

Active Travel Programme

- Over the next nine years, the active travel network will grow from its existing 10km to a connected network of 310km across the city.
- These projects will be coordinated by the Active Travel Programme Office, who are responsible for the delivery of 210km of the network.
- This will offer a network of projects that are safer, inclusive and more sustainable.
- The Clonskeagh to City Centre Walking and Cycling Scheme is one of the corridors identified under the Programme.


Benefits of the Scheme

Interim Walking & Cycling Scheme



- Interim and Permanent Walking and Cycling Scheme design happening concurrently
- Expected construction date:
 - Interim Scheme 2023
 - Permanent Scheme 2024
- Provide improved quality of service for pedestrian & cyclists over the 3km length
- Preparation of Interim scheme design drawings underway by NTA Cycle Design Office

- An Improvement of the existing cycle scheme
- The nature of the interim works will generally consist of:
 - Light segregation measures by way of bolt on kerbs / bollards
 - Concrete and bituminous works
 - > Removal of parking
 - Reduction of on street vehicle space by narrowing or removal of traffic lanes.



Charlemont Street




- New bollard protected cycle lanes

Ranelagh Road


- Removal of existing Bus lane and parking




Ranelagh Village
