Report of the Director of Services, Central and South East Areas

Grand Canal

A meeting was held in January 2020 with Waterways Ireland representatives and Councillors to discuss ongoing management and maintenance of the canals in the city and to agree a new structure for interaction between Waterways Ireland and DCC. The latest meeting was held on 2nd February 2023. Next meeting is due to be held in July 2023.

Portobello Harbour Square

Ait Urbanism + Landscape were appointed as consultant for the project and two initial public consultation workshops were held on 1st and 8th June 2022 at St. Kevin's Community Centre. Concept designs were prepared by consultants based on the outcome of these workshops and these were put on public display at St. Kevin's Community Centre between 3pm and 8pm on Thursday 21st July 2022. Online consultation was open until 19th August 2022 and a large number of submissions were received. Preliminary Appraisal form has been lodged with the Capital Project Support Office (CPSO). Provision has been included in the Parks 2023/24/25 draft Capital Programme. Parks Department presented the latest design to Councillors on 18th May 2023. There will be a further public consultation meeting in St. Kevin's Community Centre on 31st May 2023. It is hoped to commence Part 8 process in July 2023.

Rathgar Village Improvement Plan (VIP)

Herzog Park, Rathgar – Final Phase

The final phase of the project includes the re-alignment of the front boundary of the park and the revised car park layout, as set out in the Part 8 permission. A preliminary site meeting was held with Road Construction engineers on 14th April 2022. Surveys of the area were carried out including a drone survey and GPR Survey to assist in the design process. Roads engineering resource is now in place and a meeting was held on site on 5th May 2023 with Roads Engineer, Parks Dept. and Area Office. Once the detailed design process has been completed, costings to be compiled and then it is proposed to prepare a tender for works to car park area in 2023. When these works are carried out, further landscaping inside the park will be required as part of the works to complete the project.

Ringsend Irishtown Local Environment Improvement Plan (LEIP)

Library Square: (Mitchell & Associates) Meetings with internal stakeholders were held during September and October 2018. A meeting was held with local businesses to discuss parking / loading arrangements on 5th December 2018. A presentation was made to area councillors on 13th February 2019 and a preliminary draft design was brought to a public meeting for all stakeholders on Thursday 21st March 2019 in the Ringsend Irishtown Community Centre (RICC). Following a period of consultation up to 19th April 2019, submissions were received and were reviewed by the project team. A revised design was brought before the Public Realm Working Group on 22nd October 2019. A meeting of all internal stakeholders was held on 28th November 2019 and further required detail was identified by key departments. An invitation to tender for additional services to bring the project to Part 8 was issued to consultants and Mitchell & Associates were formally appointed on 17th November 2021. Preliminary meeting of design team took place on 15th December 2021 and detailed meetings with internal

departments were held in January and February 2022. GPR Survey was carried out in January 2022.

A second round of meetings with internal departments was held during April/May 2022 and work was carried out on finalising the design. A meeting was held with local businesses to agree servicing arrangements for traders on Fitzwilliam Street in November 2022. A public information meeting to present the designs to the community was held in December 2022 in Ringsend Irishtown Community Centre which was well received. A Road Safety Audit has been carried out. Pre-Part 8 drawings were circulated to Technical Departments on 14th April 2023 and final issues are now being resolved. Councillors will be briefed before we commence the formal Part 8 process.

City Quay

We have removed a raised bed within Dowling's Court in City Quay to create 2/3 more parking spaces for locals. A landscape architect is finalising the public realm improvement for the front of City Quay fronting the Liffey. It is hoped that this work will commence in late Q3. We are also liaising with an artist in relation to a proposed mural which will form the backdrop to the public realm improvement where cars currently cross the footpath to park.

Bridge Project

The Area Office continues to liaise with Swan Youth Services and St. Andrews Resource Centre together with Gardaí in Store Street and Pearse Street with a view to reducing ASB in the vicinity of the Quays which was a major problem last year. We are working on arranging diversionary activities for young people in the Area.

Cabbage Garden

A public meeting was held recently in Liberties College last week to hear Park's proposals for the Cabbage Garden. Awaiting update from Parks.

Sandymount Green

Traffic calming started on the 26th May on Sandymount Green and will continue every Friday, Saturday and Sunday until the end of September. There will be music on Saturdays and Sundays and Waste Management will provide enhanced cleaning in the area at weekends. The traffic on Sandymount Green will operate as normal from Monday to Thursday and will be open to all traffic.

Choice Based Lettings / Allocations

A three bedroom house in Cashel Avenue is currently being advertised under this scheme. A 2 bedroom flat in Crumlin Road flats is also currently being advertised.

CCTV Benbulbin Road

Following on from the provision of Discretionary Funding for the installation of CCTV at Benbulbin Road, we have continued to try to progress the matter. Adhering to advice from DCC's Data Protection Office, a letter was sent to the Garda Commissioners Office on the 11th March 2021. This letter requested written authorisation from the Garda Commissioner for Dublin City Council to install CCTV at the location, which is a public area and not within the bounds of a Dublin City Council complex. The current DCC code of practice for installation of CCTV in public places requires such authorisation from the Garda Commissioner. The office of the Commissioner replied on the 11th May 2021 and submitted a number of documents, including An Garda Síochána's Code of Practice for Community Based CCTV Systems. The documents submitted are at variance with DCC's code of practice for CCTV in public places and do not seem to take into account that DCC are installing the CCTV rather than a Community based organisation. Discussions took place with local based senior Gardaí in order to try and reconcile the differing positions but following further advice from our Data Protection Office further clarity was required from An Garda Síochána.

Further communication from An Garda Síochána outlining their position on this matter stated that their internal policy/procedures will only allow authorisation of this scheme if it is designated a Community CCTV Scheme. Designating this CCTV Project a Community Based CCTV Scheme would impose greater responsibility on the local community in relation to their role in consultation, installation, maintenance and management of the CCTV system. In addition, given the proposed location of the CCTV and the serious criminality which takes place there, there is a significant potential for health and safety issues to arise for community representatives involved in such a project. It would also have the potential to increase costs for the project.

We held further discussions with An Garda Síochána in April 2022 in relation to this CCTV scheme and while they have not changed their viewpoint they have raised issues in relation to all CCTV schemes which will require further clarification with our own Data Protection Office.

Additionally, the Office of the Data Protection Commissioner has recently issued a substantial fine against Limerick City and County Council in relation to the operation of CCTV in its area. This decision is likely to have knock on effects for other Local Authorities and our Law Department are reviewing the decision to assess its implications for existing and planned CCTV schemes.

The most recent update from DCC's Data Protection Office indicated that discussions are still ongoing between the Local Government Management Agency and An Garda Síochána. A meeting has been arranged between Area Office staff and DCC's Data Protection section for mid-June to seek further clarity on the matter.

Fr. Lar Redmond Hall, Keeper Road, Drimnagh

This community hall has been vacant for many years and Housing Development are proposing to redevelop the site for Housing. The site will be developed by Respond Housing and the draft proposal is to build 20 Older Persons Units on the site. The proposal is at an early stage and information days were held in Dolphin's Barn Library on Wednesday 25th and Thursday 26th January. A presentation was also made to the Area Committee on 13th March. Responds Architects are carrying out a further redesign in response to points raised at the Area Committee Meeting and at the Community Consultation event. Following on from the community consultation and the presentation at the Area Committee Respond and their Architects are making adjustments to the design in advance of lodging a Planning application in the coming weeks. Cllrs will be notified of the changes once they are complete.

Older Persons Complexes at Clonmacnoise Grove, Close and Ravensdale Close, Kimmage

Dublin City Council, in partnership with Fold Housing Association, intend to redevelop the above named Older Persons Complexes. It is intended that the existing complexes, which no longer meet current accommodation standards, will be demolished and replaced with high quality 1 bedroom accommodations. Area Housing Staff and Fold Housing staff have commenced consultation with residents and will carry out feasibility studies on both complexes. The needs and requirements of residents will be fully considered in any new designs for the complexes. There has been a very positive reaction from residents to the proposed redevelopment. An outline design for the redevelopments is currently being worked on by Fold's Architects and when complete a presentation will be made to the residents.

Kimimage / Rathmines Area Office

Following the appointment of a new staff member we will have now moved 5 day opening of the public counter, in our Crumlin office. The public counter will open from 9.30am until 1pm and from 2pm until 4pm, Mon. – Fri.

Rosary Hall

After receiving extra funding of €240k which was approved at the April City Council meeting (as well as €125k already allocated), it was decided to retender the entire proposed works. Meetings took place with both main community groups and consultant architects during the summer 2021 to outline and agree the proposed works which included mechanical & electrical works, fire safety works, remedial works and lift replacement.

The Area Manager also engaged in meetings with both community groups regarding governance of the facility and a management agreement was finalised in May 2022.

A supervisory committee comprising of two members of the football club and two members of the Harold's Cross Village Community Council (HXVCC) and the Area Manager will be established to optimise the use of the facility for the benefit of the Community.

Tender documentation was completed and advertised and tenders were received back on February 14th. When these tenders were assessed by Consultants it was apparent that construction inflation has led to a significant increase on the previously estimated cost.

A full Corporate Project Support Office (CPSO) appraisal form has been submitted in relation to the matter and it has been included in list of projects for capital funding

The disposal of the lease was agreed at the Area committee meeting in June and was brought to the July Council meeting and approved.

Final further work in relation to the agreed Protocol for Management of the Building was agreed late last year and the Lease signed.

The works were tendered on 6th April and the last day for submission was the 8th May. The tenders are currently being assessed.

Age Friendly Initiative Harold's Cross

The Age Friendly Committee for Harold's Cross has been operational since early 2020. A draft report was submitted by the Harold's Cross Village Community Council (HCVCC) in conjunction with Rob Chester, Area Community Officer and it was agreed to progress a number of these proposals, funding permitting. In tandem with this it is proposed to hold a workshop to further engage with the residents and ensure particularly any elderly resident who was not consulted has an opportunity to contribute to the process and be included. It was agreed to defer the facilitation of a Workshop to get the views of the wider community till autumn 2022.

A subgroup under the Housing SPC has been convened to look at the City Wide Age Friendly Strategy. Under this structure, submissions for funding may be advanced, including the Harold's Cross project.

It has been agreed by the elected members that further monies (€8k) will be allocated to this age friendly initiative in the discretionary funding for 2022.

IT Age Friendly tablets have been distributed to residents and have been very well received. Cliff Run Media have supplied over 1,000 units to established age friendly projects across the country; the tablet comes with one year's free WIFI and are dignity proofed to make access as easy as possible.

It is anticipated that when the works are completed on Rosary that it can play a pivotal role in age friendly activities going forward.

Eir have completed the work involved in getting an additional line into Harold's Cross Park to enable Virgin Media to set up the Wi-Fi hot spot for the area around the café.

A series of Sub group meeting have taken place in 2022 including February 11th, 28th, March 16th and April 8th to progress matters and it is hoped to schedule a programme of events to encourage people to participate in.

The first Ageing Well Café meeting took place on March 8th and was attended by about 40 residents with great support from HXVCC. There was a good cross section of our older persons.

A trip to Russborough House took place on April 11th.

An Ageing Well Café meeting took place on 17th May in McGowan's and a full Age Friendly Committee meeting took place on May 5th.

The sub group met on July 15th and a main meeting took place on the 20th September.

A trip was organised to the National Stud on Tuesday 27th September and was attended by a large group.

An event took place in McGowan's on 7th December and was very well attended

Further monies has been set aside in the Discretionary Fund this year for the HX Age Friendly Initiative.

A physical meeting took place on 5th April in the Pastoral Centre HX and was well attended. A meeting of the sub Group took place on 30th May and a main workshop will take place on 8th June.

Rutland Grove / Eamonn Ceannt Park

A Crumlin Halloween Mini Festival took place in Eamonn Ceannt from 12pm to 4pm on Monday 31st October 2022 and received very good feedback from the community who attended.

A 'Friends of Eamonn Ceannt' meetings took place on 15th December in the Pavilion in Eamonn Ceannt Park and again on March 30th.

Active Travel have indicated that they do not intended to proceed with the Kimmage – Clogher cycleway way at present.

Les Moore at the meeting on 30th March indicated that Active Travel have the expertise and funding and it is not his intention to sanction any roadworks that were passed as part of the Part 8.

At this meeting the 'Friends of Eamonn Ceannt' Committee visited the Area in question and the Area Manager on request has written to John Flanagan ACE of E & T Department to see if they would decrease the size of the footpath to facilitate some dedicated parking.

In relation to the upgrade of the Depot, Parks have informed local residents that due to the withdrawal of a sub-Contractor that Depot upgrade is delayed for two months.

A meeting between the Gardaí, three local resident Groups and the Area Manager took place on Wednesday evening 31st May to highlight some of the local concerns regarding matters including anti-social behaviour, illegal parking, overflowing bins and damage to playground.

Bloomsday in the South East Area

The life of James Joyce, his book *Ulysses* and the city of Dublin will be celebrated on Bloomsday in the South East Area in Ballsbridge, Portobello, Rathmines, Ringsend and Sandymount this year. Our Team have been working closely with Ballsbridge Living Tidy Towns, Dunville Avenue Traders, Portobello St. Kevin's Community Council, Ringsend & District Historical Society, Ringsend & Irishtown Community Centre, Sandymount Community Centre and the James Joyce Centre to produce a programme which will include live music, nature tours, literary events and street theatre. See listings below for full details.

Docklands Volunteer Week

Docklands Business Forum's annual Docklands Volunteer 'Day' was extended to a week of projects and activities this year during mid-May. This festival of corporate sustainability incorporated a number of events and activities south of the river including a Meeting on Sustainability with 50 local businesses, a Docklands Fitness Trail, a Heritage Trail and an Art Exhibition at Mayson Hayes Curran where one of the most impressive corporate collections of contemporary Irish art can be found. For its Clean-up Day, over 200 volunteers were involved in removing graffiti from buildings and also flotsam from the Grand Canal Basin and Royal Canal. Over 1,000 pollinators were planted that week and some restoration work to the mural at MacMahon Bridge also took place.

Family Fiestas / Street Parties

Street parties are a great way to meet neighbours and build a sense of community and such events have been very popular in the South East Area in recent years.

The street party season starts off on Saturday, 10th June at Havelock Square where local residents' activities will be complemented by the likes of a mobile farm, magic show, balloon modelling and a musical singalong, all provided by our team. Following on later in the month will be similar family orientated events at Belmont Gardens, Beechwood Park and Ramleh Park & Close. Dates listed below.

Ukrainian Community

Following on from April's 'International Day' at St. Andrew's Resource Centre, our Team has been working closely with the local Talk About Youth Project and a group of Ukrainian families who have recently settled in the Pearse Street area. A programme of Strictly Dance Fit Classes is underway for parents and access to English language classes locally also arranged. The Talk About Youth Summer Project and Ringsend Rockscool will be providing opportunities for young people to have fun, gain new experiences and meet friends during the summer. These families will also have an opportunity to immerse themselves in Irish Culture as part of a day trip we've arranged to Causey Farm in June where they'll be able to gather some sheep, feed the pigs, cut turf, make soda bread, play the bodhrán and maybe even have a dance.
