



Local Coordinator – Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme

What is the role of the Local Healthy Age Friendly Homes Co-Ordinator

- Work in partnership with stakeholders and existing service providers
- Manage a caseload of Referrals
- Assess each older persons individual needs
- Coordinate and facilitate a plan of supports and sign post them to services
- Identify any gaps in services | Highlight Models of good practice



Participant Assessment

Needs Assessment

- Housing adaptations, energy retrofits, rightsizing, minor modifications, homesharing, decluttering, others
- Health | Medical GP visits, links to health supports, transport to hospital appointments, home help, meals on wheels, physiotherapy, occupational therapy,
- Technology telecare, telehealth, digital training, supports with telecommunications, smart phones, connectivity, others
- Community/Social Transport, social activities, assistance with shopping, wide range of community groups, befriending, good morning call services, social prescribing, libraries, physical activity programmes, others

Evaluation | Maynooth University

What is the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme?

Research shows that the majority of people want to remain in their own home as they age. This desire is often challenged by their home not being suitable for the occupier as their needs become more pronounced, their financial means decrease, and their mobility declines. With the right assessment and intervention, the living environment can be changed from being one of health risk to one of health support.

A key aspect of this programme is to reduce the admission rate of people entering long-term residential care due, in the main, to their living environment not supporting their health and wellbeing needs. Accommodation that presents challenges to older people remaining mobile, keeping warm and staying safe can be significant factors in decision making on long-term care.

The Goal of the Healthy Homes Programme
Phase 1 is to support people to live in their own home
with dignity and independence, for as long as possible,
thus avoiding the premature transition into long-term
residential care. The Programme's ambition is to enable
people to live longer healthier lives in their own home,
being and feeling part of their community, by ensuring
they are in a suitable living environment, for accessibility,
size, safety, and environment, including warmth.

The Department of Health, Sláintecare and Age Friendly Ireland (Meath County Council) are rolling out this new joint programme 'Healthy Age Friendly Homes', across 9 Local Authority areas.

Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme | Referral Form

The Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme aims to support older people to live in their own home with dignity and independence, for as long as possible. The programme's ambition is to enable everyone to live longer healthier lives by keeping care close to home and expanding the range of health and social care services in the community. It is about providing a range of alternatives for older people who may otherwise transition into long term residential care prematurely. To do this we have appointed a Local Healthy Age Friendly Homes Coordinator in nine local authorities (Cork County, Dublin City, Fingal County, Galway County & City, Limerick City & County, Longford County, South Dublin, Tipperary County, Westmeath County). Each Local Coordinator will case manage a support package for each person referred, linking the supports from the variety of public, voluntary, private and community agencies in the area.

The purpose of this referral is to identify an older person who could benefit from some extra help and support in order to stay living in their own home. The Local Coordinator will carry out a home based assessment and, in partnership with the older person, will identify and design a range of supports to enable the older person to continue living independently. This will not offect any current home help, medical card, pgnsign or other services being received.

In order to see if this approach has been successful and to find out if this is a successful way of working, the local coordinator will gather information on the current housing, health, social and technology supports that the older person has/has not access to. This information will help the coordinator facilitate the older person to access a range of additional supports and information. Upon receipt of this referral each participant will receive an acknowledgement letter from their Local Coordinator outlining the next steps in the process. I consent to my details being referred to a Local Coordinator for the purpose of participating in this Programme.
