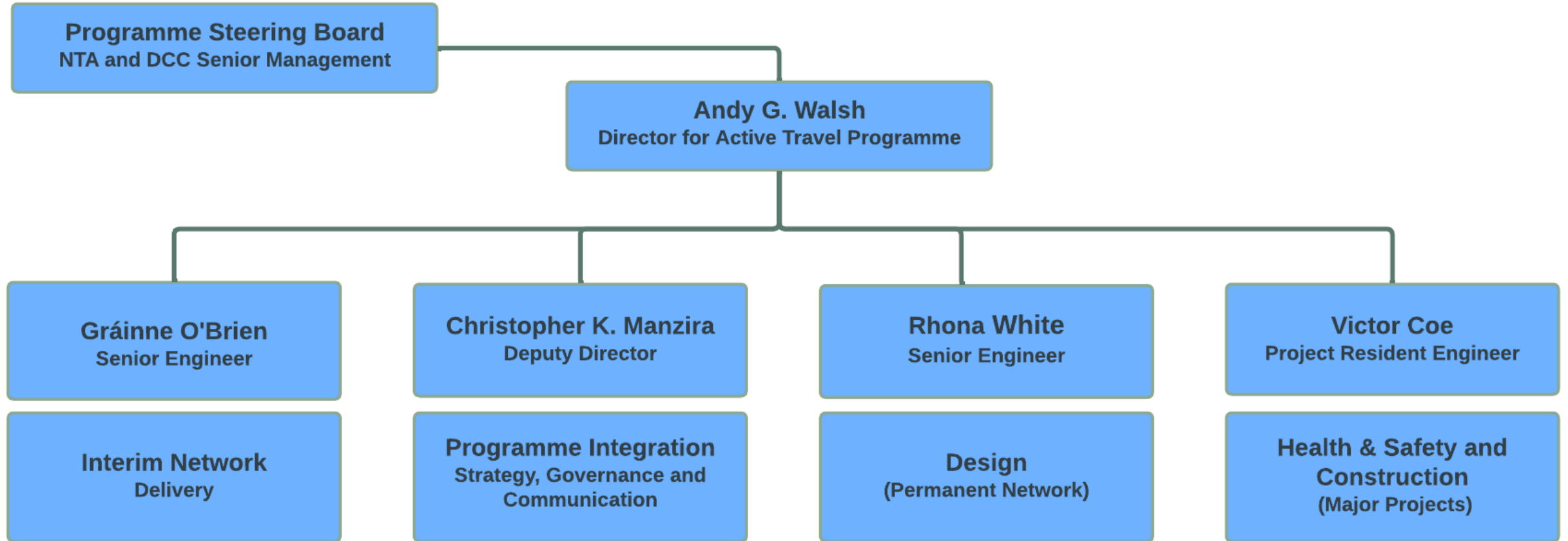

Dublin City Core Active Travel Network

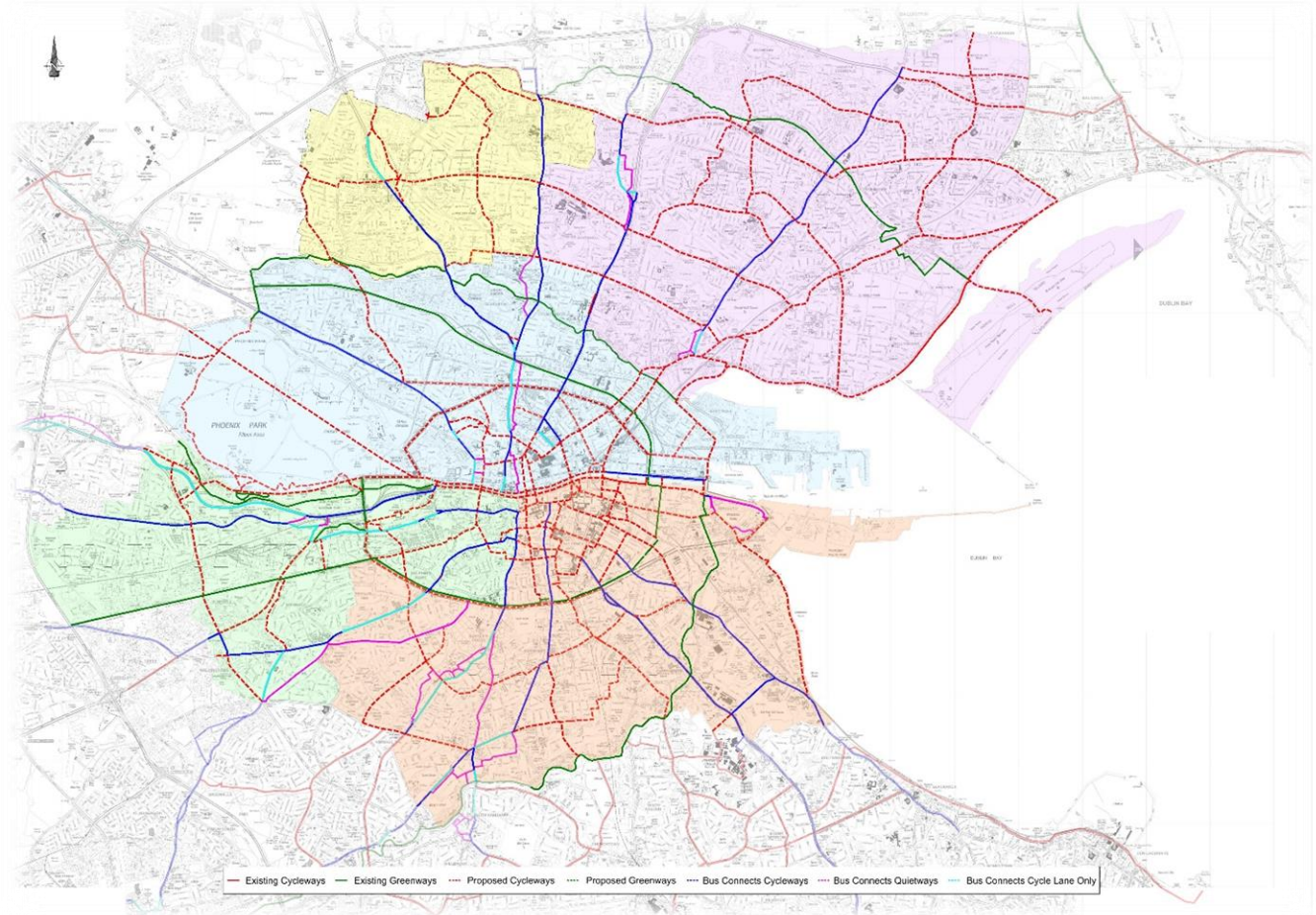
Total planned DCC network of 470km in the **Greater Dublin Area Cycle Network Plan**

Minimum required for a connected city is 310km

Of which:

- 10km (high quality) is complete
- 90km will be delivered by Busconnects
- 210km will be delivered by the Active Travel Programme Office

This 210km consists of 80 NTA-funded projects across the network

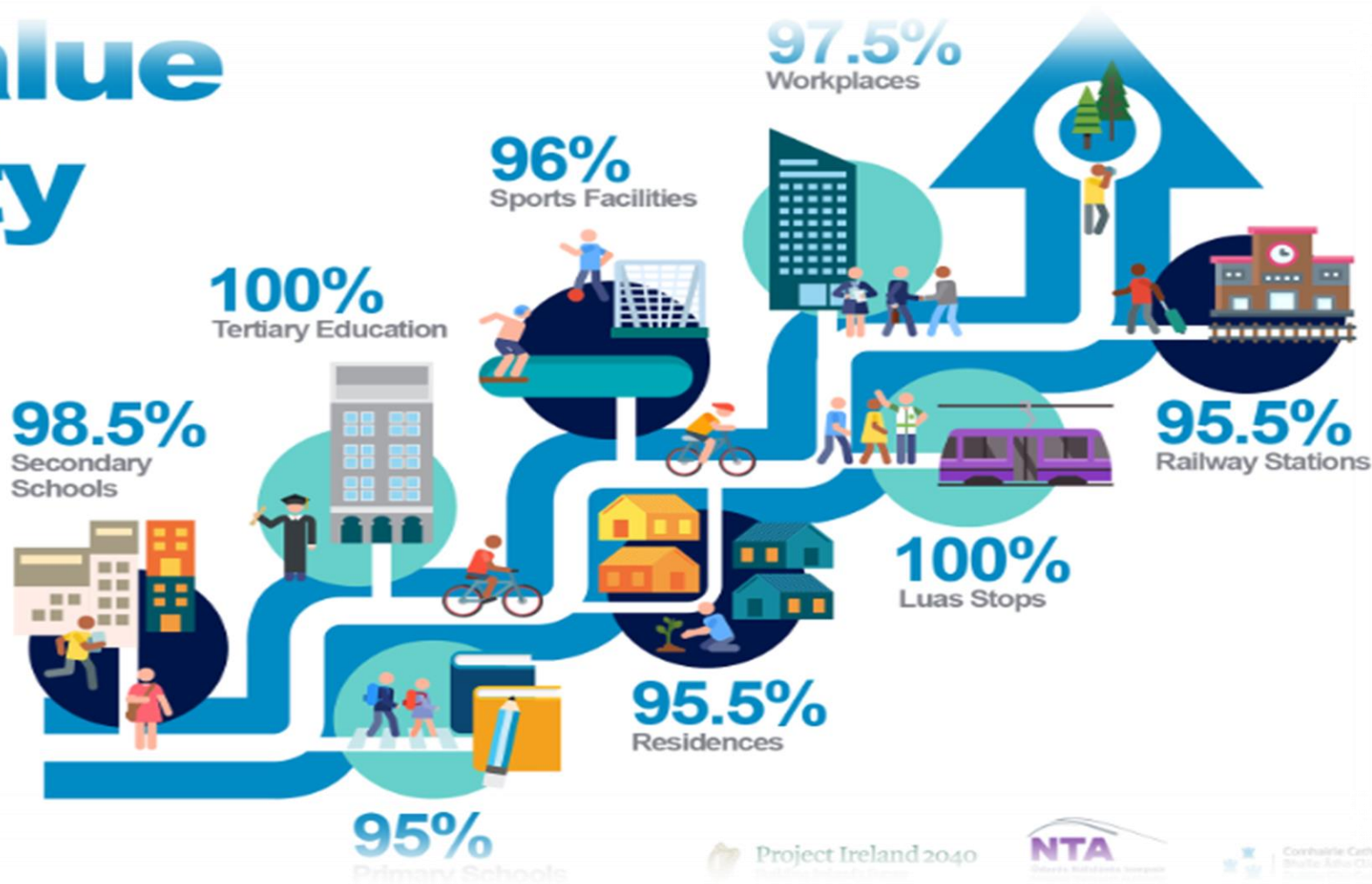

Strategy for the North Central Area

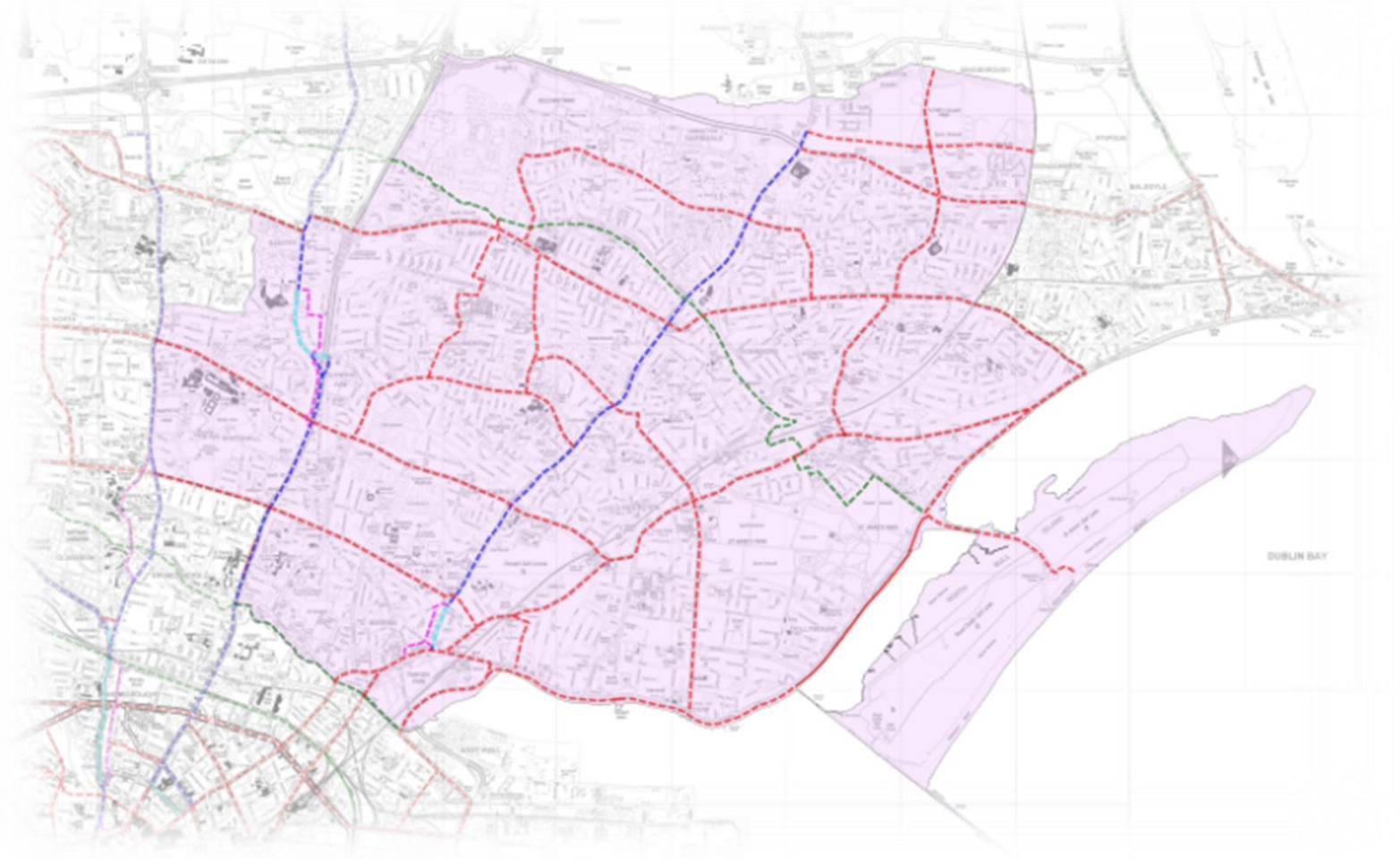
Core Network - Christopher K. Manzira, Deputy Director for Active Travel Programme

Minimum network for North Central Area to achieve a connected city is 73 km

Of which:

- 2 km (high quality) is complete
- 12 km will be delivered by Busconnects
- 59 km will be delivered by the Active Travel Programme Office

This 59km consists of 20 projects, all funded by the National Transport Authority

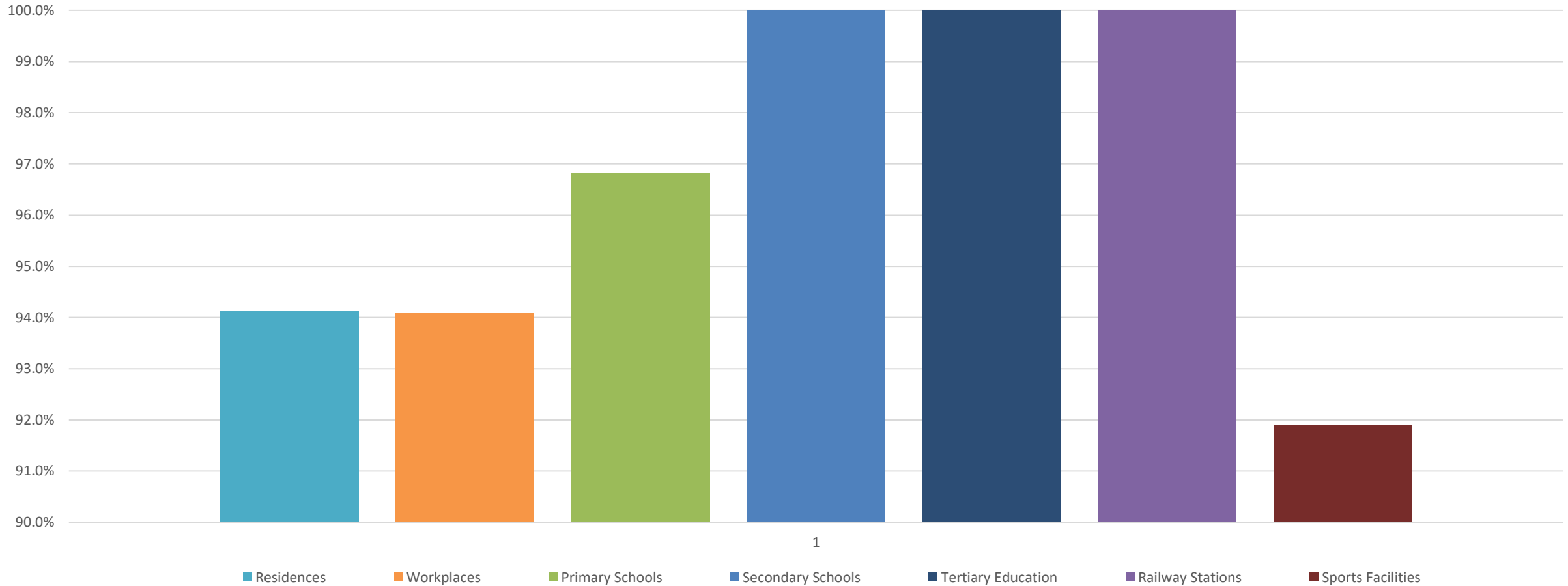

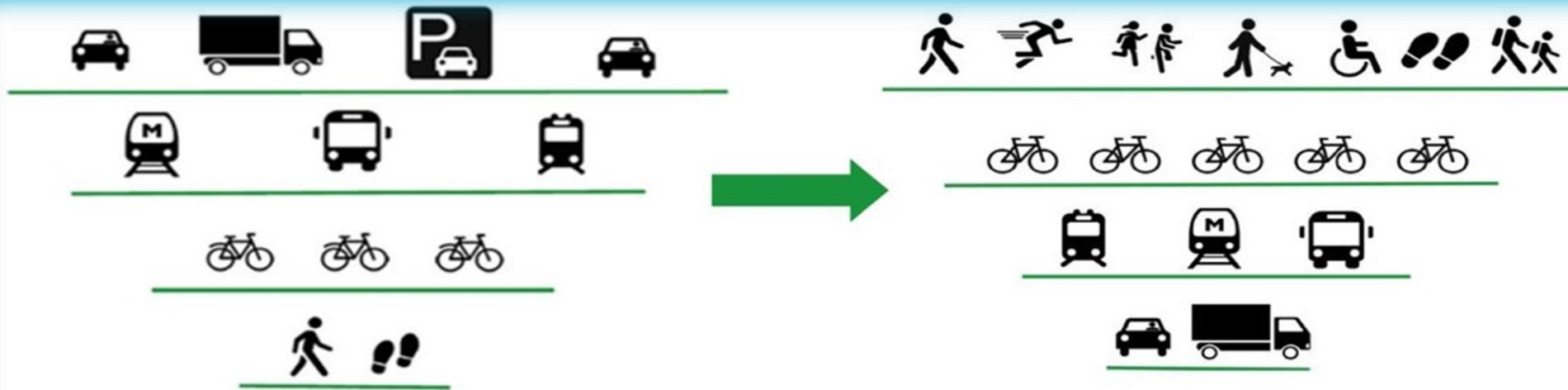
