#### **PUBLIC DOMAIN REPORT**

## Waste Management and Illegal Dumping

There were 189 incidences of illegal dumping recorded on CRM for September which were dealt with by Waste Management Services. 112 community clean-up were supported by the Public Domain Team for the month.

An increase in illegal dumping is expected for the month of October with Halloween approaching. Additional resources will be in place over the next few weeks to handle the extra volume of work.

#### <u>Halloween</u>

The Public Domain Team is liaising with the Gardaí and other departments within DCC, to arrange collection of bonfire material prior to and on the day of Halloween itself. Additional resources have been secured to assist in bonfire clearances in the NWA over the Halloween weekend. Social Media Posts from the NWA will be issued regularly over the next few weeks and reminders will be posted daily to report stockpiling in the few days before Halloween.

Teams will be on the ground from Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> to Monday 31<sup>st</sup> to remove any stockpiling of bonfire materials.

### Anti-Dumping Initiative

The 2022 allocation for funding for the NWA was €11,000. The Mattress and WEEE Amnesty Days were funded through this initiative and organised by the Public Domain Team.

Two separate events were held to promote the reduction in Electrical Waste and Mattresses. One in Finglas Civic Offices, Mellowes Road and one in Ballymun (Trinity Comprehensive

School), Main Street, Ballymun. The events were held over 4 hours each day on the 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> September.

In total 316 mattresses were recycled and 1236 Items which equated to 6293 tonnes of electrical waste were removed. It is hoped this will reduce the number of mattresses dumped and discarded over the Halloween period. It also promotes the recycling message at a more local level.







#### Weeding

The weeding contract is complete for 2022 in the North West Area. The use of Foam Stream and its efficacy will be reviewed by the Public Domain Officers citywide and recommendations will be made to improve the service in 2023.

In the meantime, additional weed control resources have been allocated to the areas. Particularly overgrown areas will be serviced by Waste Management by manual removal. The Public Domain Team have submitted a list to Waste Management which will be carried out on 22<sup>nd</sup>,& 23<sup>rd</sup> October and the 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> November.

# **Leaf Collection Scheme**

The Public Domain Team have recently been supplied with new compostable bags for leaf collection. The obvious benefit of a compostable bag is its ability to completely break down into natural components, rapidly speeding up the decomposition process to as little as 90 days in some cases. Compostable bags have many other benefits such as reducing

contributions to landfill. There is also less greenhouse gas emissions and lower water and energy consumption during manufacturing. Compostable bags are safer for humans, animals, wildlife and the environment and provide great fertilizer when composted correctly.
