Item 1

Motion in the name of Councillor Declan Meenagh

That the Central Area Committee write to Irish Rail to ask that a community art project be set up to improve the appearance of Pelletstown station and get community involvement.

Item 2

Motion in the name of Councillor Declan Meenagh

The Central Area will hold a discussion on how we can maximize support for community groups by minimizing costs and promoting the circular economy.

Item 3

Motion in the name of Councillor Cieran Perry

That the Central Area Committee calls on the Manager to carry out a review of the street clutter in the Berkeley Road area as per Dublin City Development Plan policy. Local residents believe the excessive amount of signage detracts from the visual appearance of the street. Of particular concern are the old guardrails at the traffic lights. The *Design Manual for Urban Road and Streets* published by the Dept. of Transport, Tourism & Sport in 2013 acknowledges that such guardrails may be counterproductive and as

- It may increase vehicle speeds and aggressive driver behaviour.
- Create a false sense of safety for both drivers and pedestrians (guardrails will only stop vehicles travelling at very low speeds).
- Block intervisibility between drivers and children.
- Result in pedestrians/cyclists being trapped on the carriageway or found in locations that are not anticipated by drivers.
- Reduce the width and capacity of footways and crossings.
- Create a collision hazard for cyclists where built in close proximity to cycle lanes.

There are also 17 traffic and advisory signs on Blessington Street & Geraldine Street, 6 traffic & advisory signs on Geraldine Street & O ' Connell Avenue, 5 traffic & advisory signs on O'Connell Avenue & Vincent's Street, 5 traffic & advisory signs on Vincent's Street & Sarsfield Street and 11 traffic & advisory signs on Sarsfield Street and North Circular Road.

Item 4

Motion in the name of Councillor Eimer McCormack

The elected members of the Central Area Committee call on Dublin City Council Public Domain to immediately reintroduce the cutting of grass verges and pruning of trees in the Cabra and Glasnevin Ward. Not just for hardship cases but throughout the area.

Motion in the name of Councillor Declan Meenagh

To promote sustainable building in an urban setting the Central Area Committee agrees that the next building designed in the Central Area by DCC will avoid concrete and instead use timber for construction and act as a demonstration project for modern, sustainable construction methods.

That this Central Area Committee calls on the Dublin City Council Parks, Biodiversity and Landscape Services Division to prune the trees at Glendhu Road, Glengariff Road, Glenbrook Road and Glendhu Park due to the previous requests of residents for the trees to be pruned not being accepted and furthermore that a timeframe be given as to when the trees will be pruned.
