# Cabra/Glasnevin Area Report

#### Area Office

Following Covid-19 restrictions at the Cabra/Glasnevin Area Office the public counter is now open 10am to 1pm Monday to Friday.

Public queries are also dealt with via phone and email.

Blue bags for clean-ups are collected by the public by appointment or during counter hours – other equipment like gloves, pickers and hi-viz vests are also supplied to support community efforts. At this time of year we have a large number of community groups actively cleaning their areas and removing fallen leaves.

This has been noticed and positive comments received from the local business community.

Reports of litter or dumping are also be emailed and phoned in the Cabra Office and the office then coordinates with Waste Management and Litter services

All queries made to the office are dealt with as appropriate or forwarded to the relevant department within the City Council.

#### **Front Counter**

The Front Counter at the Cabra Glasnevin Area Office is open between 10am and 1pm daily. It should be noted that people are returning to visiting the counter with a full range of queries and or requests for services.

Requests are being brought for a full range of Council services. In some cases this has included assistance with form filling and the staff must be commended in their approach to working with the public.

#### **Community Clean - Ups**

A large number of blue bags are handed out across the counter each day. Individuals and Groups in the area are collecting a high volume of leaves and bagging them for collection by Council Staff. The Cabra-Glasnevin Office and Community team continue to support community clean -ups in the area, by providing clean up equipment, bags and removal of bags.

A number of extra-long litter pickers have also been acquired to support litter collections along the canal and local rivers.

General Operatives and the street cleaning teams working in the Cabra area have been commended to the office by the public for their hard work.

#### The "17 Shops"

A further meeting will be convened in the New Year. Parking enforcement have been asked for information on a 30 min free parking allocation at the shops, this is being investigated.

Shop keepers would like to have a 30 min free parking allowance to allow customers to use the shops and move on. Parking enforcement in the area has increased at the request of the business owners.

#### **Dublin City Council Offices, Cabra Road**

Maintenance of the Cabra Glasnevin Area Management office has taken place with external painting of the rear of the building, yard clearing, flowers on the front of the building and Christmas lights being installed.

#### **Out and About Ezine**

The Cabra/Glasnevin Ezine has been issued and is on the website for December with the January 2023 issue available from the 2<sup>nd</sup> week in January. Electronic distribution will be through the DCC Central Area Social Media platforms.

#### Martin Savage Park

A pair of "Ball Stop" nets are to be provided in Martin Savage Park on health and safety grounds for all park users.

#### **Ventry Park**

Park works remain ongoing.

#### **Cabra Community Policing Forum**

Sgt Pat McGilloway has now retired from the Gardai. Sgt John LeStrange is now formally the community policing sergeant for Cabra. Sgt LeStrange has over 18 years on the force and was previously with community policing team in Blanchardstown.

#### Navan Road/Pelletstown Local Community Policing Forum

The next meeting of the forum is proposed for January 26<sup>th</sup> 2023. Location to be advised.

#### Mountjoy Garda Station

Inspector Mary McCormack has now moved to take charge of the Detective Unit in Fitzgibbon Street and Mountjoy Garda Stations. Community policing for the U District will now be under Inspector Alan Govern.

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# Area Housing Report Cabra / Glasnevin/ NWIC

### St Marys Place North/ Dorset Street Flats

Progress is currently being made with the detenanting process in both St Marys Place and the middle block and it is hoped that the two blocks will be fully detenanted by the end of Q1 2023. One on one meetings with tenants took place over the summer in relation to detenanting and the new development. Housing Maintenance is currently undertaking an extensive scheme which involves securing and clearing out all empty units and blocking access to detenanted landings. Site investigations and Surveys are continuing.

#### St Bricins Park

The Housing and Community Services Department is currently progressing the submission to the DHLG. The number of new housing units being provided on the site is 10. A newsletter was submitted to the surrounding area during the summer and feedback was received in the local office from residents. All queries were addressed and it is hoped that further consultation will take place in Q1 2023.

#### **O'Devaney Gardens**

It is hoped that Phase 1A will be handed over by the contractor in mid Q4 2022 and will be allocated before Christmas. Bartra have been on site over the summer carrying out surveys and site investigations in relation to road realignment and drainage and it is hoped that work will commence on site in early Q1 2023. Further information in relation to the development will then be circulated through the Central Area Committee.

#### St Finbars Court

A contractor has been appointed and works will commence in Q1 2023. Housing Maintenance are continuing to keep the site cleared of illegally dumped materials and the Area Office will organise removal of weeds and overgrown shrubbery before Christmas.

#### **Bannow Road Site**

Senior Management reported back to Central Area Councillors in relation to progress made and outcomes of discussions pertaining to the land with Transport for Ireland. It has been decided that an AHB will develop both social housing and cost rental on the site. More information will be available and consultation will be arranged in the coming months.

#### Infirmary Road

The Infirmary Road development will consists of 38 units in total located in two blocks, with a mix of 1, 2 and 3 bed apartments and duplexes in both blocks. The development has received Part 8 approval to include the demolition of two buildings on site, which excludes the Married Quarters as there is a preservation order in place for this building. The programme for Infirmary Road initially indicated going to tender in March 2021 but due to major delays it is now expected to go to tender in Q1 2023 to be on site in Q2 2023.

The event in Killala while well supported also had elements of anti-social behaviour that curtailed the showing of a second movie. The concept of using the Killala swale for community events however is a sound one and to that end there will be a Christmas event held on the swale. The Community Development Team feel that the more community events held on the swale the more opportunity there is to normalise such activities.

Christmas Tree lighting events are being planned for the coming days with Councillors being invited to attend. The Lighting of the tree in Drumcondra was a great success and well attended.

Winter flowers have also been distributed to community groups in the area which keep engagement with the groups while also ensuring attention to the public domain all year round.

Major garden and environmental improvements:


This area was overgrown and used by groups to hide weapons and other objects of anti social behaviour.
