Resources are allocated to target specific areas that are subject to spikes in anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>Targeting consists of increasing mobile and beat patrols and checkpoints within an area focusing on proactively engagement. ASBO's are issued if appropriate. The impact of responses is then assessed the following week.</p> <p>There is ongoing liaison with Dublin City Council to identify problem areas and co-ordinate joint responses to tackle any issues that may arise.</p>

<p>2) Reduce drug related issues affecting the community</p>	<p>Garda Policing Plan / Dublin City Joint Policing Committee 2015</p>	<p>Put operations in place to deal with issues</p>	<p>Dublin City Council An Garda Síochána</p>	<p>Outcomes of operations</p> <p>Subject to the analysis of crime incidents for the previous week, resources are allocated to areas that may be subject to drug related issues.</p> <p>A prime example of this is the ongoing attention being focused on the Dorset Street flats and Montpelier areas as part of Operation Coroza.</p> <p>Uniform and plain clothes patrols are conducted in the locality by the Community Policing Unit and the Crime Prevention Unit, along with Core Units. This has yielded positive results in the seizure of controlled drugs and the apprehension of individuals involved in the distribution of controlled drugs.</p> <p>Concerns and reports from members of the public are addressed through positive interaction between the Gardaí and the local community.</p>

				<p>the incident.</p> <p><u>Victim Support</u></p> <p>All victims of crime are contacted by their local SAP Community Garda in order to provide them with the necessary supports that they may require and to provide them with a liaison point for updates in relation to the investigation.</p> <p><u>Case Management of Offenders</u></p> <p>Prolific/Repeat offenders residing within the district are assigned Case Managers in order to co-ordinate their court cases so that matters can be dealt with effectively in court.</p> <p>This approach also serves to monitor the offender in an effort to provide Gardaí with up-to-date information as to their current address and to curtail their likelihood of reoffending.</p>

These plans involve stakeholder analysis and engagement throughout.</p>
