- There has been 1 Murder recorded in the previous 12 months (Pearse Street – 29th of March 2021). This Murder has been detected.
- There has been 36 detections for the Sale/Supply of Drugs in 2022 as opposed to 42 for the same period in 2021, a **decrease** of 14%
- There has been a total of 17 arrests for Driving whilst intoxicated in 2022 in comparison to 19 for the same period in 2021, a **decrease** of 11%
- There has been No Fatal Road Traffic Collisions recorded in 2022.
- 332 Public Order Incidents have been recorded in 2022 as opposed to 231 incidents in the same period last year, showing an **increase** of 44%
- 65 Incidents of Drunkenness have been recorded in 2022 as opposed to 43 in the same period last year, an **increase** of 51%
- 45 Incidents of Assault Causing Harm have been recorded in 2022, as opposed to 10 in the same period last year, an **increase** of 350%
- 105 incidents of Minor Assault have been recorded in 2022 as opposed to 28 in the same period last year showing an **increase** of 275%

It should be noted that in any reference to statistics, those statistics are provisional, operational, liable to change and some possibly re-classified with the introduction of Central Statistics Office reports.
