of stopping the practice of putting food waste out on the public road, footpath, in parks etc. All too often, I am asked by concerned neighbours if anything can be done to stop this practice of emptying food waste onto the public domain. It is not practical for neighbours to get involved.

To ask the Director of Services to ask the Traffic Department, to please look at the possibility of getting a speed survey carried out at the Lucan Road, Chapelizod, Dublin 20. There is currently a huge issue with speeding of cars in the vicinity of The Moorings residential complex. (*details supplied*) Eastbound traffic appears to be the main offender of speeding. Residents along this busy road are extremely anxious we do something before someone is seriously hurt or killed here.

To ask the Director of Services to look at ensuring the lamp standards in the Ballyfermot area are painted. I am aware of lamp standards along Drumfinn Avenue etc which have not been painted in over 15 years. Is there a certain amount of time when they should be done?

To ask the Director of Services that consideration of the positioning of toilet facilities for the various parks in the South Central Area ie Brickfields, the Lawns Park, Markievicz, Cherry Orchard Park, Walkinstown Park etc. All too often the lack of basic facilities results in many people with various health issues unable to use our public parks.

To ask the Director of Services to ask the Housing Department to please furnish me the following:

- Number of housing units allocated during 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020.
- The average time people allocated those units were waiting to be housed.
- Why some people with similar housing needs are forgotten in the system. They never move. I have people waiting many many years and indeed go down the list instead of moving up. I am a firm believer we must start to have a simple unified approach to housing lists i.e. allocations, transfers and medical / welfare. We have now created serious difficulties for many who feel powerless to move into housing.

To ask the Director of Services. I have recently being contacted by a family (*details supplied*) They are asking if DCC could consider buying it and allocating it to them. They love the area but cannot afford the high rents that they are currently paying the landlord.
